# Minutes of the 20th Annual Assembly

## Eastern District

### Pilgrim Holiness Church

CONVENED AT DENTON, MD., JANUARY 6th, 7th and 8th, 1925,  
FOR A THREE DAYS' CONVENTION.

Tuesday morning, January 6th, as ministers and delegates gathered a song and testimony meeting was held till 11.30 o'clock, when Rev. A. A. Price preached.

#### TUESDAY P. M.

At 1.30 o'clock p. m. the first business session was opened with devotional services, Rev. W. H. Vickers District Superintendent in charge.

First in order was enrollment of ministers and delegates.

The chair appointed Lewis Adams and Chas. Schelhouse committee on credentials.

Rev. Geo. B. Kulp was recognized as a member of the assembly and seated within the conference bar.

After roll-call minutes of last convention were called for and read.

The Superintendent invited Bro. Kulp to take the chair and preside, which he declined emphatically.

On motion the following committees were appointed:

- (3) RESOLUTIONS: Moffitt, Olsen, Hope.

A motion was carried asking the chairman of the Home Missionary Board to make a report to the convention. T. L. Trice, chairman gave a verbal report of the work of Home Missions in the District the past year.

Sister Slaughter the secretary and Bro. Hope a member of the board also spoke on the work of the past year as did Bros. Olsen and Wiggins, who held a tent meeting under its auspices.

The hours set for business sessions were, in the morning, 9 to 12 o'clock. Afternoon, 1.30 to 4.00 o'clock, unless change was ordered by assembly for preaching services.

The night services were given over to evangelistic efforts under Bro. Kulp.

After announcements the assembly adjourned for the day.

#### Wednesday, 9.00 A. M.

After devotional exercises led by Bro. Vickers the roll was called and minutes of preceding session read and approved.

It was moved and carried Bro. W. T. Martin be recognized a member of the assembly and seated within the bar.

Reports of the following pastors and ministers were read and referred to the statistical committee: Lewis Adams, P. F. Bean, S. Bafford, C. S. Hope, S. L. Mills, E. J. Moffitt, H. J. Olsen, Amy Slaughter, H. P. Adams, J. W. Covington, A. A. Price, W. H. Vickers, W. F. Wiggins.

Bro. Merrick Lowry was recognized as a member of the assembly and invited within the bar.

The hour of 11 o'clock being near, it was moved and carried to suspend reading reports to next session and proceed to elect officers.

Rev. W. I. Donohoe was introduced to the assembly and invited to a seat within the conference bar.

Bro. Vickers then handed the secretary a paper to be read to the assembly declining to allow his name to be voted for as superintendent.

The assembly extended to Bro. Vickers an expression of appreciation for his faithful services as District Superintendent the past five years by a rising vote.

The chair appointed Avery Ornett and Merrick Lowry tellers.

On first ballot P. F. Bean was elected Superintendent.

For assistant Superintendent, W. H. Vickers was elected by acclamation.

On motion the rules were suspended and the secretary directed to cast the ballot.

For Secretary-Treasurer, Chas. T. Griffin was unanimously re-elected and Bro. P. F. Bean instructed to cast the ballot.

For four members of District Council Bros. Moffitt, Olsen, Hope and Price were elected on first ballot.

On motion the elections of the Home Missionary Board was made the order of the day for 2.00 o'clock in the afternoon.

Adjourned.

### Wednesday 1.30 P. M.

The afternoon session opened with devotional services and prayer was offered by Bro. H. P. Adams.

Roll call was dispensed with and minutes of last session read and approved.

Bro. C. L. Slater was voted a member of the Assembly and seated within the bar.

Bro. H. F. Bailey dean of the Greensboro Bible School was also introduced to the assembly and invited within the conference bar. Reports of churches were taken up and the following read: Groton, Broomes Island, Beulah, Cambridge, when the order of the day, the election of Home and Foreign Missionary Boards, was called for.

It was moved and carried a nominating committee be appointed to make nominations for both Home and Foreign Missionary Boards, and present to assembly for election.

Moved and seconded we proceed to vote by ballot without nominations. Laid on table.

Moved and carried the Home Missionary Board consist of five members. Carried.

The chair appointed the following committee on nominations. Trice, Covington, Olsen, Bean and Price.

They were excused and retired to make the nominations.

Bro. Bailey was then given an opportunity to represent the Greensboro Bible School.

The committee presented as nominees for the Home Mission Board, A. A. Price, Lewis Adams, C. S. Hope, J. W. Covington, L. A. Mowbray, P. F. Bean, Amy Slaughter.

On first ballot the following received a majority vote and elected: Lewis Adams, C. S. Hope, A. A. Price, P. F. Bean and L. A. Mowbray.

Moved and carried the election of the Foreign Mission Board be the order of the day for 9.30 Thursday morning.

Moved and carried the assembly adjourn for a missionary address by Bro. C. L. Slater.

#### Thursday 9.00 A. M.

After prayer by Bro. Wiggins the session was opened for business The minutes were read and accepted.

Moved and seconded the reports be handed to the statistical committee without reading. Lost.

The election of the Foreign Mission Board was taken up as the order of the day.

The following were put in nomination by the nominating committee: H. J. Olsen, Mayme Moffitt, Chas. T. Griffin, Gertrude W. Price and Mrs. P. F. Bean. On first ballot H. J. Olsen and C. T. Griffin were elected. On second ballot sister Gertrude Price was elected.

Reading reports from churches was taken up and completed.

Bro. Slater announced the home going of sister Pratt, wife of Bro. Melvin Pratt, and moved the assembly send to Bro. Pratt a message of condolence. Carried.

The chair appointed on this committee Bros. Kulp and Olsen. The following telegram was sent:

"Rev. Melvin Pratt, Rescue Home, Terre Haute, Ind.

"The news of the home-going of Mother Pratt has just reached us. The Assembly desires to express its sympathy and love and assure you of our interest. We believe the angles were glad to see her, also the redeemed who have gone on before her and her influence will continue until Jesus comes.

The following resolution was reported by the resolutions committee:

Resolved, That we the members of the Annual Assembly of the Eastern District Pilgrim Holiness Church wish to express our appreciation and heartfelt thanks to the Editor of the Advocate, Rev. C. G. Taylor, for his untiring efforts in getting the paper out of debt and making it a sixteen-page paper, and for the sacrifice he has made for the upbuilding of the institutions of our church.

Carried unanimously by a standing vote.

An offering for Bro. Taylor was taken, amounting to \$40.79.

Also a number of subscriptions was taken for the Advocate and pastors urged to press subscriptions for the paper including five-year subscribers.

The licensed preachers reports were next read.

The treasurer's report was read and accepted.

Bro. Kulp spoke briefly and touchingly of the work of Chas. E. Cowman and the Oriental Missionary Society. The meeting adjourned.

**Thursday 1.30 P. M.**

The last business session was opened with prayer by Bro. Vickers. Roll was called and minutes of morning session read and approved.

Motion made that the Superintendent visit each church twice a year. Ruled out of order as manual already makes that provision. Moved and supported that Superintendent carry out this provision of the manual.

Moved and carried that the same provision for payment of the Superintendent be continued and that he receive the same amount additional for the second visit.

Motion carried to have the minutes published. Moved and supported the same committee (Bros. Bean and Griffin) comprise the committee on publishing same. Carried.

Moved and carried to give the committee a rising vote of thanks.

Bro. Vickers called the newly elected officers to the platform and made a retiring address to the assembly.

Motion carried to dispense with quarterly conventions since the Superintendent is to visit each church twice a year. The invitation of Bro. Covington that the next annual assembly meet at Hurlock, Md., January 5, 6 and 7th, 1926, was accepted by a rising vote.

Moved that we the preachers and delegates of the District give a rising vote of thanks to the Denton church for their hospitable entertainment. Carried unanimously. Adjourned.
