DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

General Sec., Dr. R. C. Hawkins, members of the Conference:

Christian greetings and a sincere welcome to our presiding officer, Dr. R. C. Hawkins, the clergy, delegates and friends of the Atlantic Southeast District.

It is impossible to estimate the power of holy enthusiasm. It is a gift that has lifted many a man and woman to higher grounds and has been the means of stirring every creative faculty to a very marked degree. To experience holy enthusiasm one must have holy interests, and plenty of them. Idle and purposeless people have no real christian interests and consequently no holy enthusiasm. Creators of new projects, builders of the kingdom feed upon it-- it is a part of their creative nature.

The true minister knows its value. He employs it successfully at all times. Great men build great churches upon it and these great works are sustained by it. Holy enthusiasm is the very essence of faith and the victorious life.

When holy enthusiasm lags the christian enterprize fails. The kingdom suffers and the Holy Spirit is grieved. All that is good and lasting in christian progress must be attributed to the holy enthusiasm of those who gave of themselves to bring it about.

I want to take this occasion to thank our Lord for every holy enthusiastic man of God in the Atlantic Southeast District. Thank God also for the gains made during the past year. However, considering the land yet to be taken we have no time to rest on our laurels.

Every truly enthusiastic man of God has asked himself a hundred times-- "How can I better serve the kingdom"-- "How can I put holy enthusiasm into our sunday school program, youth program, church program, financial and spiritual program." Within his heart of hearts he feels his responsibility.

DISTRICT SUPT. REPORT CON'T

1 UNDERSTANDING

Holy enthusiasm springs clear where there is complete understanding.

The minutes of the Atlantic Southeast District reveal one of the finest programs to be found anywhere. In spite of this fact lack of understanding can nullify and hamper proper enthusiasm. The end result of misunderstanding is neglect and failure; first as an individual, then as a local church and then the district. However, the main loser is the kingdom of God. It is my sincere hope therefore that this conference will take time to go over carefully the district program. And plan that each pastor and lay worker be thoroughly clear as to what their responsibilities are. With a clear understanding will come enthusiasm for this most important phase of the kingdom work.

2 ACCEPTING

Acceptance follows understanding as day follows nite. Every true christian accepts his responsibility. He is a responsible person. There are some things he does because they are right--and he accepts his responsibility gladly. No matter what his personal standard of convictions may be he accepts the fact that he must meet his moral obligations. He must pay his honest debts in the business world, and is a good citizen according to accepted standards. Even more so, he meets his moral obligations to his Lord. For he knows the kingdom work depends on him and his being a responsible christian. The kingdom stands or falls on his attitude at this point.

An enthusiastic acceptance of Christian responsibility is a blessing to the believer, consequently every pastor owes it to his God, church, and congregation to preach on tithing, local and district, at least once a quarter or every six months. It is just as important to preach tithing as it is to preach "Ye must be born again." The two go together. The important thing is to be an enthusiastic tither-church or individual. Remembering that "the Lord loveth a cheerful giver" and will greatly bless the local church or individual christian who honors them in this respect.

3 PURPOSE

The purpose of any spiritual program is to develop strong christians. The purpose of the District program is to enlist and bring to complete dedication the entire constituency of the church. Every member is to work as a part of the entire body. To think not in terms of the part but rather of the whole.

Understanding, acceptance, purpose, and all that these may involve enable us to have a definite part in Gods great over all program concerning mans redemption. They develop our zeal for Christ and the spreading of the Gospel. They also provide a ladder for us to climb to new heights of christian devotion and loyalty. They will extend our spiritual horizons. They will increase our capacity to enjoy christian living.

4 PROJECTING

In projecting our program we must have the proper motive. Jesus gave Himself, not for pride, fear, or duty; but because of his love for a lost world. "For God so loved the world....That he gave..." Loves motive is sharing not seeking-- giving not getting-- helping not hording...

The Christ centered church is that church whose greatest delight is in setting and reaching higher goals of devotion and service and in consecrating to God an ever greater percentage of that which our Lord has entrusted to us wheather it be time, talents or tithes...

The year ahead, God helping us is to be the greatest in the history of our district. As every pastor and layman enters joyfully-enthusiastically into the full church program-- a program conceived of a burden, born in prayer directed to God and dedicated to his Glory; we will sow enthusiascally and water not sparingly, trusting God to give the increase.. amen
