First Session

The annual district Assembly of the Idaho-Washington District, of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at the Coeur d'Alene Church on July 12, 1932. The meeting was called to order at 9 o'clock by District Superintendent W. J. Webster in the chair. Devotions were opened by singing "A Charge to Keep I Have"; prayer by Rev. W. J. Webster. A devotional talk was given by O. F. Gault, President of the Colorado Springs Bible School. A motion was made that Hazel Goss act in the absence of the Secretary, motion carried. A motion was made and carried that we admit Brother and Sister Gault and Brother Nering into the Assembly bar.

Assembly Bar

Reports of the Churches

Rev. Hazel Goss, Pastor of the Church at Palouse, reported. Report accepted. The Palouse Church is the baby church of the district.

Rev. Ida G. Garner reported. Sister Garner is preaching in the community Church at Mt. Hope, and is praying for a revival. Report accepted.

Rev. L. W. Goss reported. Bro. Goss has been engaged in home missionary work this year, also helping in the work at Palouse, Washington. Report accepted.

Sister Opal Webster gave in her deaconess report. Report accepted.

Church Reports

Bro. George Clark, Delegate from Athol Church, read the Church and Sunday School reports. Reports accepted.

Sister George Doll, Delegate from the Spirit Lake Church, read the Church and Sunday School reports. Reports accepted.

Motion made to adjourn until 9 o'clock Wednesday morning. Closing prayer by Rev. Stultz,

Second Session

The second session of the annual district Assembly was called to order at 9 o'clock July 13, 1932. Sister Garner conducted the devotional service. Prayer was offered by Hazel Goss.

A letter was read from Brother and Sister Calhoon stating they could not attend the Assembly on account of Mildred's sickness. They reported victory in their souls. Their reports were read by Sister Garner and accepted.

The Church and Sunday School reports were read by Sister Thomas, Delegate from the McGuires Church. Reports accepted.

Rev. Nering gave the Assembly a stirring address. He emphasized the fact that though we were small in numbers out here, that the whole P. H. Church stood back of us. Rev. Gault spoke on the budget.

Rev. Webster reports as Pastor of the Coeur d'Alene Church. Report accepted. The Coeur d'Alene Church reports were read by the delegate Sister Mary Swift. The Sunday School reports were also read by the delegate. Reports accepted.

Motion made that the chair appoint the committees. Motion carried. The following committees were appointed: Auditing—Rev. L. W. Goss and Rev. C. A. Stultz; Resolutions—Rev. O. F. Gault, Mrs. Opal Webster and Hazel Goss; Statistical—Rev. Doll, Rev. Ida Garner and Sister Thomas.

Conclusion of second session.

Third Session

The third session of the annual assembly opened by singing "I am coming Lord". Rev. Doll gave a devotional talk reading from 2 Tim., 3rd chapter. We were led in prayer by Brother Stultz, and Brother Goss, followed by singing "A Charge to keep I have."

Minutes were read and approved, roll was called. A letter was read from Rev. J. E. Henry, Seth C. Reese and Mrs. Deaderick. The examining committee reports: A motion was made that Mrs. Deaderick's name be dropped from the roll and a letter be written asking for her credentials. Motion carried. Recommended that Sister Calhoun, Rev. J. B. Bush and Rev. Doll be recommended for renewal of license. Accepted. Miss Hazel Goss has satisfactorily completed her course of study, but as she hasn't held license as long as the manual requires for ordination, we therefore recommend that her license be renewed. Recommendation was accepted.

The Auditing Committee read the following report: The District Treasurer's books were audited this 13th day of July, 1932. They are found to be correct and in good order. L. W. Goss, Chairman; C. A. Stultz, Secretary. Report accepted.

Motion made that the Chairman appoint the Editing Committee. Motion carried and the following committee was appointed: Hazel Goss, Ida Garner and R. A. Fullerton.

The Assembly was called to prayer for God to direct in the election of officers for the following year. L. W. Goss and George Doll were appointed as tellers. The following officers were elected:

Motion made to adopt a triple receipt books system. Motion carried. Motion made to have a district camp-meeting next year. Motion carried. Motion made that we have the Assembly at the beginning of the camp-meeting beginning on Monday after the camp-meeting begins on Sunday. Motion carried.

District Examining Board

The examining board stands as follows: L. W. Goss, three years; Ida G. Garner, two years; and W. J. Webster, one year. The examining board will act as the educational board.

District Board of Trustees

W. J. Webster, 3 years; J. S. Gault, 2 years; R. A. Fullerton, 1 year.

Motion made that the District Superintendent appoint the Camp-meeting committee. Carried. The Camp-meeting committee was appointed as follows: C. C. Calhoun, L. W. Goss, George Doll, R. A. Fullerton.

Fourth Session

The fourth session of the Assembly opened with singing "Down at the Cross". Devotions were led by Rev. L. W. Goss, lead in prayer by Brother Goss, Sister Garner and Brother Webster. Roll was called.

Minutes of the last session read and approved. A letter was read from Rev. Horning. Brother Hansen of Naples testified. Motion made and carried to give Brother Hansen a seat in the Assembly bar.

The resolutions committee reported the following resolutions were adopted:

Resolution No. 1: Resolved, That each local church of the district be apportioned the minimum of \$5.00 per member to finance our general church and district obligations, said amount to be distributed as follows: Foreign Missions 40%, Home Missions 20%, District Expense 20%, General budget 20%.

Resolution No. 2: Resolved, That a copy of the District minutes be placed in the hands of each Pilgrim Holiness family and minister of this district and that a copy be mailed to the General Superintendent and each District Superintendent.

Resolution No. 3: Resolved, That \$50.00 be paid our District Superintendent from the district treasury. This amount to be paid in quarterly installments.

Resolution No. 4: Resolved, That the District Superintendent should draw upon the district treasury for traveling expenses incurred in the interests of the district.

Resolution No. 5: Resolved, That the District Superintendent visit all independent Churches and Missions of the district which are supplied by ministers who are members of this Assembly, if possible.

Resolution No. 6: Resolved, That all monies or receipts for monies sent to the different departments of the general church, be given to the local church treasurer and then forwarded to the District Treasurer in order that our financial records shall be complete.

Resolution No. 7: Resolved, That our District Superintendent shall have supervision over the Home Missionary work of this district.

Resolution No. 8: Resolved, That we have two ministerial prayer-conventions each year and that the time and place be left to the Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent.

Resolution No. 9: Resolved, That the Camp-meeting committee consist of three or four members and that they be empowered to transact all business relative to the Camp-meeting, conferring with the District council when necessary.

Resolution No. 10: Let the District Superintendent appoint the statistical committee two weeks prior to the Assembly. Let the District Superintendent send two blank reports to each minister, church and Sunday school, at least two weeks prior to Assembly. Let these be filled out and one copy sent to the Superintendent not less than one week prior to Assembly which shall be given to the committee for action, the other to be retained and read on the floor of the Assembly.
