MINUTES OF THE THIRTEENTH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE ILLINOIS AND MISSOURI DISTRICT PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

The Thirteenth Annual Assembly of the Illinois and Missouri District Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at the Camp Ground, Charleston, Ill., August 26, 1935 with General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook presiding.

Rev. R. F. Bradley led in singing, "Higher Ground."

Brother R. A. Beltz of Dacoma, Okla., led us to the Throne of Grace in prayer.

The District Superintendent Rev. W. E. Catey then turned the meeting over to our General Supt., who spoke some words of encouragement to the Assembly and then read a Scripture lesson from Psalm 8.

It was moved and seconded that the first five rows of seats on either side of the tabernacle and also platform constitute the conference bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the hours of sittings be as follows: 8:30 to 11:30 a. m., 2:00 to 4:30 p. m., and 7:00 to 9:00 p. m. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the Dist. Supt. appoint committees. Carried.

George M. Oswald and R. F. Bradley were appointed on the Auditing Committee and Chloe Meeks, Myrtle Love and Gladys Neeley were appointed on the Resolutions Committee.

Moved and seconded that we dispense with the reading of reports and have a full report from the Dist. Statistician. After some discussion this motion was withdrawn.

Moved and seconded that we hear from the Ways and Means Committee. Carried.

A partial report was given.

Numbers 5 and 9 of Ways and Means were dropped and number 18 was divided into two articles. It was moved and seconded that number 23 be dropped but motion was lost.

Bro. Surbrook then gave a talk, pointing out some ways in which the Foreign and General Budget and other work should be supported.

Educational and Examining Board then gave a partial report recommending D. M. Horn, W. E. Hall, and J. W. Peters for License in the First Year Course of Study.

Moved and seconded that Bro. Beltz and Bro. Philpot be invited to sit within the Assembly Bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded that time be extended twenty minutes. Carried.

Committees were excused that they might proceed with their work.

The following ministers' reports were read and accepted: R. F. Bradley, Elmor Hanna, Mrs. Elmor Hanna, S. E. Lacey, E. A. and Chloe Meeks, O. A. Morgan, Pearl Roush, H. J. Kemp, and Elizabeth Medsker.

Adjourned with prayer by the Secretary.

Afternoon Sitting Aug. 26, 1935

Opened by singing, "Rock of Ages" led by Brother Bradley.

Scripture lesson read by Brother Catey from Eph. 5.

We were then led in prayer by Brother Meeks.

Roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

Educational and Examining Boards gave a partial report which was accepted.

Ways and Means Committee gave a partial report. (See report.)

Moved and seconded that the election of officers be the order of the day at the night sitting. Carried.

Statistical report was given by Sister Gladys Neeley which was accepted with a rising vote of thanks.

Brother O. A. Morgan and Brother R. F. Bradley were appointed on Reception Committee.

Sister Alma Acton was introduced to the Assembly and welcomed to a seat within the Conference Bar.

Also, Brother and Sister E. W. Wright and their daughter were introduced and welcomed within the Conference Bar.

The Ministerial Benefit Association was then presented by Brother Surbrook. Then the Burial Association was presented by Bro. Wright.

Time was extended for twenty minutes.

The following reports of ministers were read and accepted: Vernon Poe, Friend E. Glendening, Geo. A. Smith, W. C. Beard, Guy A. Slate, Charles C. Breen, Russell O. Frazee, Floyd M. Prather, Sylvan Calloway, Alice Van Horn, R. S. Wheeldon, Burtle Evans, and Dist. Supt. W. E. Catey. (See Supt's report.)

Adjourned with prayer by Bro. E. W. Wright.

Reports of Bro. S. W. Maness and Elmor Wheeldon were handed in at the close of the sitting.

Night Sitting Aug. 26, 1935

Opened by singing, "Higher Ground" led by Bro. G. R. Cleaver.

Scripture lesson was read by General Supt. Surbrook from Romans 12.

We were then led in prayer by Brother Philpot.

Roll was called and Advocates promised. Minutes were read and approved.

Election of Officers was the order of the day and a motion was made and seconded that Dist. Supt. appoint tellers. Carried.

Conference Bar was cleared and tellers were appointed, R. F. Bradley, James Cunningham, Geo. M. Oschwald, and W. E. Hall.

Assembly went to prayer quietly asking the Lord for His leadings and His thoughts.

The following officers were elected: W. E. Catey, Dist. Supt.; Geo. A. Smith, Assistant; H. J. Kemp, Secretary; Glenn Neeley, Treasurer; Elmor Hanna, E. A. Meeks and R. F. Bradley, additional members of the Council.

Trustees: W. E. Catey, H. J. Kemp, and R. F. Bradley.

Examining Board: R. F. Bradley, three years; W. E. Catey, two years; and Elmor Hanna, one year. Brother Bradley later tendered his resignation from this board which was accepted and the vacancy filled by Bro. F. A. Shull who was appointed by the Council.

Educational Board: Geo. A. Smith, three years; E. A. Meeks, two years; and W. G. Henschen, one year.

Motion was made and seconded to extend time thirty minutes. Carried.

Auditing Committee reported District Treasurer's books audited and correct.

District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

Auditing Committee reported Camp Treasurer's books correct.

Camp Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

Report of Educational and Examining Board was read and accepted.

Resolution Committee report was read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that the Secretary write a report of the Camp Meeting and Assembly, for the Advocate. Carried.

Moved and seconded that time be extended one hour in order to complete the business of the Assembly. Carried.

Moved and seconded that a ten minute recess be taken. Carried.

Stationing report was read in part after the recess.

Moved and seconded that Sister Gladys Neeley be elected District Statistician by acclamation. Carried.

Moved and seconded that she be paid the sum of \$10.00 for her services. Carried.

Moved and seconded that District Treasurer act as Camp Treasurer. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this Assembly empower the Dist. Council to finish any business that may have been overlooked. Carried.

Minutes of this last Sitting were read and approved.

Adjourned with prayer by General Supt. W. L. Surbrook.

WAYS AND MEANS AS REVISED BY THE ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF 1935

No. 1

Since the General Assembly has adopted the Budget System of administering the finances of the General Church, we strongly urge all local Church Boards to adopt the Budget System for administering the finances of their respective Local Churches.

Also that each pastor be paid a stipulated amount for his support and that at the respective annual church meetings, each church shall decide what financial support they will pay their pastor during the coming year.

No. 2

The District Budget shall be raised and disbursed in the following manner:
a. An amount equal to 15% of all funds received by each Local Church, including that received by each pastor for his services as such, and that paid to evangelists, and exclusive of all funds paid to the purchase, rental, or necessary upkeep, of all real estate or buildings for Church or parsonage use, shall be set aside by the local Church Treasurer each Monday and remitted by him to the District Treasurer on the first of each month.

(Necessary upkeep would not include money spent for furniture, furnishing, electric light bills, etc. It would include only money spent for anything actually necessary to the maintenance or preservation of the property, such as paint, roofing, together with the cost of applying same, special taxes, insurance premiums, payments on church debt etc.)

b. All money raised directly for District and General Church interests, such as Foreign Missions, special District enterprises, etc., is not subject to the 15% tax.

c. All money received by the District Treasurer in fulfillment of the requirements of paragraph a and e of this ruling, shall be divided by him as follows:

District Supt. Fund	60%
Miscellaneous Dist. Exp. Fund	25%

Dist. Ch. Ext. Fund 10%
General Assembly Exp. Fund 5%

d. The District Supt. shall be paid \$5.00 per month out of the District Expense Fund to help defray his traveling and communications expenses.

e. 15% of all Camp Meeting offerings shall be placed in the District Budget.

No. 3

Each church in this District shall raise not less than amount equal to \$2.00 per member for Foreign Missions, same to include money raised for Foreign Missions by the Sunday School, etc.

No. 4

Each Church in this District shall raise an amount equal to \$1.00 per member for the General Church Budget.

No. 5

Since the District Supt is to the District, what the pastor is to the Church, the District Supt. shall meet with each Local Church Board at the time of his visits and inquire carefully into the spiritual and financial condition of the Church and help them in the solution of their various problems.

No. 6

The District Supt. shall present the need of canned fruits, vegetable, meats, etc., for the District Camp Meeting to each Local Church, at least once during the year.

No. 7

The District Supt. is an advisory member of all District Boards and Committees.

No. 8

The District Supt. and the District Secretary shall keep in touch with the pastors reminding them of the plans of this Assembly and encouraging and helping them in carrying out said plans.

No. 9

The District Supt. shall examine the records of the Secretary and Treasurer of each Local Church at the time of his regular visits thereto and shall offer any needed suggestions as to how they may improve in the performance of their duties.

No. 10

The District Supt. shall review all of the District rules with each Local Church Board at the time of each regular visit to the respective Churches, and shall give them any needed advice in carrying them out.

No. 11

Our people shall not send money directly to any of our General Church interests but shall remit to their Local Church Treasurer who shall forward same to District Treasurer, who shall disburse same to the proper recipient.

No. 12

The District Secretary shall be paid \$10.00 for editing the Minutes, and the District Treasurer shall be paid \$10.00 per year for his services.

No. 13

The District Supt., Assistant Supt., and District Secretary shall constitute a Committee to have 200 copies of the Minutes printed, cost of same to be apportioned among the Churches on the basis of the cash paid to pastor during the Assembly Year of 1934-35.

No. 14

The District Treasurer shall furnish the District Supt., with a detailed report following the close of each quarter, showing what each church has paid toward each item in the District and General Financial program.

No. 15

Each pastor shall maintain a calling list using a card filing system which

shall be the property of each succeeding pastor and the expense of the same shall be borne by the Local Church.

No. 16

a. The Assembly Year shall end with July the 31st each year and all business transacted between that and the Annual Assembly shall be included in the following years report. Also the Assembly year shall be divided as into four quarters ending with the following dates respectively: First Quarter, Aug. 1st to Oct. 31st; Second quarter, Nov. 1st to Jan. 31st; Third quarter, Feb. 1st to April 30; Fourth quarter, May 1st to July 31st.

b. A quarterly meeting shall be held in each Church within ten days following the close of each quarter, at which time reports covering the quarter shall be copied in the Church Secretary book and the original reports sent to the District Supt.

Quarterly meetings shall be conducted by the pastor when the District Supt. does not happen to be present. All annual reports shall be copied in the Church Secretary book and mailed to the District Statistician immediately following the close of the Assembly Year July 31st.

No. 17

Each Local Church shall pay into the Camp Meeting Treasury the sum of five dollars for each delegate elected to the Annual Assembly, said payment to provide entertainment for said delegate throughout the Camp and Assembly.

No. 18

All of our preachers and layity shall secure respectively, a copy of our Church Manual and the Minutes of the Assembly, and shall read and study the same until they are able to understand and carry out all their provisions and requirements.

No. 19

Each Church shall be responsible for one comforter for Camp Meeting purposes and the name of the donor shall be inscribed.

No. 20

The regular Sunday School offerings on one Sunday per month shall be a special offering for Foreign Missions and shall be forwarded to the District Treasurer for this purpose. The particular Sunday on which this offering shall be taken shall be determined by the Sunday School Board.

No. 21

Each pastor shall keep a record of all subscribers to the Advocate in each neighborhood or city where he pastors and shall, about thirty days before each subscription expires, endeavor to secure a renewal of the same.

B. Each pastor shall endeavor to secure, in each town or community in which his regular appointments are located, a sufficient number of subscriptions to the Advocate to cause the total number of subscribers in each community to be equal in number to 50 per cent of the membership of the respective churches.

No. 22

The revision of church membership rolls shall be made prior to the respective annual Church Meetings.

No. 23

This Assembly requires its Ministerial members to attend the Assembly and Camp meeting. They shall be present on the first day and remain until the close. Each Church shall keep up the salary of its pastor during Camp Meeting. If any Minister does not attend he shall send a report of his work and an excuse for his absence. If he fails to do so for two consecutive years he shall be disciplined.

No. 24

The District Secretary shall notify in writing all of the members of this Assembly who have failed to meet the requirements of the foregoing rule

No. 23, calling their attention to such failure and the penalty for the same, at least thirty days before our next Assembly. The Church Extension work shall be left in the hands of the District Superintendent and the District Council.

No. 25

The pastor shall be responsible for the accuracy and condition of all Church Records, and of all quarterly and annual reports.

No. 26

The books of the course of study not now possessed by the examiners thereon shall be purchased by the District for their use. The books shall remain the property of the District and the examiners using same shall be responsible for their preservation and shall reimburse the District if the books are damaged or lost through their neglect.

No. 27

A. The District Treasurer shall make a monthly report sheet showing the amount of money received from each Church in the District for all District and General interests. Each District and General interest shall be listed separately and each church shall be listed in relation to the percentage of its share of the District and General financial responsibility it has paid. The name of the pastor of each Church shall be indicated and a copy of the entire report sent to each local Church secretary of the District, who shall post same in a conspicuous place in his respective Church.

B. A copy of above report sheet shall also be furnished the District Supt. each month.

No. 28

An annual report sheet of the Financial progress and faithfulness of each Church and Pastor in relation to the District and General interests shall be prepared by the District Statistician and posted within the next District Assembly Bar.

No. 29

Each pastor shall secure during the year not fewer than five new members for the Charleston Camp Meeting Association.

No. 30

Our next District Assembly, shall convene at 9:00 A. M. on the first Friday of the Annual District Camp Meeting.

No. 4

No. 5

That Herbert Mitchell be dropped from the Assembly Roll inasmuch as he transferred to the Ark. and La. District.

No. 6

That the name of Sarah F. Willis be dropped from The Assembly Roll inasmuch as she is deceased.

No. 7

That Grant Starwalt, Raymond Seago and Grace Seago be dropped from the Assembly Roll inasmuch as they have united with another denomination.

No. 8

We recommend that Walter Nelson be dropped from the Assembly Roll.

No. 9

We recommend that the following local preachers, J. W. Peters from the Lawrenceville, Ill., Church, Ellis Maness from the St. Louis, Mo., Church, Wm. E. Hall of the Charleston, Ill., Church, and Dwight M. Horn of the Garden Grove Iowa Church, be received into this Assembly and that they be placed in the Class of the First Year.

No. 10

That Geo. B. Knight, a local preacher from the Springfield, Mo., Church, be received into this Assembly, and that he be placed in the Class of the First Year, provided that he meets with the approval of the District Supt. after receiving the same examination required of all those desiring admission.

No. 11

That Guy A. Slate, an ordained Minister be received by transferr from the Kansas District.

No. 12

That Floyd Prather, a Licensed Minister having been duly examined by the District Boards, be received into this Assembly, and that he be placed in the Class of the third year, provided he files his transfer from the Kansas District, with the Secretary of this District.

No. 13
