REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the Twenty-first District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the West Virginia District held at Bramwell, W. Va.

Greetings in Jesus' Name:

Through the providence of God we are again permitted in a District Assembly. I trust we have come not only to hear reports and pass resolutions, but for the purpose of getting in closer touch with God and with each other.

This Assembly is of great importance to us as a Church, for by the action of the General Assembly we now have a new system of financing our General Church interests. It is not a question now if we think this is the best plan or not. It was passed by a large majority of the General Assembly and it now becomes our duty to do our best to put it in operation. I therefore, recommend that the Ways and Means Committee make but one budget including both the General and District work. I also recommend that provision in this year's budget and each year from now until the General Assembly for the traveling expense and entertainment of the delegates to th next General Assembly.

As a member of the General Board I requested them to tell me what amount would be expected of the West Virginia District, for the General Church Budget, I was informed whatever amount we would set. I therefore recommend that the Ways and Means Committee bring before this assembly at the earliest hour possible the amounts needed for each of the following items: General Church support, District Superintendent; District Treasurer; District Secretary; District Council and Incidental expenses; District Church Extension; District Printing, including Minutes and Stationery and Delegates' fare and entertainment to the General Assembly.

During the last year I have traveled 14940 miles, have attended 450 services, preached 322 times, there were 400 persons prayed through to definite victory. I have visited each Church on the District four times except three to which I did not get on my last round on account of visiting my son Harry and his family, who are now on their way to the Orient. I have been engaged in 13 Revivals; Nine out of this District and four in the West Virginia District. In these meetings and my quarterly meetings I have received offerings to the amount of \$1,506.41 The preachers on the District have paid me \$99.48 half tithe, making a Total of \$1,606.25. This amount I have paid by check to the District Treasurer toward my salary and traveling expenses.

You will see by the report of the Churches that we have not increased in numbers; it is not because of not receiving new members, but that we have insisted on dropping dead timber, and as a result 51 names have been dropped during the year.

One new Church has been organized through the District Tent work and we are expecting the incoming District Superintendent to organize another church that has been made possible through the efforts of Rev J. M. Cochran, who purchased a tent, held a meeting the result of which 44 persons are now asking for a Church.

I had the privilege of raising by subscription the balance of the indebtedness on the church at Three Mile at the close of a revival, also of dedicating the church. This is a healthy young church and will soon be out of debt.

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

Item 3.—We recommend the half tithe of ministers be continued with \$8.00 each for inactive ministers, for District Superintendent. Moved and seconded this item be adopted. Carried.

Item 4.—We recommend an offering be taken for District Tent Work. Moved and seconded this item be adopted. Carried.

The Chair appointed as tellers, Rev. O. W. Barnes and Rev. Ellis T. Boswell. Ballot spread and election pursued resulting in the following elections: District Superintendent, J. F. Woods; Assistant District Superintendent, Elmer D. Joy; Secretary, E. W. Miller; Treasurer, Mrs. Mattie Ensley; Board members, P. H. Greeson, O. W. Barnes and J. C. Baynum; Examining Board member, Ellis T. Boswell; Trustees, E. D. Joy, J. F. Woods and K. G. Lawrence.

Moved and seconded the Missionary Board be eliminated. Carried.

REPORT OF EXAMINING BOARD

Examining Board gives partial report, recommending the following for renewal of preacher's license:—E. B. Welch; Ada Heironimus; Dayton Grimes; J. R. Hatcher; L. J. Burgess; John W. Daniels; Chas. Eaton; C. S. Gladwell; John Griffith; Cora Hutchinson; C. E. Merritt; Blanch Williams; John Layne; John Stewart; C. R. Johnson, and the following for Deaconesses licenses: Mrs. Nellie Ritz; Ida Barber and Ruby Gibson. On motion duly seconded and carried each of these persons in turn were approved for license.

The board recommended that credentials of Willie Holstein be not renewed account of charges against her relative to doctrine. Moved and supported this recommendation be supported. Carried (Prayer offered here by the Assembly that this soul may be delivered from the clutches of the Tongues Movement).

Report of Rev. Mrs. Blanch Williams heard and accepted, same having been overlooked previously.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

RESOLUTION No. 1—Due to the fact that the meeting of our next General Assembly at Colorado Springs will cost several thousand dollars more than if we met at a more central place, Be it Resolved that we the West Virginia District request the General Board at its March meeting, to consider the advisability of moving the place of meeting to a more central location; also that this resolution be published in the Advocate. Moved and seconded this resolution be adopted. Carried.

RESOLUTION No. 2—We, the Committee on resolutions recommend that each local church pay expenses of their pastor and delegates to the District Assembly. Moved and seconded this resolution be adopted. Carried.

RESOLUTION No. 4—We the committee on resolutions, recommend that the Assembly defray the expenses of transportation of district secretary and district treasurer to the district assembly. Amended—Providing they are not a delegate or pastor. Moved and seconded to accept the amendment. Carried. Moved and seconded to accept the amended resolution. Carried.

RESOLUTION No. 4—We your committee on resolutions, recommend that pastor's salary be paid while he attends the District Assembly. Moved and seconded this resolution be adopted. Carried.

Moved and seconded we vote on place of next assembly. Carried.

Parkersburg and Huntington put in nomination. Vote cast and Parkersburg received majority vote.

PARKERSBURG Place of next Assembly.

Pledges here taken for our official Church Paper amounting to approximately 214.

Moved and seconded to adjourn. Carried.

FOURTH BUSINESS SESSION

SATURDAY 8:00 A. M. SEPT. 27, 1930

Opened with devotional services. Scripture lesson by Rev. E. T. Boswell.

Sr. Arnold Hodgin introduced. Moved and seconded she be given seat within conference bar. Carried.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Roll Call dispensed with.

Examining Board gives their final report, recommending W. H. Norris be received back into district and credentials renewed; also that Everett B. Bailey's credentials be renewed; and Mrs. Rosa Scaggs be granted deaconess license. It was moved and seconded that each of these recommendations be accepted. Carried.

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

(1) We recommend that all moneys coming in through the District Superintendent's meetings in or out of district in excess of \$1,500.00 and traveling expenses be given him as further remuneration for his services. Moved and seconded this recommendation be accepted. Carried.

(2) We recommend that the deficits in Secretary and Treasurer's salaries and that on the Advocate Editor's salary, and interest of \$1.20 on money borrowed to pay for minutes for last year be paid from balance on delegate's fares and remaining balance to be transferred to printing fund for minutes and printing. Moved and seconded this recommendation be accepted. Carried.

(3) We recommend that the District Board borrow sufficient to pay Brother Webb amount due him and treasurer be directed to get in touch with those who have not paid their pladge for last year and raise same. Moved and seconded this recommendation be accepted. Carried.

(4) We recommend a special offering to be taken for Brother Hodgin, Assistant General Superintendent Sunday night, the same to be applied on our general Budget for the District. Moved and seconded this be accepted. Carried.

(5) We recommend that an offering be taken at this session for the purchase of a set of study books for preachers and deaconesses course of study, the same to be in charge of Examining Board. Moved and seconded this recommendation be accepted. Carried. Offering taken \$15.00; also books donated. Moved and seconded we take 10 minutes to prayer at 10 o'clock in behalf of Brother K. G. Lawrence's daughter's operation, the outcome of bus accident yesterday at May-beury. Carried.

(6) We recommend that \$10.00 be added to the budget to both the secretary and treasurer's allowance to cover traveling expenses to district assembly. Moved and seconded to accept this. Carried.

(7) We recommend that the usual custom of taking up offering for the District Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent on each of his visits be continued. Moved and seconded this recommendation be accepted. Carried.

(8) After going carefully over the financial reports of the churches we have prepared the accompanying apportionment of the budget and recommend reducing the amount given the District Superintendent \$100.00, making it \$775.00, regretting to do so, but considering that this is an addition of \$375.00 over last year, and that the budget be divided as follows: Four parts to General Church work and three parts to District. Moved and seconded we rescind action taken in second session relative to Item one of report of Ways and Means Committee. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded we adopt this recommendation. Carried; the recommendation being as follows: Amount given by churches this year, recommended apportionment for coming year:

Moved and seconded the number of minutes to be printed be left to the committee on minutes. Carried.

Moved and seconded we extend a rising vote of thanks on Sunday evening to the Bramwell Church for their hospitality shown this assembly. Carried.

Moved and seconded date of next assembly be September 22-27, 1930, subject to change if it does not suit the General Superintendent. Carried.

Moved and seconded this Assembly give a rising vote of thanks to Brother and Senior Hodgins for their presence with us. Carried.

Moved and seconded the Secretary write a letter to unstationed preachers to send in their apportionment of \$8.00. Carried.

There being no further business before the Assembly, the Minutes of this session were read and approved, after which it was Moved and seconded to adjourn.
