# CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

## First Session

The Thirty-eighth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada convened at the Lion's Head church, July 5, 1963, at 9:00 a.m. Rev. Roy Dorsett led the congregation in singing, "O Worship the King", with Mrs. Elizabeth Evans presiding at the piano. Rev. Norman Nixon led in prayer.

The District Superintendent, Rev. L. B. Reese, introduced General Superintendent P. W. Thomas, who then read a scripture lesson from the Book of Joshua. He addressed the Conference on, "The Qualifications for Spiritual Leadership", speaking on (I) Spiritual discernment and understanding, (II) Faith, and, (III) Aggressiveness. Brother Thomas then called the Conference to order.

The roll was called and proper revisions made.

The Conference bar was designated to be the first four rows of benches across the church.

The time of sittings was set by motion as follows: 9:00 a.m. to 11:45 a.m., and 1:30 p.m. until the completion of business.

The report of Rev. L. B. Reese, District Superintendent, was given, and was accepted by a rising vote of thanks.

The Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. Norman Nixon, gave an oral report, which was accepted by the Conference.

The District Treasurer, Miss Eileen Baker, then gave her report. It was moved that her report be accepted, and the Conference gave her a standing vote of appreciation for her work.

Ministerial transfers were introduced to the Conference by the reception committee, Rev. Roy Dorsett, as follows: Rev. and Mrs. R. W. Williams from South Africa, and Rev. and Mrs. T. L. Willingham from Idaho. Each testified and were seated within the Conference bar. The congregation then stood and sang, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds", following which the Conference recessed for ten minutes.

When the session reconvened, the report of the Statistician was called for. A motion was carried that only the totals were to be given. The report was accepted with the provision that it be tabled until the Statistician could complete the statistics of the Sunday school reports.

Each local pastor then reported briefly, following which the Conference adjourned by expiration of time.

## Second Session

The second session of the 38th Annual Conference convened at 1:30 p.m., with the singing of, "Take the Name of Jesus With You," by the congregation. Bro. Fred Nash led in prayer. Following a solo, "After", sung by Miss Ruth Parsels, Bro. Thomas commented briefly on the possible shortness of time to labour for the Lord.

The Conference was then addressed by Bro. Thomas on the subject of organization, as based on our Lord's organization of the multitude before the miraculous feeding mentioned in the Gospels. He defined organization as not being life, but as being the direction of life; and also as being an orderly and convenient way of getting things done. We have organization (1) because it is God's order; (2) for fellowship; (3) for establishing permanence of endeavour; and (4) for effectiveness. Principles of efficient organization, as is illustrated by proper use of the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, were listed as follows: (1) Objectives well defined; (2) Proper distribution of responsibilities; (3) Proper delegation of authority; (4) Clear-cut instruction; (5) Faithful observance of instruction; (6) Proper supervision; (7) Proper recognition of authority; (8) Competent counsel; and (9) Proper recognition and consideration of personnel.

A motion to dispense with the roll call for the second session was carried.

Visiting ministers and friends were introduced by Rev. Dorsett as follows: Mrs. P. W. Thomas, Miss Ruth Parsels, Mr. Kalb, Rev. J. T. Austin, Mr. and Mrs. Alderson, and Mrs. Douglas Van Alstine.

The minutes of the first session were read and approved.

The report of the District Examining and Educational Board was given by Rev. Nixon with the following recommendations, which were approved:

Charles Jackson—Third Year District Ministerial License  
Douglas Van Alstine—Second Year District Ministerial License  
Roger Gast—Second Year District Ministerial License  
Ruth Parsels—Ordination as Deaconess

The report of the Resolutions Committee was given, resulting in the following:

No. 1 — adopted

No. 2 — adopted

No. 3 — adopted

No. 4 — adopted with the qualification that it be subject to the stipulations of the Manual.

Then followed a discussion as to the place of the next Annual Conference. Invitations were received from the Proton and the Toronto churches. A motion carried to close the number of invitations given. A ballot vote resulted in a unanimous decision to accept the Proton invitation.

Consideration of the report of the Resolutions Committee continued as follows:

No. 5 — adopted

No. 6 — adopted

No. 7 — adopted

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was given, with the following results after due consideration:

No. 1 — adopted

No. 2 — adopted

No. 3 — adopted

The report of the Committee on Memoirs was given by Rev. Miss Gladys White, and was received by the Conference standing for a moment of silent meditation, after which Bro. Reese was requested to lead in prayer.

Before proceeding with the election of officers, the Chairman offered prayer. The balloting resulted as follows:

District Superintendent — Rev. L. B. Reese

Assistant District Superintendent — Rev. Frank Evans

District Secretary — Rev. T. L. Willingham

District Treasurer — Miss Eileen Baker

The ballot was then cast for Advisory Council Members; while the ballots were being counted, there was a brief recess. Rev. Evans conveyed the greetings of Mrs. H. B. Jackson to the General Superintendent and to the Conference body, and her request that she be remembered in prayer in her illness.

The result of the ballot for Advisory Council Members was as follows:

Rev. Norman Nixon

Rev. Roy Dorsett

Rev. J. W. Bray

The balloting to fill a vacancy on the Examining and Educational Board resulted in the election of Rev. Mrs. Elizabeth Evans.

The Eastern Pilgrim College representative elected was Allan Baker.

In balloting for District Trustees, it was moved and carried that three names be placed on each ballot; the highest vote over the majority would serve three years; the next highest would serve two years; and the third highest would serve one year. The result was as follows:

Rev. Norman Nixon — 3 years

Mr. Clarence Watson — 2 years

Rev. J. W. Bray — 1 year

A motion was then carried to remove the Statistician's report from being tabled. The report was completed and accepted.

The following appointment of committees was reported on by the District Superintendent, and approved by the Conference:

Resolutions Committee—to be the Council

Ways and Means Committee—to be the Council

Loan Fund Committee—Rev. L. B. Reese, Rev. Norman Nixon, and Rev. Frank Evans.

Sunday School Committee—Mr. E. G. Rossiter, Rev. T. L. Willingham

The Conference then recessed until 7:15 p.m.

The Conference reconvened at 7:15 p.m., by the congregation singing, "Blessed Assurance." The alternate delegate from Lion's Head, Mr. Alex Brough, led in prayer.

The minutes of the second session thus far were read and approved.

The Chairman remarked about a number of questions asked him concerning the action taken regarding the Proton Camp Grounds, and requested Rev. Roy Dorsett to give an explanation in an endeavor to clarify the action. Rev. Dorsett complied with a brief explanation.

An announcement of a summer revival campaign to be held in the Proton tabernacle and conducted by the local Proton church was made by Rev. L. B. Reese; he also announced the plans for each local church to make missionary displays at the District Camp at Durham, Ontario.

The recommendation by the Examining and Educational Board for the renewal of deaconess license for Miss Audrey Cole and Mrs. Anne Dunleavy was approved.

In response to a motion concerning the expression of appreciation for the capable leadership and faithful ministry of General Superintendent P. W. Thomas, the Conference body arose, responding with a hearty, "God bless you", at the suggestion of the District Superintendent.

A motion carried for a standing vote of appreciation of the hospitality of the Lion's Head (Ferndale) church.

The Conference was adjourned by motion.



## ORDINATION SERVICE

Following the evening session of the Conference, an ordination service was conducted in the Lion's Head (Ferndale) church, July 5, 1963. Miss Ruth Parsels was ordained as a Deaconess by an Ordination Council consisting of General Superintendent P. W. Thomas and the members of the Council of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada.

### REPORT of the WAYS and MEANS COMMITTEE

RESOLUTION No. 1 — Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$100.00 per month, plus travelling expense at 6c per mile for District Work.

RESOLUTION No. 2—Be it resolved that the District and General Finances be raised as follows: Ten per cent of the regular church offerings, plus the pastor's tithes and fifty per cent of the evangelist's tithes.

RESOLUTION No. 3 — Be it resolved that we receive two special offerings sometime during the church year, to be known as "Quarter-Day Offerings", one offering to be devoted to youth interests of the District, and the other to District Sunday School interests.

### REPORT of the RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE as ADOPTED by the CONFERENCE

RESOLUTION No. 1 — Be it resolved that Standing Resolution No. 9 in the 1962 Conference Journal be amended to read May 31, instead of June 30, and a grace period of 15 days, instead of five days.

RESOLUTION No. 2 — Be it resolved that Standing Resolution No. 5 be deleted from the 1963 Conference Journal.

RESOLUTION No. 3 — Be it resolved that local treasurers send monthly remittances to the District Treasurer by the fifth (5th) of each month

RESOLUTION No. 4 — Be it resolved that the Annual Conference convene on the first Friday of July at 9:00 a.m., subject to the stipulations of the Manual.

RESOLUTION No. 5 — Whereas there is some disagreement concerning the District property at Proton, and  
Whereas it does not appear that the District wishes to continue a Camp there,

Be it therefore resolved that the District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada turn over said property to the Proton Pilgrim Holiness Church, who shall assume all responsibilities of the property known as the Camp Grounds, and that the use of the property be subject to Council approval.

**RESOLUTION No. 6** — Whereas there has been some misunderstanding with regards to improvements to local church property, and Whereas the District has been obligated beyond its means in times past. Be it therefore resolved that no local church involve itself beyond \$500.00 in improvements without the consent of the District Council, and under no circumstances shall the local church involve the District in bearing the expense of local improvements.

**RESOLUTION No. 7** — Be it resolved that all the District Sunday schools use the Royal Sunday School Record book for the secretaries' weekly records of the Sunday school.

## STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. That each local church assist, or pay the equivalent of two days labor for the preparation for the District Camp and Conference when called by the District Superintendent.
2. That each local church supply the parsonage with adequate heating and cooking equipment.
3. That each pastor and the District Superintendent be granted a two-weeks vacation including two Sundays with pay. Pastors who are not on stated salaries shall receive their vacation pay and Camp-meeting Sunday offerings equal to their average weekly offering.
4. That one hundred and fifty copies of the Journal be printed and distributed, cost of same to be met from District Administration.
5. That the District Council act as a District Church Extension Committee and have full authority to appoint Home Missionary pastors, and to select and build on new locations.
6. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint the committees that are to function during the ensuing year.
7. Whereas Dominion and Provincial laws require us to have a head office in order to operate under our charter, be it resolved that such office be located at 312 Oakwood Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, and that the District Superintendent act as manager of such office.
8. That the District Treasurer shall close his books for the year as of May 31,

and that pastors and local treasurers shall have a grace period of fifteen days in which to ensure that all monies received in the Conference year shall be in the Treasurer's hands to be credited as received at that date.

## REPORT of the DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To our General Superintendent, Brother P. W. Thomas, and to the members of the Thirty-eighth Annual Conference of the Pilgrims in Canada, greetings:

The past nine months have been ones of joyful service in the Lord through the great open door of Canada. It has been a real delight to enjoy the fellowship and the spiritual blessings of the Canadian Pilgrims. In every way, I have sought to forget that I am not a native of your country. You, by your generous co-operation and helpful efforts, have made me feel that I am one of you. It is with sincere emotion that I again say that this is home to the Reeses. Each of you has found a place in our hearts, and if you love us half as much as we do each of you, then we shall continue to serve our common Lord together.

In the past months, the big problem has been to obtain a clear understanding of the work of the District, and to endeavor to initiate the methods which will bear fruit in the days to come. Some no doubt have felt that the work has moved slowly, but it is far better to make haste slowly than to make moves that eventually must be rescinded. It is our feeling that before we move out much, we must go deep enough and strengthen our stakes in such a way as to stand future expansion. It would be better to have eight strong churches than to have a host of weaklings unable to mother anything, or to care for anything beyond our own borders.

In the past nine months I have conducted 6 Council meetings, 13 Board meetings, and 7 Annual Church meetings; have written from 175 to 200 letters for District interests; and have preached more than 70 times on the District.

I have sought to co-operate with the General Church by heeding the counsel of my General Superintendent. Time has also been given to each local church and to counseling with the pastors, as well as in calling with them when they so desired. We have a fine set of pastors, and it is our desire to see the pastoral replacements of the work continually kept strong and spiritual.

There are certain objectives and goals toward which we must work, and which we must accomplish if we are to go forward in the work of the church in Canada:

- (1) The superintendent must have support adequate enough that he

will be enabled to give time to the work and not be required to spend so much time off the field. This can be done only in the measure that each local church feels and carries its responsibility without expecting help from our general District funds. Every appeal from the local church for District financial aid lessens this possibility of support for a superintendent. Local churches must be made to realize that they make the District, rather than the District making the local churches. It is my feeling as of now that another year must pass before this end can be attained.

(2) Local churches should begin to put forth efforts to mother new works. Branch Sunday schools and churches are needed, if we are to expand into new fields.

(3) Pastors and workers are limiting the work of God in Canada by a failure to exercise faith. Faith is a conquest. To believe is not to do without, but it is to have our needs supplied and thus to move ahead in the work of our respective fields.

(4) Our reports reveal that too little pastoral visitation is being done on the fields. Can't we do better all along the line in this respect? Could it be that some of our calls are social and not pastoral? It takes more time to make a social visit than it does to make a pastoral call. Then, too, it is not well to become too close to some families with whom one likes to visit, while the rest of the local constituency is neglected.
