FINANCIAL PLAN FOR THE YEAR

Manual, Section 109.—All our members shall tithe their income into the local treasury of the church in which their respective memberships are held. Ten per cent of all gross receipts, with the exception of Foreign Missionary money, evangelistic support, and building funds, to be forwarded monthly to the District Treasurer for the support of the District Superintendent, to the amount agreed upon by the District Assembly; the remainder of the tithe of all church receipts to be distributed as follows: Fifty-five per cent for the general church treasury, forty per cent for Home Missions, the remaining five per cent to be used for District expenses. The General Treasurer to distribute as follows: Twenty-five per cent to Home Missions, six per cent to Church Building Fund, twenty per cent to Educational Department, twelve per cent to Orphanage, ten per cent to the Rescue Home, ten per cent to the Publishing Interests, twelve per cent to the General Superintendents and five per cent for general church expense.

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SESSION

Monday Morning, August 22, 1927, 8:00 A. M.

The first business session of the Assembly opened at eight o'clock in the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Springfield, Ohio, with Rev. W. R. Cox, General Superintendent, presiding. After singing, "Every Day and Hour," Rev. N. O. Stuckey read the twelfth chapter of Romans. Superintendent W. R. Cox gave the opening message. Rev. C. M. Brown led in prayer.

Moved and carried that Rev. Paul Coleman be appointed Assistant Secretary. The enrollment of ministers and delegates was ordered. Moved and carried that Mrs. William Bradbury act as delegate from Murray.

Moved and carried that the Conference bar shall include the first seven rows of seats facing the platform.

Moved and carried that Rev. J. F. Woods of the West Virginia District be granted an honorary seat in the Conference bar.

Moved and carried that Mrs. Harry Hays be recognized and be given a seat within the bar.

Moved and carried that Rev. H. D. Nøthstine of the Christian and Missionary Alliance be introduced to the Assembly and be given an honorary seat within the Conference bar.

Moved and carried that the hours of the Assembly be from 8:30 to 11:30 in the morning, and from 1:30 to 4:30 in the afternoon, and from 7:00 to 9:00 at night.

Moved and carried that we adopt the rules laid down in the Manual for the deliberations of this Assembly.

The following committees were appointed by the District Superintendent, Rev. J. V. Coleman: Resolutions—Revs. C. M. Brown, N. O. Stuckey, James Siders, Joel Harmon and R. W. Wolfe; Reception—Revs. Joel Harmon and Charles Marshall; Statistical—Revs. John O. Emrick, Charles Henderson and Arthur Brestel; Ways and Means—A. H. Colliflower, Revs. H. C. Uhrig and James Smith; Auditing—Revs. J. L. Dean and A. H. Kessler.

Moved and carried that the reading of the reports be dispensed with.

Moved and carried that the Assembly receive the following new churches and seat their delegates: Bowling Green, Toledo 2nd, Arthur, Carbondale, Portsmouth and St. Marys.

Moved and carried that the Assembly have thirty minutes' recess.

After recess the Assembly convened. The Reception Committee introduced Rev. and Mrs. Warren Posey of Battle Creek, Michigan. On motion they were given honorary seats in the Conference bar.

Moved and carried that the Valley Chapel church building be given to the class at Arthur. Unanimous vote.

Moved and carried that the trustees of the Wengerlawn Church be instructed to sell the church building and dispose of the money in accordance with the Manual of Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Rev. William Neff of the Pennsylvania District and Rev. G. E. Dudgeon of the Wesleyan Methodist Church were introduced to the Assembly. They, with Miss Lila Coon, were granted honorary seats in the Assembly.

The Resolutions Committee offered the following: Resolved, that this

Assembly request each church to furnish and donate to the Camp Meeting not less than one comforter and one sheet, ready for use next Camp. The resolution was amended to include two feather pillows and pillow cases.

Adjourned. Benediction by Rev. R. D. McNall.

SECOND SESSION

Monday Afternoon, August 22, 1927, 1:30 O'clock

The Assembly convened at 1:30 by singing, "His Way with Thee." Rev. G. R. Aitken led in prayer. Superintendent W. R. Cox gave some helpful exhortations concerning the selection of delegates by the local churches and the importance of all the preachers attending Conference.

Roll of ministers and delegates was called.

The minutes of the first session were read, corrected and approved.

Moved and carried that the Conference bar be extended to include the first three rows of seats on the left of the tabernacle.

Report of the District Council was called. Upon reading of their report the Assembly voted to support the recommendation of the Council and accept into our Conference, in the same standing as previously held, the following persons: Miss Lila Coon, Revs. William Neff, G. R. Aitken, James Smith and Mrs. William Neff.

General Superintendent Seth C. Rees came into the Assembly at this time and was given a glad welcome. He made a brief encouraging talk.

The Resolutions Committee presented the following: Since the Camp belongs to the District and its interests concern the District as a whole, and its burdens should be borne by the same, Be it resolved, That a free-will offering be taken by each local church and forwarded to the Camp Meeting treasurer not later than July 31st for the support of the Camp Meeting. Carried.

Moved and carried that the Assembly have a ten-minute recess.

After recess, the following report was submitted by the secretary of the District Council: We recommend that Rev. William Goodman be accepted into the Ohio District from the Kentucky Assembly. Accepted.

We recommend that we hold our next Annual Camp and Assembly at Dunkirk, Ohio, on the third and fourth Sundays of August. Recommendation accepted.

We also recommend that the Assembly hold a sub-district Camp at Springfield on the second and third Sundays of June. The District Council will have supervision. Accepted.

Moved and carried that the election of officers be held at two o'clock on Tuesday afternoon.

Moved and carried that Rev. E. O. Howell be accepted for ordination.

Moved and carried that the Resolutions Committee be excused in order to prepare business for the Assembly.

Moved and carried that the evangelists and singers of our District be introduced to the Assembly.

The following were presented: Revs. G. R. Aitken, Jacob Schell, E. E. Connin, R. D. McNall, J. D. Webb, Paul Coleman and Celia Bradshaw.

After some words of advice from General Superintendent W. R. Cox, motion was made to extend the time. Carried.

Moved and carried that Rev. M. Russel and wife of the Christian Union Church be introduced to the Assembly and granted honorary seats in the Conference bar.

The Home Missionary Quartet then sang, "The Old-time Religion."

The District Council recommended Rev. G. E. Dudgeon of the Wesleyan Methodist Church be accepted into the Ohio District in the same standing as he held in his former church. Accepted.

Moved and carried that Miss Phoebe Pierce be accepted into the Assembly.

Moved and carried that Rev. Allen Fairchild be accepted into the Assembly and credentials be granted to him.

Adjourned. Benediction by Rev. Joel Harmon.

THIRD SESSION

Monday Evening, August 22, 1927, 7:00 O'clock.

The Assembly sang, "Constantly Abiding." Miss Lila Coon led in prayer.

Moved and carried that we dispense with the roll call.

The minutes of the second session were read and approved.

Miss Wilhelmina Haines of the Indiana District was introduced and upon motion was given an honorary seat.

Miss Dorothy Dobie then sang, "I'm Living Now in Canaan Land."

Report of the District Council was called for. They recommended that Rev. S. H. Hamilton be accepted into our Assembly in same standing as held in the Quaker Church. Carried. They also recommended that Rev. Findlay Wolfe be received from the Salvation Army. Carried. The following were recommended for ordination: Rev. William Neff and wife, Revs. E. O. Howell, Charles Henderson, A. H. Kessler, Jacob Schell, Laura Shepherd, Ida Schuman, Ella Rutherford and Rev. Charles Harvey and wife. Carried.

Rev. Harry Hays then read a Scripture lesson from I Tim., chapter 4. Rev. W. R. Cox then delivered the charge to the candidates above named. God blessed and owned the ordination service.

Moved and carried that we take up an offering for the expense of entertaining the Assembly.

Brother Friedley of Dunkirk, Ohio, was introduced to the Assembly and sang two songs. He is seventy-eight years past and God blessed while he sang.

Moved and carried that Brother Friedley be granted a seat in the Conference.

The Ways and Means Committee made the following report: We recommend the adoption of the financial plan as laid down in the Manual, section 109, page 50.

Moved and carried that this report be laid on the table.

Moved and carried that we rescind the action of the morning session and open the Tuesday morning session at eight o'clock.

Rev. C. M. Brown, the Home Missionary Treasurer, reported. Report accepted.

Adjourned. Benediction by Rev. Harry Hays.

FOURTH SESSION

Tuesday Morning, August 23, 1927, 8:00 O'clock

The Assembly opened with song, "He Brought Me Out of the Miry Clay," after which Rev. L. R. Roberts led in prayer. General Superintendent W. R. Cox spoke on the subject of "Evil Speaking."

Roll of ministers and delegates was called.

Minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

On motion Rev. W. R. Cox addressed the Assembly on the nature of financing the church.

Assistant General Superintendent Rev. M. G. Standley came into the Assembly during the discussion and gave a brief testimony.

Moved and carried that the recommendation from the Ways and Means Committee relative to the adoption of the financial plan laid down in the Manual, be lifted from the table and brought before the Assembly for reconsideration.

Moved and carried that the recommendation of the Ways and Means Committee be adopted.

Moved and carried that the Assembly hear the District Treasurer's report.

Moved and carried that the above report be accepted subject to the Auditing Committee.

Brother Neal Hutchinson of the Southern District favored us with a clarinet solo.

Rev. Mrs. E. E. Shelhamer was then introduced to the Assembly and was granted an honorary seat in the Conference bar.

FIFTH SESSION

Tuesday Afternoon, August 23, 1927, 1:30 O'clock

The fifth session opened by singing, "Glory to His Name." Prayer by Rev. N. O. Stuckey. General Superintendent Seth C. Rees addressed the Assembly with timely exhortations.

Moved and carried that the Assembly hear the report from the Resolutions Committee. Report was laid on the table.

The following were introduced to the Assembly and given honorary seats: Revs. Garnett Phillippe, Elmer Hanna, R. P. Dipner and Miss Naomi Hanna.

The chairman then called for the election of officers. The following were elected: District Superintendent, Rev. J. V. Coleman; Assistant Superintendent, Rev. Harry Hays; Secretary, Rev. F. C. Saneholtz; Treasurer, A. H. Colliflower; additional members of Council, Revs. John O. Emrick, Joel Harmon and C. M. Brown.

The District Superintendent appointed Revs. J. O. Emrick and J. L. Dean as the committee on publishing the minutes.

Moved and carried that the remaining offices shall be filled by appointment by the District Council.

The report of the Foreign Missionary Treasurer was heard and accepted.

District Superintendent Rev. J. V. Coleman read his annual report. Accepted.

Moved and carried that Rev. C. M. Brown be added as a member of the Ways and Means Committee.

SIXTH SESSION

Tuesday Evening, August 23, 1927, 7:00 O'clock

Session opened with song, "He's a wonderful Saviour to Me." Prayer by Rev. R. D. Brown.

Roll of ministers and delegates was called.

The minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

The following were ordained: Revs. Garnett Phillippe, Charles Harvey

and wife and Francis Taylor. Rev. Warren Posey read Scripture lesson and Rev. M. G. Standley gave the address.

Report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

The Ways and Means Committee gave the following report: We recommend that the churches of the District open their doors for the purpose of holding Home Missionary Conventions in order that the needs of this work may be properly placed before the people. Carried. We recommend that all church extension work be under the direction of the District Council. Carried.

The Examining Board reported the candidates for credentials, which were passed upon by the Assembly, and enrolled them in the directory of the minutes.

Moved and carried that the secretary be instructed to pro-rate the cost of publishing the minutes and to notify the pastors of their local church quota. The Statistical Committee made partial report. Accepted.

Moved and carried that we extend the time indefinitely.

Resolution offered and carried that we rescind the action in regard to the June Camp Meeting here at Springfield.

The Ways and Means Committee recommends that the District Superintendent's salary be fixed at twenty-four hundred dollars, including his traveling expenses, and that all money received by him from evangelistic meetings shall be turned into the District Treasury. Carried.

Moved and carried that we rescind the action in regard to raising the cost of publishing the minutes.

The following resolutions were read and accepted:

1. Resolved, That we as an Assembly express our hearty appreciation for the excellent spirit and manner in which our General Superintendent, Rev. W. R. Cox, has presided over this Assembly.

2. Also for the presence and timely exhortations of our General Superintendent, Rev. Seth C. Rees.

3. That we express our appreciation for the faithful services rendered by our District Superintendent, Rev. J. V. Coleman, during the past year.

4. That we as an Assembly recognize the faithfulness of our Camp Meeting Committee, for providing such excellent entertainment for the Camp and Assembly.

5. That we likewise express our appreciation for the services of our Secretary, Rev. F. C. Saneholtz, and his assistant, Rev. Paul Coleman, and our District Treasurer, A. H. Colliflower. Also to our splendid cook, Rev. J. Schell, and his helpers.

6. That we especially thank Almighty God for His presence and harmonious Christian spirit that has been so manifest throughout this Assembly, and pledge our loyalty to Him and to the Church until Jesus comes.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

It is with delight that I submit the following report of the work done as your District Superintendent for the year 1926-1927. God has been with us and given us victory, for which we praise Him. We have in some respects been handicapped, but our work will show a marked increase in membership and also, I believe, in spirituality. I have spent at least two-thirds of my time working for the District. I have enjoyed immensely the fellowship of the brethren. The new work that has been organized in the last two years has taken much time. Some few places I have visited as often as five or six times. I held three revivals in the District and have placed eight meetings in new territories. We have organized six churches and have at the present time three prospective places that are waiting for a visit from our District Superintendent for a meeting to organize.

I wish to call the attention of the District and especially the pastors to study conditions surrounding your church, and wherever possible establish prayer meetings. Local preachers should be placed over them and thus try to open up some new work for our Church. This will thereby give experience to the young men and women who have the call of the Lord upon them to preach the Gospel.
