**OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS**

The second annual conference of the Louisiana District convened at 9:30 A. M., July 10, 1950, at Simms, Louisiana.

Prayer was offered by the Rev. Lee Hollingsworth, after which the Rev. J. C. Williams, district superintendent, introduced the Rev. R. A. Beltz, secretary of church extension. Brother Beltz brought us a vitalizing message on evangelism.

We then entered into the conference with Bro. Beltz in the chair. The first three rows across the tent were set as the conference bar. The roll call was given. Rev. Lloyd Montgomery, the camp evangelist, was introduced to the conference and was tendered an honorary seat within the conference bar. Bro. Montgomery gave us a clear ringing testimony that savored of the richness that comes only from those who are living in close communion with the Lord. Brother B. F. Garlington, Rev. L. F. Knight, Rev. and Mrs. James Crews, Rev. R. E. Ross, and Rev. Granville Carrol were received into the conference bar.

The report of the district superintendent was read and accepted. The district Sunday School secretary gave an oral report of the work of the Sunday Schools of the district. It was accepted. In the absence

of Sister Rathbun who was the young people's president, Bro. Rathbun was asked to give an oral report for her. The report was accepted. We were recessed until 1:30 P. M. for lunch and to give the various committees an opportunity to meet.

The second sitting met at 1:30 P. M. as ordered. The first in order was the reception of the new ministers into the district. The following ministers were received into the district: ordained ministers, Rev. L. F. Knight, 512 Maggie St., Leesville, La., and Rev. R. E. Ross, DeRidder, La.; licensed minister, second year, Rev. James D. Crews, 2244 Cable St., Baton Rouge, La.

The statistician's report was read and accepted.

The report of the Lake Charles Missionary Society was read, commended and accepted.

The report of the ways and means committee was read and accepted.

Since Bro. Beltz was having to leave before the conference was over it was decided to deviate from our regular course, and elect the two advisory council members, also our other member of the board of trustees. Rev. George W. Carr and Rev. S. P. Creech were elected council members. Rev. Lee Rathbun was elected on the board of trustees, for a term of three years.

The report of the resolutions committee was read and accepted.

Motion was made to turn any unfinished business over to the council to complete. Carried. Adjourned.

## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

I shall choose for a scripture a passage from Zechariah 4: 8-10. "Moreover the word of the Lord came unto me, saying, "The hands of Zerubbabel have laid the foundation of this house; his hands shall also finish it; and thou shalt know that the Lord of hosts hath sent me unto you. For who hath despised the day of small things? For they shall rejoice, and shall see the plummet in the hand of Zerubbabel with those seven; they are the eyes of the Lord, which run to and fro through the whole earth.'"

Our church as a whole is not considered a large denomination, yet God has seen fit to bless the work; and from enterprises like is being started in this district, the organization has grown to its present size.

Definitely we feel that we are a part of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and though we may be that small part, we must not despise the day of the beginning. I notice that one of the great handicaps of the work of God in general is to start a project (whether local or district), then to quit before it is finished. God told Zerubbabel to lay the foundation, also to finish it. I trust that our preachers will feel the weight more and more and see the need not only of laying the foundation but also of finishing the job.

We should set a goal for this conference year, and then bend every effort to attain the same. To do this we will have to work together as one. Shall we set the goal for 400 new members? A goal of 500 Sunday school students?

We should not despise the achievements of this past year. Two new churches have been organized, another one started. Our records will reveal the reason for the membership standing about the same, despite the fact that we have two new churches. Our church in Pineville has suffered some loss. The books have been cleared of some folk who have been carried who have moved away, and of others who left the church for different reasons. Simms and other churches have suffered losses through members moving to different locations. We have had an increase in membership of over fifty. Although we lost some, yet we have been able to come out in good shape. Our records will show a decided gain in Sunday school attendance, also a gain in finances. Our equity has increased around \$30,000.00

God is sending to Louisiana some fine consecrated workers. Bro. and Sr. L. F. Knight came from Ohio. They are now in Leesville, and God has helped them to acquire a good piece of property, also a few good people to help them in the battle. We predict a good future for the church in Leesville under the leadership of the Knights. Bro. and Sr. James D. Crews (Sr. Crews, formerly Peggy Wysong), from North Carolina and Ohio, respectively, have proved a blessing to us in Louisiana. They plan to take a church soon. Bro. R. E. Ross and wife have come back to us and have been doing a good job at Simms, and have helped promote the camp meeting this year.

Bro. S. P. Creech and wife and loyal people have done a marvelous piece of work for the Master and the church in Shreveport. Bro. Creech and wife have a vision and are good builders. They have finished their Sunday school rooms, and have placed plumbing in the church, also have finished off the front. They have done a good job while at Shreveport. They feel like moving on now. Let us pray that God will help them in their new field of labor.

Bro. George Carr and wife and loyal band at Pineville have done credit to the cause of God. Under great handicaps, the church went to work, and under Bro. Carr's efficient leadership they have gone forward. They have made great strides in paying off the church debt; they have had some good meetings and many souls have been saved. Their radio programs have proved a great blessing. The loss in membership came before Bro. Carr went to Pineville. They have taken in a number of new members.

Rev. R. A. Beltz, secretary of church extension, dedicated the new church at Oakdale. God was there. Bro. Beltz brought a stirring message, and a good offering was taken. Bro. and Sr. Rathbun have worked untiringly in Oakdale and God has rewarded them with a fine church. They now have a parsonage. We thank the Lord for the work in Oakdale.

Rev. R. A. Beltz dedicated the new church in Lake Charles this February. God helped Bro. Beltz, and a good offering was taken. The work in Lake Charles is being blessed by God. We have some of the finest folk in the town coming to our church. The lay members are largely responsible for the progress of the church; they have worked at the job and have given of their means unstintingly to God's cause. There is a forward move on now in the church.

Rev. and Mrs. A. T. Adams, after pastoring the church at Simms almost two years, felt led to take a church in Pennsylvania. God blessed their efforts while at Simms, and many friends were made and many souls were won to Christ. Bro. R. E. Ross filled out the year at

Simms. While Bro. Ross was there, the Sunday School rooms were started, and arrangements to have the camp at Simms were made. These two moves were the high lights at the Simms church this year. The camp meeting has become a settled fact at Simms; the church seems to be behind this move. Rev. S. P. Creech, former pastor of the Shreveport church, was called for this year. Let us pray for the work there.

Baton Rouge, under the direction of Rev. and Mrs. J. C. Chevealier, have had some good meetings, and have improved the property—Sunday School rooms have been added, and a new fan has been installed. These improvements will mean a lot to the future of the church.

The McCords in Bogalusa have held their own. We need a tonic for this place—a mighty outpouring of the Holy Ghost.

We have labored on building programs this year around one thousand hours; participated in two solicitation programs, helping to promote and to raise several thousand dollars for the work in Louisiana; travelled in the interest of the district 40,000 miles; visited the churches twenty times; made 850 calls; preached 120 times; held five short revivals, had around ninety seekers; attended and helped in two youth rallies; presided at ten board meetings, also five council meetings; attended a meeting of superintendents held at Indianapolis, Indiana; attended the General Conference held at Frankfort, Indiana; and worked on the camp ground at Simms one week.

#### REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers pay their ministerial tithes into the District Treasury.
2. We recommend that all birthday offerings be paid to the District Treasurer to be applied on District Home Missions.
3. We recommend that each church pay five per cent of all regular tithes and offerings to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Budget.
4. We recommend that the District Superintendent's traveling expenses, while traveling in the interest of the district, be paid at the rate of five cents per mile, also that the district correspondence and communications be paid by the District Treasurer.
5. We recommend that on each visit by the District Superintendent each church take an offering to be applied on traveling expenses.
6. We recommend that all monies be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the tenth of each month.
7. We recommend that each church pay the equivalent of \$1.00 per member per year to be applied on General Conference expense, the last payment to be paid not later than May 1, 1954.
8. We recommend that there be a camp meeting registration fee of one dollar per person above the age of twelve years of age, to be applied on the expense of the camp.

9. We recommend that a camp meeting committee be appointed by the District Superintendent and that said committee visit each church in the district once each year and raise an offering from each church to be used to promote the camp, said money to be sent to the District Treasurer until called for by the camp committee.
10. We recommend that five per cent of the District Budget be paid to our Zone Bible School.
11. We recommend that for each examination in the study course a fee of twenty-five cents be paid to cover the expense of the questions and postage.
12. We recommend that the District continue in operation the Pilgrim Pension plan: that each church pay into the District Treasury monthly the sum of four per cent of their pastor's salary to be forwarded to the Board of Pensions. Be it further resolved that the four per cent of evangelists' salaries be paid from the District Treasury providing they are paying their tithes into the District.
13. We recommend that when the council has passed upon a time and place to begin a new church, that a fee of \$1.00 be assessed each voting age member of the district to be applied on the property.
14. We recommend that the district pay our district superintendent \$50.00 per month over and above his house rent; also that we give him the privilege of holding two revivals as he may see fit and to retain the offering received from the same.

#### RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that the quarterly reports be mailed to the District Superintendent, and that the yearly reports be made in duplicate, one copy to be mailed immediately to the District Statistician and the other to be brought by the delegate to the conference.
2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his or her report to the District Statistician not later than ten days after the conference year closes, which is May 31, and that the Statistician disregard any and all reports received thereafter. Be it also resolved that the District Treasurer's books close at noon, June 10.
3. Resolved that the District Treasurer send to the editor of the district bulletin a monthly financial report of all monies that each church has sent in to the district.
4. Resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first prayer meeting of each month.
5. Resolved that minister's license shall not be granted to anyone who does not tithe to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.
6. Resolved that the churches pay their pastors while attending camp and conference the same as if they were on their charge.
7. Resolved that there be an offering taken in the local church to defray the pastor's expense to and from camp, this offering to be taken by the District Superintendent at his annual meeting with the local church.



8. Resolved that all register who come to camp.
9. Resolved that every person attending the camp bring his own bed linens.
10. Resolved that since our conference is not large it be conducted on Tuesday and Wednesday after the first Sunday of the camp.
11. Resolved that each pastor be given a vacation of two weeks each year with pay.
12. Resolved that the conference show our appreciation to our District Superintendent by a rising vote of thanks and a "God bless you."
13. Resolved that we, the Louisiana district, are heartily in favor with the evangelistic program that the general church made in regard to personal evangelism.
14. Resolved that we as a conference show our Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. A. Beltz, that we appreciate his presence with us, and that we pledge our utmost loyalty to him by a rising vote of thanks and a "God bless you."
15. Resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to Rev. Lloyd Montgomery, our camp evangelist, for his timely, powerful messages, and so manifest by a rising vote of thanks.
16. Resolved that we, the conference and camp, express our appreciation for the faithful service of the cooks, and for the good donations of our neighbors and friends, and that we express the same by a rising vote of thanks.
17. Resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to our District Secretary, District Treasurer, Statistician, District Sunday School Secretary, and District Young People's President by a rising vote of thanks.
