JOURNAL OF PROCEEDING

Through the tender mercies of God and His providential care, the Fith Annual Conference of the Louisiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church was assembled and was called to order by our Dist-

riect Superintendent, Rev. J. E. Ablu, at 10:00 A. M. July 7, 1953, on the District Grounds at Simms, La.

After prayer and an inspiring song service, Brother J. E. Ablu presented to the Conference our beloved General Secretary of Church Extension, Rex. R. A. Beltz, who brought us a message from the 9th Chapter of I Corinthians; using as his text, "That I Might by All Means Save Some."

First he stressed the retrospective look, and then took up the forward look. He emphasized the need of a definite program, which is by interpretation, A set of plans. Many plans or Programs fail because the people fail to follow out the plan. The plan should be of a three-fold nature; first to glorify God, Secondly to win souls; and thirdly, to build up or strengthen the brethren.

The new church in Alexandria was presented to the conference by Brother Ablu with a membership of nine. It was accepted by the Conference by a hearty Amen.

The conference bar was established; after which our Camp Evangelist, the Reverend K. C. Vance of Jackson, Ohio, along with The Reverend Edwin Reiff, and the Reverend Granville Carroll, were all introduced to the assembly. After each had given his testimony, all were given a seat within the assembly bar as honorary members.

The District Superintendent read his report, and it was accepted.

The Auditing Committee reported the books as correct and they were accepted.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The District Young People's president gave his report orally. It was requested that he put in writing; and the request was accepted.

The Woman's Missionary Society report was read by Rev. Ablu, and was accepted.

The Educational and Examining Board's report was read and accepted.

Ways and Means Committee report was read and tabled for a little clarification.

We were adjourned for lunch.

The second sitting of the conference was called at 2:30 p. m. July 7, 1953. The service was opened by singing, "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes." After prayer Sr. King of Baton Rouge, Louisiana was seated within the assembly bar.

The statistical report was read and was accepted with certain corrections to be made by the statistician and the District Superintendent.

The District Sunday School report was read and accepted.

The Ways and Means report after having been tabled for a little clarification was read and accepted.

The Resolution Committee gave a partial report; it was accepted as a partial report.

The conference was informed that, Brother Ab'ia was re-appointed District Superintendent by the General Board. That Brother Rathbun was re-appointed as District Secretary by the General Board. Brother Jack Polson was appointed as District Treasurer by the General Board. Brother J. C. Cheveallier was elected advisory councilman. Brother George Carr was elected as the other advisory councilman.

We were adjourned.

The third and final sitting of the conference was opened at 10:00 a. m., July 8, 1953, by singing, "What a Friend We Have In Jesus," after which Brother Julius Hooter lead in prayer. Brother Beltz again addressed the conference. The theme of his address was the two fold obligation. First he stressed the minister's obligation to the church in which he stressed the pastor's duties to the church. Secondly he stressed the duties of the church to the pastor.

Brother Jack Polson was re-elected on the educational examining board. Brother S. P. Creech was elected to the other vacant place on the educational board.

Brother Creech was elected ministerial delegate to General Conference.

Sister Mabel Rathbun was elected as alternate delegate to General Conference.

Brother Julius Hooter was elected lay-delegate to General Conference.

Brother B. F. Garlington was elected as alternate delegate to General Conference.

While the District Council were excused for a few minutes to attend to some business, Brother S. P. Creech and Brother Humphrey sang a beautiful duet to the delight of the Conference.

The final report of the Resolutions Committee was read and accepted.

Conference was closed with prayer.

To Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary of Church Extension, to our Faithful pastors, to the loyal members and friends of the fifth Annual Conference of the Louisiana District, greetings in the name of Him who loved us and gave all for us.

We are closing another year made difficult by many unforeseen problems, but in the midst of them all God has been on hand to give the victory. The door of opportunity is open wide for the Pilgrim Holiness Church with her message of freedom from sin. Our heart burns with consuming passion to reach the lost of our district and the world with our gospel, which is, indeed, "The power of God unto Salvation." God is depending on us to enter this open door and we must not fail Him.

I would like first of all to report that Christ has been given the preeminence in my life, that the blood covers, that I have never had

a keener sense of His presence than I feel right now.

This has been a year of activity. While we may not report the progress that we would like to have seen this year yet we must not disqualify the fact that God has helped us hitherto. Our pastors have been loyal, sacrificing laborers of love. The Oakdale Church, under the leadership of Brother and Sister Rathbun have added two class rooms, and new seats, in their church. The Shreveport Church has had a good year despite the fact they were without a regular pastor for 16 weeks. Brother and Sister Cheveallier have been leading these people for the past several months and God has been blessing their efforts. They are planning now to build or buy a new parsonage, which is sorely needed.

The church at Pineville, with Bro. and Sister Carr, has started a building Fund and now have approximately \$1,200.00 toward a new church. The men of the church at this time are in the process of building a dwelling house, which is to be sold, and the proceeds are to go into the building fund. We predict the Pineville Church will have a good year. The McDonalds and the Bogalousa church has purchased new furniture for the parsonage. Brother and Sister Polson have had a good year at Simms. Their report will show considerable improvement to the property of the church as well as the fact they have lead the district in Sunday School Attendance. Our people at Simms are faithful, not only to their local needs, but have been consistent in their giving to District needs.

Now a report of my personal activities. I have preached 128 times, have conducted 6 revivals and assisted in another. I have had approximately 70 people bow at the altar for pardon or purity. I have traveled over 11,000 miles for the District. I have held business meetings in each of our churches except one. I have visited every church in the district at least twice, and filled the pulpit in Shreveport 16 weeks. I have received 17 people into membership. I attended the Annual District Superintendents' Conference in Indianapolis. I have organized one new church in Alexadria, La., and plans have been completed for the erection of a new church there. We have purchased a lot and Lord willing, we expect to begin building immediately after this camp and conference.

Our greatest need is for more men of the same sacrificing, loyal spirit of the men we now have. With your co-operation, prayers, and love, and with God's help we plan now to make this year the best the Louisiana District has ever known.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend the all ordained and licensed ministers pay their ministerial tithe into the District Treasury, through their local church treasury.

2. We recommend that all birthday offerings be paid to the District treasurer to be applied on the District Home Missions.
3. We recommend that each church be assessed a fee of five dollars and fifty cents per member of voting to be applied on the district budget. This sum to be paid on monthly installments. New churches to be assessed in the same manner as prescribed in the manual page 98, Section 138, Paragraph 11.
4. We recommend that the District Superintendent's traveling expenses while traveling in the interest of the District be paid at the rate of five cents a mile and also that the District Correspondence and communications be paid by the District Treasurer.
5. We recommend that on each visit by the District Superintendent each church take an offering on the Superintendent's expenses, but send the money to the District Treasurer.
6. We recommend that all monies be sent to the District Treasurer no later than the tenth of each month.
7. We recommend that all monies from the local churches destined to the General Treasurer be sent to the District Treasurer.
8. We recommend that each church pay the equivalent of \$1.00 per member of voting age, per year to be applied on the General Conference expense; the last payment to be made not later than May 1, 1954.
9. We recommend that there be a camp meeting registration fee of \$1.00 per person above the age of twelve years old, to be applied on the expenses of the camp.
10. We recommend that the District continue in operation the Pilgrim Pension Plan; that each church pay into the District Treasury monthly the sum of four per cent of its pastor's salary to be forwarded to the Board of Pensions. Be it further resolved that four per cent of the evangelist's salaries be paid from the District Treasurer's funds provided the evangelists are paying their tithes into the District.
11. We recommend that a camp meeting committee be elected by the council at conference and that said committee be in full charge of necessary arrangements of camp said committee visit each church in the District once each year and raise an offering from each church to be used to promote the camp; said money to be sent to the District Treasurer to hold until called for by the camp committee.
12. We recommend that five per cent of the District Budget be paid to our Zone Bible School.
13. We recommend that when the council has passed on a time and place to begin a new church, a fee of \$1.00 be assessed each voting age member of the district to be applied on the property.
14. We recommend that the District Pay our District Superintendent a salary of \$75.00 monthly.
15. We recommend that all who have books of the study course for licensed ministers or deaconess, send a list of the same to the District Secretary, and that the District purchase the remaining

needed books to complete the courses, that these books be placed with the District Secretary to be lent to any one taking the courses, but who do not have the means to purchase same; and the care of the books or loss of same be chargeable to the borrower as well as the mailing charges both ways.

1. Resolved that the quarterly reports be mailed to the District Superintendent and that the yearly reports be made in duplicate; one copy be mailed immediately to the District Statistician and the other to be brought by the delegate to the conference.

2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his or her report to the District Statistician not later than ten days after the conference year closes, which is May 31. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer's books close at noon, June 10.

3. Resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first prayer meeting night of each month.

4. Resolved that the ministers' license shall not be granted to anyone who does not tithe to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

5. Resolved that the churches pay their pastors while they are

attending camp and conference the same as if they were on their charge.

6. Resolved that there be an offering taken in the local church to defray the pastor's expense to and from camp; this offering to be taken by the District Superintendent at his annual meeting with the local church.

7. Resolved that the camp meeting begin on the first Wednesday night in July and continue through the Friday night of the following week.

8. Resolved that all register who come to camp.

9. Resolved that every person attending the camp bring his own bed linens.

10. Resolved that since our conference is not large, it be conducted on Tuesday and Wednesday after the first Sunday of camp

11. Resolved that each pastor be given a vacation of two weeks each year with pay.

12. Resolved that all ministers pursuing the course of study take the examination through the Pilgrim College at Kernersville, North Carolina.

13. Resolved that the conference show our appreciation to our District Superintendent by a rising vote of thanks, and a God Bless you.

14. Resolved that we, the Louisiana District, are heartily in favor with the evangelical program that the General Church made in regards to personal evangelism.

15. Resolved that we, as a conference, show our Secretary of Church Extension Rev. R. A. Beltz, that we appreciate his presence with us and that we pledge our utmost loyalty to him by a rising vote of thanks and a God Bless you.

16. Resolved that by a standing vote, this conference expresses its appreciation to Rev. K. C. Vance, our camp evangelist, and to our song leader, Julius Hooter. Also Sr. Abl, and Sr. Cheveallier for the Children's Work.

17. Resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to our district Secretary, District Treasurer, Statistician, District Sunday School Secretary, Cook, and District Young People's president by a rising vote of thanks.

18. Resolved that during camp, that the lights be turned out at eleven p. m. and all staying on the grounds should be in bed at that time.

We zoned our district into two zones and appointed our zone leaders.
