May 28, 1929

The Seventh Annual Assembly of the California District was called to order by the General Superintendent, Seth C. Rees, at 10 a. m., Tuesday, May 28th, 1929. Devotional exercises conducted by Rev. C. H. Dauel.

Remarks were made by the Chairman with regard to the conduct of business, after which the Secretary Pro Tem., Miss Nettie Crutchfield, was elected. The roll of the Assembly was then made up.

Motion carried that the first five rows of seats be reserved as the Assembly bar.

Bro. Bicker, Sr., and Brother E. R. Stewart were invited to a seat in the Assembly.

District Assembly voted that the transfers of Brother and Sister J. Paul Roper be accepted.

Motion carried that the morning session begin at 9:30 and adjourn at 11:55, and the afternoon session at 2:00 and adjourn at 4:00.

Motion carried that the Chair appoint a committee of three on nomination. The following were appointed: Bro. Dauel, Bro. Coleman and Sister Tyrrell.

The District Officers' reports were next called for. The joint report of District Superintendent and the Assistant were read and accepted. Report of District Treasurer read and accepted.

Motion carried that the Nominating Committee be allowed to withdraw in order to get the business of the Assembly under way as quickly as possible.

The reports of the Churches were next taken up. The Newburg Oregon Pastors, Sunday School, Financial and Statistical reports were read and adopted. The Fresno Pastors, Financial and Sunday School reports were read and accepted. Also the Deaconess report of Sister Burt was read and adopted. The Phoenix Pastor, Statistical, Financial and Sunday School reports were read and adopted. Phoenix Pastors and Home Missionary reports read and adopted.

Bro. Nering read the reports of Brother Palmer and Sister States; reports were adopted.

Sierra Madre Pastors, Financial, Statistical and Sunday School reports read and adopted.

Motion carried that the time be extended for five minutes to hear report of Nominating Committee.

Report of Nominating Committee read and adopted (see report).

Meeting adjourned with prayer.

#### SECOND MEETING, TUESDAY, MAY 28, 2:00 P. M.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Brother Hutchings.

Roll call again read.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

J. Paul Roper was elected Secretary, and Nettie Crutchfield as Assistant Secretary.

Letters of transfer for the following were read: E. E. Bates, G. L. Palmer, Russell Lutz. Transfers were accepted.

Motion carried that we accept our Sierra Madre Church.

Motion carried that we accept our Ventura Church.

Motion carried that we accept our Long Beach Church.

Motion carried that the delegates from the Long Beach Church be admitted to the Assembly.

Motion carried that Sister Georgia Glenn and Sister White be introduced to the Assembly.

Motion carried that the transfer of Brother J. L. Rice from the Texas District be accepted.

Motion carried that the transfer of Brother Davis, pastor of the Ventura Church, from the Nazarene Church be accepted.

Motion carried that the transfer of Mrs. Chas. Smith, who comes from the World's Faith Missionary Society, be accepted.

The Pastors, Sunday School, Statistical and Financial reports of the East Pasadena and San Diego Churches were read and adopted. The San Diego Church also reported a live Home Missionary Department.

Bro. Davis, pastor of our Ventura Church, and also Bro. Lutz were introduced to the Assembly.

Mrs. Anna Waterman requested her letter. Her request was granted.

Bro. and Sister W. H. Galloway, who have joined the Methodist Church, requested that their names be dropped. It was granted.

J. Preston Lane desired to surrender his credentials, as his work was almost entirely educational. This was granted, with expressions of confidence and love from members of the Assembly. He continued his membership with us.

Reports of the following unstationed Ministers were read and adopted: Mrs. Lillie Andrews, H. L. Blake, W. R. Miner. Mrs. Nellie I. Foss, D. T. Grout, Faith M. Wright, L. W. Brown, Mrs. Florence Scofield.

Letter from Brother and Sister G. A. Hodgkin read, and report adopted. Motion carried that Bro. and Sister Hodgins' character be passed on.

Letter from Rev. R. V. and E. M. Steelhead read and report adopted. Motion carried that a letter be written to them by our District Superintendent.

Joint report of Miss Lillian Beard and Miss Salome Gross read and adopted.

Motion carried that the time be extended for the hearing of one report that cannot be made later. This report included in that of Miss Beard's, so no further time needed.

Motion to adjourn carried.

### THIRD SESSION, WEDNESDAY, MAY 29, 9:30 A. M.

Devotional exercises conducted by Brother Hutchings.

Motion carried that we dispense with the calling of the roll.

Minutes of previous session read, corrected and approved.

The following reports were given: W. L. Troyer, Sister Roper, G. M. Anoshian, Nettie Crutchfield, LeRoy Hutchings, Mrs. F. Scogin, Mrs. Yorba, Mrs. F. Evans, Mrs. Hollowell.

Motion carried that the three deaconesses furnish the Secretary

with proper notes so that they can be embodied in the minutes, thus making their reports as full as they should be.

The following reports were given: Mrs. M. Miller, joint report of A. C. and Mary Augsburg, Earl Bicker, Walter Carithers, J. P. Coleman, John Edwards, Carl Hodgkin, Chris Stone, Mrs. C. E. Clark, Dow Wright, Mrs. Alice Norris, J. Paul Roper, Mrs. Fern Cook, F. D. Cook.

The report of the new Ventura Church was given by the pastor, Bro. Davis. The progress they have made is phenomenal, and in gratitude to God the Assembly arose and sang "Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow."

The transfers of Brother F. J. Briggs, minister, and Florence Briggs, evangelist, from the Christian Alliance, were accepted. They will be granted credentials from this District and the ones they have will be surrendered. They are members of the Pasadena Church and are laboring in China.

The report of the District Foreign Missionary Treasurer read and adopted.

Motion carried that the name of Mrs. Nellie Foss be added to the Committee on Home Missions.

Motion carried that the name of Mrs. V. Yorba be added to the Sunday School Committee.

Motion carried that the name of Mr. W. R. Miner be added to the Statistical Committee.

Motion carried that the name of Mr. E. P. Dixon be added to the Rescue Board.

Brother Lutz then read his report, which was adopted.

The Belvedere Gardens Pastors, Statistical, Financial and Sunday School reports were read and adopted.

Letter from Ethel True read by Sister Rees; adopted as her report.

Motion carried that the Secretary of this Assembly be requested to write a letter of condolence to our dear sister, Ethel True. A love offering was then taken by the Assembly for her.

Motion carried that sufficient funds be taken out of the District Foreign Missionary Fund to properly care for Ethel True.

Motion carried that Sister Scogin be appointed to take care of this matter.

Motion carried that the order of the day tomorrow at 10:30 be the election of District Officers.

Moved and supported that the 1930 assembly be held in Pasadena. Carried.

Report of the Sunday School Committee read and adopted.

The Pastors and Home Missionary report of the Rialto Church read and accepted.

Partial report of the Examining Board read and adopted (see page 15 herein).

Bro. Rees presented to the assembly the need of the Advocate, whereupon the assembly agreed to secure 202 new subscriptions for the church paper the coming year.

Moved and supported that the assembly give to Bro. Rees a standing vote of thanks for his splendid articles in the Advocate.

Bro. Dauel gave a short talk urging a closer co-operation between the different departments of the district work.

Moved and supported that Chair nominate the District Board of Trustees. Carried. Bros. Jensen, Troyer and Wise were nominated.

Moved and supported that those nominated be elected. Carried.

Moved to adjourn, that committees may meet. Lost.

Report of Olinda Church pastor read and accepted.

Moved to adjourn.

**FIFTH SESSION—THURSDAY, MAY 30, 1929, 9:30 A. M.**

Devotional exercises by Bro. E. P. Dixon.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

The Pastor's, Statistical, Financial, Sunday School and Y. P. Society reports for the Pasadena Church read and adopted.

Partial report of the Resolution Committee adopted.

Motion carried that the balance of the report of the Resolution Committee be reserved until the 2:00 o'clock session.

The next order of business was the election of the District officers.

C. H. Dauel unanimously elected District Superintendent.

Motion carried that Sister Dauel be continued as Bro. Dauel's Assistant, and that the Secretary be instructed to so cast a ballot.

J. Paul Roper was unanimously elected District Secretary.

G. F. Tyrrell elected District Treasurer.

The next in order was the election of three Elders to serve on the District Council. Bro. Coleman elected on first ballot; Bro. Augsburg on the second ballot.

Motion to adjourn carried.

**SIXTH SESSION—MAY 30, 2:00 P. M.**

Devotional led by Bro. John Edwards.

Minutes read, corrected and approved.

On third ballot, Bro. Scofield was elected as third elder on District Council.

Motion carried that we grant additional time to Committee on Resolutions.

Transfers of Gilbert and Esther Fossett, ordained elders from the Kansas District, be accepted.

Report of Bro. Bailey read and accepted.

Telegram from Paul Rees read and accepted. Secretary instructed to write him letter.

Report of Ruth Hocking. Adopted.

Report of Will Chambers. Accepted.

Olinda Church Financial and Sunday School report read and accepted.

Report of Rescue Board read and accepted.

Report of May Frisk read and accepted.

Report of Committee on Foreign Missions read and accepted.

Rev. B. C. Johnson and wife were introduced to assembly and given seat in assembly bar.

Joint report of Educational and Examining Boards read and accepted.

Bro. Nering requested that Bro. Dauel be permitted to present the need of Home Missionary work.

Moved and supported that the matter of correcting roll call be deferred until morning session. Carried.

Bro. and Sister Connelley, returned missionaries from India, were introduced to assembly and given a seat within the bar.

Moved to adjourn.

#### SEVENTH SESSION—FRIDAY, MAY 31, 9:30 A. M.

Devotions conducted by Bro. Sickler.

Bro. Orkney acted as Secretary in the absence of Bro. Roper.

Moved and supported that Sister Evans, alternate of Belvedere Gardens Church, take the place of the absent delegate. Carried.

Minutes read and accepted.

Report of Resolution Committee read and acted upon by assembly. See Resolutions, page 11.

Moved and supported that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of fifteen hundred dollars per year; the District Superintendent turning all money received by him for evangelistic work into District treasury, to be applied on salary—personal gifts not included.

Amended to include expenses. Amendment lost. Original motion carried.

Sister Chapman was introduced to assembly and given a seat within the bar.

Sister Rees presented to assembly the needs of Sister Chapman, cut-going missionary to Mexico. Donations were made.

Sister Rees presented the needs of Bro. and Sister King, missionaries in the West Indies, urging that donations be sent to them.

Bro. Augsburg was excused from the assembly.

Joint report of Educational and Examining Boards read and accepted.

Moved and supported that the Executive Committee of the Rescue Board be granted power by this assembly to act in all matters pertaining to all business of the Rescue Home, subject to the approval of the District Council. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Secretary cast a ballot for the election of Bro. A. Krag as District Foreign Missionary Treasurer. Carried. Ballot was then cast by Secretary in favor of Bro. Krag.

Moved and supported that the District be incorporated. Carried.

Moved and supported that the District Council be given authority to proceed with the incorporation of the District. Carried.

General Superintendent Rees took the floor and gave the assembly a timely address in sounding a note of warning of how other denominations were seeking to induce and influence preachers and pastors of the Pilgrim Holiness Church to leave our ranks and join them, with promises of larger salaries and good support. He also reported the actions of the Michigan and New York District assemblies and the stand they have taken in pledging themselves to be true to the Pilgrim Holiness Church and the doctrines for which we stand. He further urged the preachers, pastors and workers of the California District to unitedly stand for the truth of the Bible and hold the work of the Pilgrim Holiness Church first and all other works secondary.

Moved and supported that we as an assembly express our appreciation to God for the preservation of our Senior Elder, Bro. Coleman,



and that we express our appreciation to Bro. Coleman for his presence in the assembly and for all his labors among us.

At the expressed desire of Bro. Dauel it was moved and supported that the District Council be instructed and given authority to arrange if possible for a District Camp Meeting in 1930. Carried.

Moved and supported that District stationery be printed.

Moved and supported that District Superintendent be appointed to deal according to provision made in the manual with all licentiates who become delinquent in regard to their reports. Carried.

Moved and supported that we express our appreciation to God for His goodness to us in allowing us to have Bro. Rees with us in this assembly; and to Bro. Rees for his wise counsel and good instruction in this assembly.

The assembly closed with the members forming a large circle and joining hands as a pledge to God and to one another to be true to God and to the Church, while songs and praises ascended to God.

Motion to adjourn. Carried.

#### Joint Report of District Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent to the District Assembly of the California District, May 28. 1929.

The Lord has given us a blessed year of victory on the California District, and it is with grateful hearts that we give this our first year's report as District Superintendent.

First, we want to thank the pastors, officers, members and friends of the District for their co-operation and counsel, prayers and encouragement given us in the work.

Three new churches have been organized this year—Sierra Madre, Ventura and Long Beach.

We have held ten revivals on the District—eight for our own churches and two for the Missions at Long Beach and Los Angeles. In these combined meetings there were about 200 professions and a number were definitely healed. We took 18 new members into the Church and secured a number of subscriptions to the Advocate. We conducted one funeral service, performed one marriage, and dedicated four babies.

The Lord has helped me preach 212 times. I have visited all the Churches on the District—most of them a number of times. Have given all my time to the District, helped push the Home Missions, the Bible School, Rescue work and our Church paper, and have kept sweet victory in my soul.

To God be all the glory for the help He has given us.

We have purchased permanent equipment, such as dishes, silverware, cooking utensils, table linen, bed linen, towels, blankets, laundry equipment, material for quilts.

The nine girls who have been cared for in the Home during this year have made quilts, dresser scarfs, and clothing. One has been attending the Pilgrim Bible College for the past nine months, and is doing very good work.

Brother Roper, with the call of God on him to this work, has held three Rescue Rallies, and four single Rescue Services. Three Rescue Councils have been organized, with 106 members. He has about 200 people in the East who are sending their support this way, and just as soon as possible will be organized into Rescue Councils. These Councils are already doing active work.

The friends on the District have given us dried fruit, fresh fruit and canned fruit, vegetables, meat, cakes and canned goods. We have also received blankets, about a half dozen lovely quilts, pillow cases, dish towels, two pillows, two baby beds, one baby carriage, several bundles of baby clothing, rugs, a Brunswick Victrola, etc.

At the present time we have an option on 73 acres of good land in San Diego County, with plenty of water. This is given to us with no incumbrance but a \$1300.00 mortgage. In case we are unable to get

the proper permits in San Diego County to erect a permanent Rescue Home, the donors of this land have given us the privilege of selling same on condition that the proceeds of such sale go to Rescue Work alone.

A Fresno friend has a 160-acre tract of land in Oregon and will give us one-half of any crop we raise on same. We have not had opportunity to investigate this as yet, so we do not know of how much value it may be.

### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FOREIGN MISSIONS.

Some one has said: "The true test of Christian character lies not in demonstration, but in keeping all of God's commandments, one of which is, 'Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel.'"

We feel thankful that God has sent out from our midst missionaries this past year. Mr. and Mrs. Jeffries have gone out to China and are there engaged in the work. Mr. and Mrs. Paul Grout have gone to Mexico and are doing splendidly. Mrs. R. Chapman will be leaving us for Mexico in July, to join Miss Daisy Buby, who left us for Mexico as a missionary nurse this past year. Others are earnestly preparing and awaiting God's open door. We believe, as Brother Rees has so often said, that a church's spirituality may be largely judged by its interest in Missions, both at home and abroad.

We feel that our Church is taking a step in the right direction by stressing Home Missions. For without a strong Home Base it will be difficult to accomplish much on foreign soil. However, we are expecting that rather than to retrench or to cut down our foreign donations to meet present home needs we should bring up both interests.

It is a thought worth turning over in our minds to remember that when we speak of Home and Foreign Missions, and when we compare budgets, usually we count as Home missionary money only that that has been collected in a special meeting, as in the case of an offering for foreign work. But the fact is: Everything is Home Missions that is not Foreign.

Our church buildings;  
Our pastor's salaries;  
Our parsonages;  
Our Bible Schools;  
Our Church papers;  
Our Rescue Homes, and more, being included.

Put against that the monthly offering taken for Foreign Missions, and we will find that our foreign missionary offerings are not greater than our Home Missionary offerings, as some have suggested. Then, greater results in soul-saving for a smaller expenditure of money are to be had on every foreign field, as compared with the home field.

RESOLVED: That we not only hold the ground we have, but that we go forward at Home and Abroad!

We quote from the Missionary Review of the World:

HOW MUCH SHALL I GIVE THIS YEAR TO MISSIONS?

(A little argument with myself.)

1. If I refuse to give anything to Missions this year, I practically cast a ballot in favor of the recall of every missionary, both in the home and foreign fields.

2. If I give less than heretofore, I favor a reduction of the missionary forces proportionate to my reduced contribution.
3. If I give the same as formerly, I favor holding the ground already won, but I disregard any forward movement. My song is, "Hold the Fort", forgetting that the Lord never intended that His army should take refuge in a fort. All His soldiers are under marching orders always. They are commanded to "Go".
4. If I advance my offering beyond former years, then I favor an advance movement in the conquest on new territory for Christ. Shall I join this class?

RESOLVED: I do believe in greatly increasing the present number of missionaries. Therefore, I will increase my former offering to missionary work.

FLORA M. EVANS.

During the past year I have made 767 calls, gathered 27 children into Sunday School; placed 13 babies on the cradle roll, distributed 487 garments and shoes. Visited the hospitals, praying with the sick and dying, securing undertaker and making all arrangements for funerals, etc.; also trained children and taught in Sunday School class. Physicians, druggists and merchants have been exceedingly kind, prescriptions given and filled free. One merchant sent me \$65.00 worth of new clothes and shoes. I have received and disbursed in cash \$524.64. I find it easy to reach the children, and through the children the parents. Fourteen children gathered at my home last Sunday to go to Sunday School with me. I feel that the work for and among the children a very worth-while work. They are the future Christians and the hope of our nation. Our aim is their salvation.
