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Journal of Proceedings

FIRST SITTING

The Thirteenth Annual Assembly of the Ontario District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9 a.m., September 30th, in the Bible School, Proton, Ont. Rev. Robt. Gordon led the song service and Rev. S. D. Short and the Secretary led the Assembly to the throne of grace.

The District Superintendent, Rev. H. W. Hobbs, presented Rev. W. L. Surbrook, General Superintendent. Bro. Surbrook addressed the Assembly, presenting a sermon outline from Acts, chapter ten, on The Seven Christian Characteristics, and pointing out the great practical truths which our preachers should emphasize. He then took his place as presiding officer.

The Secretary called and revised the roll, to which twenty-two members responded.

The Assembly bar was constituted to include the first six seats.

By motion the hours of Assembly used last year were again adopted, namely 9 a.m. to 12 a.m.; 1.30 p.m. to 5 p.m.; 8 p.m., evangelistic service.

The District Superintendent read his report. It was moved and seconded that this good report be accepted with a cheery amen.—Carried.

The Statistician presented her report, showing that the church had made encouraging progress along financial lines.

Moved and seconded that we accept this splendid report with gratitude to God, and to the Statistician for her faithful work.—Carried.

The Auditing Committee reported that they had found the Treasurer's book in excellent condition. The report was accepted by motion.

The District Treasurer read her report. Moved and seconded that the report be gratefully received.—Carried.

Bro. Ives addressed the Assembly, making it clear that the special offerings taken in connection with the visits of deputational workers should be forwarded thro' the treasuries of the church.

The Committee on Resolutions reported. Resolution No. 1 was referred, and resolution No. 2 was adopted by motion.

At 11 a.m., Rev. C. E. Cliff, as previously announced, addressed the Assembly. His subject, a very practical one and of blessing to all, was "The Wisdom that is from Above," based on Scripture found in James 3: 11-17.

The session closed with prayer by Bro. Surbrook.

SECOND SITTING

The second session of the Assembly opened at 1.30 p.m., by a devotional period, in which Rev. B. A. Eary led the song service and Sister Wm. Pilgrim and Rev. John Owl engaged in prayer. Bro. Surbrook occupied the chair.

The roll call was dispensed with.

The minutes of the first session were read, corrected and approved.

The report of the Committee on Resolutions was continued. Resolutions 3, 4, 5 and 6 were adopted respectively by motion.

By motion resolution No. 7 was referred to the District Council that they consider and report to the Assembly.

Resolution No. 8 was amended and the amended Resolution adopted by motion.

Resolution No. 9 was ruled out of order, inasmuch as the question of budgets has been referred to the District Council.

The District Council reported on the matter referred to them in the morning session.

By motion the report of the District Council was accepted.

Moved and seconded that we adopt recommendation No. 1 of this report.—Carried.

Moved and seconded that we adopt recommendation No. 2 of District Council's report.—Carried.

The Church, Mission, Sunday School and Workers' reports were called for, and presented by pastors, delegates and workers. The reports were accepted (For summaries of these, see Reports.)

No report was sent from Kolapore. Proton Church and Sunday School reports were deferred.

Brother Douglas Sisman, called upon to testify, gave a clear report of his experience and call.

It was moved and seconded that we proceed with the election of officers.—Carried.

Moved and seconded that we have a recess of ten minutes.—Carried.

After the recess, Bro. Surbrook called the Assembly to order, requesting Rev. A. L. McGuire to lead in prayer.

The motion prevailed that the District Superintendent appoint the tellers. Bro. Hobbs appointed as tellers B. A. Eary, A. L. McGuire and S. D. Short.

The Secretary read a recommendation from the Examining and Educational Boards that Brother and Sister Albert Baker be granted licenses, 1st year Ministerial and 1st year Deaconess, respectively. By motion this recommendation was adopted, and Bro. and Sister Baker were invited within the bar.

On the first ballot, Rev. H. W. Hobbs was elected District Superintendent.

On the first ballot for Assistant Superintendent, there was no election. It was moved and carried that the three receiving the highest number of votes be nominees. Rev. H. H. Shaw was elected.

By common consent it was agreed to continue combining the officers of Secretary and Treasurer.

At this point Bro. Surbrook was excused from the Assembly, and Rev. C. E. Cliff occupied the chair.

In the vote taken for Secretary-Treasurer, Rev. G. White was elected.

On the first ballot for District Council Advisory members, all the members were elected, as follows: S. D. Short, Robt. Gordon, A. L. McGuire, B.

A. Eary.

On the first ballot for members of Examining Board, to hold office for three years, there was no election. The motion prevailed that the four receiving the highest number of votes be nominees on the second ballot. Rev. F. White was elected.

The motion was supported and carried that the time be extended until the completion of the election of officers.

Rev. H. W. Hobbs was elected member of the Educational Committee for three years.

On the first ballot for election of District Trustees, Wilfred McNally, Ernest Robinson and Frank Bain were elected.

The motion prevailed that the District Superintendent appoint the Resolutions and Auditing Committees.

The motion prevailed that the Superintendent also appoint the Statistician.

Bro. Hobbs appointed the following Committees: Resolutions: H. H. Shaw, S. D. Short, A. L. McGuire. Auditing: Annie Short and Lily Johnson. Statistician: Florence Allen.

The session adjourned by expiration of time. Prayer of dismissal was offered by Rev. R. W. Ives.

THIRD SITTING

The third session of the Assembly came to order at 9.30 a.m., October 1st., with Bro. Surbrook in charge. After a devotional service, in which Bro. Robt. Gordon led in prayer, Rev. R. W. Ives read the thirteenth chapter of 1st Corinthians, and spoke on the subject, "Transforming the Commonplace." His talk was deeply inspirational, encouraging to alertness in using the golden opportunities afforded in the common round of life. The Holy Spirit set His seal on the message and the Assembly, coming in melting power until the regular order was suspended for a time of precious fellowship and testimony. The meeting swept on into a glorious healing service, where the power of the Lord was present to heal.

About 11.30 a.m., the business was resumed by the reading of the minutes of the last session. The minutes were approved as read.

The joint report of the Educational and Examining Committees was read by the Secretary.

Moved, seconded and carried that we adopt the recommendations of the Examining and Educational Committees.

Three further recommendations from the District Council (Nos. 3, 4 and 5) were read by the Secretary. By motion these were adopted.

The reports of the Proton Church, Sunday School and Port Law Sunday School were read by the delegate, and accepted by motion.

The motion prevailed that the District Council shall approve the minutes of this last session.

It was moved and seconded that we adjourn.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook offered prayer, closing the Assembly of 1938.

REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the Thirteenth Annual Assembly of the Ontario District Pilgrim Holiness Church, now in session at Proton, Ontario, September 30th, 1938 Greetings.

It is with a keen sense of God's goodness and faithfulness to us that I endeavour to review and report the labours of the past year.

The entrance upon the office was with many misgivings, as I viewed the task in comparison with my experience, and for anything and all that has been accomplished, to God be the glory.

In the early fall I was privileged to be present at the opening of the new Mission in Oshawa. God graciously undertook to make this possible. Much credit is due the pastor for his diligent work, and to his people for their faithful cooperation.

Due to some unexpected changes it was necessary to spend some three months of the year filling in as pastor at Lion's Head and Massey. While at the latter place, I gave what assistance possible in the painting of the church. This has added greatly to the appearance and value of the property there.

A number of revivals have been held over the District, resulting in a goodly harvest of souls.

Our District Camp held in June was greatly owned and blessed of God. Many were saved and sanctified, and the church was built up generally. Bro. Eary, our engaged evangelist, and Bro. McGuire, in charge of song, assisted by the other District workers, laboured faithfully and fruitfully throughout the Camp. On the last Sunday afternoon, in our Home Missionary meeting nearly \$250.00 was given or pledged toward the purchase of a tent and the opening of new places.

During the summer months there were four tent meetings,—Hope Ness Oshawa, Toronto and Thessalon. Eternity will reveal the final results of these.

I may say that the Toronto work has successfully passed through what proved to be a real crisis. Due to unfavourable arrangements, they were obliged to leave their former place of worship. But it proved providential, as they secured a central location for the tent. The pastor, Bro. McGuire, was the evangelist, and God graciously helped him. After holding forth for five weeks, over six Sundays, and having good crowds and results, the way was opened to move into the former Hillcrest Baptist Church, a few doors from the tent location. This I believe is a definite answer to prayer. Reports from there since then have been very encouraging.

The Thessalon meeting was a new venture, and, I think, a successful one. After a few weeks' tent-meeting, we were able to open a new mission on the main street. To date four souls have sought the Lord. The field is very ripe, and gives promise of a healthy church.

It has been my duty, and not a pleasant one, during the past year, to discontinue services at Barrie and Brampton, due to the impossibility of securing suitable places of worship within our means financially.

To briefly summarize my labours: I have preached 134 times; seekers 6; pastoral calls, 48; visited all the churches at least twice, and some more; held 12 business meetings and 3 district council meetings; attended one General Board meeting last November; was a delegate to General Assembly; travelled 13671 miles; received for support from the District, Worker's tithē, \$199.45; offerings \$70.47; total \$269.92.

The Lord has been pleased to give me a capable co-labourer in His work, for which I praise Him.

In closing, I would like to express to the workers my heart-felt thanks and appreciation for their fellowship and splendid co-operation. May God reward everyone.

REPORT OF RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

(as adopted by the Assembly)

Resolution No. 1—Referred

Resolution No. 2

Resolved that Resolution 4 of Standing Resolutions be amended by the addition of the following paragraph:

Be it further resolved that those who fail to show proper interest in complying with the said resolution shall be liable to have their credentials unrenewed.—Adopted.

Resolution No. 3

Resolved that Resolution 2 of 1937 Resolutions be deleted.—Adopted.

Resolution No. 4

Whereas the number of our standing resolutions is increasing, and whereas the price of our Minutes increases in proportion to number of pages, be it resolved that we not print our standing resolutions in our Minutes.

Be it further resolved that we have our standing resolutions typed or mimeographed and sent to the pastors, to be read to each local church.—Adopted.

Resolution No. 5

Resolved that each of our local churches observe the sacrament of the Lord's Supper at least once every quarter.—Adopted.

Resolution No. 6

Resolved that each pastor make a special effort to place a 1938 Manual in the home of each member of our church, and especially with the members of the local church board.—Adopted.

Resolution No. 7

Whereas Resolution No. 12 of 1937 Resolutions is somewhat unsatisfactory to the local church, we recommend that the matter be discussed further.

Referred to District Council to report to Assembly.

Resolution No. 8 (as amended)

Resolved that all stationed workers come, send someone, or pay the equivalent of two days labour for the preparation of District Camp and Assembly, when called upon by the District Superintendent.—Adopted.

Resolution No. 9—Ruled out of order

REPORT OF DISTRICT COUNCIL

(as adopted by the Assembly)

1. We recommend that the churches be assessed \$3.00 per member for General Budget and \$1.00 per member for District Budget, and that these funds be raised by alternate monthly missionary meetings as heretofore.

2. We recommend that provision be made for a Reserve Tent Fund, through a weekly offering from the Sunday Schools, each pastor to contribute his school as to the amount.

3. We recommend that this Assembly request the Proton Church Advisory Board to make a statement as to what proportion of the proceeds from the Bible School property, in the event of sale or fire, would be satisfactory to the local church, and that the settlement be left with the District Council.

4. We recommend that the time of our District Assembly be fixed as the last Thursday of September, 8 p.m., thro' the following Sunday; that accounts be closed September 15th; and that no reports received after September 18th be inserted in that year's reports.

5. We recommend that twenty-five cents be placed as the fee for each examination of the Study Courses, plus the expense of postage and questions.
