JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SESSION

Monday Morning, August 20, 1928, 9:00 A. M.

The first business session of the Assembly opened at nine o'clock in the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Springfield, Ohio. Rev. Harry Hayes, Assistant District Superintendent conducted devotions. Rev. L. R. Roberts led in prayer. Rev. W. R. Cox, General Superintendent took the chair and gave the opening message.

Moved and carried that Rev. C. C. Mourer be elected Ass't secretary. The roll was called by the secretary and the response was comparatively small. The roll was corrected.

Moved and carried that Mrs. John Farrow act as delegate from Nelsonville. Moved and carried that Mrs. J. L. Dean act as delegate from Columbus.

Moved and carried that the conference bar consist of the first seven rows of seats in front of the pulpit. An amendment was passed to include the first three rows on each side of pulpit.

Moved and carried that Revs. J. C. Brillhart and J. S. Hayton from West Virginia district be introduced and given honorary seats in the Assembly.

Rev. E. E. Shelhamer, Mrs. Melvin Russel and Mrs. Amy West were introduced and given honorary seats in the Assembly.

Moved and carried that the hours of the Assembly be from 8:30 to 11:30 in the morning, and from 1:30 to 4:30 in the afternoon, and from 7:00 to 9:00 at night.

Moved and carried that we adopt the rules laid down in the Manual for the deliberations of this Assembly.

Rev. Harry Hayes then read the appointment of the committees as follows: Resolutions—Revs. N. O. Stucky, C. M. Brown, W. F. Childs, J. Harmon, C. P. Pridgen; Reception—Revs. I. J. Snyder, C. A. Marshall, Mrs. C. M. Brown, Mrs. F. C. Sancholtz; Statistical—Revs. J. O. Emrick, C. Henderson, R. D. McNall, Lila Coon, Mrs. L. R. Roberts; Ways and Means—Revs. J. L. Kennet, L. R. Roberts, T. Zarley, A. H. Colliflower; Auditing—Revs. W. H. Dickinson, A. Brestel; Editing—Revs. J. O. Emrick, C. Henderson.

Reading of reports of pastors and delegates. Pastors and delegates made reports for the following churches: Athens, Ansonia, Bevis, Cincinnati 1st., Cincinnati 2nd., Cincinnati 3rd., Columbus, Dayton 1st., Port Clinton, Dayton 2nd., Defiance, Dupont.

Moved and supported that the following be introduced and given honorary seats within the bar: Revs. E. F. Arthur, Urbana, O., J. R. Walter of Cincinnati, M. M. Lytle of the Salvation Army, E. Qualls of Kentucky, Wilmina Haines of Indiana and Mother Haines of Dayton.

Rev. Haines of Rocky Mt. District was introduced and given seat in the bar.

Moved and carried that Melvin Rickner be granted dismissal from Assembly.

Moved and carried that Rev. F. C. Sancholtz be excused from the Examining Board upon resignation.

Moved and carried that the time of the forenoon session be extended ten minutes

Moved and carried that the time of the election of officers be Monday night session following devotions.

Moved and carried that Rev. L. R. Roberts be elected to fill vacancy on the Examining Board.

Announcements. Adjournment. Benediction, Rev. L. R. Roberts.

MONDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Assembly called to order by Rev. Harry Hayes. Devotions were conducted by Rev. James Siders.

Rev. W. R. Cox presided.

The following were introduced and granted honorary seats: Revs. R. D. Niles, Walter Henschen of Greensboro, L. D. Gadd of Tenn.

Special song by mixed chorus entitled, "Moment by Moment".

Rev. E. E. Shelhamer addressed the Assembly on the subject, "Examples to the believers". He said we should be examples in word, conversation, charity, spirit, faith and purity.

Rev. W. E. Posey of Michigan was introduced to the Assembly.

Moved and carried that Rev. W. E. Posey and wife be accepted by transfer into the Ohio District.

Moved and carried that Rev. C. P. Pridgen's transfer be accepted.

Roll call of ministers and delegates.

Rev. Paul Marshall of Wesleyan Methodist Church was introduced and granted honorary seat.

Reading of minutes of last session read and approved.

Report of committee on Resolutions: 1. That we build a dormitory to accommodate the increasing attendance at the Camp Meeting. 2. As the Camp Ground is too small, that we purchase one and a half acres on the East known as the Harshman property. 3. Be it resolved that the tabernacle be enlarged. 4. Because of the irregularity of the grounds, be it resolved that the needful grading be done.

The above resolutions were adopted as read.

Moved and carried that Rev. C. C. Mourer sing, "My, didn't it rain!"

A letter of condolence from the Indiana District in regard to the death of Rev. J. V. Coleman was read to the Assembly.

The following churches were reported through pastors and delegates: East Canaan, Luhrig, New Marshfield, Jackson, Liberty.

Moved and carried that we have fifteen minutes recess that the Examining Board may examine candidates for the ministry.

The Logan and Martins Ferry churches reported through pastors and delegates.

Additional report of the committee on Resolutions. 5. Owing to the growth of the District, Be it resolved that the Superintendent give his full time to the District. Carried. 6. Because of the Growth of the Camp, that the churches be called upon to donate bedding. Carried. 7. That the District Superintendent be paid \$2,000.00 for his services and money received for revivals be turned into the treasury. Referred back to Committee.

Moved and carried that the time be extended twenty minutes.

The District Council reported and five names were presented to the Assembly for license: B. C. Lehman, C. C. Bowman, C. Hook; A. E. House, J. R. Walter and they were accepted by the Assembly.

Moved and carried that the remaining reports be handed to the Statistical committee without reading so as to conserve time.

Report of District Treasurer, A. H. Colliflower was read, accepted and referred to the Auditing committee.

Adjournment. Benediction by Rev. G. E. Dudgeon.

MONDAY EVENING SESSION

Meeting called to order by Rev. Harry Hayes.

Song, "A Charge to Keep I Have." Prayer by Rev. O. W. Barnes.

Moved and carried that the roll call be omitted.

Minutes of the afternoon session read and approved.

Rev. E. E. Shelhamer addressed the Assembly on three words ending with y: Distinctly, Authority and Adaptability. His remarks were appreciated and accepted by a rising vote of thanks.

Additional report of Resolution Committee: 10. Memorial, Because of the sudden and unexpected death of our beloved District Superintendent and the great loss to our district and the General church and because of our love and respect to Sister Coleman and family, Be it resolved that we go to our knees in grief for the loss of Brother Coleman and in prayer for Sr. Coleman and family. Carried.

Moved and carried that the Examining Committee report. The following names were presented for District license: H. C. Myers, Esther Ewing, E. Meshner, E. L. Dustman, C. C. Bowman, J. M. Slonaker, B. F. McCain. Accepted. Also the following for renewal: W. C. Bowman, A. R. Shirk, Amy West, Harold Osborne. Also the following for ordination: A. E. Houck, J. R. Walter, Sylvia Rowand, Ethel Corya, R. A. Moon. Accepted.

Election of officers. The following officers were elected: District Superintendent, Rev. Harry Hayes; Assistant Superintendent, Rev. L. R. Roberts; Secretary, Rev. F. C. Sancholtz; Treasurer, Rev. C. P. Pridgen.

Time was expended until officers were all elected. Rev. C. C. Mourer then sang, "The Prayer-Answering God."

Rev. E. J. Hare of the Nazarene Church was introduced to the Assembly.

Additional members of the Council were elected: J. O. Emrick, C. M. Brown, J. Harmon.

Moved and carried that the remaining officers be elected by the District Council.

Moved and carried that the rules be suspended and the Tuesday morning session convene at nine o'clock.

Adjournment. Benediction by Rev. J. A. Shell.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The fourth session was opened by singing. "A Charge to Keep I Have". Scripture reading and prayer by Rev. H. C. Uhrig.

The chairman, Rev. W. R. Cox addressed the Assembly on "The Prayer Life."

Roll call omitted by motion.

Minutes of Monday evening session read and approved.

The secretary read a telegram from Rev. M. G. Standley of Cincinnati, O., expressing his regret that he was unable to attend the sessions. Also that God's blessings may be upon the Assembly. It was received with appreciation.

Rev. Harry Hayes then raised money to defray expenses of the dining hall and seventy-seven dollars were received.

Rev. C. C. Mourer sang, "The Preacher off the Fence".

Mrs. L. R. Roberts, Foreign Missionary treasurer of the district gave report. It was accepted subject to the approval of the Auditing Committee.

Rev. L. R. Roberts gave report of the Ways and Means Committee, that our financial plan be that as given in the Manual, Section 109, page 50. Adopted.

District treasurer, A. H. Colliflower was asked to speak concerning our financial plan. General discussion followed.

Rev. C. M. Brown, Home Missionary treasurer gave report. Report was accepted subject to the approval of the Auditing committee.

The Resolution committee reported, That the District Superintendent be paid the sum of \$2100.00 and bear his own expenses and all money received from revivals be paid into the treasurer. A substitute was offered to pay \$2400.00 salary, and he bear his owns expenses and all money received from revivals be turned into the treasurer. Carried.

Moved and carried that the time be extended ten minutes.

Rev. Harry Hayes read report of the Examining Board.

Adjournment. Benediction by Rev. L. R. Roberts.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session opened with singing, "The Same Power Today", and "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name". Prayer by Rev. J. L. Kennet.

Mrs. F. C. Sancholtz and Mrs. O. W. Barnes sang duet.

Rev. W. R. Cox spoke concerning the Financial Problems in the Local church.

Moved and carried that the roll call be dispensed with.

Minutes of forenoon session read and approved.

Moved and carried that we pay the District treasurer and secretary moneys due for services rendered in former years.

Resolution No. 8: That a committee of three be appointed to oversee the improvements of the Camp Ground. Resolution adopted.

Resolution No. 9: Resolved that a committee be appointed to purchase the land as provided for in the former resolution and that this committee consist of Revs. C. M. Brown, J. Harmon, I. J. Snider. Adopted.

Resolution No. 11. The Macedonian call is coming in from so many places. Therefore, be it resolved that we elect a Church Extension evangelist to work under the direction of the Church Extension Board and who shall receive \$35.00 per week including his expenses when actually engaged in the work. Also all money received when in meetings shall be turned into the treasurer.

Resolution No. 12: This being the District Camp and a coaling station for all the District workers, we feel that the burden should be borne equally by all. Therefore, be it resolved that a Camp Ground committee of five be elected to look after the opening and closing of the Camp. Be it further understood that each ordained and licensed minister on the District shall come and help with the work or give its equivalent in cash. Adopted.

Resolution No. 13: August being a favorable month for the Camp Meeting, Be it resolved that our next Camp Meeting being held August 16-26, 1929, and the Assembly be held August 26-28, 1929. Adopted.

Resolution No. 14: Insomuch as the children of today are to make the church of tomorrow, Be it resolved that we have a worker take charge of children and young people's services each day during Assembly.

Resolution No. 15. Resolved that the committee provided for in resolution No. 8 be authorized to borrow money to handle the business voted in other resolutions. Adopted.

Resolution No. 18: Since every district has its interests and desires to carry them through without interruption, Be it therefore resolved that the representatives of our various church interests shall be admitted into the district to represent their interests as the District Superintendent or Council shall make arrangements for them, and that they shall not come without such arrangements and understanding. Adopted.

Resolution No. 19: Inasmuch as there is a great deal of work connected with the various secretary offices as well as treasurers, Be it resolved that we provide for the expenses necessary to carry out their obligations such as books, paper, postage, etc. Adopted.

The District Council presented the following recommendation: That the District treasurer take over the work and office of the Foreign Missionary treasurer. Carried.

District Council asked to be excused from the session. Granted.

Moved and carried that we take an offering to liquidate the debt of unpaid amounts due on minutes of last year, secretary and treasurer fees, etc.

Rev. D. L. Bryant of Erlanger, Ky. was introduced and granted a seat in the bar.

Rev. C. E. Powell asked to be excused from the rest of the Assembly. Request granted by vote of Assembly.

Rev. H. C. Myers was excused from the rest of the Assembly.

Adjournment. Benediction by Rev. C. M. Brown.

TUESDAY EVENING SESSION

The evening session opened with singing, "In the Service of the King". Prayer by Rev. S. Cole.

Rev. W. R. Cox made remarks concerning the beautiful spirit that has prevailed throughout the sessions.

Rev. W. C. Stone addressed the Assembly in behalf of the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate, in which he discussed the raising of the subscription price, its value to the church and the duty of the laity to support the same.

Dedication service. Rev. C. Henderson and wife and Rev. R. P. Baumgardner and wife presented their children for dedication. Revs. W. R. Cox and W. C. Stone conducted the service.

The Examining committee reported the following names for ordination: A. E. Houck, J. R. Walter, Sylvia Rowand, Ethel Corya, R. A. Moon, J. M. Slonaker, A. G. Bryan. Report was accepted.

Rev. J. L. Schell sang, "Holy, Holy, Holy Is What the Angels Sing". Rev. C. M. Brown read Scripture lesson from 1 Tim. 4:1-10. General Supt. W. R. Cox gave the charge to the candidates. Prayer by Rev. C. P. Pridgen.

Resolution No. 20. Because of the sudden change that might come by change of the superintendency, leaving the former superintendent without work, Be it resolved that the term of office begin one month after the Assembly. Adopted.

Resolution No. 21. Because of the great benefit, mutual uplift and blessing that comes from the association of the saints, Be it resolved that a ministerial convention be called sometime during the year by the District Superintendent. Adopted.

Final resolution: 1. That we as an Assembly express our hearty appreciation for the excellent spirit and manner in which our General Superintendent, W. R. Cox has presided over this Assembly. 2. That we as an Assembly recognize the

faithfulness of our Camp Meeting committee for providing such excellent entertainment for the Camp and Assembly. 3. That we express our appreciation for the services of our secretary, Rev. F. C. Saneholtz and his assistant, Rev. C. C. Mourer, and our district treasurer, A. H. Colliflower and our splendid cook, Rev. J. L. Schell and his helpers. 4. That we especially thank Almighty God for His presence and the harmonious Christian spirit that has been so manifest throughout the Assembly and pledge our loyalty to him and the church until Jesus comes or calls.

The Ways and Means committee reported as follows: We are indebted for past considerations—last year's minutes, \$31, this year's minutes, \$137, past salaries of secretary and treasurer, \$80, and the editor, \$70. Total, \$318.

An offering was taken as ordered in the afternoon session. Total taken in cash and pledges, \$94.62. Balance of indebtedness, \$223.38.

Moved and carried that the secretary write the pastors of the district to raise the balance of the above debt, and instruct them to take offerings in their various churches.

Report of Statistical committee read and accepted.

Report of Auditing committee read and accepted.

Moved and carried that the Camp Meeting committee prepare report of finances for the minutes. Substitute was made for a report of the previous year.

Moved and carried that we have the same number of minutes printed as last year.

The treasurer of the Camp Meeting Board gave report. Report accepted subject to the approval of the Auditing committee.

Final adjournment.

SPECIAL ITEMS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

The Ways and Means committee recommend that we comply with section 109, page 50 of the manual in regard to our finances. And inasmuch as this has failed to reach further than the needs of our own district, that we further recommend that in addition to the title all of our churches, through the encouragement of their respective pastors raise their respective amounts, according to the apportionment in the following table, and send quarterly to our district treasurer and that the first amount up to and including \$112.50 of each quarter be forwarded to our general church treasurer specified for the General Superintendents and the remaining forwarded according to the Manual apportionment.
