REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the members of the 9th annual conference of the Louisiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, to Reverend R. C. Hawkins our chairman and General Secretary of Church Extension, to our laymen and friends, greetings through Him who loved us and gave Himself for us.

Another year of ministry and service to Christ and our church has flown by and only eternity will reveal the true fruitage of our efforts. I was deeply humbled when asked by Brother Hawkins to fill the vacancy of this office which was brought about by the resignation of your former Superintendent. After earnest prayer and waiting upon God I felt it was His will for us to come to Louisiana. The reception that my family and I have received by the wonderful people of this district has made us feel welcome and that we are among friends with whom we can live and labor.

In the six months that I have served you I have endeavored to get acquainted with you and to get an over-all picture of our churches. It is true we are few in number and our material resources are limited but it is equally true that our God is mighty and He will lead us on to victory and success.

GENERAL:

ALEXANDRIA--has had a good year under the leadership of Brother and Sister Taylor. They have added a lovely bedroom to the parsonage and have showed a gain in both Church membership and Sunday School attendance.

BASTROP--The Polsons have installed new pews in their Church and have decorated the auditorium.

BATON ROUGE--has showed a gain in every department this past year. Brother and Sister Titus Creech have made a number of improvements on the Church property.

BOGALUSA--has called Brother and Sister Murray as their pastors for this coming year. I feel this fine consecrated couple will be a blessing to our work there.

OAKDALE--has spent over \$ 400.00 on Church improvements. The parsonage and Church have been painted on the outside. Reverend Robert Durham has been called as their new pastor.

PINEVILLE--shows a gain in membership and Sunday School attendance. Brother Durham has built a combination study and bedroom in the basement of the Church which is a fine asset.

SIMMS--The Sherwoods have had another good year and show a gain in Sunday School. The Church has been redecorated on the inside and it is very attractive. The parsonage has been remodeled on the outside with asphalt shingles of stone design.

SHREVEPORT--Brother and Sister Creech have done a wonderful work here and have showed gains in both membership and Sunday School attendance for the year. The parsonage has been painted on the outside and some furniture has been added.

WEST MONROE--has experienced a crisis which brought about losses in membership and attendance but the Lord has given us a real family of Pilgrims in the persons of Brother and Sister Raymond Kensell to take over our work there. I believe the work will become established under their ministry.

COLUMBIA, MISS.--Here I had the honor of organizing the first Pilgrim Holiness Church in the state of Mississippi with 9 charter members. God has used Reverend and Mrs. Pat LaFon in a marvelous way in this city where we were unknown and nearly unheard of. They have built for us an influence among the people there which I pray will spread over the state of Mississippi in years ahead and give us another Church Extension District.

They have purchased a lot 178 x 310 and have erected a 32 x 72 wood framed building with three classrooms, a combination nursery and classroom, and restrooms. The auditorium is 32 x 45 feet and has a tile floor and indirect lighting. The Church is nearing completion on the inside and is to be finished with a brick veneer on the outside.

PERSONAL:

I have visited each Church at least twice and some of them more than twice. I have travelled over 8,000 miles in the interest of the District. I have held three revivals, two weekend meetings, and attended the Superintendent's Conference in Indianapolis in January.

In conclusion I would like to express my appreciation to the ministers and laymen of the district for the kindness and support that has extended to us in the short time we have known you. Also to the Department of Church Extension for it's contribution to our state. We are all indebted to Reverend R. C. Hawkins for his capable leadership and for everything he has done for us. But most of all we are indebted to God for His mercy, love and providence toward us.

My heart and spirit is in the work here and I purpose to give not only my time and what little talent I have, but to put my life into the strengthening of our Churches which we now have as well as starting new ones. To be successful we must be united in spirit and purpose and the Lork will give us the desires of our heart. Let us work together to make this a great year in the Louisiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The first sitting of the Ninth Annual Conference of the Louisiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:30 A. M., June 24, 1957.

The Conference was opened by singing "When I See the Blood" led by Rev. Raymond Kensell. Rev. B. F. Durham then led in prayer after which Rev. Arnold Peck introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension, who presided over the Conference.

Rev. Hawkins read the Scripture lesson, using the 121 and 123 Psalms. He then directed a few brief remarks to the Conference stressing our utter dependance upon God.

The first order of business was the calling of the roll by the Secretary.

It was moved and carried that Mrs. Catherine Rodriguez be seated as delegate from the Oakdale Church.

It was moved and carried that Mrs. Raymond Kensell be seated as delegate from the West Monroe Church.

The first ten rows of seats in the center section of the tabernacle was designated as the Conference bar.

The Chariman called for the establishment of time for the sittings. It was moved and carried that the time remain the same as it was last year (morning session to end at 11:45 A. M. and the afternoon session begin at 1:00 P. M. and remain in session until the business be completed.)

The District Superintendent read his report which was accepted with a hearty "Amen" from the Conference.

The Auditing committee read it's report which was accepted.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

Rev. Raymond Kensell, our new pastor of the West Monroe Church, was received into the Conference.

It was moved and carried to receive the newly Organized Columbia, Miss. Church into the Conference.

Mr. Julius Hooter, District Statistician, read his report, it was accepted.

A combined report from the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary and Youth Leader was read and accepted.

The Missionary Society's report was read and accepted with words of appreciation.

The Educational and Examining Board read it's report. It was accepted.

The Resolutions Committee began it's report.

The morning sitting adjourned by expiration of time.

#### SECOND SESSION OF THE CONFERENCE:

The second session of the Conference was opened by Mr. Julius Hooter leading the Conference in singing "Sunshine In My Soul". Prayer by Rev. Peck.

The Chairman called for the reading of the minutes of the morning session, which were read and approved.

The Reception Committee presented the following to the Conference: Rev. Robert Durham and family, Mr. Huey Hooter, Mr. Parvin Taylor, Rev. and Mrs. William Murray, Rev. and Mrs. Raymond Kensell, and Mrs. R. C. Hawkins and son Dick. After a glowing testimony of God's Saving Grace from each they were granted seat in the Conference bar.

The Resolutions Committee continued it's report. With certain corrections and rejections it was accepted.

The Ways and Means Committee read it's report which was accepted.

The next order of business being the election of officers, Rev. R. C. Hawkins read the names of those appointed by the General Board. These and other officers elected appear on the page with the official directory.

The Committee appointments were read by Bro. Peck.

The Committee on Memorials reported the passing of one our Licensed Ministers, Rev. Jesse Carter. The Chairman asked that the Conference stand for a moment of silent prayer, which was followed by prayer by Bro. Hawkins.

After a few words of encouragement by the Chairman the Conference adjourned in prayer.

COMMITTEE REPORTS  
RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Resolved that three copies of all reports be made; the monthly reports to be mailed; one to the General Secretary of Church Extension, and one to the District Superintendent, and the annual reports be sent immediately at the close of the year to the District Statistician and District Superintendent. The third copies of the reports to be retained for local files.

2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his report to the District Statistician not later than 10 days after the Conference year closes.

3. Resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first Sunday of each month and that the church board appoint someone to take care of this matter.

4. Resolved that the minister's license shall not be granted to anyone who does not tithe to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

5. Resolved that all register who come to camp.

6. Resolved that every person attending the camp bring his own bed linens.

7. Resolved that each pastor be given a vacation of two weeks each year with pay.

8. Resolved that all ministers pursuing the course of study, take the examination through the Pilgrim College at Kernersville, North Carolina.

9. In as much as there is to be two elected advisory members to the District Council; be it resolved that one be a lay member.

10. Resolved if funds are available that the District send the District Youth Leader and the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary to the workers Conference each year.

11. Resolved that the District Youth Leader and Sunday School Promotional Secretary tour the District once a year in the interest of their respective fields in the company of the District Superintendent.

12. Resolved that the District be divided into zones and that each zone have a leader appointed by the Council. Purpose to provide opportunity for fellowship and Youth Rallys for our young people. Further that a meeting be held in each zone at least twice a year.

13. Be it resolved that the thirteenth resolution read as follow: Resolve that the Conference show our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. and Mrs. Arnold Peck; our Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins; our camp evangelists, Rev. and Mrs. L. A. Williams; and to our musicians, Rev. and Mrs. Bryan Taylor. Be it further resolved that we as a Conference show our appreciation to the District Officials by a rising vote of thanks and with an AMEN.

14. Be it resolved that this Conference go on record to support the Living Endowment Association of Southern Pilgrim College of Kearnerville, N. C. and each Church send in as many shares of \$5.00 per share as possible.

#### WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers pay their ministerial tith into the District Treasury through their local church treasury.
2. We recommend that all birthday offerings be paid to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Home Missions.
3. We recommend that offerings taken on the Superintendents expense when he is present at a Church be applied on the local Church District Budget.
4. We recommend that each Church pay budget on monthly bases. Set up on 11 months. The conference month be excluded from budget. In this case month of June. Alexandria \$16.00, Bastrop \$4.00, Baton Rouge \$4.00, Bogalusa \$6.00, West Monroe \$6.00, Oakdale \$8.00, Pineville \$16.00, Shreveport \$12.00, Simms \$13.00 and Columbia \$4.00.
5. We recommend that all monies from the local Churches destined to the General Treasurer be sent to the District Treasurer.
6. We recommend that all monies be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the tenth of each month.
7. We recommend that each pastor upon return to his local Church put forth a special effort to raise the equivalent to \$1.00 per member, per year for 4 years. This is to be used to send delegates to General Conference.
8. We recommend that there be a camp meeting registration fee of \$1.00 per person above the age of six years old, to be applied to the expense of the camp.

9. We recommend that five per cent of the District Budget be paid to our zone Bible School.

10. We recommend that the District raise it's portion of the District Superintendent's salary \$90.00 a month. We further recommend that we pay five cents per mile travel expense, also that we pay his postage, stationary, and telephone expense as used in connection with his duties in District work, and also pay all utilities.

11. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$3.00 per month for his service. Further we recommend that each member of the District Council be paid at the rate of five cents per mile when call to District Council meetings. Further we recommend that the District Treasurer and Secretary be supplied their stationary and postage for District work.

12. We recommend that all who have books of the study course for Licensed Ministers or Deaconess, send a list of the same to the District Secretary and that the District purchase the remaining needed books to complete the courses, that these books be placed with the District Secretary to be lent to anyone taking the courses, but who do not have the means to purchase same, and the care of the books or loss of the same be chargeable to the borrower as well as the mailing charge both way.

13. We recommend that there be a offering taken in the local Church to defray the pastor's expenses to and from camp; this offering to be taken by the District Superintendent at his annual meeting with the local Church.

14. We recommend that the Churches pay their pastors while they are attending camp and Conference that same as if they were on their charge.

15. We recommend that all persons registered , and taking their meals in the camp dining room be charged the following rates for their meals; Breakfast 25¢, Dinner 30¢, and Supper 30¢. And that meal tickets shall be sold during the camp at the above rates.

Rev. Jesse A. Carter; a minister and singer in the Pilgrim Holiness Church, in the Ala. and La. districts. He was born in Ohio in 1902 and departed this life in 1957. He was faithful and spiritual, and will be missed by his fellow Pilgrims.
