MINUTES OF THE SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE OKLAHOMA DISTRICT

The first sitting of the Seventeenth Annual Conference of the Oklahoma District convened at Hopeton, July 20, 1943, at 9:30 A. M. Our General Secretary of Home Missions, Rev. R. W. Wolfe, presided.

Rev. C. J. Meyers led in singing "He's a Wonderful Savior to Me" and "Faith of Our Fathers." We were led in prayer by Rev. J. V. Hickman, and several good testimonies followed. Bro. Wolfe brought us an inspired message from the Book of Philemon.

The roll call of Ministers and Delegates from the churches was called.

Rev. J. H. Fortner from the Kansas District, Rev. and Mrs. C. J. Meyers from the California District and Rev. and Mrs. Vearyl League of the Rocky Mountain District, were received into the Oklahoma District.

The motion was made and seconded that we receive the Oklahoma City church into the Conference. Carried. Sister Meyers, Sister Wilson, and Brother Hickman gave stirring testimonies relative to the work in Oklahoma City.

The motion was made and seconded that we convene for the next session at 1:30 P. M., adjourn at 2:15, convene 15 minutes after the Preaching Service, and adjourn at 5 o'clock. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that the first three rows of seats constitute the Conference Bar.

Dist. Supt. D. R. Close appointed Bro. Fitts to the Reception Committee; Bro. League to the Statistical Committee. Rev. G. G. Beckwith, Hillsboro, Texas, was introduced to the Conference and granted an honorary seat within the Conference Bar. The motion was made and seconded we adjourn. Carried. John F. Wilson, Secretary.

The second sitting convened at 1:30 P. M. Rev. E. W. Burton led in singing "Saved to the Uttermost." Rev. J. M. Edgar led in prayer.

E. W. Burton gave the report of the Resolutions Committee. The motion was made and seconded that we accept the report.

Rev. Z. D. Fitts introduced Mrs. J. V. Hickman, Miss Arminta Billbe, Mrs. H. F. Billbe, Mr. and Mrs. S. E. Hofen, Myra and Elva Hofen to the Conference.

Recessed.

The third sitting convened at 4:30 P. M. Rev. D. R. Close, Rev. W. W. Ponder, Rev. Jack Fitts, Rev. John F. Wilson, Rev. E. W. Burton, Rev. Vearyl League and Rev. C. J. Meyers gave pastoral reports. The Conference was adjourned by expiration of time. John F. Wilson, Secretary.

The fourth sitting convened at 9:30 A. M. Z. D. Fitts led in singing "The Bloodwashed Pilgrim." Rev. G. G. Beckwith led in prayer. D. R. Close led the devotion from St. Luke 11: 1-4. The Minutes of the Conference were read and received.

The motion was made and seconded that the date of ordination and the phone number be listed in the Conference Minutes.

The District Superintendent's report was read and accepted.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The Recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee were read and accepted.

The District Superintendent appointed the committees for the following year as listed on Page 2.

J. H. Fortner and W. P. Haltom were elected as the additional councilmen.

The following were elected to the Educational Board: J. H. Fortner, 3 years; C. J. Meyers, 2 years.

Clarence Budy was elected to the Bible School Board.

The ordination service was conducted at 2:30 P. M., July 21. Vearl League and Mrs. Bobbye Wilson were the candidates ordained. Rev. C. J. Meyers led the singing for this service. Rev. D. R. Close, R. W. Wolfe, and John F. Wilson read the scripture lesson. Rev. H. J. Olsen delivered the ordination charge, basing his message on Ezek. 19: 1-8.

Prayer was offered by Rev. R. W. Wolfe and Rev. J. H. Fortner.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

Standing Resolutions

1. We recommend that the fiscal year close June 30th, and that the pastors preach their farewell sermon the Sunday following camp.
2. Inasmuch as the District Treasurer has so much work to do at the close of the year, be it resolved that all district and general monies be sent to the District Treasurer not later than July 5.
3. Be it resolved that all delegates exceed the age of eighteen years.
4. Be it resolved that the Council make arrangements for a quarterly bulletin of district interests to be sent to each church.
5. Whereas it is so expensive to buy new tents and we must conserve the ones we have, be it resolved that each time the tent is used for established churches the sum of \$5.00 be sent to the District Treasurer, and that \$15.00 be paid for the use during the district campaign; also that each Sunday School with an attendance of over 75 pay 20c per week and the school with an attendance under 75 pay 10c per week into the tent fund.
6. In order that we may conserve the Lord's money and give our churches the advantage of evangelistic meetings, be it resolved that we as pastors and churches consult our Superintendent in slating Evangelists and if it is possible and practical that they be slated for two or more consecutive meetings which would keep down traveling expense.
7. Inasmuch as there is such a great blessing derived from a ministerial and Christian workers convention, be it resolved that during the year we have a three-day convention in the district. The council shall be the committee to set the time and prepare the program.
8. We recommend that the District Superintendent appoint all committees for the next year during the present conference sitting.
9. Be it resolved that our camp begin the third Friday in July.
10. Whereas it is quite a job to get ready for camp and to clean up after the camp and as camp comes in a busy time, be it resolved that each minister come a day earlier, stay throughout camp and a day after camp unless excused by the District Superintendent.
11. We recommend that we have 150 copies of the Minutes of the 1943 Conference printed.
12. Resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off charge during the year; providing that his charge be supplied satisfactorily with local board.
13. Resolved that the 1944 Camp have Children and Young Peoples services, the District Superintendent to secure leaders.
14. Resolved that the District Council set the date of district conference.
15. Resolved that each active minister be released for two Sundays during

the camp and conference and that they receive regular salary provided they attend camp and conference.

16. Resolved that the first prayer meeting night of each month shall be the donation night for the pastors of the district. The announcement shall be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School Superintendent.

17. Resolved that we as a Conference express our appreciation to our District Superintendent by a rising vote of thanks for his labors of love among us during the past year.

18. Resolved that a letter of appreciation be sent to Mr. W. W. Starr of Alva expressing the appreciation of the district for kindness shown by his representative, Mr. Earl Eastman.

19. Be it resolved that appreciation be expressed by the Secretary to the business firms who have donated to the camp.

New Resolutions

20. Be it resolved that a zone rally be held each quarter.

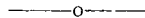
21. We recommend that the District Superintendent write a letter of appreciation to Brother and Sister Davis.

22. We recommend that the District Council appoint a Sunday School board; we further recommend that the District Supt. be a member of said board.

23. Be it resolved that we devote the first zone rally to the interests of Sunday School work of the district.

24. We recommend that we devote at least one sitting of the ministerial convention to the interests of Sunday School work.

25. We recommend that the District Superintendent appoint an advertising committee for the camp.



RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that the local churches be budgeted as follows:

Note: The District Budget includes the General Conference expense money. It is distributed as follows: Blackwell, \$12.00; Hopeton, \$12.00; Fairview, \$2.00; Newkirk, \$1.00; Pleasant View, \$12.00; Pond Creek, \$2.00; Oklahoma City, \$1.00.

2. We recommend that District Superintendent be paid 2½ cents per mile for travel expense.

3. We recommend that an offering be taken for the District Superintendent on the churches' District Budget.

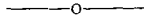
4. We recommend that all ministerial tithe be paid to the district treasurer monthly. This tithe is to be placed in the district fund.

5. We recommend that the birthday offering of the Sunday School be given in the interest of the Bible School.

6. We recommend that the registration fee at camp be set at \$2.00 for those who stay the full time, and 10 cents a meal for those who stay a short time, active ministers and families excepted.

7. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$10.00 for his services for this year.

8. We recommend that the District postage, stationery, telegrams and telephone calls be paid out of the District Budget.
9. We recommend that the district budget and district home missions be kept in separate funds.
10. We recommend that in case there is not enough money comes in through district budget and ministerial tithe to take care of the district superintendent support that the rest be taken from the district home missionary fund.
11. We recommend that all district and general funds be forwarded to the District Treasurer on the first of each month.
12. We recommend that all district checks from the bank be kept on file and turned over with the treasurer's books.
13. We recommend that the Minutes be sold at 10c per copy.
14. We recommend the District Home Missionary offering which is taken the last Sunday of Camp be applied to the interest of home missions and that an evangelistic home missionary offering be taken by the District Superintendent some time during the year. The distribution of all home missionary monies shall be left to the District Council.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

We respectfully submit the following report of our labors for the past year:

We appreciate the near presence of God and His blessings upon the way. God's Spirit and the cooperation and fellowship of the pastors and churches have made the work of the year a pleasure.

This has been in many respects one of the best years the Oklahoma District has enjoyed. Good revivals have been held in every church and some of these revivals were far above average in results, souls being saved and the church built up. Our pastors and churches are carrying a burden for God's work which shall take root downward and bear fruit upward.

Our numerical increase has not been large, but it has been good. The people that have united with us will make good Pilgrims.

Our churches have made considerable advances in improvements and payments on indebtedness the past year. Newkirk has done a lot of dressing up which has cost Brother Wilson a great deal of work. His people have loyally supported him in this. Fairview, with some help from the District, will be out of debt this year. In this we rejoice with them. We appreciate the help given by Clarence Budy, Bill Haltom and Mac Nelson in signing the note with the Fairview trustees at a critical time in the life of this church. Brother League has made many friends for our work at Pond Creek and he should see a time of reaping. Blackwell now has the indebtedness on their property over half paid and has done nearly \$400.00 worth of improvements the past year. Pleasant View did a great deal of work on their basement. Hopeton has done some shingling. A lot of work has been done on the District Camp Ground the past year by Brother Fitts, Brother Burton, and Brother Everett Haltom. In a few years this should be one of our nice Camp Grounds.

The past year the General Home Missionary Department secured Brother and Sister C. J. Meyers and assumed the responsibility of opening up a new work in Oklahoma City. We rejoice with them in the success of their labors and that this year they have brought into the Conference a new church.

The past year we have preached 111 times, held 3 revivals, baptized 5, dedicated 12 children, preached or assisted in 5 funerals, made 8 visits to the churches and held 17 business meetings, traveled 6,117 miles in District work, attended 1 General Board Meeting, 1 Bible School Board Meeting, and 1 Committee Meeting of the Bible School Board. I have received for stationery \$145.88, for telephone and telegrams \$34.42, salary from District \$420.00, General Home Missionary Department \$556.00. My ministerial tithe is paid into the District Treasurer.
