CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The Twenty-eighth Annual Conference of the Idaho-Washington District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Spirit Lake, Idaho, in the Camp Meeting Tabernacle, July 16, 1942, at 9:00 a. m. with District Superintendent E. R. Himmelright in the chair.

The Conference was led in singing by Rev. Stanley Weber, singing "Jesus Will Walk With Me" and "The Hallelujah Side." We were then led in prayer by Rev. Walter Drown, Superintendent of the Rocky Mountain District.

The congregation joined in singing "He Whispers His Love To Me."

Rev. E. R. Himmelright read portions of scripture from 2 Peter 1:1-12 and 1 Corinthians 13, admonishing us to work in "harmony and love."

The meeting was called to order and roll was called by the secretary, with twenty ministers and delegates responding.

Motion made that the pastors appoint a delegate to represent their churches if their delegate and alternate are absent. Carried.

Motion that the Daisy, Washington, and Granite, Idaho, churches be accepted into the District. Carried.

Motion that Rev. J. F. Leasure be accepted into the District. Carried.

Motion that the chair appoint a secretary's helper. Carried. Rev. Harper Cole was appointed.

Motion made that the first five rows of the north and central sections of the Tabernacle and the platform constitute the Conference Bar. Carried.

Motion made that the time of sittings be 9:00 a. m. to 11:30 a. m. and 2:00 p. m. to 5:00 p. m. Carried.

Motion made that Rev. Walter Drown and Rev. Beckwith, representative of the Beulah Rescue Home, be granted honorary seats within the Conference Bar. Carried.

Motion made that the chair appoint the committees. Carried.

The following committees were appointed:

Resolutions—Revs. Stanley Weber, Elmer Storm, Orbie Wells, J. F. Leasure.

Ways and Means—Revs. W. J. Webster, Lloyd Laubaugh, J. W.

Partridge.

Auditing—Revs. John Orkney, C. A. Wilson, C. E. Dietz.

Editing—Revs. Harper Cole, J. W. Partridge.

Motion made that the reports from the District be given. Carried.

The District Superintendent's report was read and accepted by a rising vote of thanks.

Motion made that only totals be read in the church financial reports. Carried.

The following church reports were read and accepted: Clarkston, Athol, Coeur d'Alene, Grandview, Hermiston, Kamiah and Kennewick.

Sis. Satre sang by special request the song "It Cleanseth Me" which was enjoyed.

The churches continued reporting as follows: McGuires, Nez Perce, Spirit Lake, Spokane, and Weippe.

Reports of the following ministers were read and accepted: Revs. Weber, Orkney, and Partridge.

There was a motion that we recess until 2:00 p. m. Carried.

Rev. W. J. Webster dismissed with prayer.

Second Sitting

Opened by singing "Help Somebody Today," led by Rev. Geo. Banka. The Conference was led in prayer by Rev. Orbie Wells.

Rev. W. J. Webster read the scripture lesson from 2 Peter 3.

Motion that Sis. Whittenberg act as Delegate for the Grandview Church, Sis. Sanders for the Kennewick Church, and Sis. Banka for the Granite Church. Carried.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved as corrected.

The Secretary read the roll call. There was a motion that the roll call be dispensed with in the succeeding sittings. Carried.

The following minister's reports were read and approved: Revs. Wells, Idler, Leasure, Cole, Kenney, Laubaugh, Webster, Banka, and Dietz.

Reports from the Granite and Daisy Churches were read and approved.

The minister's reports proceeded as follows: Revs. Abbott, Ida Garner, Hazel Goss, and L. W. Goss.

Reports of the following Ordained Deaconesses were read and approved: Mrs. Opal Webster, Mrs. Laura Himmelright.

The chair appointed Sis. Kenney and Sis. Lindner on the Reception Committee.

The District Treasurer's report was read and approved.

Motion that each of the first nineteen resolutions in the 1941 minutes be voted on separately. Carried.

Resolutions 1 through 9 were accepted.

There was a motion that Resolution 10 be dropped. Carried.

Resolutions 11 through 13 were accepted.

Motion that Resolution 14 be deleted. Carried.

Resolutions 15 through 17 were accepted.

Motion that Resolution 18 be deleted. Carried.

Resolution 19 was accepted.

New resolutions were presented and Resolution 20 was accepted

as amended that "the District Conference follow the Annual Camp Meeting."

Resolution 21 was rejected.

Resolution 22 was accepted with the amendment that "the District Council be delegated to arrange the financing" of the District Bulletin.

Resolution 23 was accepted.

Motion made to extend the time to complete the discussion of Resolution 24. Carried.

Resolution 24 was accepted as amended to include "all the committees except the Reception Committee."

Adjourned by expiration of time.

Third Sitting

Opened by singing "Blessed Assurance," led by Rev. Stanley Weber. The Conference was led in prayer by Rev. J. W. Partridge.

The congregation then joined in singing "Must Jesus Bear the Cross Alone?"

Rev. L. J. Laubaugh read the scripture lesson from Philippians 4.

Motion that Sis. Orkney be granted an honorary seat in Conference Bar. Carried.

The Resolutions Committee reported, presenting Resolutions 25 and 23, which were accepted.

The Ways and Means Committee presented Resolutions 1, 2, 4, 6, 7, 8, and 9, which were accepted. There were motions to rescind Resolutions 3 and 5 and to accept substitute resolutions. Carried.

The Statistical Report was read and approved.

Motion that the order of the day for election be at 2 p. m. July 17.

Ministerial reports for Revs. Wilson, Storm, Bennett, Ostergard, and Eva Wilson were read and approved.

The Reception Committee presented Sisters Partridge and Leasure and the Conference granted them honorary seats within the bar.

Th report of the Benton City Church was read and approved.

The Resolutions Committee presented Resolution 27, which was accepted.

Motion to recess until the afternoon session. Carried.

Fourth Sitting

Opened with singing "It Cleanseth Me," led by Rev. J. F. Leasure. Rev. Stanley Weber led the Conference in prayer.

The scripture lesson was read by Rev. Walter Drown from St. John 1:1-14. He gave us a stirring message on "A Called Leadership in the Church."

The minutes of the second and third sittings were read and approved.

The Conference proceeded with the order of the day, which was the election of officers.

The following tellers were appointed: Revs. Lloyd Laubaugh, Stanley Weber, and J. F. Leasure.

The Conference went before the Lord to seek guidance for the election, led by Rev. W. J. Webster followed by a season of silent prayer.

The election of officers was as follows:

Rev. E. R. Himmelright was elected District Superintendent, but resigned.

District Superintendent.....Rev. Ralph Tromble

Assistant Superintendent.....Rev. J. W. Partridge

District Secretary.....Rev. Lloyd Laubaugh

Rev. Harper Cole was elected as Treasurer. Motion that the election of Treasurer be referred to the District Council to be voted on later. Carried.

Additional Councilmen: Revs. W. J. Webster, John Orkney, Stanley Weber.

The Examining Board: Revs. J. W. Partridge, John Orkney, L. J. Laubaugh.

The Educational Board: Revs. C. E. Dietz, Harper Cole, W. J. Webster.

The Resolutions Committee presented Resolution 28, which was accepted.

Motion that the morning session for July 18 be at 8:00 a. m. Carried.

Motion to recess for 10 minutes. Carried.

Reconvened at 5:00 p. m.

Motion to rescind former action on Ways and Means Committee Resolution 1. Carried.

Motion that the "minimum assessment per voting member be \$7.00." Carried.

Motion to rescind former action on Resolution 5. Carried.

Motion that the District Superintendent receive \$70.00 per month for his services. Carried.

The Conference gave a rising vote of appreciation to Bro. and Sis. Himmelright for their faithful and loving service during the last eight years.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

Fifth Sitting

Opened by singing "Faith of Our Fathers," led by Rev. L. J. Laubaugh. The Conference was led in prayer by Sis. Lindner.

Minutes of the fourth sitting were read and approved as corrected.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

The Secretary read the report of the District Council nominating E. R. Himmelright and R. A. Fullerton for Treasurer. Rev. E. R. Himmelright was elected.

The Resolutions Committee presented Resolution 29, which was accepted.

Motion to recess for 15 minutes. Carried.

Reconvened at 9:10 a. m.

The Examining Committee report was read and accepted.

Motion to retain Rev. T. C. Abbott as an ordained minister. Carried.

Motion to drop the name of Rev. G. N. Wickens from the roll. Carried.

Motion that Rev. Orbie Wells be ordained. Carried.

Motion that Rev. Geo. Banka be ordained. Carried.

Motion that Rev. Paul Idler be ordained. Carried.

Motion that Sis. Bernice Beers be retained as a Licensed Dea-

coness. Lost.

Motion that Rev. Charles Noble be granted a first year's license. Lost.

Motion that Bro. Drown raise the deficit on the District Superintendent's salary in the evening service. Carried.

The standing committees were appointed as follows:

Resolutions—Revs. Stanley Weber, Orbie Wells, J. F. Leasure.

Ways and Means—Revs. W. J. Webster, Lloyd Laubaugh, J. W. Partridge.

Auditing—Revs. John Orkney, C. E. Dietz.

Editing—Revs. Harper Cole, J. W. Partridge, Lloyd Laubaugh.

Motion to recess until the call of the chair. If the call is not within the next five hours (by 3:00 p. m.) the Conference will not reconvene until Monday, July 20, at 9:00 a. m. Carried.

Motion to adjourn. Carried.

Sixth Sitting

Meeting called to order by Rev. E. R. Himmelright.

The Secretary read a telegram from Rev. Ralph Tromble.

Motion to keep business open until Monday, July 20, to consider Bro. Tromble's conditions. Carried.

Secretary read the resignation of Rev. Stanley Weber from the District Council and Resolutions Committee. Accepted.

The Conference elected Rev. Orbie Wells as the Additional Councilman.

Rev. Paul Idler was appointed to the Resolutions Committee.

Motion to recess until the call of the chair. Carried.

Seventh Sitting

Opened by singing "We'll Understand It Better Bye and Bye." Rev. Walter Drown led the Conference before the throne in prayer.

Motion to proceed with the business of calling a District Superintendent. Carried.

The Secretary read a letter from Rev. Ralph Tromble and also the report of the District Council. A vote was taken but lacked the requested two-thirds majority.

Motion that we vote for any ordained minister for Superintendent and in case one should be elected who already holds office, he may resign to accept the Superintendency. Carried.

Rev. J. W. Partridge was elected District Superintendent and his resignation as Assistant Superintendent was accepted.

Motion that the Assistant Superintendent be elected under the same conditions as the Superintendent. Carried.

Rev. John Orkney was elected Assistant Superintendent and his resignation as Additional Councilman was accepted.

Rev. Paul Idler was elected as Additional Councilman.

Motion to ordain Rev. J. F. Leasure. Carried.

Motion that the Ordination Service be on Friday, July 24, at 10:00 a. m. Carried.

Bro. Himmelright very tenderly expressed his appreciation to the Conference for the privileges of the past years and exhorted us to all be "among the elect at the great day of His appearing."

A rising vote of thanks was extended Bro. and Sis. Himmelright.

The chair announced that Bro. and Sis. Weber were soon leaving the District for other parts of "the harvest field."

A vote of appreciation to Bro. and Sis. Weber was expressed in a hearty "Amen!"

Amid tears and with feelings of deep regret the saints marched by the altar and expressed to Bro. and Sis. Himmelright and Bro. and Sis. Weber their heart-felt love and gratitude for the Christian fellowship and service in the past few years. Our hearts were melted together while singing "Blessed Be the Tie That Binds."

Bro. Weber dismissed with prayer.

FOOTNOTE AFTER CONFERENCE MINUTES:—

Rev. Paul Idler was disqualified as Councilman and therefore the District Council elected Rev. J. F. Leasure to fill the vacancy.

Rising circumstances made it necessary for the Council to make the change between the Assistant Superintendent and the District Treasurer.

District Superintendent's Report

To the District Conference of the Idaho-Washington District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Greeting: I herewith submit my annual report.

This has been a year with many burdens and cares for the most of us, but truly the Lord has been very gracious to remember us in these times. The great need of these days is not so much a material need as it is a spiritual need. Truly these are days of falling away and we must turn to the Lord for the needed help.

The Lord has blessed the churches of the district with some gracious revivals and a number of souls seeking the Lord at the altar of prayer. Two new churches have been added to the district: Daisy, Washington, where Bro. Dietz has been pastoring the past year, and Granite, Idaho, where Bro. Banka has held on for several years.

The report of my work seems very small in comparison with the great need, but we have done our best with what we have had to do with. I have traveled fifteen thousand miles on the District, held at least four quarterly meetings in nearly all the churches, held about thirty-five business meetings for the District, School, and churches, preached 86 times with several seeking who claimed victory, and dedicated three children.

Financial receipts have been: Salary from the District \$660.00, from the General Church \$150.00, and special offerings \$29.08, a total of \$779.08. Travel expense \$268.11, postage \$8.35, and food donations \$27.68.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank each of you who have stood by us with your help not only financially but your prayers and words of advice and encouragement.

Resolutions

1. Resolved, that we have two prayer conventions during the year, and that the time and place of said conventions be arranged for by the Superintendent and his Assistant.

2. Resolved, that two hundred copies of the District Minutes be printed.

3. Resolved, that the District Superintendent appoint the Statistical Committee at least two weeks prior to the Conference.

4. Resolved, that no worker shall be allowed on our platform whose practice, that is, their lives and dress, does not come up to our church standards.

5. Resolved, that our District Superintendent be our Home Missionary and that he choose his helpers.

6. Resolved, that our District Council serve as the Camp Meeting Committee, or elect a committee if necessary.

7. Resolved, that we recommend active pastors to be elected as the advisory members of the District Council.

8. Resolved, that no pastor or church shall call an evangelist without the consent of the District Superintendent.

9. Resolved, that each pastor preach or at least touch definitely on tithing twice a year.

10. Resolved, that all parent members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church refrain from cutting their girls' hair, and to dress them as becometh holiness.

11. Resolved, that each church have a uniform Treasurer's book to keep accurate account.

12. Resolved, that we express our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Secretary, and Treasurer for their services during the year.

13. Resolved, that each pastor be responsible to see the annual reports from his church be sent in not later than July 10 and in case of failure to do this the pastor explain same to the Assembly.

14. Resolved, that our churches give our District Superintendent an offering of provisions when he comes for the quarterly meetings.

15. Resolved, that no church board shall accept members into our churches who have come from other holiness churches until they first have received a letter of recommendation from the church where the applicant was a member, or at least make their investigation.

16. Resolved, that the District Superintendent instruct the local church board as to their duties when he makes his quarterly calls.

17. Resolved, that the District Conference follow the Annual Camp Meeting.

18. Resolved, that we have a monthly publication to be called, "The Idaho-Washington Bulletin." The District Council shall arrange a means of finance and also approve the appointment of an Editor, selected by the District Superintendent.

19. Resolved, that each church have a financial budget, setting an allowance for all expenditures, including the pastor's salary.

20. Resolved, that all committees, except the Reception Committee, be appointed by the District Superintendent at the close of each Conference and hold office through the next yearly Conference.

21. Resolved, that each pastor and the District Superintendent be

given a two weeks vacation each year with pay.

22. Resolved, that all church reports be handed to the Statistical Committee and not read at the Conference. The Superintendent's and Treasurer's reports shall be read.

23. Resolved, that each church pay their pastor his salary during Camp Meeting and Conference.

24. Resolved, that we express our appreciation to Sis. Whittenberg, her helpers in the kitchen, and the Spirit Lake Church for the fine entertainment.

Ways and Means Committee

1. Resolved, that each local church of the district be apportioned the minimum of \$7.00 per voting member to finance our general church and district obligation. Said amount to be distributed as follows: Foreign Missions, \$1.90; District Expense, \$4.00; General Administration, 50 cents; General Home Missions, 60 cents. Be it further resolved, that all active and inactive licensed and ordained ministers and deaconesses pay the tithe of their remuneration received from their ministry into the local church treasury to be applied on District Expense.

2. Resolved, that each church take a foreign missionary offering each month.

3. Resolved, that there be an assessment of 25 cents per member annually for the General Conference expense.

4. Resolved, that each local treasurer send all money for the district and general purposes to the District Treasurer the first of each month, or more often if necessary.

5. Resolved, that we pay our District Superintendent \$70.00 per month for his services. This said amount to be paid semi-monthly.

6. Resolved, that our District Treasurer send our pastors a monthly statement of their church's district obligation, and that the pastors attempt to raise this amount when in arrears.

7. Resolved, that we have a Home Missionary budget, and that we use the Home Missionary pledge card recommended by the General Church.

8. Resolved, that each Sunday School take 5% of their regular offerings and send to the District Treasurer monthly to be applied on the District Home Mission Fund.

9. Resolved, that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and District Treasurer be \$10.00 and \$20.00 respectively.

We, the Auditing Committee, have examined the books of the Treasurer, and we find them correct and in good form.
