Journal of Proceedings

FIRST SESSION, TUESDAY, JANUARY 4th, 1927

The Twenty-Second Annual Assembly of the Eastern District, Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Cambridge, Md., 10.15 a. m., January 4th, 1927, with District Superintendent, Rev. P. F. Bean, in the chair. Session was opened with song, "In the Service of The King." Led in prayer by Rev. W. R. Cox.

Moved and supported we hear the reading of the ministers and Church reports at this time, carried.

SECOND SESSION, TUESDAY AFTERNOON, JANUARY 4th,

Rev. W. R. Cox read for a scripture lesson the 18th Psalm and Rev. W. H. Vickers, led in prayer.

THIRD SESSION, WEDNESDAY MORNING, JANUARY 5th.

Session opened at 9.00 a. m., by singing Hymn "Constantly Abiding." Rev. W. R. Cox in chair. Rev. W. H. Vickers read for a Scripture Lesson the 105th Psalm. Rev. S. Lewis Adams led in prayer.

Moved and Supported Louise Parker and Pearl Vincent, Gospel Singers, be invited within the Conference Bar. Carried.

Moved and supported Rev. H. A. Sanholtz, District Superintendent of the Pennsylvania District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, be granted an honorary seat within the Conference Bar. Carried

The roll was called. Minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Rev. P. F. Bean, District Superintendent, read his report. The report was by motion adopted as read, with a rising vote of thanks for the faithful service of our District Superintendent.

Moved and supported Revs. Higgs and Donaldson, ministers of the Nazarene Church, be invited within the Conference Bar. Carried.

The District Treasurer read his report which was adopted as read.

The report of the Church Extension Board was read by the Treasurer and adopted.

After a brief season of prayer the Assembly proceeded to elect officers.

Moved and supported the Assembly at this time pray for Brother Zach. Hatfield, of Harrington, Del., who has been ill for sometime. Carried.

Adjourned.

FOURTH SESSION, WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, JANUARY 5TH

Session opened with hymn, "I have Moved." Rev. W. R. Cox in chair. Rev. Willard Donahoe read for a Scripture lesson the 51st Psalm. Prayer by Rev. Thomas S. Dixon.

Roll call. Reading of the minutes of the previous session.

Report of the committee on Resolutions:

Resolution No. 1. Resolved, the District Superintendent shall not be required to visit the established churches twice annually as heretofore, but he shall devote his spare time helping new and struggling churches, and he shall be remunerated from free-will offerings and the Church Extension Fund. Adopted.

Resolution No. 2. Having followed the plan of free-will offerings for the support of every department of our work, both in the District and General Church work, and being confident this is in accord with the New Testament Church, be it therefore: Resolved, we shall not try to enforce the Budget System introduced and adopted at our last General Assembly at Frankfort, Ind., for the following reasons:

First: We have five camp-meetings on our District which support is largely pledged in advance and a change of plans at this time would be disastrous.

Second: Our Foreign Missionary program is so heavy the Budget System would not meet present needs.

Third: We cannot conscientiously force a ruling on our people that is out in harmony with the spirit of the New Testament no matter how promising and gratifying the results. Adopted.

Resolution No. 3. Considering the confused state of the public mind regarding the teaching of full salvation, and owing to the many false religious cults professing to preach the doctrine of Holiness, and the proselyting spirit rife in some quarters, be it therefore; Resolved: That the Church Extension Board shall not employ ministers or workers who are members of other denominations, said workers having been passed upon by the District Council as to both doctrine and life. Adopted.

Resolution No. 4. Resolved each local church shall conduct a service and take an offering quarterly in the interest of Church Ex-

tension work, and 10% be sent to the General Board of Home Missions. Adopted.

Resolution No. 5. Resolved, that our next Annual Assembly shall deal according to its Godly judgment with its ministers who may be delinquent in carrying out and complying with the decisions of this Annual Assembly. Adopted.

Resolution No. 6. Resolved, we have two Ministerial Conventions on our District this year and the time and place of the same shall be decided by the District Council the same to be announced at this Assembly. Adopted.

Resolution No. 7. Resolved the District Council shall outline the work of our District Superintendent for the coming year. Adopted.

Resolution No. 8. Resolved, that this Annual Assembly tender to the Church of Cambridge, together with its Pastors, a vote of thanks for their untiring efforts in entertaining this assembly. Adopted.

Resolution No. 9. Resolved that the reports of the ministers and churches be in the hands of our Secretary at the first session of our next Assembly, and the Secretary read the same and they at once be turned over to the Statistical Committee, thus providing more time to transact business necessary for our District and the major interests of our Church as well as for public worship. Adopted.

Resolution No. 10. Resolve, the Church Extension Board be requested to create more interest among our churches concerning Church Extension Work, and one or two members of the Board visit each church to raise funds for Church Extension Work. Adopted.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

FIFTH SESSION, THURSDAY MORNING, JANUARY 6th

Session opened by singing hymn, "He Abides." Rev. W. R. Cox in chair. Led in prayer by Rev. Sewell Bafford. Rev. T. S. Dixon read for a scripture lesson, St. John 14th chapter.

By motion dispensed with calling roll. The minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

The Auditing Committee's report was read, and adopted.

Report of the District Council:

Recommendation No. 1. We recommend our District Superintendent be required to make at least one visit to each church annually or as many times thereafter as the church and council deems necessary and he be remunerated for his services as provided in Resolution No. 1, reported by the Committee on Resolutions and the Council defer further action in outlining his work, leaving it to His Godly judgment. Adopted.

Recommendation No. 2. We recommend John L. Hurley be granted license to preach. Adopted.

Recommendation No. 3. We recommend Lola Vickers license be renewed. Adopted.

Recommendation No. 4. We recommend Elizabeth Clough be granted a Deacones' License. Adopted.

Recommendation No. 5. We recommend that Rev. T. S. Dixon be ordained at this assembly. Adopted.

Recommendation No. 6. Since a number of our ministers and deaconesses have not reported to this assembly, we recommend that they be requested to send a report to our District Secretary at once, in order that same may be placed in our minutes, if they desire their credentials renewed, we further recommend our District Secretary send a copy of this recommendation to each delinquent minister and deaconess. Adopted.

Session adjourned by expiration of time.

SIXTH SESSION, THURSDAY AFTERNOON, JANUARY 6th

Session opened at 3.20 P. M., preceded by an ordination service at which time Rev. T. S. Dixon was ordained. Rev. W. R. Cox delivered the ordination charge.

Roll call omitted. Minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Moved and supported the amount to be raised for the support of the editor of the Advocate be apportioned the churches by the District Council. Carried.

Moved and supported the Editing Committee have minutes printed and each church pay for them according to the number sent them. Carried.

Moved and supported to accept the invitation of Milton, Delaware church for our next Annual Assembly. Carried.

Report of the Statistical Committee was read and adopted.

Moved and supported the District Treasurer write each delinquent church requesting they forward assessments for our General Superintendent's Salary. Adopted.

Moved and supported our District Treasurer write any delinquent Church one month before our next Annual Assembly, requesting they forward amounts required in order that the Treasurer's report may be complete at the opening of the Assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported Rev. and Mrs. Earl Lowry be offered the apologies of the Assembly for our neglect in not offering them an honorary seat in the Conference, and they be invited within the Conference Bar. Carried.

Moved and supported we adjourn to meet at Milton, Delaware, January 3, 4 and 5th, 1928.

District Superintendent's Report.

**District Superintendent's Annual Report for Year 1926 to the Annual
District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in Session
At Cambridge, Maryland, January 4, 5 and 6th, 1927**

Through the providence of God we are now permitted to meet in another district assembly. Since our last Annual Assembly the all-wise God has seen fit to call a few of our number from time into eternity, but in the midst of all this, we feel the Lord has been merciful and gracious to us as a Church.

We as a district are indebted to Almighty God for the many blessings he has bestowed upon us during the past year and He is worthy of all the praise for every victory He has helped us to win. And as I lift my heart to him in greatfulness for His many favors. I want to thank the ministers and their good people for the way they have so nobly stood by us in the work. We feel there is a blessed fellowship among our people.

Most all of our Churches have had one, or more revivals during the past year and some of them have been marked with great success and many souls have been saved and sanctified. We believe the reports from our Churches to this Assembly will show that our District has made one of the best records that she has made for several years.

We appreciate the good work that has been accomplished through the Church Extension board under which Brother L. A. Mowbray and his co-workers have held several very successful meetings. Also the work done under the Hedge and Highway society managed by evangelist Rev. W. H. Vickers and his singers, who have held several meetings with good success. And through these societies and the faithful labors of some of our ministers we have been able to organize three new Churches this year.

First. Early in the spring under the faithful labors of Rev. Thomas S. Dixon we were able to organize a Pilgrim Holiness Church at Mardela Springs, Md., with a membership of 13. They now have a beautiful little Church, all complete, size 32x40 feet, with a recess pulpit and a membership at this time of 21.

Second. Under the faithful ministry of Sr. Mary P. Garrett there has been a Pilgrim Holiness Church organized at Lowsonia, Md., with a membership of 18 and they have erected a very beautiful tabernacle, size 40x60 feet, and nearly all paid for.

Third. At Wachapreague, Va., a very nice church was built several years ago, but was no organized, and had practically gone down,

but through the efforts of Rev. W. H. Vickers and Rev. Merrick Lowry the work has been revived and organized this year bringing the property over into the hands of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and they have a membership of 11.

With these new organizations there has been built this year a beautiful Church at Milton, Del., size 30x45 feet with a recess pulpit, this work was brought about through the labors of Rev. H. P. Adams working under the District Church Extension work and organized in December of 1925. With a membership of 14. During this year they have made a gain of 58 members and now have a membership of 72, and property worth about \$7,000.00 and nearly out of debt. I say praise God. Besides this two of our old churches have been enlarged, making more room and adding beauty. They are as follows: Centreville, Md., Rev. R. O. Musser as pastor; Broom's Island, Md., Rev. Sewell Bafford as pastor.

There is now a new Church under construction at Milford, Del., they had been worshipping in a School house, which they bought several years ago, but during last year they sold the School building and purchased a nice front lot on one of the Main streets of their city, and are now erecting a nice Church, size 30x50 feet, which contains a basement under the entire Church. Rev. C. W. Schelhouse is their faithful pastor.

Our District has made a good record in raising Foreign Missionary money and have nobly stood by the home work in its different departments. At this time there is some good prospects for a few more new organizations, which can be completed soon.

Our work for the year as a whole is as follows: We have traveled either by train or our car about 6,000 miles, and with our pastoral work we have visited about all the churches on the district twice this year; we have preached 77 times, out of which I preached 37 times in making my visits to the different churches. Conducted 13 funerals. Children dedicated, 28. Baptism, 18. Marriages, 8. Prayer meetings conducted, 11. Subscriptions to the Advocate, 28. Number saved and sanctified at our church; saved 40, sanctified 46. On our visits to the different churches 3 saved and 2 sanctified. The total offerings cash received, \$1517.35. Out of which I received from the District, \$222.61.
