JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The seventh annual conference of the Texas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the Dallas Church at 7:45 P.M., June 11, 1957, as Rev. R. E. Nible asked Brother Snell to lead the song service. The ministers, delegates, and friends joined in singing, "Dwelling in Beulah Land," and "He's a Wonderful Saviour to Me." Rev. John Abernathy led in prayer. The blessings of the Lord came upon us as we sang "At Calvary," several spontaneous testimonies were in order, and then we all joined in singing "Amazing Grace."

Mr. and Mrs. Ed Smith, of the Dallas Church, brought a special number in song. The chairman of the conference, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension, was introduced, and brought the evening message, using as a basis the Scripture: Genesis 5:18-25, and the thought: Enoch walked with God. One admonition that lingered in our thoughts was that if we are to walk with God, we will have to do so with Eternity in view.

SECOND SITTING

The first business session was called to order, and Bro. Ferlet led the group in singing, "Standing on the Promises," and "I Will Sing the Wondrous Story." We were led to the Throne of Grace in prayer by Bro. Aslin. The chairman commented briefly on 2 Cor. 7:1-7, and especially verse 5: "We were troubled on every side."

The roll was called. In the absence of a delegate from Raymondville, Mrs. Allen Thomas was seated by a motion from the floor. There were three churches that had no lay delegation, namely, Abilene, Amarillo, and Hillsboro.

The conference bar was set as the first five seats on each side and the platform. The time of the sittings of the conference was set at 9-12 A.M., 2-4 P.M., and preaching service at 7:30 P.M.

The order of the day was declared to be the reading of reports. Rev. Hawkins made an explanation of the absence of Bro. Husselton, our former District Superintendent, and had many kind things to say about the sacrificial labors of this man of God for the Texas District. A motion was made from the floor that the secretary of the conference send a letter of greetings and appreciation to Rev. Husselton, expressing the sincere thanks of this conference for his years of unstinting service to the churches of our district. This resolution was passed with a rising vote of thanks.

The new District Superintendent, appointed by the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Rev. Roy E. Nible, was presented to the conference. In his remarks, given in a spirit of humility, he mentioned the fact that he did not want this job, but, he said, "I am not my own." A unanimous vote, pledging allegiance to the new superintendent, was heartily entered into by a standing ovation.

A recess was declared by the chair until 11 o'clock.

After the recess, the auditing committee report was read and approved. The district treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The Sunday School promotional Secretary's report was given, showing a gain for the conference Sunday Schools of 50 or 14% gain. The total average attendance for the district was 404. The report was heard with interest, and accepted with hearty approval.

The Promotional Secretary then presented the awards for the highest gains in Sunday Schools. Houston received both the certificate for the highest numerical gain, and also for the highest percentage gain. They showed a gain of 67, or 183%. Also the percentage gain ribbons were awarded: Houston, for lack of a larger ribbon, received a gold one, representing over 50% gain. Borger, Dallas, and Raymondville each received a blue ribbon representing over 10% gain, as the actual gain in

each school was as follows: Borger, 19 percent; Dallas, 16 percent, and Raymondville, 14 percent.

The session was adjourned with prayer by Brother Spencer.

THIRD SITTING

The afternoon session was called to order, and Bro. Ferlet led in singing, "Faith is the Victory." Sister King led in prayer.

Bro. Ferlet read the report of the Educational and Examining Board, which was accepted, and their recommendations adopted. Bro. Nible requested that Rev. Russell Manship be accepted into the Texas District pending his transfer from the Southern Indiana Conference, and that he be issued the same credentials that he has had in that district. The request was granted by a motion from the floor, which was adopted.

The statistician's report was read, and was accepted pending corrections.

The resolutions committee gave a partial report. Resolution No. 5 under Church Government in the 1956 minutes was amended as recommended by that committee.

The Ways and Means Committee reported. The recommended change to Standing Rule No. 3 was adopted, as were also new resolutions numbered six and seven. The session was dismissed with prayer by Rev. Hawkins.

FOURTH SITTING

The evening service opened with Bro. Ed Smith leading the congregation in singing, "'Tis True, Oh Yes, 'Tis True," "I Know Whom I Have Believed," and "If Jesus Goes With Me." Brother Ferlet carried our petitions to the Lord in prayer. Rev. and Mrs. Allen Thomas sang, "Glorious Freedom."

Rev. R. C. Hawkins brought the message of the evening using as his theme, "Pentecost," and reading the Scripture lesson in Acts 15:1-11. He elucidated Pentecost as bringing purity to the heart, producing power for service, and inducing progress in the Christian life.

FIFTH SITTING

The fifth and final session of the conference was called to order, and Bro. Aslin led in singing, "All the Way My Saviour Leads," Bro. Allen Thomas led in prayer. The chairman, Brother Hawkins, brought a few thoughts from Colossians 3:12-17.

The minutes of the previous sessions were read and approved.

The Resolutions committee brought a further report. An amendment to Resolution No. 2 under Church Government in the 1956 minutes was adopted as recommended. Also Resolution No. 3 under Conference rules was amended as per their resolution.

Rev. Hawkins then read the appointments made by the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church as follows:

District Superintendent.....Rev. Roy E. Nible
District Secretary.....Rev. S. Allen Thomas
District Treasurer.....Rev. John Abernathy

The ballots were cast for the advisory members of the District Council, and Rev. T. E. Aslin and Rev. Anatole Ferlet were elected on the first ballot Mr. W. A. Reed, layman from Corpus Christi, was elected to succeed himself as District Trustee for a two-year term.

Rev. T. E. Aslin was elected as Ministerial Delegate to the General Conference, and Rev. Anatole Ferlet elected his alternate.

Mrs. Elva Dooley, of Dallas, was elected lay delegate, and Mr. Harold Leslie, of Houston, alternate, to the General Conference.

The District Superintendent read the committee appointments. A recess was requested by the Ways and Means Committee, to give them time to finish preparation of their final report. It was granted, and the conference was recessed until 11:15 A.M.

After the recess, the Ways and Means Committee recommended new

Resolution No. 8, to provide finances for the General Conference Expenses. The resolution was adopted.

Invitations for the Worker's Convention, set for Nov. 19-21, 1957, were extended by the churches at Corpus Christi and Dalhart. The conference chose to accept the Corpus Christi invitation.

The resolutions committee brought a final report, and their miscellaneous resolutions were received and heartily approved. After some announcements by Rev. R. E. Nible, a resolution to adjourn was passed. We were dismissed with prayer by Rev. T. E. Aslin.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

TO THE TEXAS DISTRICT CONFERENCE OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH.

GREETINGS IN THE NAME OF OUR WONDERFUL LORD:

This report will of necessity be only a partial report. Since I was not serving as Superintendent the entire year.

My labors from last District Conference, 1956 to January, 1957 were as follows:

We were engaged in Deputational work for The Department from August to September in the states of Washington and Idaho. After returning to Texas we labored in the church at Borger, Texas, living in a house trailer, and assisted the pastor in getting established there. At the time we were in the Panhandle, we attended several Sunday School Zone meetings, in which wife and I both took part.

While we were in Borger, we painted the parsonage, and finished some work on the church building. Also, we made many calls in the interest of the church and Sunday School.

We conducted two business meetings with the Dalhart pastor and board and held a week end meeting in this church.

While visiting the churches we preached and labored with the pastor and his people at Amarillo. God helped us there, also.

We held business meetings at Hillsboro, Corpus Christi, and Houston. Also, wife and I were engaged in a week end meeting with the pastors in Raymondville. While in the Valley we investigated the prospects of a new work in Brownsville. Several days and much time was spent on this prospect.

Wife and I served as pastors at Abilene, until a pastor was found. Then we were called by the Houston Church for a week's revival which was followed by the District Ministers meeting. Rev. Hawkins was in charge of this Conference.

We attended the Church Workers Conference in Indianapolis, and at that time arrangements were made for us to labor in the New Work in Tampa. We have labored in the Department of Church Extension as pastor, and District Superintendent, for nine years, and feel that the Lord has blessed our labors. We give Him all the praise and want to report real Victory thru the Precious Blood. We are still laboring for the Department of Church Extension, and appreciate very much the opportunity to open a new soul saving center in the beautiful state of Florida.

REPORT OF THE WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE

We recommend the following plan for raising the District Budget:

1. That every church be assessed 3 per cent of the total receipts including Sunday School and Young People's offerings, but with the exception of monies received for missions, evangelists, or Bible Schools; and that the pastor's ministerial tithe be paid to the District Treasurer along with the 3 per cent of the church receipts. We further recommend that the local church treasurer, with the assistance of the pastor, see

that the budget be paid by the fifteenth of the month succeeding that it which it was received.

2. We recommend that the district pay \$50.00 per month on the salary of the District Superintendent.

3. We recommend that the traveling expense of the District Superintendent be paid by the district at the rate of six cents per mile. We further recommend that a free-will offering be taken by each church at the time of his regular visit, the same to be applied to his traveling expenses.

4. We recommend that the phone and utility bills of the District Superintendent be paid by the District.

5. We recommend that each church be assessed \$15.00 for conference expenses, to be raised by the pastor.

6. We recommend that prior to the Annual Worker's convention each church receive a free-will offering to defray expenses of said convention.

7. We recommend that the district pay the mailing expenses of the Sunday School Promotional Secretary, and any traveling expenses authorized by the District Superintendent.

8. We recommend that each pastor raise an offering in his church of an amount at least equivalent to \$1.00 per member, same to be sent to the District Treasurer for the General Conference Expenses. It is further recommended that this offering be received at the earliest convenient date.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

Church Government

1. We recommend that the annual business of the church be closed by May 25th, 1958. We also recommend that the District Treasurer's books be closed by May 28, 1958, and that each church send all funds to the District Treasurer by May 28, 1958.

2. Be it resolved that the annual conference be held June 2 through June 4, 1958, the place to be set by the district council.

3. We recommend that a quarterly bulletin be compiled by the District Superintendent, and sent to each church at the beginning of each quarter. Be it further resolved that the amounts of budget paid by each church in that period be published in that bulletin.

4. We recommend that a worker's convention be held during the year, the time and place to be agreed upon by the District Superintendent and the General Secretary of Church Extension.

5. We recommend that each church set aside one service each month as a time for pounding the pastor. An announcement shall be made by a deacon or deaconess of the local church as provided for by the Manual, page 28, section 50.

6. We recommend that the location of the churches and parsonages appear in the minutes. We further recommend that where parsonages are equipped with telephones, the name of the pastor and the Pilgrim Holiness Church be listed in the phone directory, and also that the number appear in the minutes.

7. Be it resolved that the churches of the Texas District be Zoned as follows: Zone 1: Abilene, Corpus Christi, Dallas, Hillsboro, Houston, and Raymondville; Zone 2: Amarillo, Borger, and Dalhart.

8. Be it resolved that at least one prayer meeting each quarter be set aside to pray for the Forward Movement in the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Sunday School

We recommend that there be a Sunday School Promotional Secretary. We further recommend that each pastor send him a report on Monday following the last Sunday of each month, including average

Sunday School attendance, church attendance, and total calls made by the church and pastor.

Conference

1. We recommend that there be an editing committee composed of the District Council. It shall be the duty of this committee to publish the minutes of the conference.

2. We recommend that the church entertaining the District Conference provide lodging for the pastors, their wives, dependent children, lay delegates, and others if possible. We further recommend that any expense incurred for the same be taken care of by the District Treasurer.

3. We recommend that each pastor see that the yearly reports be in the hands of the statistician by May 29, 1958.

4. We recommend that the District Superintendent appoint a District Youth Leader.

5. We recommend that each pastor report in full each month to the General Secretary of Church Extension and District Superintendent on blanks provided by the General Secretary.

6. We recommend that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

7. We recommend that no pastor shall call an evangelist outside our church without the approval of the District Superintendent.

Miscellaneous

We recommend that immediately following the conference the District Treasurer mail each pastor an itemized notice of the financial responsibilities of his church to the District for the year, giving the address of the District Treasurer.

2. Whereas Almighty God has given us another year of splendid progress in our District and has permitted us to enjoy another gracious conference: Therefore, be it resolved that we express our appreciation to God by standing and saying, "Praise the Lord."

3. Whereas our conference has enjoyed the efficient and spiritual leadership of our General Secretary of Church Extension: Therefore, be it resolved that we show our appreciation to him by standing and saying, "God bless you."

4. Whereas we appreciate the leadership and faithful labors of our former District Superintendent: Therefore, be it resolved that we give him a rising vote of thanks, and that we instruct our secretary to send him a letter of greetings expressing our sincere appreciation for his years of unstinting labor in behalf of the churches of our District.

5. Be it resolved that the local church be accorded our appreciation for the entertainment enjoyed by this conference, and Sister Dooley's untiring efforts to properly house us, and that our District Treasurer be authorized to pay the local church \$15.00 to help defray the cost.

6. Whereas our Secretary has served faithfully for this conference: Therefore, be it resolved that we express our sincere appreciation by a rising vote of thanks.

7. Be it resolved that this conference instruct our District Secretary to send Rev. Raymond Kensell, our former District Treasurer, a letter of appreciation for his faithful labors as our District Treasurer.

8. Resolved that we show our appreciation to the Sunday School Promotional Secretary, Rev. Anatole Ferlet, for his labor by a hearty, "Amen."

9. We recommend that a rising vote of thanks be given to the cooks and all who assisted them during this conference.

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL AND EXAMINING BOARD

The Examining and Educational Board recommends that Rev. T. T. Hines and Rev. Nicholas Maynard again be extended fourth year Dis-

tract Ministers License, and that Rev. James Mulkey again be extended first year District Ministers License. We also recommend that Miss Elsie Morris be commissioned as a Song Evangelist.
