CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SESSION

The Forty-second Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada convened at the Ferndale Church on July 5, 1967 at 9:00 a.m. The conference joined in the singing of "A Charge to Keep I Have" led by Rev. R. Dorsett. Rev. Miller, Church Extension Secretary, led in prayer.

The District Superintendent Rev. Reese introduced General Superintendent Paul F. Elliott, who brought greetings from the General Board. Greetings were also extended to the Conference from Rev. and Mrs. Miller.

Rev. Harding was appointed as secretary pro-tem in the absence of the District Secretary.

The Chairman called for the reading of the roll.

The Conference Bar was set for the first four rows in the church and the platform. Rev. Willingham was appointed as a Reception Committee, and introduced Rev. and Mrs. Miller, Rev. Dorsett, Rev. Joseph Jackson, and Mrs. Bray, who were all granted honorary seats in the Conference Bar.

It was moved that the conference sessions be as follows: 9 - 11:45 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. until adjournment.

The report of District Superintendent Reese was given, at which time he reported that he was not allowing his name to come up again this year for the district office. The report was received by a rising vote of appreciation and hearty amens for his labors of the past five years as District Superintendent.

The Auditor's report was given and received.

The District Treasurer's Report was given. Motion prevailed that the \$200 note which Massey owes to the District be cancelled. The treasurer's report was accepted.

There was a motion that the statistical report be completed as soon as possible, given to the Council for approval, and included into the Journal. Seconded and carried.

The Missionary Society President's report was given and received.

The Sunday School Promotional Secretary's report was given and received.

It was moved, seconded, and carried that the Conference congratulate Strathroy on their achievement of winning the Division C First place award in the denominational March to Sunday School in March contest.

The Memoirs Committee report was given and received by the Conference rising and bowing for a period of silence after which Rev. Reese led in prayer.

It was moved and seconded that words of greetings from the Conference be sent to Rev. A. B. Lawrence. Carried.

The Steering Committee reported.

RESOLUTION NO. 1 — Be it resolved that we receive two special offerings during the church year to be known as "Quarter Day Offerings". One offering to be devoted to youth interests of the District, to be received during the National Youth Week. The other offering to be devoted to District Sunday School interests, to be received at a time convenient to the local church. Adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 2 — Be it resolved that a special Home Missionary offering be received at Camp, to be used according to the advice of the District Council. Adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 3 — Be it resolved that each church raise the equivalent of \$1.50 per member each year in order to set up an International Delegates Fund, and that the balance needed be taken from the special offering taken up at the annual District Camp Meeting. Adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 4 — Be it resolved that each church have as a goal a minimum of \$50.00 per week, plus parsonage and utilities to be paid to the pastors of this District, and that, if it is necessary, that the pastor be allowed to work to make it up to \$50.00 per week plus \$10.00 per child by holding meetings or by manual labour. Adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 5 — Be it resolved that a Camp Treasurer be appointed by the Camp Committee yearly to handle all camp funds. Adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 6 — Be it resolved that 10% of regular church offerings, Pastor's tithe, and ½ of evangelist's tithe, received in local church be used for District Administration Expense. Adopted.

Dr. Elliott presented an explanation of the status of a Home Missionary District. A discussion followed with Bro. Elliott and Bro. Miller answering a number of questions presented from the conference. These questions and the discussion arose from a motion carried by the District Council which reads:

INASMUCH as the Canada District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church is as small as any Home Missionary District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and in view of the fact that the Central Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada is a Home Missionary District, and due to the fact that the General Churches are uniting; therefore we, the Ontario District Council of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, request permission to become a Home Missionary District again. This proposal was accepted by the General Board of the Church.

Rev. Dorsett, honorary member of the bar, was given the opportunity of speaking to the matter.

It was moved and seconded that the Conference approve the action of the Council taken on April 28, 1967.

It was moved and seconded that the motion be tabled until the afternoon session and that it appear as the first order of business. Carried.

Rev. Spearman, Conference President of the Central Canada Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, was introduced to the Conference and brought words of greetings. He was granted an honorary seat in the Conference Bar.

Meeting was adjourned because of a lapse of time. Bro. Elliott closed in prayer.

SECOND SESSION

The second session of the Forty-second Annual Conference convened at 2:00 p.m. Dale Shaw led the congregation in prayer.

The minutes of the previous session were approved as read.

A motion carried concerning the council action of April 28, 1967. The action by the council requested permission of the General Church to revert to a Home Missionary District. This action was approved.

Rev. J. S. A. Spearman, Conference President of the Central Canada Wesleyan Methodist Conference, was officially appointed, by the Church Extension Secretary under authority of the General Board, as District Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada.

The following recommendations of the Examining Committee were approved:

Dale Shaw for second year District License.

Charles Jackson for third year District License.

The need for a Comity Committee to be established for the work toward merger was explained by Dr. Elliott. It was moved and seconded that the District Council act in this capacity. Carried.

A report from the Steering Committee presented Resolution No. 7 to the conference bar. It was adopted.

It was suggested that a study of the school situation be placed in the hands of the Comity Committee. This had special reference to the Reformed Baptist School in New Brunswick.

The Spearman family were introduced and given honorary seats in the Conference Bar.

The Chair called for elections.

Rev. G. L. Harding was elected District Secretary.

Miss E. Baker was elected as District Treasurer.

Dr. Ivan Jackson and Rev. N. Nixon were elected to the District Council as advisory members.

Rev. Nixon was elected to a three year term on the Examining and Educational Board.

Mrs. B. Nixon was elected as District Missionary Society President.

It was moved, seconded, and carried that District Council make the appointments of P.E.L.T. Leader and C.Y.C. Director.

It was moved that the secretary cast a unanimous ballot for Rev. J. W. Bray for District Trustee for another year. Seconded and carried.

In the election of Ministerial and Lay Delegates to the General and Merging Conference, it was moved, seconded, and carried that the next highest become the alternates.

After two ballots, Rev. Norman Nixon was elected as the Ministerial Delegate with Rev. T. L. Willingham as second alternate, and Rev. F. Evans as third alternate.

Mr. William Bowden was elected as Lay Delegate with Dr. Ivan Jackson as alternate.

Brother Elliott informed the Conference that the Merging Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church and the Wesleyan Methodist Church would convene on June 25, 1968 at Warner Auditorium, Anderson, Indiana. There will be 648 delegates (324 lay and 324 ministerial).

Motion prevailed that Rev. Harding be sent by the District as a fraternal delegate to the Annual Conference of the Central Canada Wesleyan Methodist Church.

Brother Elliott presented a few closing remarks on the merger.

The congregation sang "Bless Be the Tie that Binds."

It was moved, seconded, and carried that the next Annual Conference be held in Toronto on July 19, 1968.

A rising vote of thanks was extended to Dr. Elliott, Rev. Miller, Rev. Spearman, and Rev. Reese.

It was moved and seconded that council review and approve the minutes of this session. Carried.

Session was adjourned.

RESOLUTIONS FROM THE STEERING COMMITTEE

Resolution No. 1 — Be it resolved that we receive two special offerings during the church year to be known as "Quarter Day Offerings". One offering to be devoted to youth interests of the District, to be received during the National Youth Week. The other offering to be devoted to District Dundas School interests, to be received at a time convenient to the local church. Adopted.

Resolution No. 2 — Be it resolved that a special Home Missionary offering be received at Camp, to be used according to the advice of the District Council. Adopted.

Resolution No. 3 — Be it resolved that each church raise the equivalent of \$1.50 per member each year in order to set up an International Delegates Fund, and that the balance needed be taken from the special offering taken up at the Annual District Camp Meeting. Adopted.

Resolution No. 4 — Be it resolved that each church have as a goal a minimum of \$50.00 per week, plus parsonage and utilities to be paid to the pastors of this District, and that, if it is necessary, that the pastor be allowed to work to make it up to \$50.00 per week plus \$10.00 per child by holding meetings or by manual labour. Adopted.

Resolution No. 5 — Be it resolved that a Camp Treasurer be appointed by the Camp Committee yearly to handle all camp funds. Adopted.

Resolution No. 6 — Be it resolved that 10% of regular church offerings, Pastor's tithe, and ½ of evangelist's tithe, received in local church be used for District Administration Expense. Adopted.

Resolution No. 7 — Whereas the District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada on July 5, 1963, passed a resolution (No. 5) handing the property of the Bible School and Camp Grounds at Proton to the Pilgrim Holiness local church at Proton. Be it resolved that the trustees of the Proton Church be authorized to hold in their names all lands in the village of Proton now in their names, or in the name of the Ontario District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada, or in the name of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada; and be it further resolved that this Conference agrees to the execution and delivery of such deeds and other documents as may be necessary to give effect to this resolution. Adopted.

It is moved and seconded that General Superintendent Elliott explain to the Conference Body the implications and benefits of becoming a Home Missionary District; and that the Conference Body be allowed the privilege of voting on the matter. Carried.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. That the district treasurer shall close his books for the year as of May 31, and that pastors and local treasurers shall have a grace period of 15 days in which to ensure that all monies received in the conference year shall be in the treasurer's hands to be credited as received at that date.

2. Be it resolved that local treasurers send monthly remittances to the district treasurer by the fifth (5) of each month.

3. Be it resolved that the annual conference convene on the first Friday of July at 9:00 a.m. subject to the stipulations of the Manual.

4. Whereas there has been some misunderstanding with regards to improvements to local church property and

Whereas the District has been obligated beyond its means in times past, Be it therefore resolved that no local church involve itself beyond \$500.00 in improvements without the consent of the District Council, and under no circumstances shall the local church involve the District in bearing the expense of local improvements.

5. Be it resolved that all the District Sunday Schools use the Royal Sunday School Record book for the secretary's weekly records of the Sunday school.

6. That each local church supply the parsonage with adequate heating and cooking equipment.

7. That each pastor and the District Superintendent be granted a two-weeks' vacation including Sundays with pay. Pastors who are not on stated salaries shall receive their vacation pay and Camp-meeting Sunday offerings equal to their average weekly offering.

8. That two hundred (200) copies of the Journal be printed and distributed, cost of same to be met from District Administration.

9. That the District Council act as a District Church Extension Committee and have full authority to appoint Home Missionary Pastors, and to select and build on new locations.

10. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint the committees that are to function during the ensuing year.

11. Whereas Dominion and Provincial laws require us to have a head office in order to operate under our charter, be it resolved that such office be located at 312 Oakwood Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, and that the District Superintendent act as manager of such office.

12. That the District publish a paper in the interest of the Churches; said paper to be known as the "Sentinel"; to be published monthly, at the subscription rate of \$1.00 per annum.

13. That the District Conference Journal record the number of "Sentinel" subscriptions from each local Church.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Christian greetings to General Superintendent P. F. Elliott and to the members of this, the Forty-second Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Canada.

Another year of labors and spiritual activity has passed, and we stand at the place of inventory and the assessment of those endeavours.

The multiplicity of duties that have occupied our time has indeed been varied, and we trust not without some measure of success.

(1) In this past year, over 8000 miles have been traveled in behalf of the district.

(2) One revival was conducted in the district.

(3) In addition to these labors, I have preached fifteen times, besides giving a number of short exhortations as occasion seemed to demand.

(4) Besides the regular preachments of the past year, I taught a series of Bible Studies in the Camp, and also led in a Refresher Course for the ministers of the district.

(5) In pursuit of the regular routine of the office of superintendent, several church meetings and Council meetings were conducted.

(6) Off the district, it was my privilege to conduct four revival meetings, one indoor camp, and two week-end meetings.

(7) As a member of the Eastern Pilgrim College Board, many miles were traveled in discharging the duties of that office.

Inasmuch as the District Council has requested that this district be placed under the Department of General Church Extension, and inasmuch as my duties in other areas have become increasingly demanding, this will be the final year of my labors in the capacity of your superintendent.

Five years have passed with their successes and their failures. No one is more aware of my weaknesses than I. In considering the matters of the past five years, I find only deep humiliation at the realization of how little has been accomplished. To try to assess the work of the past five years would be of little profit. In the words of Job, let it suffice to say, "Behold, my witness is in heaven, and my record is on high."

As your new leader assumes his responsibility, let us all rally to his support. Let us see that we give him that loyalty which will make his labors easy and his associations with us a constant delight.

In the words of Paul, "Obey your leaders and defer to them; for they are tireless in their concern for you, as men who must render an account. Let it be a happy task for them, and not pain and grief, for that would bring you no advantage" (Heb. 13:17, New English Bible.)

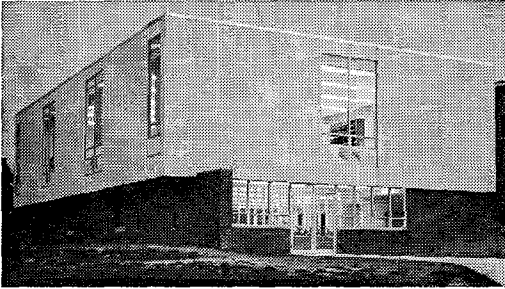

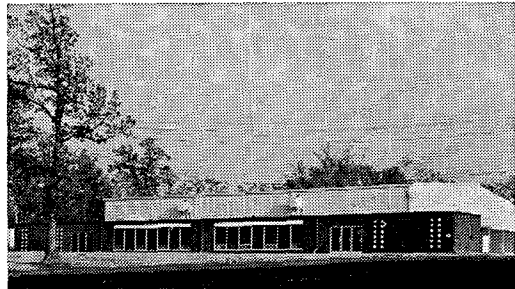
