THE SONG 'BLEST BE THE TIE THAT BINDS' WAS THEN SUNG. REV. H. J. OLSEN WAS PRESENTED BY THE RECEPTION COMMITTEE AND WAS GRANTED AN HONORARY SEAT WITHIN THE BAR. THE DISTRICT SECRETARY GAVE THE ROLL CALL,

THE CONFERENCE BAR WAS FORMED. IT WAS VOTED THAT THE FIRST FIVE ROWS OF SEATS ACROSS THE TABERNACLE AND THE PLATFORM CONSTITUTE THE BAR.

REV. P. W. THOMAS SPOKE OF HOW THE GENERAL BOARD WAS CONNECTED WITH OUR CHURCH AND IS ELECTED BY THE CHURCH FOR THE BETTERMENT OF OUR CHURCH IN GENERAL. THEY ARE DOING THEIR BEST TO SEE THAT THE WORK GOES FORWARD. THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS MEET WITH THE GENERAL CONFERENCE AND IN THAT WAY HELP THE WORK PROGRESS, BOTH HERE AND IN THE FOREIGN FIELDS.

REPORTS WERE CALLED FOR BY THE CHAIR.

THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT, REV. M. C. KITTLE, PRESENTED HIS REPORT WHICH WAS ACCEPTED WITH APPRECIATION.

THE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT, REV. G. M. PRATT, PRESENTED A VERBAL REPORT WHICH WAS RECEIVED WITH THANKSGIVING.

THE CONFERENCE ACCEPTED A REPORT WITH THE AUDITING COMMITTEE.

MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION: 10 ¢ FOR PILGRIM  
EVANGELISTIC INSTITUTE; \$ 5.50 FOR GENERAL BUDGET  
AS FOLLOWS: \$ 2.00 FOR FOREIGN MISSIONS, 1.00  
GENERAL HOME MISSION; \$ 1.00 FOR GENERAL ADMIN-  
ISTRATION EXPENSE; 75 ¢ FOR SENIOR COLLEGE; 50 ¢  
FOR CHURCH EXTENSION; 25 ¢ FOR YOUTH FUND.

RESOLVED THAT WE HAVE A CAMP MEETING ASSOCIATION  
WITH A MEMBERSHIP FEE OF \$ 1.50 PER YEAR, TO BE  
EQUALLY DIVIDED BETWEEN CAMP EXPENSE AND CAMP-  
GROUND IMPROVEMENT. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT  
THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT PRESENT THIS ASSOCIA-  
TION ON HIS VISITS TO THE CHURCHES AND GET AS MANY  
MEMBERS AS POSSIBLE.

CONFERENCE RE-CONVENED AT 1:15 P. M., WITH REV. PAUL IDLER LEADING THE CONGREGATION IN THE SINGING OF 'THE SOLID ROCK'.

## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT

TO THE 36TH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE IDAHO-WASHINGTON DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH: - GREETINGS IN JESUS NAME.

ANOTHER YEAR WITH IT'S PROBLEMS AND IT'S VICTORIES HAS BECOME HISTORY AND AGAIN WE GATHER TO REVIEW OUR PAST LABORS AND LAY THE FOUNDATIONS FOR A MORE SUCCESSFUL YEAR TO COME.

### MATERIALLY

ALL MOST ALL OF THE CHURCHES HAVE MADE SOME MATERIAL IMPROVEMENT.

1. BENTON CITY HAS PUT A NEW FLOOR IN THEIR CHURCH.
2. CLARKSTON HAS PAID OFF THEIR INDEBTEDNESS AND ARE BUILDING A FINE PARSONAGE WHICH IS WELL UNDER WAY.
3. COEUR D'ALENE IS PUTTING IN SOME MUCH NEEDED SUNDAY SCHOOL ROOM IN THE BASEMENT.

4. HERMISTON HAS LIFED MUCH OF THEIR HEAVY DEBT AND ARRANGED A LOAN WITHOUT INTEREST.
5. KENNEWICK HAS INSTALLED A FINE NEW HEATING SYSTEM AND HAS IMPROVED THEIR PARSONAGE.
6. POST FALLS HAS MADE NEEDED REPAIRS ON THEIR PARSONAGE.
7. WEIPPE IS WORKING ON THEIR PARSONAGE, GETTING IT READY FOR OCCUPANCY.
8. PLANS ARE WELL UNDER WAY FOR NEW CHURCH BUILDING AT BOISE AND YAKIMA.
9. BRO. BUERY HAS MADE PROGRESS TOWARD A NEW CHURCH IN NEWPORT, WASH.

PASTORS AND PEOPLE HAVE WORKED UNTIRINGLY TO ACCOMPLISH THESE IMPROVEMENTS.

### NUMERICALLY

EACH MAJOR DEPARTMENT OF THE CHURCH WILL SHOW A GAIN,  
 A GAIN OF 21 PER CENT IN CHURCH MEMBERSHIP  
 A GAIN OF 8,8 PER CENT IN SUNDAY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE.  
 A GAIN OF 25 PER CENT IN YOUNG PEOPLES SOCIETY MEMBERSHIP.  
 A GAIN OF 11 PER CENT IN YOUNG PEOPLES SOCIETY ATTENDANCE.

### SPIRITUALLY
