## GENERAL PROCEEDINGS

### Monday Morning

THE TWENTY-FIRST DISTRICT CONFERENCE OF THE VIRGINIA DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH CONVENED IN STAUNTON, VIRGINIA, MONDAY MORNING, JULY 6th, 1942.

A devotional service preceded the business session. The devotions were conducted by Rev. J. H. Norton. Brother Guill led the Conference in prayer.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, our highly esteemed General Superintendent, was presented to the Conference by District Superintendent, Rev. D. E. Snow. Brother Surbrook made appreciative remarks concerning the ministry and leadership of Brother Snow.

Rev. H. D. Dieter, president of the Allentown Bible Institute, addressed the Conference. Brother Dieter exhorted us to a great life of prayer and faith. He also gave a report relative to the progress of the Institute.

The roll of both the Ministerial and Lay Delegates was called.

Moved and seconded that Mrs. Byrd Puffenbarger be seated as the delegate from Billers Crest. Carried.

A motion prevailed that the first six seats constitute the Conference bar.

Moved and seconded that the District Superintendent fix the hours for business. Carried.

The hours for business were set as follows: 9-11:30 a. m., 1:30-5 p. m., and 7-9 p. m.

By motion Rev. J. M. Jackson was received into the District and given a voice and seat in the Conference.

Rev. J. E. Guill was appointed on the Ways and Means Committee, and Rev. E. J. Hocking was placed on the Auditing Committee.

The report of the District Superintendent was given, and by motion was reviewed.

The Statistical Report was read by the District Statistician, and by motion was received with a rising vote of thanks to the Committee for the splendid work done.

The Board of Education and Examination reported. We, the Board of Education and Examination, recommend the following: (1) That Rev. J. M. Jackson, coming to us from the Wesleyan Methodist Church, be received as an ordained minister into the Conference of the Virginia District; (2) That all licensed ministers failing to complete and report on at least two subjects a year, in the required course of study, will be asked to accept local license, unless, in the judgment of the Education Board, an exception shall be made. This recommendation will go into effect next Conference year. (Page 98, Section 142 of the Manual); (3) We further recommend the ordination at this Conference of Rev. C. M. Muse, who will have completed the educational requirements this fall, and who has met the spiritual standards for ordination prescribed by our Manual.

Moved and seconded that the report of the Education and Examination Board be received. Carried.

The Auditing Committee reported as follows: We, the Auditing Committee, have audited the books of the District Treasurer, and find them not only correct, but in excellent condition otherwise.—I. T. Dunn, E. J. Hocking, committee.

The Resolutions Committee reported, and due to the fact that they had no resolutions to present, their report was received with a rising vote of thanks.

Moved and seconded that we recess until the afternoon sitting. Carried.

Brother Snow dismissed with prayer.

## Monday Afternoon

On reconvening, the Conference sang: "Near the Cross". We were led to the throne of grace by Brother Driver and Brother Surbrook.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. and Mrs. Jason Felter to the Conference.

A motion prevailed that Brother and Sister Felter sing. Sister Felter sang to the edification of the Conference.

Sister Caudill and her Brother Kenneth favored the Conference with a duet.

Moved and seconded that the District Camp Meeting be moved to July 16-25, and that the Conference convene on July 26. Carried.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

Recommendation No. 1. Carried.

Recommendation No. 2 was discussed, a substitute recommendation was offered, and by motion was carried.

Recommendation No. 3 carried.

Recommendation No. 4, after discussion, was amended as follows: (1) Said tithes to be based on the cash offerings reported by the District Statistician, rather than the offerings reported by the District Treasurer; (2) Full tithes of the District Superintendent's remuneration received from the District. Carried with the two above amendments.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn, and meet at 6:15 p. m., and that the order of the day on reconvening be the Election of Officers. Carried.

Brother Michael dismissed with prayer.

## Monday Evening

The evening sitting was opened by singing one verse of an old church hymn.

Moved and seconded that we dispense with the roll call. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the District Treasurer report. Carried.

The Treasurer's Report was given, and a motion prevailed that it be received with a rising vote of thanks to the Treasurer for his splendid work.

Since the order of the day was the Election of Officers, the District Superintendent, by a motion, was authorized to appoint the tellers. The tellers were appointed as follows: Revs. E. J. Hocking, Alvin Jackson, I. T. Dunn, O. T. Bowles, and Rev. J. A. Howard presided at the blackboard.

The Officers were elected as follows: Rev. D. E. Snow, District Superintendent; Rev. H. H. Michael, Assistant District Superintendent; Rev. G. A. Castevens, District Secretary; Rev. J. E. Kraus, District Treasurer; Advisory members: Rev. J. E. Guill, Rev. C. A. Cooper, Rev. O. W. Bogan.

Rev. G. A. Castevens was elected to the Board of Education and Examination for three years.

The Trustees were elected as follows: Mr. D. B. Driver, three years; Mr. J. S. Harlow, two years; Mr. U. P. Black, one year.

Moved and seconded that Brother Bowles be given a rising vote of thanks for his service as a Council member. Carried.

A very impressive ordination service was conducted by Rev. W. L. Surbrook, in which Brother C. M. Muse was set apart to the ministry.

A vote of appreciation was extended to our presiding officer for his service rendered in presiding so efficiently.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Carried.

Brother Surbrook dismissed the Conference with prayer, asking our Heavenly Father's blessing upon all.

Moved and seconded that the appointment of the Zone Chairmen be left in the hands of the District Council. Carried. The District Council selected the following as Zone Chairmen: Rev. Byrd Puffenbarger, Eastern Zone Chairman; Rev. J. A. Howard, Western Zone Chairman.

A motion prevailed that the local Societies repeat the pledges toward Home Missions as in the past year.

Resolution No. 1. Whereas there are so many that do not know all the by-laws and resolutions of the past year, be it therefore resolved that they be printed each year in the Conference minutes.

Resolution No. 2. Resolved that the District Superintendent appoint all committees to act through the following year.

Resolution No. 3. Resolved that the District Council be empowered to take charge of any unfinished business of the Conference after its adjournment.

Resolution No. 4. Resolved that no resolution presented to the Conference and lost shall be printed in the minutes.

Resolution No. 5. Resolved that a place be given in our Church Financial blanks to show money borrowed.

Resolution No. 6. Resolved that a Sunday School Rally be held at least once a year, under the supervision of the Pastor.

Resolution No. 7. Resolved that as far as possible appointments of committees be arranged so that each committee can meet at the same time.

Resolution No. 8. Resolved that when possible every Church have a weekly children's meeting.

Resolution No. 9. Resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given our District Superintendent and all the workers who have so tirelessly worked to make the Conference an enjoyable season of fellowship and a profitable time in planning the work of the Church.

Resolution No. 10. Resolved that the workers for the District Camp Meeting be left in the hands of the District Council.

Resolution No. 11. Resolved that we have a Camp Meeting Committee of five who shall have full supervision of the Camp.

Resolution No. 12. Resolved that the District build a parsonage for the District Superintendent.

Resolution No. 13. Resolved that all Licensed Ministers who have been denied the privilege of attending Bible School be required to take the correspondence course from Allentown Bible Institute, leading to ordination.

Resolution No. 14. Resolved that the Evangelistic League revert back to the former custom, the District Superintendent being chairman, and appointing two others to serve with him.

Resolution No. 15. Resolved that the Annual District Young People's Rally be held the first Friday night, Saturday and Sunday of the Annual Camp.

Resolution No. 16. Resolved that no person who is a member of the Virginia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church be permitted to wear a ring.

Resolution No. 17. Resolved that all resolutions be grouped in one group and numbered accordingly.

Resolution No. 18. Resolved that the Conference year close May the 31st, and that the Camp Meeting be moved to July 16-25, and that the District Conference convene Monday morning, July 26th, at 8:30 a. m.

## Ways and Means Recommendations

Recommendation No. 1. We recommend that the Churches pound the Pastors at least once a month.

Recommendation No. 2. We recommend that pledges be taken from the Conference floor to cover the publication of the minutes, same to be included in the budget.

Recommendation No. 3. We recommend that the Missionary Budget of \$1.90 or more be raised as a Foreign Missionary Fund by best methods suited to local conditions.

Recommendation No. 4. We recommend that each local Church pay \$1.00 for each representative attending the District Conference. Each evangelist and unstationed minister will pay one dollar (\$1.00) toward the expenses of the Conference.

Recommendation No. 5. We recommend that each Church take a special offering and also a donation or pounding for the support of the District Camp Meeting. Said cash offering to be sent to the District Treasurer at least thirty days previous to the Camp. (Added recommendation of 1938) We recommend that the pledges for donations be taken from the Conference floor.

Recommendation No. 6. We recommend that the Evangelistic League shall be free to raise money in addition to the budget for Church Extension work.

Recommendation No. 7. We recommend that each local Treasurer forward to the District Treasurer all offerings for General and District Funds by the 20th of each month.

Recommendation No. 8. We recommend that we have a Church Extension Fund, this fund to be raised by each Church paying on an average of at least one per cent of the regular offerings. This Fund is to be used for buying or building church property in the District only. Any church borrowing from this Fund shall give a note signed by the Trustees and a deed of trust for the amount borrowed. This Fund shall be under the control of the District Council.

Recommendation No. 9. We recommend that the Young People's Societies of the District send in an offering to the District Camp to help defray the expense of free entertainment at the Young People's Rally. These offerings may be taken monthly in the Young People's Societies.

Recommendation No. 10. We recommend that our Pastors present the penny-a-day proposition, relative to the Allentown Bible Institute to the local Churches, and do their best to raise same.

Recommendation No. 11. Inasmuch as we have a Camp Meeting Association, we recommend that Recommendation No. 11, page 15, (1939 minutes) be deleted from the minutes.

Recommendation No. 12. We recommend that our District and General Budgets be set at the same amount as last year which is as follows: \$2,985.00, this to cover Foreign Missions, General Budget, District Incidental, District Home Missions, General Conference Expense, Contingency Fund, and last year's Deficits. The following amendment was adopted this year at the District Conference. That all our Home Missionary funds be applied on the Hampton project.

The above budget is pro-rated to the Churches as follows:

We further recommend that the District Superintendent receive as his remuneration one-half of the ministers' tithes, said tithes to be based on the cash offering reported in the Statistical Report, rather than the amount reported by the District Treasurer. The Superintendent shall visit each Church twice this year, his traveling expenses to be raised by free will offerings at the time of his visit. The District is to assume no further obligation. We further recommend that the full tithe of the District Superintendent's remuneration received from the District be turned into the District Treasury against our deficit.

Motion from 1940 minutes, page 8, Tuesday afternoon: "Moved and seconded that the remaining half of the Ministers' tithes be applied on the budgets. Carried."

Recommendation No. 13. Whereas the Martinsville Church is now able to support their Pastor, but since they have no parsonage, we recommend that all of the Sunday Schools in the District set aside one Sunday this year and raise a special offering to be applied on the parsonage rent. This offering to be sent to the District Treasurer as soon as received.

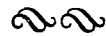
