SATURDAY SESSION, July 28, 1934

The Assembly convened at the Jonesboro Tabernacle at 8:00 A. M., July 28, 1934 with our General Superintendent, Rev. W. L. Surbrook in the chair.

After a short song service, Sister Hattie Musselman led in prayer which was followed by appropriate scripture reading by Brother Surbrook. (Phil. 2:1-16.)

Rev. Milton Stockman was appointed to act as Secretary protem during the absence of the regular Secretary, H. T. Nutter.

After the roll call it was voted that the first six seats on the north side of the tabernacle be used as a conference bar.

Motion carried that the Assembly convene at 8:00 A. M., and adjourn at 12:00 noon, and the afternoon session to convene at 1:30 and adjourn at 4:00 P. M.

Motion prevailed that the District Superintendent appoint at least two members for each of the following committees: Ways and Means, Statistical, Resolutions, Memorials and Auditing.

Motion prevailed that we invite into the conference bar, with privilege of the floor, the following brethren: Rev. Herbert Mitchell, Rev. J. F. Talbirt and Rev. J. N. Walker.

Sister Etta Belle Coleman read her ministerial report and it was accepted.

Rev. Milton Stockman read his report which was accepted.

Sister Sheridan read reports of the Bogalusa Church and Sunday School which were accepted.

Brother A. C. Adams gave a report of the Church at Brookland which was accepted.

Sister Hattie Musselman read the reports of the Alexandria Church and Sunday School which were referred for correction.

Rev. G. T. Bustin appointed the following committees: Ways and Means Committee, W. C. Bowman and Milton Stockman; Committee on Statistics, H. T. Nutter and W. T. Johnson; Resolutions Committee, Miss Hattie Musselman

and Mrs. John Coleman; Memorials, Rev. J. F. Talbirt, Rev. J. N. Walker and Rev. G. T. Bustin; Auditing Committee, Rev. W. C. Bowman and H. T. Nutter.

Reports of the Alexandria Church, Sunday School, and Woman's Missionary Society were re-read by the delegate, Miss Hattie Musselman. Reports were accepted.

Reports of the Shreveport Church and Sunday School were read by the Secretary, H. T. Nutter. Reports accepted.

A motion prevailed to elect District officers and delegates to the General Assembly at Frankfort, Indiana, at the beginning of the afternoon session.

A motion prevailed to recess until 1:30.

After recess the Assembly sang, "Ready to Go", and "Blessed Assurance". Rev. W. T. Johnson led in prayer.

A motion prevailed that we receive Rev. J. F. Talbirt of the Eastern District into our Assembly.

A motion prevailed receiving to our District Rev. J. N. Walker of the Michigan District.

A motion prevailed that we receive Sister Hattie Musselman to our District.

Rev. J. S. Wallace was dropped from the roll at his own request.

A motion prevailed that the District Superintendent appoint two tellers to assist the Secretary in distributing, collecting, and counting the ballots during the election of officers. Rev. Herbert Mitchell and Rev. R. E. Ross were appointed.

Before the election of officers, the entire Assembly went upon their knees in earnest prayer.

Rev. G. T. Bustin was re-elected District Superintendent for another year on the first secret ballot.

H. T. Nutter was elected District Secretary on the first secret ballot and Rev. Willie Johnson was elected District Treasurer on the first ballot.

Rev. J. F. Talbirt, Rev. Milton Stockman and Rev. J.

N. Walker were chosen by large majority on the first nominating ballot for the three elective members on the District Council.

Rev. W. C. Bowman was re-elected assistant District Superintendent by a large majority on the first secret ballot.

A motion prevailed that the District Council appoint the District missionary officers for another year.

Rev. J. F. Talbirt was elected on the first nominating ballot to complete the District Board of Examiners.

Rev. W. T. Johnson was elected on the first nominating ballot for ministerial delegate to the General Assembly and Rev. Milton Stockman was elected alternate.

W. T. Purtee of Jonesboro and Mrs. Nathaniel Smith of Batan Rouge, Louisiana, were elected on the first nominating ballot as lay delegates to the General Assembly and Mrs. Eva Johnson of Jonesboro and Mr. Mouton Sheridan of Bogalusa, Louisiana, were elected as alternates.

Rev. Milton Stockman read a partial report of the Ways and Means Committee which was adopted.

Miss Hattie Musselman read the report of the resolution Committee, which was adopted by the Assembly.

Rev. J. N. Walker reported for the Memorial Committee. The report was adopted in part and part referred back to Committee.

H. T. Nutter read the reports of the Jonesboro Church and Sunday School. These reports were accepted.

A motion prevailed that the ordination service take place at the opening of the afternoon service on Sunday.

On motion, the session adjourned with prayer.

MORNING SESSION, MONDAY, JULY 30, 1934.

Prayer by Rev. J. F. Talbirt.

Scripture quotations by members of the Assembly.

Motion prevailed to omit roll-call.

Minutes of Saturday's session read, corrected and approved.

Report of the District Superintendent was heard and approved.

Rev. G. T. Bustin's pastoral report of the Alexandria Church was read and accepted.

Rev. Willie Johnson read his report which was accepted.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook arose from his chair and under the leadership of the Holy Spirit gave the Assembly some excellent advice as how to meet and wisely solve various local church problems.

The Secretary read the report for Rev. John Cochran which was accepted.

Woodrow Heatherly, delegate from the Algoa Church, read the reports of that church. Reports were accepted.

Reports of the District Woman's Missionary Society was read by Mrs. Lura Bustin and approved by the Assembly.

Sister Rachel Stockman read her deaconess report for the Bogalusa Church. Report accepted.

Sister Hattie Musselman read her report of the Pilgrim Mission at Smithville, Louisiana. The report was accepted.

The Secretary read the reports of Rev. Arthur Whitlock and his wife, Rev. Gertrude Whitlock. These reports were accepted.

Memorial No. 4 was reported and referred back for re-drafting.

A motion prevailed that we ask the District Council to investigate the work at Bogalusa and Center Point in regard to the work of Brother and Sister Whitlock before renewing their credentials.

Motion prevailed to leave the time and place of meeting of the next Assembly and the selection of Camp Evangelist and singers in the hands of the District Council.

On motion, the Assembly recessed until the afternoon.

The afternoon session was opened with prayer by Rev. W. C. Bowman.

The Ways and Means Committee finished reporting. Six numbers had already been passed upon. All but No. 2 had been accepted. That is, 5 recommendations had been accepted. Now, 6, 7, and 8 were read and accepted.

The auditing Committee reported the District Treasurer's books correct. The report was accepted.

The District Treasurer's report was heard and approved.

Memorials No. 4, No. 5, and No. 6 were heard and approved.

The report of the Burnt Hill Church by the delegate, J. N. Craft, was accepted.

On learning that we were entitled to two ministerial delegates to the General Assembly, a motion prevailed to elect Rev. Milton Stockman to serve with Rev. Willie Johnson who had already been elected.

Motion prevailed that we elect by secret ballot two ministerial alternates to the General Assembly. Rev. J. F. Talbirt and Sister Lura Bustin were chosen on the first secret ballot.

Motion prevailed that the present District trustees, H. T. Nutter, Rev. Willie Johnson and J. R. Hinchcliffe be re-elected for another year.

Motion prevailed permitting the District Woman's Missionary Society to raise such supplies in materials and money as they could for the Annual Camp Meeting.

Motion prevailed leaving all linens, quilts, dishes, etc., in the care of a committee appointed by the District Woman's Missionary Society.

The report of the Examining Board was heard and approved.

The report of the statistical committee was left



in the hands of H. T. Nutter and Willie Johnson to complete.

Motion prevailed that within the next thirty days each church take a special collection to help to defray the expenses of the seven delegates to the coming General Assembly.

A motion prevailed that once a month regularly the church board of each local church publicly announce and encourage a pounding for the pastor, the value of such pounding to be carefully estimated and applied as the local church board may direct.

The District Council reported to the Assembly that Jonesboro had been selected for the next District Assembly which would be held between July 15, 1935 and September 15, 1935, and recommended Rev. L. L. Waddell, District Superintendent of the Kansas District for Camp Evangelist and Rev. J. W. Walker as song leader with Sister Rachel Stockman at the piano. It was decided that the Assembly year should end July 15, 1935. The ministerial convention was voted to Bogalusa, Louisiana for four days, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and the 2nd Sunday in April.

The District Superintendent reported that the Oakdale and Forest City Churches had both been without a pastor during the year but that at each place there were yet four members remaining true to God and the Church.

Motions prevailed to leave with the District Council all unfinished business.

Adjourned with prayer by Rev. J. F. Talbirt.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED  
BY THE ASSEMBLY

1. We recommend that the District expenses for the next General Assembly be divided into four equal parts, 25 % to be raised each year, each local church to be assessed according to its membership.

2. We recommend that each local church take a special monthly offering for Foreign Missions.

3. We recommend that each Sunday School send its birthday offerings with the monthly local church offerings for Foreign Missions.

4. We recommend that recommendation number twelve of last year be changed to read as follows: This Assembly shall authorize the publishing of one hundred copies of the minutes of this Assembly separate from any other publication, five copies to be sent to the General Headquarters and one copy to the Superintendent of each District. The remainder to be distributed among the churches of the district according to membership.

5. We recommend that the district minutes be multi-graphed at our Bible School at Colorado Springs and that the cost of their publication be divided among the churches of the district according to membership.

6. We recommend that each church have not less than one shower of groceries each month for their pastor, each church board to handle their own local conditions.

7. We recommend that each church take an offering for Camp-Meeting expenses, said offering to be not less than equal to 25 cents annually for each member. All other legislation concerning Camp Meeting expenses to be annulled.

8. We recommend that each local church take an offering for expense of District delegates to General Assembly. Offering to be taken within 30 days from date.
