Scripture reading by Brother Hodgin.

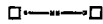

Opened at 9:15 A. M., June 30th. Song service led by Bro. Ralph Tromble. Song, "He Is Real To Me."

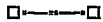
Prayer by Brother E. W. Reed.

### FIFTH SESSION

The various appointments of pastors for the coming year is read.

District Treasurer's report is read and approved.

Little Ruth Elaine Porterfield is then dedicated by Brother R. G. Finch.

Rev. Ralph Tromble is then ordained to the ministry. Rev. G. Arnold Hodgkin giving the charge.

Adjourned at 3:15 P. M. by joining hands about the tabernacle and singing "Blest Be the Tie That Binds," followed by the benediction pronounced by Brother R. G. Finch.



The following Resolutions were passed at this Assembly:

- No. 1.—That the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$1200.00 per year, together with house rent and traveling expenses.
- No. 2.—That all buildings, such as churches, parsonages, or extensive improvements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.
- No. 3.—That no Church of our District shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of Foreign Missions or other Church institutions without consulting our District Superintendent.
- No. 4.—That money shall be paid from District Treasury as directed by District Superintendent.
- No. 5.—That all lady workers and preachers' wives wear their dresses to reach from their collar bone to at least half way between the middle of the knee and the floor.
- No. 6.—Observing the inroads that immodesty is working in our Churches, and believing that God has no double standard, be it resolved that the same standard required of preachers' wives and lady evangelists be required also of the laywomen of the Church.
- No. 7.—We, the members of the Tenth Annual Assembly, resolve that there be given Brother Hodgkin a rising vote of thanks by way of expressing our appreciation of his labor and faithful service.



Recommendations from Ways and Means Committee:

- No. 1.—We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid the sum of \$25.00 for his labors, plus his expense for stationery, stamps, etc.
- No. 2.—We recommend that the District Secretary be paid the sum of \$25.00 for his labors, plus his expenditures for stationery, stamps, etc.
- No. 3.—We recommend that the amount paid to evangelists be decided upon by the local advisory board at the time of their service.
- No. 4.—We recommend that all District monies be paid monthly through the local treasury.
- No. 5.—We recommend that the District Superintendent appoint an editorial committee to assist the Secretary in preparing the District Minutes for publication.
- No. 6.—That the Publication Committee set a price on the Minutes and that each pastor consult with his Church and order the needed copies.
- No. 7.—That the District Council elect or appoint an Educational Board.





## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.



The past year has been a year of advance and progress in many ways for the Rocky Mountain District.

In spite of the hard times and depression that is so generally felt everywhere, God has enabled us as a District to take new territory in many places.

With the exception of a few cases, our already established Churches have made advancement and have seen many souls saved this year.

Our brethren in the Home Mission field have organized six new Churches this year. Two of these were organized by Brothers L. D. Sharp and John J. Doll in Kansas, where good work was done which we believe will bring reward through all eternity. One was organized by W. M. Ingersoll at Clearwater, Nebraska, another by Ira N. Diggs at Columbine School House, near Matheson, Colorado; another by L. D. Sharp and John J. Doll at Akron, Nebraska, and another by Brothers Ralph Armstrong and John Doll across the Divide, near Cripple Creek; the name of this is to be Mt. Pisgah Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Two very nice church buildings have been erected in the District; one at Lyan, Colo., and one at Colorado Springs.

Not including the trip to General Assembly, I traveled for District work by automobile, 19,510 miles. I have preached 224 times, made 124 Church visits, held 49 business meetings besides 21 annual Church meetings. Have had about 65 seekers.

It has been a year of willing sacrifice gladly given to our blessed Lord. He has blessed us beyond measure and repaid us for every battle.
