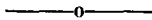
Moved and supported that we hear the reports of Pastor and Churches. Carried.

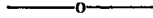

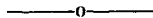

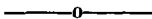

The session was opened by singing, "All Hail the Power of Jesus Name."

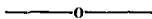

**REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS
ADOPTED BY THE ASSEMBLY.**

1. We recommend that each pastor conduct a special prayer service for Foreign Missions once each month, advertising meeting publicly, and that an offering be taken for this work at the close of the service, same to be sent to the District Treasurer.

2. We recommend that the District Council shall have charge of the Home Missionary work of the District with authority to take such steps as they think best for the interest of this work.

3. We recommend that the District Superintendent visit each church twice during the year and perform the other duties of the office, that he be paid \$600 and traveling expenses for his services to the District, also, that inasmuch as the District cannot fully support him he may serve as pastor of some church in the District.

4. We recommend that all the ministerial members of this Assembly, except the District Superintendent, pay one tenth of their income from ministerial labor into their local church treasury and that the local Church Treasurer remit same to the District Treasurer for the support of the District Superintendent.

5. We recommend that the local Church Treasurer deduct pastor's tithe from his salary as it is received, forwarding same to the District Treasurer.

6. We recommend that the District Superintendent tithe his income from ministerial labor into the District Treasury for the support of the General Superintendents.

7. We recommend that each church shall raise for the District Superintendent's support as follows:

St. Louis \$45	Carlinville \$20
Marshall 45	Springfield 20
Oblong 40	Effingham 15
Caruthersville 40	Onarga 15
Charleston 40	Asbury 15
Joplin 40	Coffeyville 10
Lawrenceville 40	Martinsville 10

We further recommend that these amounts shall be divided into twelve equal installments and be paid monthly.

8. We recommend that each pastor urge his church to adopt the tithe system and insist that his members place their tithe in the local church treasury and that from this a stipulated amount be paid the pastor sufficient for his support, and that at the last quarterly meeting the church shall decide what support their pastor shall receive the following year.

9. We recommend that each local church pay into the District Treasury an amount equal to 5% of the total offerings received during the year 1929-1930, after deducting money paid for the erection or purchase of churches or parsonages, the purchase of real estate for church purposes, or for rent on place of worship or parsonages, and that this money be divided as follows: District Expense 50%, Gen-

eral Superintendent 20%, District Home Missions 15%, and Camp-ground 15%.

10. We recommend that the District Budget be raised monthly.

11. We recommend that our people do not send money direct to our General Church interests, but that they remit to their local Church Treasurer who shall send the same to the District Treasurer, who shall then forward these amounts to the places for which they are intended.

12. We recommend that the District Secretary be paid ten dollars for editing the Minutes.

13. We recommend that the District Secretary publish three hundred copies of the Minutes and send them to the pastors to be distributed among the members at ten cents per copy, which amount shall be sent to the District Treasurer.

14. We recommend that all our preachers and people shall secure a copy of our Church Manual and the Minutes of this Assembly and that they read and study the same until they are able to understand and carry out all their provisions and requirements.

15. We recommend that the Assembly year shall end the last Sunday before Campmeeting and that all business transacted between that time and the Annual Assembly shall be included in the following year's report.

16. We recommend that all ministers have their reports made out in full before the Assembly convenes.

17. We recommend that the pastor, with the other members of the Advisory Board, meet prior to each quarterly meeting, for the purpose of auditing all church books.

18. We recommend that the revision of church membership records be made prior to the annual church meeting.

19. We recommend that each church be responsible for one comforter for Campmeeting purposes and that the name of the donor be inscribed.

20. We recommend that all able-bodied men who are members of this Assembly, pay the sum of five dollars each into the Camp Treasury, and that all the members of the Assembly who assist in preparing for Camp be paid the sum of one dollar per day for their labor, providing above assessment has been paid by them. We further recommend that this assessment shall be paid by APRIL 1st.

21. We recommend that all the officers, boards, and committees necessary to conduct the work of this District, other than the District Council, be elected by the incoming District Council, and that they shall hold office until the close of the next Annual Assembly.

22. We recommend that the District Superintendent shall be an advisory member of all District boards and committees.

23. We recommend that the District Secretary and the District Treasurer keep in touch with the pastors and remind them of the plans of this Assembly and encourage and help them carry out said plans.

24. We recommend that this Assembly require the ministerial members to attend Assembly and Campmeeting and that they be present on the first day and remain until the close, and that the churches keep up the salary of their pastor while attending the same, and that if they do not attend they shall send a report of their work and an excuse for their absence, and furthermore if they fail to do so for two

consecutive years their names shall be dropped from the Assembly roll.

25. We recommend that the District Secretary notify in writing all the members of this Assembly who have failed to meet the requirements of recommendation number "twenty-four" calling their attention to such failure and the penalty for the same at least thirty days before our next Assembly.

26. We recommend and urge that all ministers who are back on their tithe send in the same to the District Treasurer at the earliest possible date, to be applied on Rev. D. C. Shearer's back salary. We further recommend that each church strive to raise their back appropriation for the District Superintendent's support.
