## PROCEEDINGS

### MONDAY, AUGUST 7th, 1950, FIRST SESSION

The seventeenth Annual Conference of the Tennessee District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at Cumberland Grove Campground, Jamestown, Tennessee, August 7th, 1950, with Rev. Paul F. Elliott, General Secretary of Sunday School and Young Peoples' Work, presiding. The Conference was opened at 8:30 A. M., by singing, "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes." Prayer by Rev. L. T. Wallingford.

Roll Call.

It was moved and adopted that the first six seats of the two middle sections of the tabernacle, also the platform, constitute the conference bar.

It was moved and adopted that the time of the sittings be from 8:30 to 12:00 noon, and from 1:00 to 5:00 P. M.

Report of the District Superintendent was read and accepted.

Rev. Lester Mayhew and Mrs. S. W. Simmons were introduced to the conference, after a word from each of them it was moved and adopted that they be given an honorary seat with the bar.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

The report of the District Treasurer was read and temporarily tabled for correction.

The report of the District Statistician was read and accepted.

The report of the District Sunday School and Young Peoples' Promotional Secretary was read and accepted.

It was moved and adopted that the District Young People's Secretary be elected by the District Council. (Rev. Jack Polson was elected.)

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and accepted. (See Resolutions of the Ways and Means Committee.)

It was moved and adopted that the Conference adjourn.

### AFTERNOON SITTING

The afternoon sitting was opened by singing, "Victory In Jesus." Prayer by Rev. Jack Polson.

Minutes of the former sitting read and approved.

Sister Hotle of Indiana was introduced to the Conference. After giving a word of testimony she was given an honorary seat with the bar.

The District Treasurer's report, as corrected, was received.

The report of the Resolutions Committee was read and accepted. (See Resolutions.)

The report of the Examining Board was read and accepted.

It was moved and adopted that all unfinished business be left in the hands of the District Council.

It was moved and adopted that we express our thanks and appreciation to our retiring District Superintendent, Rev. William E. Hall, also Rev. Paul F. Elliott, who presided so efficiently, by a rising vote of thanks.

It was moved and adopted that the District Council approve the minutes of the afternoon session.

### **REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT**

To the seventeenth Annual Conference of the Tennessee District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, greetings in the name of Jesus.

We have again come to the end of another year of battles. God has been good in bringing us through with victories. Yes, we are made to say, "Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow."

I have traveled 12,380 miles in the interest of the District. Preached 148 times, attended one zone Bible School board meeting at Kernersville, N. C., also attended one District Superintendents' meeting at Indianapolis, Ind. Held one Ministerial Meeting, eight week-end meetings (or week meetings), sixteen annual church business meetings. Visited all the churches from one to four times this year. Have made trips to places to see about starting home missionary work. Held a number of District Council meetings. Attended the General Conference at Frankfort, Indiana. Held two revivals off the District. Received \$202.01 for revivals, \$1,208.90 as salary. Also received \$233.16 from the District for traveling expenses. Received \$44.85 as Christmas gifts from churches on the District. Fifty saved and twenty seven sanctified.

A mission was started this year at Sand Springs near Monterey. This work is in charge of the Monterey church.

Many improvements have been made to our church property over the District. Chattanooga has redecorated their church on the inside, also made some new seats for the church.

Cumberland Grove has purchased another bus to be used for the Sunday School and church services.

Lake City has purchased a bus to bring people to their services. McEwen also bought a bus which is helping their church and Sunday School.

Jellico has made some needed improvements. God is helping the folk to move forward.

Mineral Springs has put a new floor over the sub floor, and also painted the church on the outside. They are planning to

soon build Sunday School rooms.

Monterey has built some Sunday School rooms.

LaFollette has painted the church on the outside.

Paris has made some much needed improvements.

God has helped us to make a few improvements on the camp-ground.

We can say surely God has helped us in all of these things, for which we praise Him.

We feel we can say that God is helping us to move forward.

### **REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL AND Y. P. S. PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY**

I count it a privilege to have been able to serve our District and Church in the capacity of Sunday School and Y. P. S. Promotional Secretary this year. God has blessed and some gains have been made in our Sunday School and Y. P. Societies.

Arranged for a Y. P. S. in one of our churches in January, and, under the faithful leader, pastor and his wife, it is going good.

Have traveled 858 miles in the interest of our S. S. and youth work. Have given all of our churches, except four, a five day Youth Convention, also one a four days Convention at their request. To another I gave a fourteen day meeting. The other two I was unable to get to on account of sickness. Regret this greatly. In the services we had 38 seeking regeneration, and nine seeking sanctification.

Received \$227.39 support.

Through the very efficient help of Sister Lory, and the churches that co-operated, we have been able to put out nine News Sheets in the interest of our S. S. and Y. P. S's. To God we give all the praise.

### **RESOLUTIONS**

1. Be it resolved that the date of the District Campmeeting be year to year from Friday before the first Sunday in July to continue to the second Sunday in July, and the Conference to follow on Monday.

2. Be it resolved that we have three zones in the District as follows: Zone No. 1 to comprise the following churches: Clinton, Knoxville, Lake City, LaFollette, Jellico, New Tazwell (Sand Lick), Lone Mountain and Morristown. Zone No. 2, McEwen and Paris. Zone No. 3, Jamestown, Monterey, Moss, Cumberland Grove, Chattanooga, Wolfe River, Mineral Springs and Silver Point. Each zone is to meet for an all-day meeting quarterly. The morning service is to be devoted to Young People's work, and the afternoon to Sunday School interests. The night service speaker is to be chosen by the zone chairman and pastor of the local church.

3. Since it is a matter of importance for all pastors to attend Campmeeting and Conference, be it resolved that all pastor's support at the church he is serving continue over the Sundays he is away.

4. Be it resolved that each pastor read all resolutions, also recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee to the church at the earliest convenience, and also a few weeks previous to Campmeeting.

5. Whereas many of our pastors have not received sufficient financial support, be it resolved that our District Superintendent impress on the deacons the fact that it is their duty to see that donations are brought to the pastor.

6. Be it resolved that no pastor's wife be elected to serve at the Conference as a delegate where the church has a sufficient number of members to select from.

7. Be it resolved that each church organize a Young People's Society and to encourage same.

8. Be it resolved that one copy of the District Minutes be in every Pilgrim Holiness Church for the use of those wishing to read same, also that pastors urge members to have their own copy.

9. Be it resolved that the District Council have charge of the printing of the District Minutes, and make provision for the paying for same.

10. Be it resolved that the Examining Committee before recommending ministers or deaconesses to the Conference explain the requirements and obligations of the District and urge the keeping of same.

11. Be it resolved that no children under twelve years of age be sent to stay at the Campmeeting unless attended by parents or guardian.

12. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be empowered to appoint regular committees.

13. Be it resolved that churches desiring to build cottages for their pastors may do so under the supervision of the camp-ground and lot committee.

14. Be it resolved that we have a District Ministerial Convention, the date to be from Tuesday until Thursday before the last Sunday in March. The place to be left in the hands of the District Council.

15. Be it resolved that each church have a communion service once each quarter.

16. Be it resolved that each church grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay.

17. Be it resolved that no minister of the District receive a recommendation to another district until their district obligations, such as ministerial tithes and other requirements passed by the Conference, are paid.

18. Be it resolved that this Conference appoint a committee to write letter of appreciation to various ones who contributed to the success of the Camp.

19. We recommend that the District Secretary write a letter of thanks and publish it in the Upper Cumberland Times, thanking those who assisted, in any way in making the Campmeeting a success.

20. Be it resolved that any pastor or church failing to comply

with the rules and regulations passed by the Conference, that said pastor or delegate meet with the District Council and give a satisfactory explanation before being allowed a voice in the Conference.

21. Be it resolved that each church give one pair of pillows and cases, and one sheet or quilt this year to the Campground.

22. Be it resolved that we put on a special drive in the District for subscriptions to the Advocate, and that our pastors make an effort to get the paper going into every member's home, and also put the paper into as many schools, libraries, doctor's offices and church friends homes as possible.

23. Be it resolved that our District Superintendent be allowed a two weeks vacation with pay.

24. We recommend that in all revivals in local churches, also all seekers in our services of the local churches be reported by the local pastor in his pastors report.

25. Be it resolved that the Superintendent be placed on the Pilgrim Bible College board of trustees.

26. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be given a rising vote of thanks for excellent service rendered the District.

27. Be it resolved that all persons attending the Campmeeting abide by the rules of the District Council.

28. Be it resolved that the Recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee, and the Resolutions be mimeographed within thirty days after Conference and a copy be sent to each pastor immediately.

29. We recommend that no pastor engage in a revival during Campmeeting, Conference or Ministerial Convention.

30. Be it resolved that the ones who operate the dining room and lunch stand, also those in charge of the beds, be on the Campground two days before Campmeeting.

31. Moved and adopted that those taking the course of study, take it with the P. B. C. at Kernesville, N. C., where possible.

32. Moved and adopted that the following persons be given a rising vote of thanks for the excellent services rendered during the Campmeeting: Rev. and Mrs. Edward Galyon, Rev. and Mrs. Jack Polson, Rev. and Mrs. Harry Vance, Rev. and Mrs. Chas F. Lory and others.

33. Moved and adopted that the conference year is to close May 31st because of the recent change in time of Campmeeting and Conference.

### **Recommendations of the**

## **WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE**

### **Local Church Financial**

1. We recommend that all evangelists, song evangelists, pastors and conference ministers are to send their ministerial tithes to the District Treasurer the first of each month. Where their ministerial tithes do not average as much as \$2.00 per month, they are to send that amount monthly, except ministerial students



while attending Bible School, or those physically unable to work or pastor a church. When husband and wife are both pastoring a church, or both traveling together in evangelistic work they shall be assessed a minimum of \$2.00 per month. This money is to be divided as follows: 60% District Administration; 20% District Home Missions, 20% District Campground.

2. We recommend that each evangelist, song evangelist, pastor and conference minister pay their general budget through the local church.

3. We recommend that all members tithe into the local treasury, except ministerial tithe, and that 10% of the regular offering, or its equivalent, from each Church or Mission be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month. The District Treasurer is to divide as follows: 40% District Administration fund; 17½% District Missionary fund; 7½% Camp Ground fund; 15% Incidental fund; 15% General Conference fund; 5% Bible School fund.

4. We recommend that each Church raise three cans of food, or its equivalent, per member for our Campmeeting, and that the pastor be responsible for raising of same and getting same to the camp.

5. We recommend that each Church or Mission take two fire will offerings for our Bible School at Kernersville. The first to be taken on or before October 31st, and to be sent to the District Treasurer November 1st. The second to be taken on or before May 31st and to be sent to the District Treasurer on June 1st.

6. We recommend that our Churches and Missions be assessed the following amounts for traveling expenses of our District Superintendent: Chattanooga, Jamestown, McEwen, Clinton, Monterey and Paris \$2.50 per month. Lake City, Jellico, Knoxville, LaFollette, Cumberland Grove and Morristown \$1.50 per month. Mineral Springs, Moss, New Tazewell and Lone Mountain 50c per month. This money is to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month to be placed in the District Superintendent's traveling expense fund. Also it is to be understood that any Church calling the Superintendent for a special meeting shall be expected to give him the equivalent of 5c per mile for his expenses.

### **Sunday School Work**

1. We recommend that all birthday offerings be placed in the District Home Missions fund, and that all pastors co-operate with our Sunday School Superintendents in urging those attending our Sunday Schools to bring in their birthday offerings, explaining to them that the money is used for District Home Missions. This money is to be sent to our District Treasurer the first of each month.

2. We recommend that our pastors see to it that on the last Sunday of each month the Sunday School raise the equivalent of 2c per member average attendance for that month, the same to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of the following month. This money is to be divided equally between the District Home Missions fund and the District Campground fund.

### Young Peoples Work

1. We recommend that each Young People's Society send one offering each month to the District Treasurer to be placed in our District Sunday School and Young Peoples fund.

2. We recommend that our District Young People's and Sunday School Secretary send a monthly news sheet to each pastor, Sunday School Superintendent and Young People's leader informing them as to what the local churches are doing for our young people, also giving them helpful hints and advice, and do all in their power to push the interests of the Sunday School and Young People's work in the Tennessee District. Said secretary to receive \$4.00 per month to take care of expense and trouble in connection with this work. This money is to be paid from the District Sunday School and Young People's fund. We further recommend that all pastors, Sunday School Superintendents and local Young People's leaders in our Churches heartily cooperate with our District leader.

### District Financial

1. We recommend that our District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$100.00 a month.

2. We recommend that our District Superintendent pay his tithes to the District Treasurer, the same to be placed in the Incidental fund.

3. We recommend that our District Superintendent be allowed the privilege of holding three revivals off the District this year, and that he be permitted to keep his offerings, but he shall pay his own traveling expenses.

4. We recommend that our District Treasurer pay our District Superintendent's light and telephone bills, also his 4% pension plan dues, same to be paid from the Incidental fund.

5. We recommend that our District Superintendent's traveling expenses to the Superintendent's meeting in Indianapolis be paid from the Incidental fund.

6. In as much as the District at this time is unable to pay our District Superintendent a larger salary, we recommend that when the Campground and Lot committee hire labor for improvements on the Campground such as painting, carpenter work, etc., that our District Superintendent be granted the privilege of doing this work at the times when he is home, if he so desires. The District Council is to decide the hourly wage to be paid, taking into consideration the prevailing wage paid locally for work of this kind.

7. We recommend that our District Superintendent visit each Church three times during the year if possible, and that he inform the Churches of what progress the district is making, and also inform each as to what progress that Church is making in keeping their budgets paid. If they are behind he is to meet with the board and try to work out a plan whereby they can do better.

8. We recommend that our District Superintendent appoint someone to launder all Campmeeting things needing washing at the close of Camp, the party doing the work to receive \$15.00. This money is to be paid from the Campmeeting fund.

9. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$2.50 per month for expenses, same to be paid from the District Administrative fund.

10. We recommend that our District Treasurer be paid \$7.50 per month for expenses, this money to be paid from the District Administrative fund. The treasurer is to mail out on the tenth of each month to each pastor or Church treasurer, and active evangelists, a report of monies received to date, also to keep the Superintendent informed as to how the Churches are keeping up their budgets.

11. We recommend that our District Treasurer pay the 4% contribution to the Pension Plan for each of our evangelists and song evangelists who are cooperating with the District in sending in their ministerial tithes monthly, and who desire to sign with the Pension Plan. This payment is to be made from the Incidental fund.

12. We recommend that all conference licensed and ordained ministers, also ordained deaconesses pay to the District Treasurer \$7.50 per year for the purpose of improving our Campground. This money is to be placed in the Campground fund.

13. We recommend that each Zone meeting an offering be taken in one of the services, this money to be sent to the District Treasurer to be placed in the Sunday School and Young Peoples' fund.

14. We recommend that the District Superintendent appoint a committee of three to be in charge of all District Home Missionary work and monies to be spent for that work.

15. We recommend that we have a Campground and Lot committee, consisting of the District Superintendent, the District Treasurer and one other man elected by the District Council. This committee is to be in charge of all lots, the upkeep and improvements of all buildings and to have the oversight of all rooms. The chairman is to get the consent of at least one other member of the committee before paying out any monies for improvements.

16. We recommend that we have a Campmeeting committee consisting of District Treasurer, the person in charge of the kitchen, also of the lunch stand. The duties of this committee are to purchase foods needed for Camp, to count all offerings received at Camp, and to keep the District Superintendent informed from time to time as to how much money additional will need to be raised to take care of camp expense.

17. We recommend that in his first trip over the District, the Superintendent shall have a Home Missionary service and take an offering and pledges for District Home Missionary work.

18. We recommend that the Dist. Treas. start a Campmeeting account at the Union Bank at Jamestown at the start of 1951 Camp. This account to run from year to year thereafter.
