# CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

## First Session

The Fortieth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada convened at the Strathroy Church, July 2, 1965, at 9:00 a.m. The Conference opened with the singing of "Onward Christian Soldiers," led by the host Pastor, Rev. Jerry Harding. Rev. Frank Evans led the congregation in prayer.

The Mayor of Strathroy, Mr. G. McDonald, and the President of the local Ministerial Association, Rev. Bruce Robertson, brought greetings of welcome to the Conference. Rev. L. B. Reese replied and called for a short recess.

The Conference re-convened as General Superintendent Melvin H. Snyder called for a brief report of the Examining and Educational Board. This report recommended that Jerry Harding and Mrs. Williams be ordained to the ministry and to the office of a deaconess respectively. After the Conference had approved this recommendation Rev. Snyder addressed the Congregation from I Tim. 4:16, pointing out the (1) Word of Warning, (2) Word of Exhortation, and (3) Word of Promise. He then proceeded with the ordination service. The presence of the Lord was very real at this time.

After a song, Rev. L. B. Reese, District Superintendent, introduced the General Superintendent. In taking the Chair, Rev. Snyder addressed the Conference briefly on the importance of doing business for God.

The Conference Roll was established with 13 Ministerial and 6 lay delegates.

It was moved and seconded that the Conference bar be set as the second, third and fourth pews, including the platform, on each side of the church; and that the session times be 9:00 a.m. to 12:15; 2:00 p.m. till 5:30 p.m. Carried.

A motion prevailed that Mrs. Reese be seated as the Lion's Head delegate.

The District Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, and Treasurer's reports were presented to the Conference. Motion prevailed that these reports be accepted.

A motion carried that a Home Missionary Fund of \$100.00 be placed at the disposition of the Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent and Treasurer.

The first session adjourned by expiration of time.

## Second Session

The second session of the Fortieth Annual Conference convened at 2:00 p.m. by singing "Stand up for Jesus." Mr. Wm. Bowden led the congregation in prayer.

The minutes of the first session were read and approved.

The report of the Statistician was presented. It was moved and carried that only the totals be read. The report was received with appreciation.

It was moved and carried that we refer the CYC program to the Council with power to act.

The Sunday School Promotional Secretary, Mrs. E. Evans, presented her report, which was received with a rising vote of thanks.

The report of the Memoirs Committee was read and received with a moment for silent prayer and meditation, after which Gen. Supt. Snyder led in prayer.

The Examining and Educational Board recommended the following:

C. Jackson — Third Year Licence.

D. Rossiter — First Year Licence.

A. Cole — Deaconess Licence.

A. Dunleavy — Deaconess Licence.

Moved and seconded that these recommendations be accepted. Carried.

Moved and carried that Ron Shepstone be granted First Year Licence.

The Resolutions Committee presented the following business:

Moved and seconded that the following resolution be presented as a Memorial to General Conference:

INASMUCH as it is evident that there are so many false teachings today regarding the person of the devil, and that it is important for the believer to have a clear statement of belief regarding this person, and whereas this does not appear as a part of the doctrinal statement of the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, let the following be presented to the General Conference for inclusion in said Manual:

The teachings of the Word of God clearly indicate that the devil is a person.  
The source of evil is personal, not mere influence.  
He has great power, is called the prince of the powers of the air. Lk. 4:6; Acts 26:18; Jn. 12:31; 14:30; 16:11.  
He is limited in his activity. I Cor. 10:13.  
He has myriads of angels and demons to assist him. Mk. 5:9; 16:9; I Tim. 4:1.  
He may come as an angel of light. Mt. 4:6; II Cor. 2:11.  
He attempts to thwart God's law and work. Zec. 3:1.  
He must be resisted. Eph. 4:27; 6:11; Jas. 4:7; I Pet. 5:8, 9.  
He tempts to disobedience, Gen. 3:4,5; inflicts disease, Jb. 2:7; lies, Jn. 8:44; preys upon man, I Pet. 5:8.  
He shall eventually be cast into the lake of fire, Rev. 19:20; 20:10. Carried.

Moved and carried that the following resolutions be adopted:  
BE IT RESOLVED that the District publish a paper in the interest of the Churches; said paper to be known as the "Sentinel"; to be published monthly, at the subscription rate of \$1.00 per annum.

BE IT RESOLVED that the District Conference Journal record the number of "Sentinel" subscriptions from each local Church.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada open a new Church in the Bramalea area.

Moved and carried that this resolution be amended to read: that the District Council explore the possibilities of such a move.

The Ways and Means Committee presented the following resolutions:  
BE IT RESOLVED that we receive two special offerings during the Church year to be known as "Quarter Day Offerings." One offering to be devoted to youth interests of the District, to be received during National Youth Week. The other offering to be devoted to the District Sunday School interests, to be received the Sunday preceding Rally Day. Carried.

BE IT RESOLVED that a special Home Missionary offering be received at Camp, to be used according to the advice of the District Council. Carried.

BE IT RESOLVED that each church raise the equivalent of 50¢ per member each year in order to set up an International Delegates' Fund, and that the balance needed be taken from special offering which is taken up at the annual district camp meeting. Carried.

The Conference recessed.

The General Superintendent called the Conference to order and proceeded with the elections.

The balloting resulted as follows:  
District Superintendent ..... Rev. L. B. Reese (2 years).  
Assistant Superintendent ... Rev. Frank Evans.  
District Secretary ..... Rev. R. W. Williams.  
District Treasurer ..... Miss Eileen Baker.  
Advisory members ..... Rev. Norman Nixon, Rev. Ted Willingham, Mr. William Bowden.

A motion prevailed that the name receiving the highest ballot shall be the ministerial delegate to General Conference, and the second and third highest be alternates.

The balloting resulted in Rev. Ted Willingham's election as delegate and Rev. Frank Evans as alternate.

Moved and seconded that the matter of the second delegate be referred to the council. Carried.

Mr. William Bowden was elected as lay delegate and the Chairman ruled that Mr. Hector

Mayers be alternate delegate.

Rev. Frank Evans was elected to the Educational and Examining Board for a three-year term.

Motion prevailed that the Council take care of all unfinished business.

Motion prevailed that the Council approve the Conference Minutes.

Moved and seconded that the Council take care of the second alternate delegate. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the Steering Committee take the place of the Resolutions and Ways and Means Committees Carried.

Moved and seconded that the Council accept one of the invitations for the 1966 Conference. Carried.

Moved and carried by an unanimous vote that Clarence Watson fill the office of a District Trustee for a three-year term.

Moved and seconded that we express our appreciation to the Strathroy Church and the General Superintendent by a rising vote of thanks.

Moved and seconded that Conference Adjourn. Carried.

## WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

**RESOLUTION No. 1** — Be it resolved that we receive two special offerings during the Church year to be known as "Quarter Day offerings." One offering to be devoted to youth interests of the District, to be received during National Youth Week. The other offering to be devoted to the District Sunday School interests, to be received the Sunday preceding Rally Day.

**RESOLUTION No. 2** — Be it resolved that a special Home Missionary offering be received at Camp, to be used according to the advice of the District Council.

**RESOLUTION No. 3** — Be it resolved that each church raise the equivalent of 50¢ per member each year in order to set up an International Delegates' Fund, and that balance needed be taken from special offering which is taken up at the annual district camp meeting.

## STANDING RESOLUTIONS

- 1 That the district treasurer shall close his books for the year as of May 31, and that pastors and local treasurers shall have a grace period of 15 days in which to ensure that all monies received in the conference year shall be in the treasurer's hands to be credited as received at that date.
2. Be it resolved that local treasurers send monthly remittances to the district treasurer by the fifth (5) of each month.
3. Be it resolved that the annual conference convene on the first Friday of July at 9:00 a.m., subject to the stipulations of the Manual.
4. Whereas there is some disagreement concerning the District property at Proton and, Whereas it does appear that the District wishes to continue a camp there, Be it therefore resolved that the District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada turn over said property to the Proton Pilgrim Holiness Church, who shall assume all responsibilities of the property known as the Camp Grounds, and that the use of the property be subject to Council approval.
5. Whereas there has been some misunderstanding with regards to improvements to local church property, and Whereas the District has been obligated beyond its means in times past, Be it therefore resolved that no local church involve itself beyond \$500.00 in improvements without the consent of the District Council, and under no circumstances shall the local church in-



- volve the District in bearing the expense of local improvements.
6. Be it resolved that all the District Sunday Schools use the Royal Sunday School Record book for the secretary's weekly records of the Sunday school.
  7. That each local church supply the parsonage with adequate heating and cooking equipment.
  8. That each pastor and the District Superintendent be granted a two-weeks' vacation including Sundays with pay. Pastors who are not on stated salaries shall receive their vacation pay and Camp-meeting Sunday offerings equal to their average weekly offering.
  9. That one hundred and fifty copies of the Journal be printed and distributed, cost of same to be met from District Administration.
  10. That the District Council act as a District Church Extension Committee and have full authority to appoint Home Missionary pastors, and to select and build on new locations.
  11. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint the committees that are to function during the ensuing year.
  12. Whereas Dominion and Provincial laws require us to have a head office in order to operate under our charter, be it resolved that such office be located at 312 Oakwood Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, and that the District Superintendent act as manager of such office.
  13. That the District publish a paper in the interest of the Churches; said paper to be known as the "Sentinel"; to be published monthly, at the subscription rate of \$1.00 per annum.
  14. That the District Conference Journal record the number of "Sentinel" subscriptions from each local Church.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

To the members of the Fortieth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada, and to General Superintendent, Rev. Melvin H. Snyder, greetings:

It is with mingled feelings of joy and gratitude that I make this, my third, report to this Conference. God has been gracious to us in multiplied ways across the preceding months. We are now in a position to assess our objectives and to look at the road which lies plainly ahead.

As your superintendent, I am reporting the following items relative to the duties of the past year:

(1) In the performance of this office, over 10,000 miles have been travelled within the Canadian borders, and in attending necessary meetings, such as a trip to the Church Leaders' Conference at Indianapolis; two area meetings; two Eastern Pilgrim College Board meetings; and the combined Canada-New York ministerial meeting at Rochester.

(2) I have preached twenty times on the District, besides holding a Short Course at Toronto, and giving Bible Studies at the annual Camp held at Durham.

(3) In conducting the business of the District, I have attended one Conference; two Council meetings; seven business meetings in local churches; and have presided at two board meetings.

(4) In addition to the above, I have preached in four camps, have conducted two revival meetings, and have written numerous letters in connection with my duties.

Some of the objectives which were set for this past year have been accomplished.

(1) Our Sunday Schools in the main have shown growth and a healthier condition. This can be said to be a wonderful accomplishment on the part of our pastors who have worked hard and faithfully to see this end attained. It is a great satisfaction to me to see how both MASSEY and BRUCE MINES have gained in their Sunday School this year under the dedicated effort of the Shepstones and the Shaws respectively.

(2) PROTON has been on the move under the faithful labors of its pastor, Bro. Williams. The people have nobly responded in pushing the total liquidation of several hundred dollars indebtedness which they had. In addition, this church has rallied around their pastor and have helped him pay for the repair of his car recently. My personal thanks to all of the Proton brethren who have had a part in these accomplishments.

(3) LION'S HEAD made a number of needed parsonage repairs. During the several weeks' illness of Bro. Willingham, both the local church and the other churches of the

District helped to carry a share of the burden

(4) DURHAM was re-opened and has made steady gains under the leadership of Don Rossiter. Paint, carpentry, sacrifice, and labor in general have shown that the re-opening of the work at Durham could be accomplished. We look to the future for a strong church in that community. Let us continue to give them a helping hand whenever possible, and trust that another year will see many more victories in Durham.

(5) DYER'S BAY recently took some steps forward at the time of their annual meeting. The church decided to give the pastor a stipulated amount on his support. This was a good step in the right direction.

(6) STRATHROY has accepted the challenge of full support for their pastor, and has made good headway under the leadership of the Hardings. The accomplishments of this church are proving that our faith and confidence were not misplaced. The loss of the Brunsons has been a great one for the Strathroy church, and we must still pray and do what we can to see this church strengthened to a point of definite outreach.

(7) TORONTO continues to carry a substantial load of the District work. We appreciate how nobly this church has stood by the work at Durham with their interest and support.

In view of the above, it would seem that we should move out in certain areas of our work in Canada. In evaluating the past year, and in focusing our attention on what needs to be done in the future, let us seek to set some new goals for the coming year

(1) If we move ahead, we must be realistic in looking at the changing world around us. One very obvious fact is that ours is a cosmopolitan and metropolitan society. Travel methods have left us no boundaries. Provincialism is outmoded, and we must think in terms of modern conveniences. The church which has only a local perspective is a dying church. The world is at our door, and we must have a local outreach to meet this growing challenge. It is no longer a facetious statement that our small communities are the suburbs of the nearest metropolis. Blind indeed is the person who cannot see that the world has come to our very door, and that we must meet the challenge. Cosmopolitan sainthood is a predestination, and we must accept it realistically. No longer can we cloister ourselves in our little communities and say, "Let the rest of the world go by." We are debtors to give to every man the gospel in the same measure we have received it.

(2) We need a forward-looking building program across our Canadian work. Without grace in his heart, many a stranger would turn from some of our churches because of the lack of appeal in the appearance of the buildings. Some of our parsonage buildings need to be improved in order to measure up to a minimum of the demand of our present-day living standards

(3) Our pastors should be receiving salaries adequate for their needs. With cars to buy, with the necessity of having presentable clothing, with books to purchase, and with many other items of hidden-tax nature, the needs of our pastors should be carefully considered by each local constituency. It is my feeling that the minimum wage on our District should be \$50.00 per week, plus parsonage and utilities. Will our churches accept this goal? It can be done. Remember that our pastors have no property, no homes, or much in the way of other tangibles by which to secure their future. The least that we can do is to supply their current needs.

(4) We should make a strong effort this year to start a new church in a metropolitan centre. The day of rural churches is past. Thousands of dollars will be needed in any metropolitan area. What will you do in this regard? This outreach is not the responsibility of your superintendent alone, but this is a task for the united efforts of all of us.

(5) The plans of your District Administration officers for the coming year will include efforts toward seeing the spiritual tone of the local churches elevated. Worldly trends shall be strongly censured, as it is felt that we must get back to our original status in this area. Your District Administration personnel pledge themselves to prosecute the procedures and regulations of the Manual and the Church in every particular.

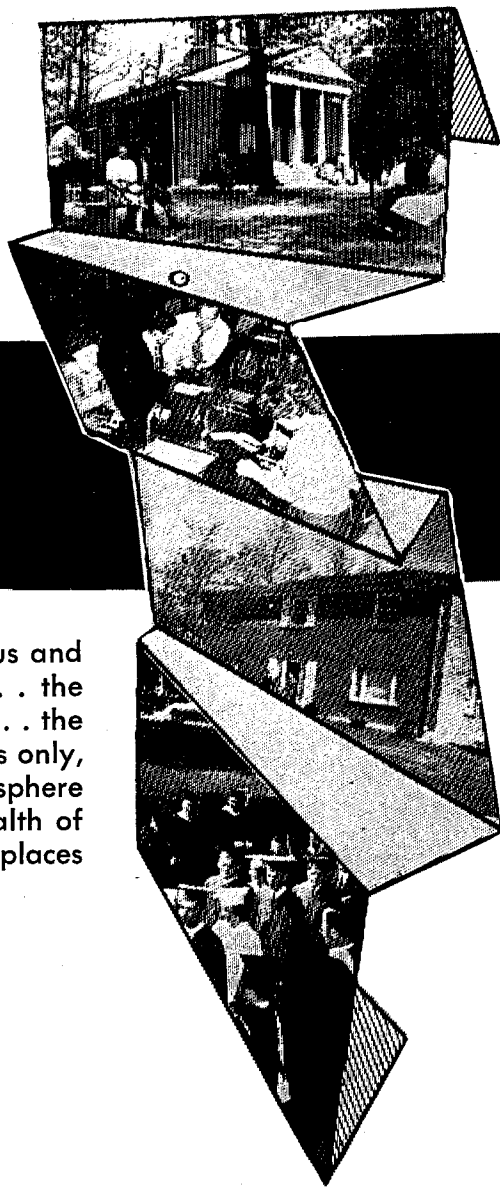
