MINUTES OF ASSEMBLY

NEW YORK DISTRICT

The seventh Annual Assembly of the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church was held at Schenectady, N. Y., April 17 to 22, 1928. District Superintendent A. H. Wilson, presiding. General Superintendent W. R. Cox arrived during the first session and took up the duties of the presiding officer.

First session called to order at 9 A. M., April 17th.

Voted that all reports having errors shall be returned to delegates for correction.

Voted that report of Belden Sunday Schcol appear in the Assembly minutes.

Voted that report of Young People's Society of the Binghamton church be read but excluded from minutes.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

APRIL 17, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises. Rev. W. R. Cox presiding.

Roll call of delegates and workers. Minutes of last session, read, corrected and approved.

Several resolutions were presented which were returned to the Resolution Committee for redrafting or to be presented at a later session.

Reading and passing on reports.

Moved and carried that the Pastor, Delegate and District Superintendent decide on a name for the new church in Onondaga county.

Voted that an adding machine be secured for the use of the Statistical Committee.

Adjourned to 9 A. M. Wednesday.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 18, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises. W. R. Cox presiding.

Voted to dispense with roll call.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Rev. S. T. Gunter of the Free Methodist church of Utica was introduced and voted seat in conference.

Reading and passing on reports of preachers and workers.

Rev. Floyd Baker and wife of Otego were introduced and voted seat in conference.

Moved and carried that song evangelists report all meetings in which they are engaged as regular workers.

Moved and carried that we proceed to the election of officers at the Thursday morning session.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 18, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises. W. R. Cox presiding.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Upon recommendation of the District Council the District Assembly received into membership the Rev. Floyd Baker of Otego, N. Y.

Moved and carried that the Pastor of the Binghamton church be granted the privilege of changing his church report regarding membership.

Moved and carried that each church holding young people's meetings shall report the same to the District Assembly.

Report of the Treasurer of the Binghamton Camp read and accepted.

Resolution regarding a financial plan to support the District Superintendent devoting his entire time to work of the District returned to the Resolution Committee for redrafting.

Moved and carried that the election of officers be deferred until the above resolution shall have been voted upon by the Assembly.

Resolution regarding young people's societies being found in each church was presented by Resolution Committee.

Voted to amend the resolution by inserting the words "when possible."

Adjourned to 9 A. M.

THURSDAY, APRIL 19, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises. W. R. Cox presiding.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

The following resolution was presented by Resolution Committee:

Resolved, That the District Superintendent shall not serve a pastorate.

Amended as follows: The District Superintendent shall not serve a pastorate but shall devote his entire time to the District work as District Superintendent.

After a lengthy discussion the resolution was lost.

The Assembly proceeded to the election of officers:

The following officers were elected: District Superintendent, Rev. A. H. Wilson; Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. A. E. Blann; District Secretary, Rev. Alvin Young; District Treasurer, Rev. W. J. C. Vanoss; Advisory Members of District Council, Rev. H. J. Felter, Rev. G. J. Becker and Rev. Floyd Baker; Member of Board of Trustees for three years, Rev. S. N. Bennett; Member of Board of Examiners for three years, Rev. A. H. Wilson.

On motion it was voted to suspend the rules and proceed to the reading of reports.

The report of the District Treasurer read and accepted.

The report of the Home Missionary Secretary-Treasurer read and accepted.

The report of the Foreign Missionary Sec.-Treasurer read and accepted.

The report of the Orphanage Representative read and accepted.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

THURSDAY, APRIL 19, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises. W. R. Cox presiding.

Mrs. A. E. Blann and Mrs. Alvin Young, of Northville; Mrs. Daniel Backer and Miss Florence Fairbanks, of Syracuse, were introduced to the Assembly.

As the election of officers was not completed it was resumed at this time.

Voted to suspend the rules and the Secretary cast one ballot for the re-election of the present Foreign Missionary Board. The Foreign Missionary Board re-elected as follows: Rev. A. E. Blann, Augusta Engwer and Verna Hamlin.

Several resolutions were presented by the Resolution Committee and passed upon by the Assembly.

Adjourned to 9 A. M.

FRIDAY, APRIL 20, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises. W. R. Cox presiding.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

The personal reports of Rev. Delbert Frasier and Lena M. Roy were read and accepted.

The report of the Missionary work in Alaska read and accepted.

The Auditors' report was read and accepted.

The name of Leon Wilson was presented with recommendation from the Examining Board for license to preach. The recommendation was favorably passed upon.

The personal report of Leon Wilson was read and accepted.

The personal report of Cora Hill was read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that \$100.00 be raised by the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Inc., for improvements on the lot owned by the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Inc., in the Chenango Valley Cemetery at Binghamton, money to be forwarded to the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees.

Amended as follows: That the Binghamton church pay \$50.00 of the \$100.00. Carried as amended.

Moved and carried that the Board of Trustees report all their activities at each annual Assembly.

Invitations received from the following churches for the 1929 Assembly: Gloversville, Albany and Lake Placid.

Moved and carried that we vote by secret ballot to determine the place of next Assembly.

It was voted to hold the 1929 Assembly at Gloversville April 16 to 21.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

FRIDAY, APRIL 20, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises. W. R. Cox presiding.

Minutes of last session read, corrected and approved.

The following members were recommended to the Assembly for license to preach: Ann Wilson, Ervin Phillips. For ordination: Jasper Hamm, Geo. J. Becker, Lee Lawrence, Oscar Sharp and Harry Twining.

Adjourned to 9 A. M.

SATURDAY, APRIL 21, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises. W. R. Cox presiding.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Rev. H. A. Saneholtz was introduced and voted seat in conference.

Two additional names were recommended for ordination: Loren Wilson and Oscar Lawrence.

The ordination service was held at the opening of the session conducted by the General Superintendent, Rev. W. R. Cox. Assistant District Superintendent Rev. A. E. Blann read the third chapter of I Timothy. II Timothy, 4:1-8 was read by District Superintendent Rev. A. H. Wilson. Rev. H. A. Saneholtz, District Superintendent of the Pennsylvania District, read

the third chapter of Titus. General Superintendent Cox delivered the charge to the candidates, laying emphasis upon the work of the ministry, the success of which depends upon prayer and study on the part of the minister. The service was most impressive, the blessing of God falling upon the entire Assembly.

The following preachers were ordained: George J. Becker, Oscar Lawrence, Lee Lawrence, Harry Twining, Jasper Hamm, Oscar Sharp and Lorrin Wilson.

The report of the Statistical Committee was read and accepted.

Resolutions were passed upon by the Assembly after which the session adjourned to 2 P. M.

SATURDAY, APRIL 21, 3 P. M.

Devotional exercises. W. R. Cox presiding.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Upon recommendation of the District Council Rev. S. N. Bennett was re-elected Orphanage Representative.

Moved and seconded that each church take an offering quarterly to accompany birthday offerings for the support of orphanage work and forward same to Brother Bennett. Motion lost.

The Board of Examiners recommended Mrs. A. H. Wilson for Deaconess license which was favorably passed upon.

Moved and carried that resolutions Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of the Minutes of 1927 be reprinted in the Minutes of 1928.

Moved and seconded that 1,000 copies of the Minutes of the District Assembly be printed and distributed free of charge among our people.

Amended as follows: That 760 be printed instead of 1,000 and distributed free among our people. Carried as amended.

Sister Ann Wilson, who was recently granted a license to preach, was introduced and voted a seat in conference.

Sister McFarland, a mission worker of Schenectady, was introduced to the Assembly, also Sister Grace Bush, her co-worker.

Moved and seconded that the Secretary be instructed to extend to Brother Fuller our greeting, love and sympathy.

Substitute motion: That Brother S. N. Bennett extend to Brother Fuller our greeting, love and sympathy and that flowers be purchased for his enjoyment.

The closing hours of this Assembly are drawing near. It will soon be referred to as a matter of history. The only record that will be preserved by many of us will be that which is written upon our memory. Shall we not cherish only that which has blessed and uplifted? Surely the blessings which have been ours have been almost numberless. The exhortations which we have been privileged to hear from the lips of our General Superintendent, the sermons loaded with Gospel truth, backed up with spiritual dynamite, have certainly refreshed our souls. The fair and impartial rulings, the patience exhibited with our impetuous ways has proven him to be a master mind in dealing with difficult problems. May he be spared to us for many years if Jesus tarries.

Then let us not forget the faithfulness of our District Officers: The Superintendent and Secretary. The messages in song, the co-operation of all, both in attendance and labor. And last, but not least, the entertainment which has been so far beyond our expectations that we have been led to exclaim: "How can these things be?" We can only say: May the Lord bless you, every one.

The Pastor of this Church has surely been untiring in her efforts. The members have stood by loyally, and the friends of the work have proven their love for this body of humble people in a way to make our hearts rejoice for all that has been done.

The daily press has been very courteous, opening their columns for our reports. For all of this we wish to extend a vote of thanks. We shall not soon forget Schenectady.

There being no further business the Assembly adjourned in due form. The Lord has been with us during this Assembly and the work of the District is advancing. Praise Him for the "Old Time Religion."

Resolution No. 1—Resolved: That our class leaders give a report of their activities on the blank provided for the same, and that the same be read and included with the other church reports at our District Assembly.

Resolution No. 2—Resolved: That we recommend that our churches of the New York District observe the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper at least once every three months. Due notice to be given from the pulpit on the previous Sunday, or not less than a week in advance.

Resolution No. 3—Because of the ever growing menace to vital Salvation of the divorce and remarriage evil, we feel that some definite position should be taken by the Pilgrim Holiness Church regarding the same, that honest hearts may be protected and warned, and inasmuch as the Manual does not declare itself definitely on the subject; therefore, be it

Resolved: That until such time as our General Church does take such definite position, that people who are divorced and remarried, except to be remarried to the one from whom they were divorced, shall be denied membership in our Pilgrim Holiness Churches of the New York District.

Resolution No. 4—Recognizing that missionary interest is vital to the deepest spirituality of a Church, we recommend and urgently request that each Pastor see that a freewill offering be taken once each month and that the congregation be notified a week in advance that said offering will be taken. The day and date of offering to be determined by the local Church. This offering to be sent before the 26th of each month with the report to the District Secretary of the Missionary Board. This offering shall not be taken from the Pastor's support.

Resolution No. 5—Resolved: That all moneys intended for District Secretaries, Treasurer, etc., of the various departments of the District be sent them so as to reach them not later than April 10th.

Resolution No. 6—Resolved: That the New York District be subdivided by the District Council as to include small groups of Churches, which shall meet together for conventions, same to be in charge of the District Superintendent or his assistant, or some one appointed by him.

Resolution No. 7—Resolved: That all moneys given to Missionaries visiting our local Churches be reported to our District Foreign Missionary Treasurer, by means of a receipt showing amount given them, and be it further

Resolved: That all other moneys intended for the various mission fields, etc., be sent through the District Foreign Missionary Treasurer either specified or unspecified.

Resolution No. 8—Resolved: That all activities for the benefit of the Bethel Orphanage work be reported direct to the representative of the orphan work for the District, and that a report be sent in from each Church at the end of each quarter of the Conference year, and be it further

Resolved: That each Church give at least one service during the year to the interest of the orphanage work, at which the representative of the same shall be invited to have charge.

Resolution No. 9—We recommend that each Sunday School in the District establish a birthday box for the benefit of the Bethel Orphanage work, the contents of which shall be sent at the end of each quarter of the Conference year to the District Representative.

Resolution No. 10—Resolved: That our Church extension work be continued for another year, and the evangelist so engaged and supported by the District as heretofore.

Resolution No. 11—Resolved: That an offering be taken by each Church to help defray the expenses of the District Assembly, the same to be brought to Assembly by delegate.

Resolution No. 12—Resolved: That each Church throughout the New York District, if possible, shall have a Young People's Society, as set forth in the Manual, and that same shall report at Annual Assembly.

Resolution No. 13—Because of the fact that the Pastor's conference year closes with the Annual Assembly, be it

Resolved: That said Pastor's farewell service will be on the Sunday following conference.

Resolution No. 14—Resolved: That each Church sending a delegate or delegates to the District Assembly pay the traveling expenses of said delegates. The same to apply to this Assembly and hereafter.

Resolution No. 15—Resolved: That an offering be taken, also a vote of thanks be extended to Lottie Dodge and Sister Marney of Binghamton, to reward them for their labor in putting out the fire on Binghamton Camp grounds, money to be sent by Secretary.

Resolution No. 16—Resolved: That we of the New York District Assembly, voice our sentiment against the proposed advance in price of our Church paper from \$1.00 to \$1.50, and that the time of such advance be postponed or deferred, and we recommend some other method of meeting the deficit and assure you of our co-operation.

Resolution No. 17—Resolved: That we of the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church assume the responsibility of the tuition and clothing of Allen Reed, son of Brother Reed, Missionary in Africa, while he is completing his high school education in the United States.

Resolution No. 18—Since our Manual provides that a representative shall visit our Churches once a year in the interest of the various departments of our Church, and since it is our desire to contribute to the support of these departments, but with a proper proportion, and as we have our District and local obligations to take care of, be it therefore

Resolved: That none of our Churches shall make arrangements with said representatives nor respond to solicitations by mail or for such services without the indorsements and co-operation of the District Superintendent.

Resolution No. 19—Resolved: That children under the age of 14 years who are members of our Church be excused from conference claims.

Resolution No. 20—Resolved: That the proper authorities be requested to give this Assembly a description of our Burial Association insurance as to the financial standing and its work, and that the various Pastors and workers bring the same to their people.

Resolution No. 21—Resolved: That each Church take monthly offering for Church extension work, said offering to be sent to Secretary-Treasurer of Church extension work.

Resolution No. 22—Since the support of the Foreign Missionary Department needs constant and regular attention and that occasions of great enthusiasm do not last, be it therefore

Resolved: That each local Church organize some definite and systematic plan by which regular monthly offerings shall be given to the support of Foreign Missionary.

REPORT OF THE AUDITING COMMITTEE

The following books have been audited and found correct: District Treasurer's book, Home Missionary book, Camp Meeting Secretary-Treasurer's book. The Missionary book shows an omission of \$10 from Binghamton Church on page 34, a mistake in copying. And in the disbursements an item of \$5 sent to A. L. King has been omitted. This also is a mistake in copying. The Orphanage book was found to be correct.

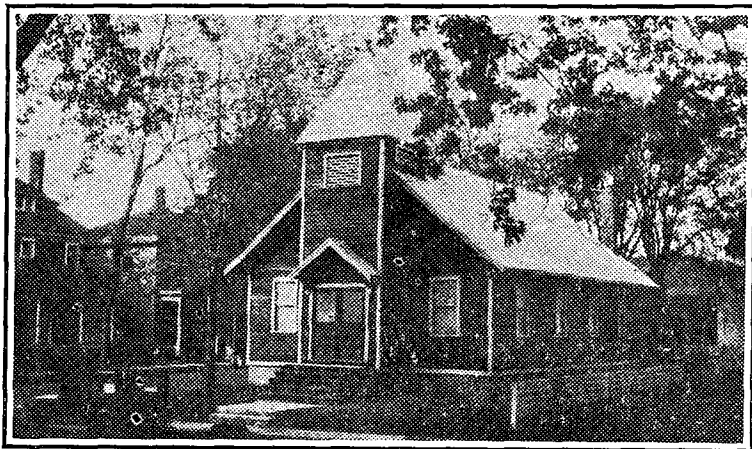
