JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

Rev. R. E. Nible, Superintendent of the Texas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, called the eighth annual conference to order on Monday night, June 2, 1958, at the Dallas First Church. Rev. Allen Thomas led the congregation in singing, "He's a Wonderful Saviour to Me" and, "Since Jesus Came into My Heart." Prayer was requested for the wife of our beloved General Superintendent, Rev. W. H. Neff. Rev. Charles Mayfield, pastor of the church at Dalhart, led in prayer.

Brother Nible introduced Rev. Manship, pastor of the host church, who made welcoming remarks. After another congregational song, an offering was received, and Miss Elsie Morris sang a special number in song.

The Superintendent then presented the chairman of the conference, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, who delivered personal greetings from Rev. Neff, and brought a very timely message from II Cor. 6:1-10, using as a theme, "Approving our ministry."

SECOND SITTING

On Tuesday Morning at 8:30 A.M., the conference was called to order for its first business session. Miss Elsie Morris led the ministers, delegates, and friends in singing, "I Know Whom I Have Believed," and "A Shelter in the Time of Storm." Brother Manship led us to the Throne of Grace in prayer. Bro. Nible presented Rev. Hawkins as the chairman of the conference, who read as a Scripture Lesson from II Thess. 3:1-7.

The roll was called. A motion carried to seat Miss Morris as delegate from Corpus Christi in the absence of both the elected delegate and alternate. Sister Ferlet was seated as a representative from San Antonio.

The Conference Bar was set to include the first five seats on each side of the church and the platform, and all ministers and delegates were instructed to take a seat within the conference bar.

Rev. Nible introduced Rev. Mayfield and Rev. Aeschliman to the conference, and recommended that they be seated as full members of this conference pending the receipt of their transfers from the districts of which they were formerly members. This action was confirmed by the group.

The time of the sessions were designated as 8:30 to 12:00 A.M., 1:30 to 5:00 P.M., and 7:30 for the evening service.

Brother Hawkins called for the report of the District Superintendent. This good report was received with a hearty, "Amen."

The Auditing Committee report was read and approved, and the report of the District Treasurer was in turn given attention. Brother Abernathy's suggestions were well received, and the report was approved as read.

The Statistician's report was read, and the motion that it be adopted carried.

The report of the Sunday School Secretary was read by the District Secretary, in Bro. Ferlet's absence. It was approved as read.

A memorial tribute to the late Rev. Eva D. Vernon, an ordained minister of the Texas District, was read. The conference stood in a silent tribute to her, and Bro. Nible led in prayer.

Rev. Hawkins read the appointments to the District offices made by the General Board, which were as follows: District Superintendent, Rev. R. E. Nible; District Secretary, Rev. S. Allen Thomas; District Treasurer, Rev. John Abernathy.

Revs. Aeschliman and Mayfield were appointed tellers. Ballots were cast for the two advisory positions on the district council. Rev. Russell Manship and Rev. Charles Mayfield were elected.

The ballots were cast for the district trustee and Rev. John Abernathy was elected for two years.

A recess was called to permit the council to take care of some pertinent business.

After the recess, Rev. Aslin was elected to the vacancy on the Examining Board, and Rev. Manship was elected Youth Secretary.

In the few remaining minutes of the morning session, Rev. Hawkins outlined a preview of the Four-Year Plan being proposed by the General Board to the General Conference. We were adjourned by expiration of time. Bro. John Coe dismissed with prayer.

THIRD SITTING

On Tuesday afternoon the conference resumed its business after a short devotional service in which Sr. Morris led the group in singing, "In the Service of the King." Sister Aslin prayed for the Conference to have Divine guidance in this the final business session of the conference.

A motion was adopted that the reading of the minutes be approved by the Council. Inasmuch as it was considered complete, it was commonly agreed to dispense with any further calling of the roll.

The Educational & Examining Board reported, and their report was adopted by the conference.

The resolutions committee reported, and the following actions were taken:

Resolution #1 was adopted.

Resolution #2 was amended to provide that the business of the committees shall be taken care of on Tuesday, and the actual conference shall be convened on Wednesday.

Resolutions 3, 4, 5, and 6 were adopted as read.

Resolution #7 was amended to include Houston Second Church and San Antonio in Zone 1, and Abilene in Zone 2.

The "Sunday School" resolution was amended to provide that the Sunday School Secretary issue a monthly bulletin to the churches of the district, including interesting reports and information from the churches sent in by the pastors.

Under "Conference," resolutions 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, and 7 were passed as read. Resolution #4 was lost.

The Ways & Means Committee reported. It was decided that the plan already in operation would work fine if each church would do its part. Resolutions 1 through 6 were re-enacted, and 7 and 8 were approved as amended.

The final miscellaneous resolutions were reported by the resolutions committee, and were passed.

Bro. Abernathy, pastor of the Houston First Church, read a report sent in by the "Pilgrim Hope Society," a group of junior Young People he has organized for Bible Study. May the Lord richly bless them.

A motion to adjourn carried, and we were dismissed with prayer by Brother Hawkins.

EVENING SERVICE

While the actual business of the conference ended with the afternoon session, yet on Tuesday night there was a wonderful service, worthy of reporting in the Conference Journal. The Presence of the Lord settled down on the group while Miss Morris was singing a special song. Afterwards, several gave their testimonies, and there was an old-fashioned heart-warming Presence very near. Without waiting for a message, two or three hungry souls came forward seeking victory. It was a scene that will linger in many hearts.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the eighth annual conference of the Texas District: Greetings, my brethren. After another year in the harvest field of our loving Lord, we remind you of the words of the Apostle Paul, in II Cor. 15:58, "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, for as much as ye know that your labor is not in vain for the Lord." I am sure that we could not place material values on your labors of the past year. No doubt each one, with myself, have had our struggles and battles, but, by the help and grace of our Lord, we

have come to this hour victoriously. Some of you have proven that you have what it takes to build a Home Missionary District. No doubt you could go other places where you could receive better salaries, but you have proven there are higher ambitions in your lives than material gain. As far as I know, not one of you are running from the battles you have faced in the past; but you feel there is yet much territory to be taken and you are remaining another year, to do your best to go forward for the Lord.

Amarillo has had some encouraging times during the past year. While there are battles ahead, we believe God will give the victory for Amarillo. Bro. and Sr. Coe have labored hard, and have been faithful to the work.

Abilene. This work was closed last November, because we had no one to carry on. It was just a temporary closing. We moved there the last of January, and plan on starting the work again, as soon as possible. Prospects are good for a nice Sunday School. We would have started before this, but duties called us to other places. Abilene will be one of our good churches in the future: just give us a little time to prove it.

At Borger, Bro. & Sr. Maynard have labored faithfully for the past two years. They are going back for another year. A young couple were saved in the church this past year, and are proving to be a real blessing to the work there. Their enthusiasm to do things for God is outstanding. It is truly wonderful what a born-again experience does in the heart of an individual.

Corpus Christi is a spot of beauty, a place where anyone would want to live. It has had its problems along with the rest; but has had its victories too, and that is the part we want to magnify. Bro. & Sr. Aslin are the fine pastors there. A family moved there from Nebraska, and are helping them in the Church. Sister Elsie Morris has been a real blessing to the church, too.

Dalhart has had a real struggle this past year; and we wondered, at times, what would be the outcome; but we are glad to tell you the clouds have lifted, and the sun is shining again. They were without a pastor for several months, and then God sent Bro. & Sr. Charles Mayfield to be their shepherd. They are doing a splendid work. Dalhart will rise again to bless the Texas District.

Dallas has had a good year: even though it has had some battles, God has given victories. We appreciate the labors of Bro. & Sr. Manship and family. We are happy to have them in our District.

Hillsboro is the oldest work on the Texas District. Bro. & Sr. Aeschliman came here from Kansas. They have labored faithfully, without one word of complaint. It makes me feel like burning out for God and the District when I see such willingness to sacrifice, as these young people have manifested. God bless them. They are going back another year, to find diamonds in the rough that Jesus can polish and shine for His glory.

Houston, First: much can be said about this church. Nowhere in the west have I seen a church grow like this one. Could I say a little more, without anyone feeling I am partial? Nowhere have I seen a pastor work any harder than Bro. & Sr. Abernathy. They have built onto their nice church in order to care for their growing Sunday School. This is the youngest of the organized churches, and has the largest membership and Sunday School. I pray that this great accomplishment shall be a challenge to you and me to work a little harder this new conference year.

Houston, Second: We are glad to report that we have started services for the second church in Houston. A tent meeting was held there recently. The first Sunday School session was on May 11th, when twenty eight were present; and there was an average of twenty-two for three Sundays. Bro. & Sr. Robert Kiblinger, of Terre Haute, Ind., are coming to take over this new work. Keep your eye on that church, for some people in it have a mind to work.

At Raymondville, the All-Mexican work has had a good year. There has been the District Sunday School of the month several times this year. Bro. & Sr. Allen Thomas are to be commended for their fine work there. We also want to make mention of the labors of Miss Van Metre, who has been a great blessing to the work there. May God bless her for the sacrifices she has made to help the work. Bro. Thomas has also started services at another town this past year. Their interest has been very good there.

One of their members, Sister Vernon, of Brownsville, went to her heavenly reward recently. Sr. Vernon has been a great blessing in God's work in the past.

At San Antonio, we bought a property and thought the prospects looked fairly good to get a work started in this large city. Bro. & Sr. Ferlet are there. They have had obstacles that have made it hard; but we believe God is able to give us the victory and a fine church will be started there. We plan on a tent meeting there, sometime this summer.

PERSONAL REPORT

We took over the District as superintendent right after the conference last year. We didn't have a pastor at Hillsboro, so we spent a few Sundays in July preaching for them. About the first of August we loaded the District Tent in a two-wheel trailer, and headed for the Panhandle of Texas to hold meetings at Dalhart and Amarillo. We felt these were an encouragement to the people.

Our labors carried us many miles across the country, but God always brought us back safely.

In September of 1957, we held the opening convention for our Colorado Springs Bible College; and also attended the school board

meeting in February. We traveled 2,800 miles in the interest of the school.

We attended the Superintendents meeting in January in Indianapolis, Ind., traveling 1,850 miles on this trip. We held 46 services in the interest of Church Extension, and traveled 7,775 miles for the Department of Church Extension.

We visited most of the churches twice, and held four annual meetings. Because of the circumstances we were not able to have the others, but we gave them a preaching service. We traveled 15,241 miles in the interest of the District, making a total of 27,666 miles traveled for the year. We preached 100 sermons, had approximately 50 seekers at the altar. We also held a third tent meeting in Houston in May, where a second church is being started. We have done many hours of manual work at Dalhart and Abilene on the parsonages.

It has been one of the busiest years of my life, with problems I didn't expect; but it has been a good year on the District.

REPORT OF THE WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE

We recommend the following plan for raising the District Budget:

1. That every church be assessed three per cent of the total receipts including Sunday School and Young People's offerings, but with the exception of monies received for missions, evangelists, or Bible Schools; and that the pastor's ministerial tithe be paid to the District Treasurer, along with the 3% of the church receipts. We further recommend that the local church treasurer, with the assistance of the pastor, see that the budget be paid by the fifteenth of the month succeeding that in which it was received.
2. We recommend that the District pay \$50.00 per month on the salary of the District Superintendent.
3. We recommend that the traveling expense of the District Superintendent be paid by the district at the rate of six cents per mile. We further recommend that a free-will offering be taken by each church at the time of his regular visit, the same to be applied to his traveling expenses.
4. We recommend that the phone and utility bills of the District Superintendent be paid by the district.
5. We recommend that each church be assessed \$15.00 for conference expenses to be raised by the pastor.
6. We recommend that prior to the Annual Workers Convention each church receive a free-will offering to defray expenses of the said convention.

7. We recommend that the District pay the mailing expenses of the Sunday School Promotional Secretary and Executive Youth Leader, and any traveling expenses authorized by the District Superintendent.

8. We recommend that each pastor raise an offering in his church each year for the next quadrennium, of an amount at least equivalent to 50¢ per member, same to be sent to the District Treasurer for General Conference Expenses.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

CHURCH GOVERNMENT

1. We recommend that the annual business of the church be closed by May 31, 1959. We also recommend that the District Treasurer's books be closed by June 1, 1959, and that each church send all funds to the District Treasurer by June 1, 1959.

2. Be it resolved that the Annual Conference be held June 9-14, 1959, with the work of the committees being taken care of on Tuesday, and the Conference in regular session on Wednesday, the place to be set by the District Council.

3. We recommend that a quarterly bulletin be compiled by the District Superintendent, and sent to each church at the beginning of each quarter. Be it further resolved that the amounts of budget paid by each church in that quarter be published in that bulletin.

4. We recommend that a Worker's Convention be held during the year, the time and place to be agreed upon by the District Superintendent and the General Secretary of Church Extension.

5. We recommend that each church set aside one service each month as a time for pounding the pastor. An announcement by a deacon or deaconess of the local church as provided for by the manual, page 28, Section 50.

6. We recommend that the location of the churches and parsonages appear in the minutes. We further recommend that where parsonages are equipped with telephones, the name of the pastor and the Pilgrim Holiness Church be listed in the phone directory, and also that the number appear in the minutes.

7. Be it resolved that the churches of the Texas District be zoned as follows: Zone I, Corpus Christi, Dallas, Hillsboro, Houston I, Houston II, and Raymondville; Zone II, Abilene, Amarillo, Borger, and Dalhart.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

We recommend that there be a Sunday School Promotional Secretary. We further recommend that each pastor send him a report on Monday following the last Sunday of each month, including average Sunday School attendance, church attendance, total calls made by the church and pas-

tor, and other interesting news from his church, which the Promotional Secretary shall include in a monthly bulletin to be issued to each of the churches.

CONFERENCE

1. We recommend that there be an editing committee composed of the District Council. It shall be the duty of this committee to publish the minutes of the conference.

2. We recommend that the church entertaining the District Conference provide lodging for the pastors, their wives, dependent children, lay delegates, and others if possible. We further recommend that any expense incurred for the same be taken care of by the District Treasurer.

3. We recommend that each pastor see that the yearly reports be in the hands of the statistician by June 5, 1959.

4. We recommend that each pastor report in full to the General Secretary of Church Extension and District Superintendent on blanks provided by the General Secretary.

5. We recommend that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

6. We recommend that no pastor shall call an evangelist outside our church without the approval of the District Superintendent.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. We recommend that immediately following the conference the District Treasurer shall mail each pastor an itemized notice of the financial responsibilities of his church to the District for the year, giving the address of the District Treasurer.

2. Whereas Almighty God has given us another year of splendid progress in our District and has permitted us to enjoy another gracious conference: therefore, be it resolved that we express our appreciation to God by standing and saying, "Praise the Lord."

3. Whereas our conference has enjoyed the efficient and spiritual leadership of our General Secretary of Church Extension: Therefore, be it resolved that we show our appreciation to him by standing and saying, "God bless you."

4. We recommend that we show our deep appreciation to Rev. Roy Nible, our beloved and faithful District Superintendent, by standing and giving him a rising vote of thanks for his untiring service for God and the District.

5. For our efficient Secretary, Rev. Allen Thomas, who has served faithfully this conference year, therefore, be it resolved that we express our sincere appreciation by a rising vote of thanks.

6. Be it resolved that this conference show their deep appreciation to our efficient District Treasurer, Rev. John Abernathy, who has served faithfully this conference year, by saying a hearty "God bless you."

7. Be it resolved that we show our appreciation to our Sunday School Secretary, Rev. Anatole Ferlet, by having our secretary send him a letter of thanks and our regrets for his absence at our District Conference.

8. We recommend that a rising vote of thanks be given to the cooks and all who assisted them during this conference.

9. Be it resolved that the local church be accorded our appreciation for the entertainment enjoyed by this conference, and Sister Dooley's untiring efforts to properly house us, and that our District Treasurer be authorized to pay the local church \$15.00 to help defray the cost.

REPORT OF THE EXAMINING & EDUCATION BOARD

We, the educational and examining board, recommend the following: For First Year License, Rev. James Mulkey. For Fourth Year License, Rev. Francis Aeschliman, Rev. Russell Manship, Rev. Nicholas Maynard. We further recommend that Rev. T. T. Hines be dropped from our roll, inasmuch as he has joined another denomination. We recommend that Rev. Robert Kiblinger be received from the Southern Indiana Conference with such credentials as he brings.
