JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Thirty-third annual Conference of the Idaho-Washington District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the Camp meeting tabernacle at Clarkston, Wash. Aug. 24, 1947.

Conference opened with singing "Amazing Grace" led by Rev. R. V. Steelhead, after which Rev. C. R. Bennett led in prayer.

Rev. E. E. Storm, Dist. Supt. introduced Rev. L. W. Sturk, the General Supt. who brought us greeting from the General Church Officials.

In addressing the Conference he used Acts 2 as a text for his message, emphasizing the following thoughts: (1) Pentecostal Unification, (2) Pentecostal Manifestation, (3) Pentecostal Purification, (4) Pentecostal Demonstration, (5) Pentecostal Lingelization. He further stated: "If our Church is to go forward, we must go on Bible lines."

A chorus was then sung entitled "I was all on the Altar, When the fire fell."

A motion was made that Betty Lou Zahn be seated as a delegate, representing the Boise Church. Motion carried.

A motion was made that the Caldwell Church be accepted by the Conference. Motion carried. The delegate was called forward and gave his testimony which was followed by the singing of "The Old Time Religion."

A motion was made that the Conference bar consist of the first five rows of seats and the platform. Motion carried, and all voting members were seated within the bar.

A motion was made that the Dist. Supt. appoint a Reception Committee. Motion carried. Rev. R. V. Steelhead and Rev. Ida Garner were appointed.

A motion was made that the time of Conference sitting be from 8:30-11:30 a.m. 1:30-5:00 p.m. and from 7:00-9:30 p.m.

A Reception Committee presented the following persons: Mrs. Martin, Schaar, E. Louise Van Metre, Rev. and Mrs. Harold Penny. They were granted honorary seats within the bar.

The Statistician gave his report. A motion to accept it with appreciation, was made and carried.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

Be it resolved that we amend Resolution No. 1 to read as follows, That each local Church of the District be apportioned the minimum sum of \$9.75 per voting member, plus the Pastor's tithe for Dist. Administration Expense, \$2.00 for General Foreign Missions, \$1.00 for General Home Missions, and \$1.00 for General Administrative Expense.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting opened by singing, "Guide Me O Thou Great Jehovah" led by Rev. Stanley Weber, followed with prayer by Rev. L. J. Laubaugh.

Srs. Schaar and Martin favored us with a message in song which was much appreciated.

A motion to dispense with the roll call was made and carried.

THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE again offered their report. A motion that resolution No. 14 be deleted was made and carried. We recommend that we amend resolution No. 9 to read "Be it therefore resolved that the Dist. Supt. receive .05 cents per mile traveling expense when using his car, and actual train or bus fare when traveling in the interest of the District. A motion was made to adopt the recommendation. Carried.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

We, the Auditing Committee of the Idaho-Washington Conference, have examined the treasurer's book and have found it neatly and correctly kept.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

A motion to receive Rev. A. G. Wheeler into the Conference, carried.

A motion to recess 45 minutes, carried.

THIRD SITTING

This sitting was opened with prayer by entire Conference.

The Resolution Committee reported.

A motion to accept resolution No. 5 as amended. This motion was lost.

A motion to accept No. 13 omitting the words "and governed by rules drawn by the council" was made and carried.

A motion was made to amend No. 19 to read, "Resolved that each church give our Dist. Supt. a cash offering for his traveling expenses when he comes to hold the Quarterly Conferences. Said offering to be applied on the Dist. budget. (Deleting the words, besides the regular offering), adopted as amended.

We recommend that each church endeavor to purchase at least two sign boards to be placed on highways, advertising our church and its location. A motion was made and was adopted.

Resolved that we have at least one lay member on the Dist. Council. A motion was made to adopt, but was lost.

RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that the District Council serve as the District Trustees.

2. Resolved that our District go on record as being opposed to our members wearing wedding and class rings.

3. Be it resolved that each church be granted the privilege of erecting a cabin for their pastor, the plans to be under the supervision of the District Council.

4. Resolved that the Conference request the District to provide a lunch stand on our camp grounds, the same to be governed by the District Council.

5. Resolved that the District Conference follow the annual camp meeting. Be it further recommended that the pastors and all members of the Conference be in attendance throughout the camp meeting.

6. Resolved, that we have a monthly publication to be called "The Idaho-Washington Bulletin." The District Council shall arrange a means of finance and also approve the appointment of an editor, selected by the District Superintendent. Be it further resolved that all pastors cooperate by sending church items to the District Editor.

7. Resolved that the Camp Registrar and Food Purchaser receive \$10.00 each for their services during camp and conference. this amount to be paid from camp meeting expense, and that food purchaser receive operating expenses above his \$10.00.

8. Resolved that the District Superintendent have the privilege of holding four meetings during the year off the district and to keep all money.

9. Resolved, that we have one prayer convention and one three-day Christian Workers' Institute during the year, and that one or more services be devoted to the young people, the time and place shall be arranged by the Superintendent and his Assistant.

10. Resolved, that three hundred copies of the District minutes be printed.

11. Resolved, that the District Superintendent appoint the Statistical Committee at least two weeks prior to the Conference.

12. Resolved, that no worker be allowed on our platform whose practice, that is, their lives and dress, does not come up to our church standards.

13. Resolved, that the Conference elect a committee of two to work with the District Superintendent in district home missionary work, said committee to be nominated by the District Council.

14. Resolved, that our District Council serve as the Camp Meeting Committee or elect a committee if necessary.

15. Resolved, that we recommend active ministers be elected as members of the District Council.

16. Resolved, that all parent members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church refrain from cutting their girls' hair and to dress them as becometh holiness.

17. Resolved that each church have a uniform Treasurer's book to keep accurate account.

18. Resolved, that our conference year close June 30 and that each pastor sees that a correct report from his church be sent in not later than July 10 and in case of failure to do this the pastor explain same to the conference.

19. Resolved, that our churches give our District Superintendent a cash offering for his travel expense when he comes for the quarterly meeting.

20. Resolved, that the District Superintendent instruct the local church board as to their duties when he makes his quarterly calls.

21. Resolved, that each church have a financial budget, setting an allowance for all expenditures, including the pastor's salary.

22. Resolved, that all committees except the Reception Committee, be appointed by the District Superintendent at the close of each conference and hold office through the next yearly conference.

23. Resolved, that each pastor and the District Superintendent be given a two weeks' vacation each year with pay.

24. Resolved that each church pay their pastor his salary during Camp Meeting and conference.

25. Resolved, that we have a District Young People's Convention during the year and that it be held at a convenient time for those young people who are in school.

26. Resolved, that all members voting in the annual church meeting, must be present.

27. Resolved, that we have a meeting for ministers and workers at least three times during the Camp Meeting. The District Superintendent shall be in charge and all ministers and workers are urged to be present.

28. Resolved, that we have a District Sunday School Committee to promote Sunday School interest in the district and to cooperate with the General Committee and that said committee be appointed by the District Council and the District Superintendent be a member of the committee. (Recommended by the General Sunday School Committee.)

29. Resolved, that we have young people's study class during our Camp Meeting and that the District Council appoint a leader to take charge of this work.

30. Resolved, that the full addresses of all ministers be printed after their names in the Conference Minutes and that the words "Pastor or unstationed by" dropped.

31. Resolved, that we express our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Secretary and Treasurer for their services during the year. Be it further resolved, that we express our appreciation to our cook, Sister Hueth, and her helpers in the kitchen; also to the Clarkston church and friends for the splendid entertainment furnished.

New Resolutions As Adopted by '47 Conference

32. We recommend that each church endeavor to purchase at least two signs, to be placed on highways to advertise and show locations of our churches in each locality, the price of each to be \$12.00.

3. Resolved, that our churches give our Dist. Supt. a cash offering for his travel expenses when he comes for the quarterly meeting, this offering to be applied on the Dist. Budget.

34. Resolved, that we extend our appreciations to all our camp meeting workers, namely, Rev. Marion Hill, Miss E. Louise Van Metre, missionary from Peru, S.A., Miss Ethel Schaar and Miss Mable Martin, special singers, also to our beloved General Supt. L. W. Sturk of Indianapolis, Ind.

WAYS AND MEANS

1. Be it resolved that each local church of the District be apportioned the minimum of \$9.75 per voting member, plus the pastor's tithes for District administration expense, plus \$2.00 for General Foreign missions, \$1.00 for General Home Missions, and \$1.00 for General administration expense.

2. Resolved, that each church take a missionary offering each month during the year, alternating equally between Home and Foreign Missions.

3. Resolved, that local treasurer send all money for the district and general purposes to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.

4. Resolved, that our District Treasurer send our pastor a monthly statement of their church's obligations the same to be posted in the church and that the pastors attempt to raise said amount when in arrears.

5. Resolved that we have a Home Missionary budget, that we use the Home Missionary pledge card recommended by the General Church, and that the District Superintendent present same to each church.

6. Resolved, that each Sunday School take 5 per cent of their regular offerings and send to the District Treasurer monthly to be applied on the District Home Mission Fund.

7. Resolved, that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary, and District Treasurer be \$15.00 and \$30.00 respectively.

8. Resolved that the District pay traveling expenses for all Councilmen and entertainment of same for all sessions except Conference and Camp; also District Conventions.

9. Be it resolved that the Dist. Supt. receive .05 cents per mile for travel expense when he uses his car and actual train or bus fare when traveling in the interest of the District.

10. Resolved, that the District Treasurer be bonded, the amount to be set by the Council and the cost to be paid out of the District Fund.

11. Be it resolved that we use envelopes for the purpose of creating Camp Meeting funds from year to year. Same to be passed out at Camp Meeting time and all urged to give at least \$1.00 during the year for this fund. Also urge those who can to give foodstuffs.

12. Be it resolved that a registration fee be charged for all those eating at the dining hall or staying on the Camp Grounds as follows: (1) all over 14 years of age be charged the sum of \$2.00. (2) Furthermore there shall be a charge for meals in the dining room as follows. All 14 years and over shall pay for breakfast 15 cents; dinner and supper, 20 cents each. The above charges to aid in defraying the Camp Meeting expenses. Anyone willing to work for their meals and entertainment may do so by applying to the registrar.

13. Be it resolved that all ministers give two day's work before the Camp and Conference and as much time at the close of same as to take care of all necessary details; furthermore be it resolved that all ministers meet the above requirements shall be provided with their families free entertainment during the Camp and Conference. Ministers not giving the proper amount and time during Camp and Conference shall pay the regular Camp Meeting charges for meals and entertainment.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Conference of the Idaho-Washington Dist.

Another year has passed into history. There have been many problems but God has been very gracious to us.

Some of our churches have gone through the year facing situations such as they have never faced before, but the Lord has blessed and given them victory.

There have been both loss and gains in the church. I feel that the Ministry and Laity are striving for a great spiritual awakening on the District, that God's kingdom may go forward.

Some of our churches have made advancement in improving of our church property. The church building at Kennewick has been completed. The church at Boise is making head-way in their building program.

The Home Missionary work is making some progress. It has bought one new tent, and held a meeting at Caldwell, Idaho, which resulted in the organization of a new church with 11 members, with a building program being arranged. We have a church building rented in Walla Walla and will send workers into that field. Yakima has been reopened and the field is white unto harvest. Daisy is being reopened and a pastor sent there. My personal report:

I have preached 75 times. Prayed in 50 homes, 50 seekers at the altar under my ministry. Preached one funeral. Had two marriage ceremonies. Received \$251 in cash. Traveled 5,039 miles, visiting Dist. churches. Traveled 4,698 miles in interest of Dist. Home Missionary work. I have victory in my soul, Saved and Sanctified to date. Respectfully submitted,

Report was accepted.

A motion was made that the Dist. Supt. appoint the committee on Memoir. Srs. Nettleton and Wells were appointed.

A motion made that all business be cared for today. Motion carried.

The Conference joined in singing the Doxology. This sitting closed by prayer by Sister Van Metre.

FOURTH SITTING

Rev. Steelhead led the Conference in singing, "Take the Name of Jesus with You."

The Examining and Educational board reported.

The names of the following were read and approved by the Conference: Rev. D. L. Goss to be ordained. Rev. H. L. Goss be reinstated as an ordained minister. Rev. F. M. Cass as an ordained minister. Rev. Geo. Banka as an ordained minister.

An ordination service was conducted by Gen. Supt. L. W. Sturk, reading from the Book of Ruth. Rev. D. L. Goss was ordained for the preaching of the gospel.

Rev. L. W. Sturk favored us with singing, "I Won't Have to Cross Jordon Alone," to the delight of the Conference.

A motion was made that resolution No. 32 be made to read: We extend our appreciation to our Camp workers, Rev. Marion Hill, Srs. Schaar, Martin, Rev. and Sr. Harold Penny. (The splendid message of Rev. Hill, and the Spiritual Singing of Srs. Schaar, Martin and the Pennys were all received with pleasure.) Motion carried.

The By-laws of the corporation were read by the Secretary, and ratified by the Conference upon motion duly made and seconded.

The election of officers was the next order of business. Tellers were appointed by the Dist. Supt. E. E. Storm, viz.: Revs. Horning, Shoemaker, Weber, Steelhead.

Moved and seconded that the District Council appoint the Editor of the District Bulletin.

Moved that the Conference minutes be approved by District Council. Carried.

Moved and seconded that a vote of thanks be given Dist. Supt. Storm. Carried.

Conference closed with a song by Srs. Schaar and Martin entitled "I'm a Private in the Army of the Lord." Prayer by Gen. Supt. L. W. Sturk.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MEMOIR
