PROCEEDINGS

Monday, August 4, 1947, First Session

The fourteenth Annual Conference of the Tennessee District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Cumberland Grove Campground, Jamestown, Tennessee, August 4th, 1947, with General Secretary, Rev. S. M. Stikeleather, presiding. The Conference opened at 8:00 o'clock A. M., by singing, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." Prayer by Rev. E. A. Shetler. Brother Stikeleather commented on James the 3rd chapter, and prayed.

Roll Call.

It was moved and adopted that Rev. M. H. Russell, Rev. and Mrs. A. M. Eads, Rev. Glenn Bragg and Rev. S. W. Simmons be received into the conference.

It was moved and adopted that the two center sections of the tabernacle back to the sixth seat, also the platform, constitute the conference bar.

It was moved and adopted Sister Beulah Moyers fill the vacancy on the Reception Committee made by the absence of Sister Delsie Todd.

The report of the District Superintendent was read and accepted.

The report of the Auditing Committee was made and accepted.

The report of the District Treasurer was read and accepted.

The report of the Statistician was made and accepted.

Brother Elvin F. Hotle of the Reception Committee presented the following to the conference: Brother and Sister Clemm of Indiana, Brother Hays of Chattanooga, Brother Hall from Illinois, Brother and Sister Bond from Indiana, Brother Carter from Indiana, Sister Elmer Braden from Jellico, and Sister Frank Hotle from Indiana. Also Brothers Grenn Bragg and M. H. Russell.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee read and accepted. (See Ways and Means).

It was moved and adopted that the conference recess at 12:00 o'clock noon until 1:00 P. M.

Report of the Resolutions Committee read. (See Resolutions).

It was moved and adopted that \$4.00 per year for each member of the church be the assessment for General Budget instead of \$3.00 as heretofore.

Recess to 1:00 o'clock P. M.

Second Sitting

The conference reconvened at 1:00 o'clock P. M. The song "Heavenly Sunlight" was sung, followed by prayer lead by Brother Simmons.

It was moved and adopted that the election of officers be at 1:45 P. M.

It was moved and adopted that the report of the Educational and Examining Committee be received. (See Official Directory).

It was moved and adopted that Brothers Virgil H. Greene and Charles F. Lory receive ordination at this conference.

It was moved and adopted that the time for the election of officers be extended thirty minutes.

The final report of the Resolutions Committee was given and accepted. (See Resolutions).

Brother Homer Brown was introduced to the conference, also Miss Schoonemaker.

A rising vote of thanks was given Brother Walter Hall for his excellent work done on the campground.

A rising vote of thanks was given the cooks, the bed man and all other workers during the camp and conference.

A rising vote of thanks was given Brother S. M. Stikeleather at this time.

A rising vote of thanks was also given Brother Wm. E. Hall, District Superintendent, for his good services rendered the District.

Election of officers. (See Official Directory).

It was moved and adopted that the next Ministerial Convention be held at McEwen. Date March 16-18, 1948.

After recess the ordination service was held. Brother Stikeleather, General Secretary, gave the charge, and was assisted in the service by several members of the District Council.

It was moved and adopted that the Conference adjourn.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the fourteenth District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Tennessee District, greetings in the name of Jesus.

Coming to the close of the year and looking back over the past, we see many places where God has lead us on to victory. We will have to say that it has been a year of problems and battles, yet the Lord God of Elijah came to our rescue. We have enjoyed working with the brethren of the District, also their fellowship.

Many fields in Tennessee are open to us for extension work. God has helped us to make some forward steps. The debt on the Clinton church has been paid off. Also some repairs on the parsonage have been made. A new six room parsonage has been built at McEwen. The debt on the Paris church is nearly paid off.

Have traveled 14,214 miles in the interest of the District. Have held several week-end meetings. Attended a board meeting of the Pilgrim Bible College at Kernersville, N. C. Held one revival at Lake City church. Conducted one ministerial meeting at Chattanooga. Preached 105 times. Conducted two funerals. Baptized three. Conducted five communion services, eleven annual business meetings, ten other business meetings and ten District Council meetings.

Received \$1,062.21 as salary, \$258.64 for week-end meetings and traveling expenses, \$13.50 in donations, and \$113.77 for revival held at Lake City. There have been thirteen saved and four sanctified.

RESOLUTIONS

No. 1. Be it resolved that the date of the District Campmeeting be year to year from Friday before the last Sunday in July to continue over the first Sunday in August, and the Conference to

follow on Monday.

No. 2. Be it resolved that each church devote one service each month to General Missionary interests, and offerings to be taken in the Sunday School or Church service and sent to the District Treasurer for General Missions.

No. 3. Be it resolved that we have two zones in the District next year. Zone No. 1 to be composed of the following churches: Clinton, Knoxville, Lake City, LaFollette, Jellico and New Tazwell. Zone No. 2 to be composed of the following churches: Jamestown, Monterey, McEwen, Paris, Moss, Cumberland Grove, Alpine and Chattanooga. The ministers and delegates from each zone are to meet while at Conference and elect a chairman for their respective zones. Each zone is to meet for an all day meeting each quarter, the morning and afternoon services to be devoted to young people and the Sunday Schools, in charge of our District Young Peoples' leader and the Secretary of the Sunday School Committee. The speaker of the night service to be chosen by the zone chairman and the pastor of the local church.

No. 4. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent, or his assistant, visit each church three times a year, and that he make one of these visits over Sunday at each church.

No. 5. Since it is a matter of importance for all pastors of the District to attend the Conference and Campmeeting, be it resolved that all pastors' support at the church he is serving continue over the Sundays he is away.

No. 6. Be it resolved that each pastor read all resolutions, and also recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee, to his church at the earliest convenience, and also a few weeks previous to Campmeeting.

No. 7. Be it resolved that each church take an offering of groceries, vegetables and cash for the camp.

No. 8. Be it resolved that all monies raised by the local church for District or General expense be sent to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.

No. 9. Whereas many of our pastors have not received sufficient financial support, be it resolved that our District Superintendent impress upon the local deacons or deaconesses that it is one of their duties to see that monthly donations are brought to the pastor.

No. 10. We recommend that no pastor's wife be elected to serve as a delegate to the Conference where the church has a sufficient number of members to select from.

No. 11. Be it resolved that each pastor organize a Young Peoples' Society where possible, and to encourage same. Furthermore, that District Home Missionary offerings be taken monthly at regular Young Peoples' services.

No. 12. Be it resolved that one copy of the minutes be in every Pilgrim Holiness Church for the use of those wishing to read same, also that pastors urge members to have their own copy.

No. 13. Be it resolved that the District Council have charge of the printing of the minutes and make provision for the paying

for same.

No. 14. Be it resolved that we have one Ministerial Convention this year. Workers and date to be arranged by the District Council.

No. 15. Be it resolved that all annual church and ministerial reports be in the hands of the District Statistician not later than ten days before Camp.

No. 16. Be it resolved that the Examining Committee before recommending ministers or deaconesses to the conference, explain the requirements and obligations of the District and urge the keeping of them.

No. 17. Be it resolved that no children under twelve years of age be sent to stay at the Campmeeting unless attended by parents or guardian.

No. 18. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be empowered to appoint regular committees.

No. 19. Be it resolved that churches desiring to finish rooms or build cottages for their pastor, be allowed to do so under the supervision of the District Council.

No. 20. Be it resolved that the church entertaining the Ministerial Convention make arrangements with some restaurant for said delegates to be fed, expenses to be taken care of by offerings to be raised at the convention, and that bedding arrangements be made by the entertaining church.

No. 21. Be it resolved that each church have a communion service once each quarter.

No. 22. Be it resolved that each church grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay.

No. 23. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer pay the regular monthly telephone bill at the District Superintendent's residence, plus any extra bills pertaining to the duties of the District Superintendent, these to be paid from the Campground fund.

No. 24. Be it resolved that no ministers of this district receive a recommendation to another district until their district obligations such as ministerial tithes, and other requirements passed by the conference, are paid.

No. 25. We recommend that our District Secretary write a letter of thanks to the Highway Commissioner for grading and putting rock on the lane leading to the tabernacle.

No. 26. We recommend that the District Secretary write a letter of thanks and publish it in the Upper Cumberland Times, thanking each and every one who has assisted in any way in making the Campmeeting a success.

No. 27. Be it resolved that each church devote two services during this year to our Bible School interests and that young people be encouraged to attend. Also that offerings be received at the services, same to be applied toward the Bible School budget.

No. 28. Be it resolved that any pastor or church failing to comply with the rules and regulations passed by the conference, that said pastor or delegate meet with the District Council and give a satisfactory explanation before being allowed a voice in the con-

ference.

No. 29. Be it resolved that each church give one pair of pillows and cases, and one sheet or quilt this year for the Campground.

No. 30. Be it resolved that we put on a special drive in the District for subscriptions to our church paper, the Advocate, and our pastors make an effort to get the paper going into every member's home, and also that the church put the paper into as many schools, libraries, doctors' offices and church friends homes as possible.

No. 31. Be it resolved that our District Superintendent be allowed two weeks vacation annually with pay.

No. 32. Whereas our General Board has approved the Pension Plan for ministers, be it resolved that our District co-operate by obtaining information and making it possible for each church and minister to participate, the District Treasurer to act as our representative.

No. 33. We recommend that all revivals in local churches, also all seekers in our services of the local churches be reported by the local pastor in his pastor's report.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF

THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

No. 1. We recommend that the ministers' tithes be sent to the District Treasurer, same to be placed in the District Superintendent's Salary Fund.

No. 2. We recommend that all members tithe into the local treasury, and that 10% of the regular offerings, or its equivalent, be sent to the District Treasurer to be prorated to the various departments of the District work. Be it further resolved that the percent for the various departments be as follows: District Superintendent 35%; District Home Missions 25%; Incidentals 25%; Campground fund 15%.

No. 3. We recommend that the District Superintendent be allowed the privilege of holding two revivals off the district this year, and that he be permitted to keep his offerings, but he shall pay his own traveling expenses.

No. 4. We recommend that each pastor take a free will offering at each visit of the District Superintendent or assistant for his traveling expense, and that each local church treasurer report said amount to the District Treasurer with other monies.

No. 5. We recommend that each church member be assessed 25c this year to accumulate the General Conference expense, except the church failing to send in their assessment for last year who shall send in 50c per member.

No. 6. We recommend that the District Treasurer be allowed \$2.50 per month for postage, 'phone calls, etc., same to be paid from the incidental fund.

No. 7. After organizing the Cumberland Grove Campmeeting Association, charging \$1.00 per year membership fee, we further recommend that the District Council have charge of same Associa-

tion.

No. 8. We recommend that all birthday offerings be applied on the District Home Missionary work in the District.

No. 9. We recommend that the District Council have charge of the Home Missionary work in the District.

No. 10. We recommend that we have a Campground and Lot Committee consisting of the District Superintendent, District Treasurer and one other man appointed by the District Council, the chairman of this committee to be chosen by the District Council. This committee is to have charge of all lots, the upkeep and improvements of all buildings, the oversight of the rooms, but no new buildings to be built without the consent of the District Council. The chairman of this committee is to get the consent of at least one other member of the committee before paying out any monies for improvements or making any changes.

No. 11. We recommend that each conference minister or deaconess pay \$15.00 in cash to support the work on the campground, or make arrangements with the chairman of the committee to work four days.

No. 12. We recommend that our District Superintendent pay his tithes to the District Treasurer, the same to be placed in the District Home Missionary fund.

No. 13. We recommend that the District Secretary be paid \$25.00, and the District Treasurer be paid \$50.00 for their yearly services to the District, and that it be paid from the Incidental fund in quarterly installments.

No. 14. We recommend that our District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$1350.00 divided into twelve equal payments to be paid on the 10th of each month starting August 10th.

No. 15. We recommend that all conference licensed unstationed ministers whose ministerial tithes do not amount to as much as \$2.00 per month be assessed \$2.00 per month, this money to be placed in the District Superintendent's salary fund.

No. 16. We recommend that each church raise the equivalent of \$1.00 per member per year for our Bible School, the money to be sent through the Local Treasurer to the District Treasurer.

No. 17. We recommend that each Sunday School raise the equivalent of 10c per enrollment member per year to be applied to District Home Missions.

No. 18. We recommend that the contributions to be made to the Pension Fund for the District Superintendent and our conference evangelists be paid from the incidental fund.

No. 19. We recommend that the six rooms in our new building be assigned to the first six churches sending in \$25.00 each. The churches to be allowed the privilege of choosing their rooms in the order that they send in their money. This \$25.00 from each church is to be used to finish up the room for that church. It is to be understood that the rooms are for the pastor of the church sending in the \$25.00.
