CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

First Session

The Thirty-ninth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada convened at the Proton church, July 9, 1964, at 9 a.m. The Conference opened with the singing of "Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah". Rev. L. B. Reese, our Superintendent, requested prayer for Rev. and Mrs. Ron Williams of Massey who lost their baby. Rev. Norman Nixon led the congregation in prayer.

Bro. Reese introduced General Superintendent Melvin H. Snyder, who then read the scripture lesson from Matthew 8:5-13 and Hebrews 11:1-2. He spoke on the sixth miracle found in Matthew 8, that of the Centurion's Faith. His faith was greater than that of Mary, the mother of Jesus or of John. His faith was the greatest of all in Israel. The Centurion (1) exercised a profound humility, (2) exercised a profound love and (3) recognized constituted authority.

The roll was called and proper revisions made.

The Conference bar was designated to be in the middle section of pews. Mrs. E. G. Rossiter was granted an honorary seat in the Conference. A motion was carried that all alternate delegates present would be granted honorary seats within the bar.

The time of sessions was set by motion as follows: 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and from 2:00 p.m. until the completion of business.

The report of Superintendent Rev. L. B. Reese was given, and was accepted with appreciation, manifested by all saying "amen".

The Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. Frank Evans, gave an oral report which was accepted with hearty "amens".

The District Treasurer, Miss Eileen Baker, then gave her report. It was moved and carried that her report be accepted with a rising vote of thanks.

A brief explanation of the plan for raising funds for the fall ministerial meeting was given by Bro. Reese.

The following committees were appointed by the Superintendent:

**Resolutions Committee:** Rev. Don Rossiter, Rev. Norman Nixon, Rev. Miss Gladys White.

**Ways and Means Committee:** Rev. Frank Evans, Rev. Ted Willingham, Mr. William Bowden, Rev. Charles Jackson.

**Church Extension Loan Fund:** Rev. L. B. Reese, Rev. Norman Nixon, Rev. Frank Evans.

**Sunday School Committee:** Mrs. Elizabeth Evans, Mr. E. G. Rossiter, Rev. Ted Willingham.

Pastor's reports from the following charges were given briefly: Dyer's Bay, Lion's Head, Proton Station, Strathroy and Toronto, following which the conference adjourned by expiration of time.

## Second Session

The second session of the 39th Annual Conference convened at 2 p.m. with the singing of "Dwelling in Beulah Land" and "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart" by the congregation. Special request for prayer was made for Dr. and Mrs. Ivan Jackson. Mr. Ed Rossiter led in prayer.

Minutes of the first session were read and approved.

Report of the Resolutions Committee was given. Motion was made and carried that Resolution No. 1 from Standing Resolutions in the Minutes be deleted.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee was given, which resulted in the adoption of Resolution No. 4.

Motion was made and carried as follows:

That this Conference go on record, that inasmuch as some church groups and denominations are initiating a strong and liberal movement to discredit the divine inspiration of the Scriptures, we do hereby affirm our position with respect to the plenary inspiration of the sixty-six books of the divine Word of God, commonly called the Holy Bible or translated by the King James Version, and be it also known that we do hereby affirm our full endorsement of all doctrines of the Pilgrim Holiness Church as set forth in the Manual.

The District Examining and Education Board report was given by Mrs. Elizabeth Evans with the following recommendations, which were approved:

Don Rossiter—First Year Ministerial License

Douglas Van Alstine—Renewal of Second Year License

Roger Gast—transferred to the Michigan District

Mrs. Ann Dunleavy—Renewal of Deaconess License

Miss Audrey Cole—Renewal of Deaconess License

The report of the Committee on Memoirs was given by Reverend Miss Gladys White and was received by the Conference standing for silent meditation, after which General Superintendent Snyder prayed.

A motion was made and carried that the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada be willing to allow their Superintendent, Reverend L. B. Reese to be also the District Superintendent of the New York District.

The balloting resulted as follows:

Assistant District Superintendent—Reverend Frank Evans

District Secretary—Reverend Ron W. Williams

District Treasurer—Miss Eileen Baker

Advisory Members—Reverend Norman Dixon, Reverend Ted Willingham,  
Mr. William Bowden.

Brother Norman Nixon by acclamation was elected to the Examining Board.

Reverend J. W. Bray by acclamation was elected District Trustee.

The Superintendent L. B. Reese made the following appointment: Statistician, Mrs. Ruth H. Brunson; Memoirs, Rev. Miss Gladys White.

Motion was made and carried that the District Committees meet the day prior to Conference and be prepared to give a copy of Resolutions made to the members of the Conference before the morning session.

A motion was made and carried that the pastors consult with the Superintendent before engaging a worker for a week end meeting or a revival.

A motion was made and carried that the District Council take care of all unfinished business.

It was agreed to give to the Council authority to approve the Minutes of the last session.

Motion was made and carried that we express appreciation to the Proton Pilgrim Holiness Church for their hospitality.

A motion was made and carried for a rising standing vote to show our appreciation to our presiding General Superintendent Snyder.

The conference was adjourned by a motion.

## WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

**RESOLUTION No. 1**—Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$100.00 per month, plus travelling expense at 6c per mile for District Work.

**RESOLUTION No. 2**—Be it resolved that the District and General Finances be raised as follows: Ten per cent of the regular church offerings, plus the pastor's tithe and fifty per cent of the evangelist's tithe.

**RESOLUTION No. 3**—Be it resolved that we receive two special offerings sometime during the church year, to be known as "Quarter-Day Offerings", one offering to be devoted to youth interests of the District, and the other to District Sunday School interests.

**RESOLUTION No. 4**—Be it resolved that each church raise the equivalent of 50c per member each year in order to set up an International Delegate's Fund, and that the balance needed be taken from special district project offering which is taken up at the annual district camp meeting.

## STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. That the district treasurer shall close his books for the year as of May 31, and that pastors and local treasurers shall have a grace period of 15 days in which to ensure that all monies received in the conference year shall be in the treasurer's hands to be credited as received at that date.

2. Be it resolved that local treasurers send monthly remittances to the district treasurer by the fifth (5) of each month.
3. Be it resolved that the annual conference convene on the first Friday of July at 9:00 a.m., subject to the stipulations of the Manual.
4. Whereas there is some disagreement concerning the District property at Proton and,  
Whereas it does not appear that the District wishes to continue a camp there,  
Be it therefore resolved that the District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada turn over said property to the Proton Pilgrim Holiness Church, who shall assume all responsibilities of the property known as the Camp Grounds, and that the use of the property be subject to Council approval.
5. Whereas there has been some misunderstanding with regards to improvements to local church property, and  
Whereas the District has been obligated beyond its means in times past,  
Be it therefore resolved that no local church involve itself beyond \$500.00 in improvements without the consent of the District Council, and under no circumstances shall the local church involve the District in bearing the expense of local improvements.
6. Be it resolved that all the District Sunday Schools use the Royal Sunday School Record book for the secretary's weekly records of the Sunday school.
7. That each local church supply the parsonage with adequate heating and cooking equipment.
8. That each pastor and the District Superintendent be granted a two-week's vacation including Sundays with pay. Pastors who are not on stated salaries shall receive their vacation pay and Camp-meeting Sunday offerings equal to their average weekly offering.
9. That one hundred and fifty copies of the Journal be printed and distributed, cost of same to be met from District Administration.
10. That the District Council act as a District Church Extension Committee and have full authority to appoint Home Missionary pastors, and to select and build on new locations.
11. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint the committees that are to function during the ensuing year.
12. Whereas Dominion and Provincial laws require us to have a head office in order to operate under our charter, be it resolved that such office be located at 312 Oakwood Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, and that the District Superintendent act as manager of such office.
13. That the District Treasurer shall close his books as of May 31, and that pastors and local treasurers shall have a grace period of fifteen days in which to ensure that all monies received in the Conference year shall be in the Treasurer's hands to be credited as received at that date.



## REPORT of the SUPERINTENDENT

To our General Superintendent, Rev. Melvin Snyder, and to the members of the Thirty-ninth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada, greetings:

It is with real joy that I make this report to you. In the light of all circumstances I have sought faithfully to carry out my duties with respect to the work of superintendent among our churches and in cooperation with the program of the General Church.

The following is a report of the labors of the past year: I have preached forty-eight times among our Canadian Pilgrims; during the year I have led nine prayer meetings; and it has been my pleasure to have taught several Sunday School classes. At the instigation of the Council, I taught Bible Class in our 1963 Camp, and assisted in a Short Course for Christian Workers held in the Toronto church. I have investigated possibilities in prospect of opening some new churches. I conducted four Council meetings and held seven business meetings with the local churches. At the request of the Council, I held the Ministerial meeting at Toronto. In connection with the work in Canada, I have travelled five thousand miles. I have assisted in the preparations for reopening the work at Durham, and have written over one hundred-fifty letters in carrying out the duties of my office.

In view of the limitations and frailties of the human flesh, no one is more keenly aware of my deficiencies than I. However, the work of Canada is a constant source of joy and delight to me. Each of you has a special place in my heart, and your spiritual welfare is a continual burden and concern in my prayers.

Some of the procedure which the Council and I have sought to follow may warrant some explanations. First, it has seemed wise to endeavour to build up the image of the parent body, both on a General level and also with respect to our Canadian Administration. The unity of our churches is our strength. To act and exist as independent churches will ultimately destroy us, and will lead to immediate stalemate in our Canadian work. To encourage our dependence on one another, the following steps have been taken:

(1) Keeping pastors and churches aware of the over-all programs by means of letters and contacts; (2) having the Conference in local churches apart from our Camp; (3) having the Ministerial meetings in different churches in order that each church may profit thereby; (4) endeavouring to bring pastors closer together by various means. It is our plan to have some devotional times and retreats for the ministers alone. As an illustration of this, we are expecting all of the pastors to come together at Lion's Head prior to Camp, Thursday noon, August 27, for fasting, prayer, etc., in behalf of the Camp.

Necessity has made it imperative that I be out of Canada considerable time. We have had no parsonage for the superintendent. You can see that I have had some additional expense in obtaining a home. If all continues as is, this will not be so necessary in the not-too-distant future.

However, it might be well to consider the fact that the evangelistic field has kept us with a constant source of supply for pastoral replacements. God has given us some of the best of pastors, and it shall be my continual desire and expectancy to have the best.

Dear brethren, it seems to me that churches are born—not simply organized. It is easy to get in a hurry to organize churches, and with it create problems which will many times lead to "defeatism". If Zion travails, she shall bring forth.

Perhaps the greatest goal, and the policy which should have priority, is that our churches need more spiritual "thrust". We want more of the evident dynamic of the Spirit in our midst. Our desire and effort should be to obtain pastors who will always have a message. All our people and our adherents should come to church assured "that they can look up and be fed". In view of these policies, I shall continue as long as I am in this office to be concerned with the spiritual history more than with any statistical report. A spiritual "thrust" will produce its own statistical report.

In conclusion: God gave us a good Camp last year. This should be an annual goal. To this end, I charge all our pastors to set aside each of the ensuing weekly prayer-meetings with definite prayer-emphasis for the coming Camp until it convenes on August 29th.

Sister Mercer was a staunch and shining Pilgrim whose ringing and triumphant testimony was unfailing through her many years among us, and continued an inspiration to all who visited her even during her last declining months. Thanks be unto God who always causeth us to triumph through our Lord Jesus was her blessed experience.

In loving memory of Sister Margaret Downs who got back to the Lord, joined the Strathroy Pilgrim Holiness Church, and lived in victory until her call home a few months later.

In loving remembrance of Brother Isaiah Waugh, adherent of the Lion's Head Church who found blessed release from earthly suffering when called into eternal rest on April 5, 1964, in his eighty-eighth year. Brother Waugh's spirit triumphed over physical blindness and great pain, as he witnessed for his Saviour to those about him and exhorted them to prepare for eternity.

In loving remembrance of Brother Ed Watson of the Durham Church, who was called to heavenly service on Friday, July 3, 1964, in his eighty-fourth year. Brother Watson is remembered as one of the first converts in our early tent meetings in Durham, one for whom God wrought a miraculous transformation in his heart and in his home. He became God's policeman for us those early days when the Pilgrims enjoyed a little persecution. His daily life in the Nursing Home impressed the inmates that he lived for and served his Lord and others.

In loving memory of Brother William Fleming, husband of a good member in the Bruce Mines Church. Though of a very retiring nature and of late years too ill to attend church, Brother Fleming had the confidence of those who knew him concerning the reality of his Christian experience.

In loving memory of Brother Dan McFarlane, probationary member of the Bruce Mines Church, suddenly called to meet the Lord in the spring of 1964. Brother McFarlane, very hospitable to the visiting pastors, prayed and found the Lord on one of these visits and soon declared his faith.

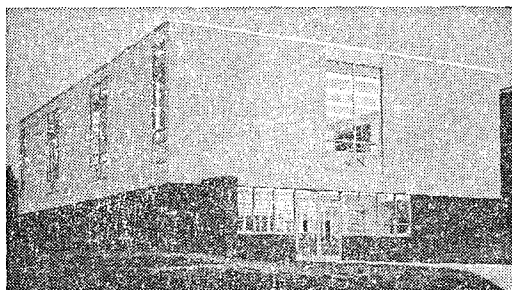

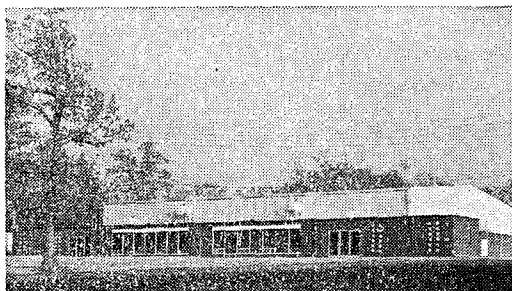
