## PROCEEDINGS

### FIRST SITTING—Wednesday A. M., July 21, 1943

The Seventh Annual Conference of the Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9 A. M., July 21, 1943, at 2117 Market St., Hannibal, Missouri. Rev. Leon L. Adams of St. Louis, Missouri, led the Conference in singing "Victory Ahead" and "Jesus Saves."

Rev. George Durkee, pastor at Pacific Junction, Iowa, offered prayer. Rev. and Mrs. Leon L. Adams sang, "Tell Me His Name Again."

Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, District Superintendent, introduced Rev. L. W. Sturk, Second Assistant General Superintendent, of Cincinnati, Ohio, the presiding officer of the Conference. Brother Sturk spoke words of greeting to the Conference and then gave a splendid message on "The Song of Solomon." By special request Brother Sturk sang "No One Ever Cared For Me Like Jesus," which was a great blessing to all.

The Secretary called the roll of ordained and licensed ministers, licensed deaconesses and lay delegates.

The District Superintendent appointed Mrs. L. A. Braden and Mrs. W. O. Bottenberg as a Reception Committee.

Moved and seconded that the Conference bar include the first five seats on both sides of the church and the platform. Motion carried.

The following were introduced to the Conference and gave their testimony and on motion were granted honorary seats in the conference bar: Miss Leanna Stuart, Missionary from the West Indies; Rev. Paul F. Elliott, District Superintendent of Pittsburg District and our special Conference speaker; Rev. R. D. Brown, District Superintendent of Ontario District; Rev. Harold C. Penny of Jonesboro, Arkansas.

Motion made and seconded that Rev. Otis H. Green, pastor of Forbes Church, be granted a seat in the conference bar. Motion carried.

The Auditing Committee gave its report and on motion it was accepted. (See District Treasurer's Report.)

The District Treasurer, R. A. Beltz, gave a splendid report and on motion it was accepted. (See District Treasurer's Report.)

Rev. H. T. Mills, President of Bible Holiness Seminary, Owosso, Michigan, was presented to the Conference and gave words of testimony. Rev. and Mrs. C. C. Whittington were introduced to the Conference.

Motion made and seconded to recess until one o'clock. Carried. Rev. H. T. Mills dismissed with prayer.

The Conference convened again at 1 p. m. by singing, "Under the Blood," "Sanctifying Power," and "Marching On." Rev. L. A. Braden of Rector, Arkansas, offered prayer. Rev. L. W. Sturk spoke to the Conference.

The Resolution Committee gave a partial report which was adopted. (See Report of Resolution Committee.)

Rev. C. M. Belton and Bro. Ogle from St. Louis First Church were introduced and gave their testimonies.

Moved and seconded to have two conventions this Conference year, one in the southern part of the District and one in the northern part of the District. After discussion, this matter was referred to the District Council.

## SECOND SITTING—Thursday A. M., July 22, 1943

The Conference opened at 9:00 A. M. by singing "The Cleansing Stream." Rev. A. I. Wise, Pastor of the Rector Church, led in prayer. Rev. L. W. Sturk, the Presiding Officer, brought a splendid message on "Our Church."

The Secretary read the Minutes of the previous sitting and they were approved.

Rev. Harlow Reed, Pastor of the Hannibal Church of the Nazarene, was introduced to the Conference and gave his testimony. On motion, he was granted an honorary seat within the Conference Bar.

The Report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and adopted. (See Report of Ways and Means Committee.)

The report of the District Statistician was read. Motion made and seconded that this report be accepted subject to correction by the Statistical and Editing Committee. Motion carried. (See Statistical Tables.)

Letters were read by the Secretary from Rev. M. L. Peterson, Pastor of Omaha Church, and Rev. O. E. Fields, Pastor of Council Bluffs Church, who could not be present for the Conference.

The Chairman announced that the order of the day was the election of officers. It was moved and seconded that the District Superintendent appoint the tellers. Motion carried. He appointed Leon L. Adams, F. Paul Bittick, B. Ivan Williams, and C. C. Whittington. The Conference knelt in silent prayer, after which Rev. H. T. Mills led in public prayer. The election resulted as follows:

District Superintendent, Rev. W. O. Bottenberg; Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. Edward Boone; District Secretary, Rev. W. Lloyd Smith; District Treasurer, Rev. R. A. Beltz; Additional Members of District Council, Rev. A. I. Wise, Rev. M. L. Peterson, Rev. Leon L. Adams; Examining and Educational Board, Rev. A. I. Wise, three years; Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, two years; Rev. C. C. Whittington, one year.

It was moved and seconded that the District Trustees be the District Superintendent, Assistant District Superintendent, District Secretary, and District Treasurer. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, District Superintendent, serve on the Board of Bible Holiness Seminary at Owosso, Michigan. Carried.

The Resolution Committee gave its final report which was adopted. Brother Beltz made a motion to read the Resolutions of appreciation for services rendered by certain individuals and the Hannibal Church at the Thursday night service. Carried. (See Report of Resolution Committee.)

Rev. Paul F. Elliott, Chairman of the General Sunday School Committee, addressed the Conference in the interest of Sunday School work.

The Conference recessed until 1:30 P. M.

The Conference met at 1:30 and was opened with song and prayer. The Educational and Examining Board made a partial report which was adopted. (See Report of Educational and Examining Board.)

An Ordination Service was held and the following were ordained to the ministry:

C. M. Belton; Leon L. Adams; Perry E. Brown; F. Paul Bittick.

The Ordination Council was composed of Rev. L. W. Sturk, Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, Rev. H. T. Mills, Rev. R. D. Brown, Rev. Edward Boone, and Rev. R. A. Beltz. The congregation joined in singing, "A Charge to Keep I Have." Scripture was read by Bros. Mills, Beltz, and Sturk. Rev. Sturk gave the ordination address after which the candidates were duly ordained by the Ordination Council.

The final Report of the Examining Board was read and accepted. (See Report of Educational and Examining Board.)

It had been suggested during the Conference that all licensed ministers and deaconesses of this District take their course of study through the Correspondence Department of Bible Holiness Seminary, Owosso, Michigan. The matter was again brought before the Conference and it was moved and seconded that this Conference instruct the Examining and Educational Board to refer all licensed ministers and deaconesses who are pursuing the course of study to the Correspondence Department of Bible Holiness Seminary for the completion of their course. Further, that the Educational Board give each licensed minister and deaconess a statement of the work completed and that a copy of same be mailed to Bible Holiness Seminary. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that the District Council be given authority to complete any unfinished business that may have been overlooked by this Conference. Motion carried.

The business of the Conference having been finished, it was moved and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried. Dismissed with prayer.

## REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

1. Be it resolved that each of our resolutions remain in effect from year to year except when revoked by the District Conference.

2. Be it resolved that each pastor consult the District Superintendent before calling an evangelist.

3. Be it resolved that each church pay its offerings to deputational workers of the Bible School, Foreign Missions, Home Missions and Rescue Home through the District Treasurer, so that the District will receive credit for the same.

4. Be it resolved that each pastor be permitted to conduct two revival meetings away from his own charge during each conference year, if it can be planned so as not to conflict with the local church work.

5. Since our Camp meeting is growing from year to year, and many items are needed such as bedding and cooking utensils, we recommend that each church furnish as many of these items as possible before next Camp. The District Council shall make a list of things needed and the pastors shall present this list to the churches.

6. Be it resolved that the Conference year close June 30th. All church and ministers reports shall be sent immediately to the District Statistical Committee so that they may be compiled before the Conference. The District Treasurer shall close his books on July 6th, therefore, money must be mailed to the District Treasurer by July 1st to be included in the annual report. By action of the District Conference all churches who pay their District and General Budgets in full will be counted star churches.

7. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint all committees. All the above appointments shall be announced at this conference and their names printed in the Minutes.

8. Be it resolved that the District Council select the location and date for a Christian Workers' convention after receiving invitations from the churches and that we urge all ministers, Sunday School superintendents and young people's workers to attend.

9. Be it resolved that the District Council select a location and date for our Conference and camp and call the evangelist and workers.

10. Be it resolved we have a Sunday School rally as was provided in the previous General Conference and two banners be provided by the District and given, one for gain in attendance above the previous quarter, and the other given on largest percentage of gain over the previous quarter and that the interdenominational Sunday Schools in our district be included in this rally.

11. Be it resolved that we express our appreciation to the following for their labors in this Conference by a rising vote of thanks:

To Rev. L. W. Sturk, our beloved Assistant General Superintendent, for the splendid, efficient way in which he has conducted this conference.

To Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, our District Superintendent, for his splendid work and untiring efforts this past year over the District.

To Rev. and Mrs. W. L. Smith, pastors of the Hannibal Church, and their good people for their hospitality and their liberality in entertaining this conference, and beautifying the church by placing before us these beautiful flowers.

To the Church of the Nazarene of this city and their pastor, Rev. Reed, for the use of their large fan.

To Rev. W. L. Smith, our secretary, and Rev. R. A. Beltz, our treasurer, for their efficient and accurate work.

To Rev. Paul F. Elliott, Jr., our evangelist, who faithfully ministered God's Word, which was instructive and convincing and enjoyed by all.

To Sister Leanna Stuart, our foreign missionary representative, for the inspirational service given.

To Rev. R. D. Brown, representing home missionary work for his encouragement and service rendered.

To Rev. H. T. Mills, the president of Bible Holiness Seminary, for his spiritual and instructive service.

To these and all others who may have assisted in any way to the success of this conference, we wish to say, thank you, and God bless you.

12. Resolved that we request our District Superintendent to read the report of churches and their pastors for the coming year.

13. Resolved that we instruct our District Secretary to write letters of appreciation to the St. Louis Gospel Tabernacle, the Interdenominational Church of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and the Ft. Wayne Interdenominational Church and their pastor, Rev. W. P. Staupher, for their gifts to us as a District and Church.

14. Be it resolved, that the District Council elect a Sunday School Board of four including the District Superintendent. The duties of the District Sunday School Board, in harmony with the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, shall be as follows:

(1). The District Sunday School Board shall arrange for an annual Sunday School Convention to be held at the time of the Christian Worker's Convention.

(2). To promote and encourage the Sunday school work throughout the District.

(3). To present an annual report to the District Conference which shall include the following:

a. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.

b. A statement of the general condition of the Sunday school work on the District.

c. To recommend to the District Conference through the Ways and Means Committee the amount considered necessary to finance the District Sunday School Work.

(4). The District Sunday School Board shall be amenable to the District Council.



(5). The District Council shall have the right to remove, or cause to be removed, any member of the District Sunday School Board who, in the judgment of such Council, is not in harmony with the teaching of the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

(6). If for any reason there is a vacancy on the District Sunday School Board, the District Council, by a majority vote, may fill the vacancy.

(7). The District Sunday School Board shall work in conjunction with the General Sunday School Committee in promoting the Annual Rally Day, etc.

(8). To have published each month a District Sunday School sheet showing the attendance of each Sunday school on the District for the month, the preceding month, and the attendance for the same month a year ago, as well as the average attendance for the year, this sheet to be sent to each pastor and Sunday school superintendent on the District.

**REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE**

We recommend the adoption of the following:

1. All licensed and ordained ministers and evangelists of this Conference shall pay their tithe from income from ministerial labors into the District Treasury for the support of the District Superintendent and the District work.

2. Each licensed and ordained minister of this Conference shall pay a conference claim of one dollar a month or twelve dollars a year to the District Treasury. No credentials will be renewed unless the conference claim is paid, unless a special exemption is granted by a vote of the District Council.

3. The churches shall be apportioned the following monthly amounts for the District Budget: (District Budget includes moneys used for the support and expense of the District officers, District Home Missions and miscellaneous District expense.)

These amounts shall begin with the month of July and shall be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the tenth of the following month.

4. Each church shall pay to the General Budget an annual amount equal to \$2.25 for each member above voting age. We recommend that this be paid in monthly payments. (General Budget includes moneys for Foreign Missions, General Home Missions and General Church Administrative expense.)

5. The Churches shall be apportioned the following annual amounts for the Bible Holiness Seminary, Owosso, Michigan:

6. The District Superintendent shall visit each Church and preaching point at least two times during the year. He shall be allowed the privilege of holding four revival meetings off the District. The remainder of his time shall be devoted to District evangelism and home missionary work.

7. The District Superintendent shall be paid a salary of \$125.00 a month, plus house rent not to exceed \$30.00 a month, and three cents a mile for traveling on the District in visiting churches and Home Missionary work. He shall be allowed expense for postage, telephone and telegrams. He shall be permitted to keep his offerings for evangelistic meetings over and above his salary, but shall pay his own traveling expenses to and from same.

8. At each visit of the District Superintendent the churches shall take an offering for him, the same to be applied on his traveling expense and the church shall be credited for this amount on the District Budget. The District Superintendent shall send all such offerings to the District Treasurer, who shall receipt the churches for the same.

9. We recommend that 500 copies of the Minutes of this Conference be published and distributed among the churches. The District Council shall appoint one or more persons to edit and mail the Minutes.

10. There shall be a camp and Conference registration fee of \$1.00 per person for those above 12 years of age and 50c for those between the ages of 5 and 12 years.

11. The District Treasurer shall set aside \$20.00 a month from the District Budget fund for a special Camp and Conference fund toward the expenses of the Annual Conference.

12. The District Treasurer shall be paid \$50.00 for his services during the year, the District Secretary \$25.00 for his services, and the Statistician \$20.00.

13. The District Treasurer shall set aside \$75.00 each year for General Conference expense. This money shall be taken from the District budget fund.

14. Inasmuch as there is such a great need for money in our District for Home Missions and Church Extension work, we recommend that each church be asked to raise during the year an amount equivalent to \$1.00 per member for the District Home Missions fund.

We further recommend that the fund be raised through the Sunday Schools and Young People's Societies.

# DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

TO THE SEVENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE CENTRAL DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH.

Greetings:

Through the tender mercies of God, we are again permitted to enjoy another District Conference. We are reminded that time is swiftly passing, and as we look back over the year we can say with David, "The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous, and His ears are open unto their cry" (Psa. 34:15). We believe the burdens and experiences of the past year have enriched our life, and have brought us closer to the Lord. Many hearts are saddened because of the young men being called into the war, but let us continue to pray without ceasing for America, and Victory for the United Nations. We are looking forward to the return of our boys to their loved ones, and how we appreciate their efforts in preserving liberty and freedom. We are also looking forward to the end of this great war against sin and unrighteousness, when the Devil will suffer the greatest defeat ever known, and the Saints of God go marching home.

The past year has been a blessed year of sweet fellowship among the Ministry and the Laity, and as a District we are closely united in love and prayer. We greatly enjoyed a mid-year Convention at Springfield, Mo., in the month of March with Brother W. L. Surbrook, General Superintendent, and Brother P. W. Thomas, Secretary of Foreign Missions as special workers.

We have organized a small church at Bradleyville, Missouri, which will be in connection with the Garrison Church and served by the same pastor. A new work has been opened in St. Joseph, Missouri, under the direction of Rev. and Mrs. M. L. Allen. They are conducting services in a rented church in the south part of the city. Rev. F. O. Davis, Local Minister of the Council Bluffs church, is launching a new work near Underwood, Iowa. Rev. O. E. Livingood is conducting a Sunday School at Silver City, Iowa. Brother and Sister Lorimor of Bentonville, Mo., have completed arrangements for a new work in their town. The church at Eddyville has material and is ready to begin building a new church. A fine corner lot has been purchased and paid for during the past year. The Caruthersville church is contemplating a program to remodel the church. Jonesboro church has liquidated its debt, also the Garden Grove church. A number of our churches have building funds, with plans to build after the war. The Interdenominational Church of Fort Wayne, Indiana, with Rev. W. P. Staupher, their pastor, have offered to support again in the establishing of another new Church in the McFadden Community. They have stood back of Brother Wieand in a remarkable way with their prayers and finance. We wish to recommend to this Conference that a letter of appreciation and gratitude be sent to the Fort Wayne Church, also the Gospel Tabernacle Church in St. Louis and their pastor, Rev. R. A. Beltz, and the Interdenominational Church in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, with Brother Stokes their pastor. The St. Louis church has contributed \$823.12 to Foreign Missions through Central District, and the Cedar Rapids church \$100.30, making a total of \$923.42.

We greatly appreciate the \$324.26 we now have in our Home Mission Evangelistic fund, which has accumulated since Christmas. We are deeply in need of \$2,000.00 in this fund that we may substantially open a good church in one of our cities in the near future, and three dollars from each member of Central District during this year will put us over the top.

We praise God for a gain of over 27 per cent in finance over last year, and two per cent gain in membership. Without a doubt, each one of our churches has gone forward during the past year, and we are very conscious that God's presence has been with us, and His seal is upon each department of the Pilgrim Church. As Superintend-

ent, we have continually appreciated one hundred per cent cooperation.

We have traveled 14,000 miles in District work, visiting the churches three times and attended the General Board meeting in May. We have conducted two Revivals on the District, and three Revivals elsewhere, traveling in all about 30,000 miles. My salary from the District is paid in full; my offerings from Revivals and Gifts amounted to \$706.98. We have preached 200 times, have prayed with over 200 souls at our altars, married one couple and preached one funeral.

With utmost confidence in the Ministry, and each member of Central District, by God's grace, we will continue to go forward throughout this new Conference year.
