District Superintendent's Report

Staunton Virginia, August 29, 1938.

To the Seventh Annual Assembly of The Virginia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church:

Brethren: We extend to you greetings and thank you most heartily for your cooperation and for your prayers in our behalf, as we have endeavored to carry on the work to which you have assigned us. This work cannot be carried on but by the help of the Lord and the prayers of those with whom we have labored.

We wish to give to God all the glory for His presence, and His blessings and the help of the Holy Spirit in our labors. We also wish to thank God for His kind care over us in our travels.

During the year, we have preached 160 times, held one revival in the District, and made 106 calls on the various Churches of the District and have held 87 business meetings with the Churches in the District, and 77 quarterly meetings. We have had 32 souls seeking God and anointed 12 persons for healing, and dedicated two children. We have travelled 19,467 miles and have paid out in the District of our offerings \$292.44. We have received from the District Treasurer for Home Missionary work \$114.51 and for special travelling expenses from the District incidental fund \$66.83. As supply for Churches, pastoral work and evangelistic work \$181.70, donations \$55.60, as direct remuneration \$1,038. Of this \$781.64 was tithe and \$282.46 offering from Churches.

The finances of the District have exceeded any previous year. Our District Treasurer's report shows an increase of approximately \$702.84 over last year. We also note with pleasure that the amount raised on the General Budget is noticeably more than last year, and \$33.03 would have paid us out in full. This is the nearest that we have come to meeting this budget at any time. Our Foreign Missionary offerings are larger as well. We owe at the present time \$57.50 on the tent. Because of other pressing needs in the Home Missionary Department, we have not paid this off.

We are glad to say that nearly all of our Churches have had excellent revivals, and better revivals than for some time. A number of them were very helpful in building up the Churches.

The Beaverdam Church has done wonderfully, and been blessed under the ministry of Brother and Sister Pope. A good meeting was held at Staunton during the winter. Newport News had an excellent meeting under the ministry of Sister Moffatt and others, some of which, while not large, were very effective in building up the Church.

The Vinton Church has secured a lot and has erected a basement church valued at \$1,800 or \$2,000, lot and all, and have an indebtedness of only around \$800. This basement was dedicated on July 10th and followed by a revival with Rev. W. S. Dean as preacher and Sister Cummins and the Bates Sisters as singers. Some folks have united with the Church and the work has picked up quite a bit.

The persistent efforts in the Sunday School has resulted in greatly increasing the attendance where carried out. We want to stress the importance of conscientiously and prayerfully putting forth more effort in this field. It

brings young people and children especially in contact with the Church and through this into an experience of grace, and into the Church. They in turn draw the older ones to the Church.

A Home Missionary campaign was put on at Martinsville, but did not result in a permanent organization, Brother and Sister Bowles, Brother and Sister Cooper, and Sister Cummins were the workers in this meeting. We are looking forward to beginning a meeting shortly after the close of the Assembly, with Brother Jackson as the preacher. We trust that this will result in more definite work. The task before us in Home Missionary work is immense. We do believe, however, that we are reaching the place that we shall be able to more definitely push this work. Not a little missionary money has been put in Vinton and Newport News over a period of time, but we feel that this is slowly bringing results, and that time will justify and more than justify the outlay. We are working to perfect plans whereby we may more effectively carry on this work the coming year.

We pray God's blessing upon this Assembly, and trust that we may solve many of our problems and take advanced steps for the future, that we may enlarge our usefulness in this needy District. In closing may I exhort you to make the coming year of greater blessing and usefulness by our being more spiritual and walking more closely and humbly with God.

Resolution No. 2. Resolved that we have a Camp Meeting Committee of three who shall have supervision of the Camp except the devotional services.

Resolution No. 3. Resolved that this Assembly give a rising vote of thanks to all who have served so faithfully to make this Assembly a blessing.

Ways and Means Recommendations

Recommendation No. 1. We recommend that our Churches pound the Pastors at least once each month.

Recommendation No. 2. We recommend that pledges be taken from the floor to cover the publication of minutes of this Assembly, same to be included in the budget.

Recommendation No. 3. We recommend that an offering be taken for the District Superintendent on each of his visits to the local Churches, in cash or donations to cover not less than his expenses.

Recommendation No. 4. We recommend that the Missionary Budget of \$2.00 or more per member be raised as Foreign Missionary funds by methods best suited to local conditions.

Recommendation No. 5. We recommend that each local Church, each Pastor and each Evangelist forward to the District Treasurer through the local Church Treasurer, an offering equivalent to \$1.00 per representative of the Annual Assembly to help defray expense of the Assembly.

Recommendation No. 6. We recommend that each Church take a special cash offering and also a donation or paunding for the support of the District Camp Meeting. Said cash offering to be sent to the District Treasurer at least thirty days previous to the Camp.

Recommendation No. 7. (Only the last clause retained). It is understood that the Evangelistic League shall be free to function and raise money in addition to the budget percentage for Church Extension work.

Recommendation No. 8. We recommend that the District Superintendent shall not hold a pastorate but be granted the privilege of evangelistic work for one-fourth of the year as he chooses and the remuneration be his own.

Recommendation No. 9. We recommend that all licensed and ordained ministers and deaconesses pay their tithes from remuneration received from their ministry into the local Church Treasury, to be forwarded to the District Treasurer for the support of the District Superintendent, and the District Superintendent in turn pay his tithe into the District Treasury, said tithes to be applied to the General and District Budgets.

Recommendation No. 10. We recommend that each local Treasurer forward to the District Treasurer all offerings for General and District funds by the 20th of each month.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THIS YEAR

Recommendation No. 1. We recommend that we add to Recommendation No. 9 the following: "That pledges for donations be taken from the Assembly floor."

Recommendation No. 2. We recommend that we apportion the Churches for the General and District Budgets according to financial strength instead of numerical strength, that the financial strength be determined by taking an average of what was paid by the Churches the past four years.

Recommendation No. 3. We recommend that we have a District Camp Meeting fund, said fund to be raised by the Sunday School paying at least one average of ten per cent. each Sunday, including Foreign Missions, said fund to be sent in monthly to the District Treasurer.

Recommendation No. 4. We recommend that we have a Church Extension fund, this fund to be raised by each Church paying an average of at least one per cent. of the regular offerings. This fund is to be used for buying or building church property in the District only. Any Church borrowing from this fund shall give a note signed by the trustees and a deed of trust for the amount borrowed. This fund shall be in control of the District Council.

Recommendation No. 5. We recommend that the Young People's Societies

of the District send in an offering to the District Camp to help defray the expenses of free entertainment at the Young People's Convention. These offerings may be taken monthly in the Young People's Society.

Recommendation No. 6. We recommend that pledges be solicited from the Assembly floor to raise the deficit in General Assembly expense.

Recommendation No. 7. We recommend that a minimum of \$300 for traveling expenses be given the District Superintendent, amount to be raised on each visit to the local Churches according to last year's minutes, Recommendation No. 4, Page 13.

Recommendation No. 8. We recommend that all licensed or ordained ministers not actually engaged in the ministry but in secular work pay ten dollars per year out of their tithe to be paid to the District Superintendent's support.

Memorials to the General Assembly

Memorial No. 1. Inasmuch as Paragraph No. 5, Section 80, of our Manual has been misleading and has been interpreted to prohibit any social privileges among our young people, be it resolved that we substitute the following: "This organization shall hold no meetings which are detrimental to their spiritual life."

Memorial No. 2. Resolved that Section No. 188, Paragraph No. 7, to be the following: That we ask the General Assembly to correct the Manual to agree with the minutes of the General Assembly of September 10, 1934, relative to Section 188, Paragraph 7, of the Manual.

Memorial No. 3. Be it resolved that Section 24, Paragraph 1, Page 26, of our Manual, be changed to read: wherever there are at least 15 persons.

Memorial No. 4. Since there is divided opinion regarding the wedding ring, be it resolved that we insert in Section 29, Paragraph 13, following the word "gold" such as "wedding ring" included.

Memorial No. 5. Whereas our Foreign Missionaries represent so large a portion of our Church, be it resolved that all actively engaged Missionaries home on furlough planning to return to Mission fields, be given a seat in the Assembly bar and a voice and vote in the General Assembly.

Memorial No. 6. Be it resolved that a place be given in our Church finance report blanks to show money borrowed.

Memorial No. 7. Be it resolved that no one be elected to the local Church board who has not been a member in good standing for at least twelve months, nor who is under the age of 21 years, except where the local Church board deem it necessary.

Memorial No. 8. Be it resolved that any Pastor having accepted a call to a local Church, and wishing to resign before the end of Assembly year shall be required to give at least sixty days notice to his District Superintendent and local Church board unless released earlier by local Church board and District Superintendent.

Memorial No. 9. Whereas quite often backslidden members of our Church continue to exercise the functions of members in good standing, such as that of voting in the Annual Church Meeting, be it resolved that the following be adopted: "When a member of our Church ceases to profess salvation, the local Church board shall instruct the Church Secretary to transfer the name of such person to the "roll of probationary members" unless it is deemed advisable to

immediately expel him from the Church, or to secure his personal withdrawal from membership. His name shall be returned to the roll of full members, when his spirit and practice shall have convinced the local Church board of his reclamation. Probationary members shall not vote in any Church business meeting, and may be expelled, or their personal withdrawal from membership secured, at any time, according to the provisions of the Manual."

Memorial No. 10. Whereas the practice of promiscuous bathing is one of the major evils of our day, being equally as wrong as the theatre or the dance, be it resolved, that the following be adopted as one of the special rules of our Church: "We are opposed to the practice of promiscuous bathing."
