MINUTES OF THE FIFTEENTH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE ILLINOIS DISTRICT PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

Assembly convened August 30 at 9:30 by singing "Onward Christian Soldiers" and "Down At The Cross"; led by Bro.D. M. Horn. We were then led in prayer by Bro. Melvin Pratt.

After brief remarks by the District Supt. W. E. Catey, Rev. S. M. Stikeleather encouraged the Assembly along Home Mission and Church extension work also exhorting to let brotherly love continue.

Roll was called, twenty-eight ministers and delegates answering to the roll call.

The Assembly bar was fixed and the Paris church was presented and accepted into the Assembly.

Supt. W. E. Catey appointed Bro. D. M. Horn and Bro. Cyril Scott on the reception Committee

Bro. and Sister E. A. Meeks and Sister Pearl Roush was appointed on the resolution Committee.

Moved and seconded that the Assembly open at 8:30 A. M. and close at 11:30 A. M.; 2:00 to 4:00 P. M.

Moved and seconded that night sitting begin at 7:30. Carried.

The reception committee presented Bro. R. G. Flexon, Bro. Dale Zits, Bro. Martin, Bro. Wm. Pratt, Bro. Velvin Pratt, Bro Friend Glendenning, Bro. Roy Glendenning, Bro. Herbert Glendenning, Bro. Walter Hall, Sister Dice and Dierdorf, Bro. Roy Bendinger, Sister Pratt and Sister Stikeleather.

All were welcomed into the Assembly.

Moved and seconded that Dst. Statistician give her report. Carried.

Minister's report were read and accepted.

Financial, Statistical, Sunday School reports were read and accepted.

Time for the ordination service was set for 2:00 P. M.

Bro. James Cunningham was appointed on auditing Committee in place of Bro. Ellis Maness.

Adjourned with prayer by Bro. Flexon.

AFTERNOON SITTING

Bro. Cyril Scott led in singing, "I need thee every hour."

Bro. Elmor Hanna led in prayer.

Roll call was suspended with and minutes were read and accepted after some correction.

A joint committee of examining and Educational boards gave in a partial report, recommending that Bro. John Aberanthey of Chicago, Ill., be ordained. Report was accepted.

The Assembly sang, "A Charge to Keep I Have."

Bro. Flexon read a scripture lesson from I Tim. 3rd chapter.

Bro. Catey read from 2 Tim. 4th chapter.

Bro. Hanna read from Titus 3.

Bro. Stikeleather gave the charge and the ordination Council consisting of Bro. Stikeleather, Bro. R. G. Flexon, Bro. W. E. Catey, Bro. W. G. Henschen and Bro. Elmor Hanna laid their hands on Bro. Abernathy, all bowing in prayer, and Bro. Abernathy was duly ordained.

He was given his credentials and the blessings of God upon him were asked by the Assembly.

The male quartette then sang "Jesus Savior Pilot Me" and "Rock of Ages." A real time of refreshing from the presence of the Lord.

The auditing committee report was then read and accepted.

Examining Board: W. E. Catey, 3 years.

Educational Board: D. M. Horn, 3 years.

Statistician; Gladys Neeley, by acclamation.

Moved and seconded that Dist. Supt. W. H. Pratt appoint committees. Carried.

Adjourned with prayer by Bro. Melvin Pratt.

TUESDAY MORNING SITTING

Assembly opened by singing "Blessed Assurance" led by Bro D. M. Horn. Sister Alice Van Horn led in prayer.

Bro. Stikeleather read scripture Lesson from I John 2nd Chapter, and exhorted Assembly to Practical Christianity.

Minutes were read and approved.

Report of Educational and Examining Board was read and accepted.

Bro. Geo. A. Smith was invited within the Assembly bar.

Report of Resolution Committee was read by Sister Meeks.

Ways and Means Committee report was read by Bro. Henschen.

Moved and seconded that time be extended 10 min. Carried.

Moved and seconded that all unfinished business be given over to District Council. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we receive Bro. W. H. Pratt into this Assembly upon presentation of his transfer from the Indiana District. Carried.

Resignation of Bro. F. A. Shull from Examining Board was read and accepted.

Announcements were made and we adjourned with prayer led by Bro. Pratt.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON

Bro. Horn led in singing "He is So Precious to Me".

Quotations of Scripture were given by Members of Assembly.

Bro. Geo. Smith led in prayer.

Moved and seconded that reading of minutes be postponed till close of session.

Bro. Pratt read names of Committees:

Ways and Means—W. G. Henschen, W. E. Catey, Glen Neeley.

Resolution Committee—Ellis Meeks, Chloe Meeks, Grace Catey.

Auditing Committee—D. M. Horn, Wm. Hall and James Cunningham.
Moved and seconded that Dist. Supt. appoint two to serve with himself on Memorial Committee. Carried.

Bro. Henschen read another re-ommendation from Ways and Means Committee, which was accepted.

Stationing report was read by Bro. Catey.

Minutes were read and approved.

Prayer by Bro. Catey.

H. J. Kemp, Secretary.

Assembly adjourned by singing the Doxology.

REPORT OF RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

1. Resolved, that each church shall conduct a S. S. Teachers training class.
2. We recommend that no pastor shall call an evangelist over the protest of the District Superintendent.
3. Resolved that the District Council appoint a sheriff to be deputized to patrol the camp ground during camp meeting.
4. Resolved that all preachers either come, send some one or pay the equivalent, \$2.00 per day labor for the preparation of the District camp and assembly when called upon by District Superintendent.
5. Resolved that each church be responsible for one comforter, six dish towels, six plates, six glasses, six desserts, six knives, forks and spoons, 3 deep dishes for the 1938 camp.
6. Resolved that each church shall bring good donation of canned fruit and vegetables for camp.
7. Resolved that each pastor instruct his people that all who come to camp shall abide by its rules.
8. Resolved that no single young people shall be allowed off the ground after 7 P. M. without permission.
9. In as much as there has been a failure on the part of some of our pastors in carrying out some of the resolutions of the district assembly be it resolved that if any pastor shall fail to carry out any resolution as passed by the District Assembly he shall be denied both voice and vote in the following District Assembly unless he shows just cause.
10. Resolved that each zone have a S. S. attendance banner the same to be given to the S. S. having the largest percentage of increase and provision shall be made for S. S. Rallies in the various churches.
11. Resolved that this assembly extend their heartfelt appreciation to our out-going District Superintendent Bro. Catey for his faithful labors with us during the past seven years.
12. Resolved that the District Superintendent be instructed to arrange all the rules now written under the ways and means heading not pertaining to finances under the Resolutions Heading.
13. Resolved that we give Bro. Stikeleather a rising vote of thanks for his help in this assembly.
14. Resolved that we express our thanks to the Keith Bakery, Marshall Bakery, Thompson Meat Market, the Maytag Dealer, the Charleston Courier, Effingham (Prim's Bakery) for their donations to the camp. That the Secretary be instructed to send a copy of this resolution to each.
15. Resolved that all who work for meals pay a registration fee of \$1.00 and that the young people be expected to attend the young people's and the night services.
16. Resolved that all our evangelists and ministers arrange their slates and work so as not to conflict with the camp and assembly. Resolved that each pastor shall have the privilege of holding one revival off his charge with regular salary providing he supply his pulpit satisfactorily in his absence.
17. For several years we have planned to build a tabernacle. At last our hopes are realized and we wish to offer our heart felt thanks to God for His helping hand. Thru Him we have the beautiful tabernacle. But the People had a mind to work under the leadership of our District Superintendent Bro. Catey and the contractor Bro. Walter Hall. The District Council and several others laboring together with God have made this tabernacle possible. Be it Resolved that we all stand and say "Thanks be to God for the Tabernacle."
18. Resolved that a supervisor for the children be appointed by the District

council for the duration of the camp.

19. Resolved that this assembly instruct the camp meeting committee to set aside a play grounds for the children.

20. Resolved hat all parents be expected to be responsible for the conduct of their children while at camp.

21. Resolved that the District Secretary be instructed to have 200 copies of these minutes printed within 15 days after the close of this assembly.

22. Resolved that all reports be mailed to the District Statistician by August 5th.

23. We recommend that any unfinished business be referred to the District Council .

24. The District Superintendent shall present the needs of canned fruits, vegetables, meats, etc., for the District Camp Meeting to each Local Church, at least once during the year.

25. The District Superintendent is an advisory member of all District Boards and Committees.

26. The District Superintendent and the District Secretary shall keep in touch with the pastors, reminding them of the plans of this Assembly, and encouraging and helping them in carrying out said plans.

27. The District Superintendent shall examine the records of the Secretary and Treasurer of each Local Church at the time of his regular visits thereto and shall offer any needed suggestions as to how they may improve in the performance of their duties.

28. The District Superintendent shall review all of the District rules with each Local Church Board at the time of each regular visit to the respective Churches, and shall give them any needed advice in carrying them out.

29. The District Treasurer shall furnish the District Superintendent with a detailed report following the close of each quarter, showing what each Church has paid to each item in the District and General financial program.

30. Each pastor shall maintain a calling list, using a card filing system which shall be the property of each succeeding pastor and the expense of the same shall be borne by the Local Church.

31. a. The Assembly shall end with July 31st each year and all business transacted between that and the Annual Assembly shall be included in the following year's report. Also the Assembly Year shall be divided into four quarters ending with the following dates respectively: First Quarter, August 1st to October 31st; Second Quarter, November 1st to January 31st; Third Quarter, February 1st to April 30th; Fourth Quarter, May 1st to July 31st.

b. A quarterly meeting shall be held in each Church within ten days following the close of each quarter, at which time reports covering the quarter shall be heard and then copied in the Church Secretary book and mailed to the District Statistician immediately following the close of the Assembly Year, July 31st.

32. All of our preachers and laity shall secure respectively, a copy of our Church Manual and the Minutes of the Assembly, and shall read and study the same until they are able to understand and carry out all their provisions and requirements.

33. a. Each pastor shall keep a record of all subscribers to the Advocate in each neighborhood where he pastors and shall, about thirty days before each subscription expires, endeavor to secure a renewal of the same.

b. Each pastor shall endeavor to secure in each town or community in which his regular appointments are located, a sufficient number of subscriptions to the Advocate to cause the total number of subscribers in each community to be equal in number to 50 per cent of the membership of the respective churches.

34. The revision of church membership rolls shall be made prior to the respective annual Church Meetings.

35. This Assembly requires its Ministerial members to attend the Assembly and Camp Meeting. They shall be present on the first day and remain to the close. Each Church shall keep up the salary of its pastor during Camp Meeting. If any minister does not attend, he shall send a report of his work and an excuse for his absence. If he fails to do so for two consecutive years he shall be disciplined.

36. The District Secretary shall notify in writing all of the members of this Assembly who have failed to meet the requirements of the foregoing rule No. 35, calling their attention to such failure and the penalty for the same at

bly at least thirty days before our next Assembly.

37. The pastor shall be responsible for the accuracy and condition of all Church Records, and of all quarterly and annually reports.

38. The books of the course of the study not now possessed by the examiners thereon shall be purchased by the District for their use. The books shall remain the property of the District and the examiners using same shall be responsible for their preservation and shall reimburse the District if the books are damaged or lost through their neglect.

39. Each pastor shall secure during the year not fewer than five new members for the Charleston Camp Meeting Association.

SPECIAL RULING:—Each Local or Licensed Minister taking examination shall pay to his examiner the amount of 50¢ for each examination taken.

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

No. 1. Since the General Assembly has adopted the Budget System of administering the finances of the General Church, we strongly urge all Local Boards to adopt the Budget System for administering the finances of their respective Local Churches.

Also that each pastor be given a stipulated amount for his support and that at the respective annual meetings, each church shall decide what financial support they will pay their pastor during the coming year.

No. 2. The District Budget shall be raised and disbursed in the following manner:—

a. An amount equal to 10% of all funds received by each Local Church including that received by each pastor for his services as such, and that paid to evangelists, and exclusive of all funds paid to the purchase, rental, or necessary upkeep, of all real state or Building for Church or parsonage use, shall be set aside by the Local Church Treasurer each Monday and remitted by him to the District Treasurer on the first of each month.

(Necessary upkeep would not include money spent for furniture, furnishings, electric light bills, etc. It would include only money spent for anything actually necessary to the maintainance or preservation of the property, such as paint, roofing, together with the cost of applying same, special taxes, insurance premiums, payment on church debt, etc.)

b. All money received by the District Treasurer in fulfillment of the requirements of paragraph a of the ruling, shall be divided by him as follows:

District Superintendent fund	60%
Miscellaneous District Expense fund	25%
District Church Extension fund	10%
General Assembly Expense fund	5%

No. 3. That the ministerial tithe of licensed and ordained ministers and local preachers acting as pastors, be paid through the local church treasurer, for the District Budget.

No. 4. In carrying out the above resolution the pastors should put their tithes in the regular Sunday offerings and the local Treasurer should keep said tithes separate from other tithes and offerings.

No. 5. Each Church in this district shall raise an amount equal to \$1.00 per member for the General Budget.

No. 6. Each Church in this District shall raise an amount equal to \$2.00 per member for Foreign Missions, same to include money raised for Foreign Missions by the Sunday Schools, etc.

No. 7. Since the District Superintendent is to the District what the pastor is to the Church, the District Superintendent shall meet with each Local Church Board at the time of his visits and inquire carefully into the spiritual and financial condition of the Church and help them in the solution of their various problems.

No. 8. Our people shall not send money directly to any of our General Church interests, but shall remit to their Local Treasurer who shall forward same to District Treasurer, who shall disburse to the proper recipient.

No. 9. The District Secretary shall be paid \$10.00 for editing the Minutes and the District Treasurer shall be paid \$20.00 per year for his services.

No. 10. Each Local Church shall pay into the Camp Meeting Treasury the sum of five dollars for each delegate throughout the Camp.

No. 11. The regular Sunday School offerings on one Sunday per month shall be a special offering for Foreign Missions and shall be forwarded to the

District Treasurer for that purpose. The particular Sunday on which this offering shall be taken shall be determined by the Sunday School Board.

No. 12.a. The District Treasurer shall make a monthly report sheet, showing the amount of money received from each Church in the District for all District and General interests. Each District and General interest shall be listed separately and each Church shall be listed in relation to the percentage of its share of the District and General financial responsibility it has paid. The name of the pastor of each Church shall be indicated and a copy of the entire report sent to each local Church Secretary of the District, who shall post same in a conspicuous place in his respective Church.

b. A copy of above report sheet shall also be furnished the District Superintendent each month.

No. 15. An annual report sheet of the financial progress and faithfulness of each Church and Pastor in relation to the District and General interests shall be prepared by the District Statistician and posted within the next District Assembly Bar.

No. 14. That the attention of the churches be called to standing resolution No. 10.

No. 15. That sanitary and well lighted toilets be provided for next camp and assembly.

No. 16. All working for their meals shall pay a registration fee of \$1.00.

No. 17. We recommend that the District Superintendent be authorized to conduct a series of Missionary Prayer Conferences throughout the state and that he be authorized to ask the General Board to provide two additional members of the party.
