JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Eleventh Annual District Conference of Wisconsin Pilgrim Church convened at 9:00 a.m. August 17, 1966, at Burr Wesleyan Camp Grounds, Burr Ridge, Wisconsin with Rev. Miller presiding.

The conference was opened with congregational singing led by Rev. Watkins. Prayer was then offered by Mrs. Mary Hollmann. The meeting was turned over to Rev. Miller at which time he gave some inspiring thoughts and a challenge to become fisher's of men and to follow Christ. Matt. 4:19.

A motion was made that the middle section of chairs be set as the conference bar. This motion was seconded by Mr. Blann. A motion was then made to receive Miss Jordan, Rev. Schaffner, and Rev. Watkins into the Conference Bar.

DISTRICT MISSIONARY SOCIETY REPORT *** August 17, 1966

In the good providence of God, we are here in another Camp and Conference. We have much to praise God for, in spite of the unrest, turmoil, confusion and unhappiness in the world. God's people are a privileged and peculiarly happy people.

This has been a very special year for me. It was my privilege to accompany my husband on a business trip to Europe and Israel - a trip and experience I shall never forget. The Land of the Bible is a place that most of us here at home think of in our imagination and cannot realize it as an existing real place, but it is. Places like Nazareth, Bethlehem, Tiberius, Capernaum, Beer Sheba, Caesarea, and Jerusalem are all as real today as in Jesus's time. I can not tell you how humbled and thankful I was to be a born again believer and follower of the Lord Jesus as I visited and stood in places that He many years ago had lived and travelled. But this is not a report of my trip to Israel. Because He told His disciples to "Go into all the world and preach the Gospel", we have a report on our part in helping others to carry out that Great Commission.

We have six churches in Wisconsin and all have helped to make this report. Since my report last year did not include the Missionary service, the month of August, 1965 thru July 1966 are reported now.

The six societies have sent to the Department of World Missions \$991.57. This amount includes: money given for the Cushe, Trinidad project; Project of the Month; Self Denial November offering; Equipment Fund; Child Care; Native Worker and other World Missionary office appeals such as Rev. Chamberlain, Rev. Biberstein and the Rev. Duckworth Family support.

The amount given for the Cushe, Trinidad project is \$268.66.

Our special District Camp Project is the gifts of the Societies in money or products toward the food supplies for the Camp - so that the teen-agers might attend Camp for half rate and contribute the other half in work assistance in Dining Room, Kitchen, Snack Shack and other chores that they might do to lighten the burdens of the adults in order that all may enjoy Camp. To this fund the societies contributed \$101.40

In view of the fact that our Societies are so far apart and we see each other for fellowship only at Camp - I think this is a fine record. We are doing better each year and I'm sure that we will continue to better the record each year as long as Jesus lets us stay here to work for Him.

I could not close this report until I tell you what a thrill and blessing it was to be at the International Conference this year and enjoy the services and sessions the first time that the National Churches were represented by some of the most outstanding men from all the Fields. I wish you all could have been there to hear their reports, testimonies, and native songs as well as other wonderful singing. They each added much to the Conference and collectively it was just wonderful.

May God bless each officer and each member of the societies in the coming year.

STANDING RULES

Section I Sunday School and Youth

1. The offerings taken at District Sunday School Promotional Meetings shall be sent to the District Treasurer. It is to be expected that these offerings adequately cover the expenses involved (\$10. min. ave. per meeting.) (1962)
2. Each Church in the District shall contribute one of its Sunday School offerings semi-annually to the expenses of the District Sunday School Board. This fund will cover the cost of the following items:
 - A. Purchase of reference books and magazines subscriptions for the use of the District Sunday School Board.
 - B. Correspondence, report forms, and mailing expense to the churches in the district.
 - C. Travel and expenses of the promotional secretary to meetings of the National Sunday School Association within the State of Wisconsin, and to our National Sunday School Leader's Conference. (1961)

Section II Camp Meeting

1. The Camp Meeting Board shall be composed of the District Council. (1958)
2. Retired Pilgrim Ministers and their wives shall be given concessions due to the regular ministry; such as reduction of rates during camp meeting, etc. (1959)

Section III District Superintendent and District Council

1. A meeting shall be held by the District Supt. each September to familiarize the ministers of the District with the current program for the new year. (1959)
2. An installation service shall be conducted by the District Supt., or someone appointed by him, for each incoming pastor to a local church within the district. (1958)
3. The District Supt. shall appoint all committees. A list of appointments shall be submitted to the District Council for approval. (1958)
4. All evangelists within the church and also all Christian workers that represent works outside our denomination, shall be approved by the District Council or the District Supt. before conducting services in our churches. (1956)
5. The District Supt. shall be chairman of the Educational and Examining Board. (1958)
6. An offering shall be received by the churches at the visits of the District Supt. This amount is to be sent by the local treasurer to the District Treasurer in addition to the budget. It is to be expected that these offerings

adequately cover his traveling expenses. (1958)

7. All District Officials shall be paid travel expense at the rate of 3¢ per mile, plus meals when traveling for District work approved by the Council. (1958)

8. The District Treasurer shall pay the conference contribution to the Pilgrim Pension Plan for the District Supt. (1958)

9. The District Treasurer shall reserve 5% of the District Budget for covering the expenses of the Delegates to the General Conference. (1958)

10. No assessment shall be levied against the Churches without the consent of the District Conference or Council. (1958)

Section IV Business Practice

1. Each Church shall be required to have adequate insurance protection, including public liability. (1958)

2. Three members of the District Council shall be appointed by the Council to be the District Trustees. (1958)

3. The local church treasurers shall balance their books at the end of each month and forward all District and General funds immediately to the District Treasurer. (1958)

4. The District Supt. and the pastors of our churches shall be given two weeks vacation with pay. (1958)

5. Pastors shall be limited to 15 days away from their respective fields in revivals unless approved by the District Council. (1958)

6. All plans for building, remodeling, or financing of any construction to cost in excess of \$500. shall be submitted to the District Council for approval before construction is begun. (1958)

7. Unorganized churches may form a Pilgrim Fellowship. (1958)

8. All unstationed ministers shall submit annual reports to the District Supt. and Statistician. (1958)

9. A Conference Action Committee of 5 members shall bring all matters of legislation and finance to the conference. They shall meet one month prior to conference and send a copy of all proposed action to Pastors to be presented at his local church. (1958)

10. All Committees and District leaders shall submit to the District Sec. by September 15, the dates of planned conventions, rallies, etc.; these and other dates of importance shall be included in the calendar of events to be compiled by the Secretary and distributed to each pastor. (1959)

11. The District Supt. shall appoint a District Reporter to provide news coverage regarding District and General Church activities. Articles shall be written in best form possible and shall be approved by the District Superintendent.

Copies of news articles shall be given to each pastor for his local newspaper. (1959)

12. In the election of church delegates to the District Conferences, specific consideration shall be given the following:

- a. He shall be able to properly represent his local church in any conference action.
- b. The local church shall instruct the delegate with regard to any proposed conference action. (1959)

13. The District Treasurer shall be bonded. (1958)

14. The Fiscal Year for the District shall be April 1, to March 31.

Section V Memorials and Memoirs

1. The Memorial committee shall be also the memoirs committee, and shall pay tribute to those of our membership who have deceased during the conference year. (1958)

Section VI Conference Journal

1. All district resolutions shall become standing rules on year after their adoption, and the date shall be inserted parenthetically. (1958)

2. The Conference Action Committee shall meet before publishing the official minutes in order to advise with respect to the portion pertaining to the standing rules, and the report of the said committee. (1960)

Section VII Special Pastoral Duties

1. Each pastor shall teach a class in Manual for all new members or other members of his church who have not had the opportunity to attend such a class previously. This class is to be offered at least once a year. (1958)

Section VIII Budget

1. The local church assessment for District expense shall be 5% of all local church offerings. This amount shall not include Sunday School offerings, Building Funds, Evangelistic or other Special offerings raised for General Church purposes. (1960)

2. The local church District assessment (5% of the regular offerings) and special offerings received for District operations, is not always adequate to cover all of the cost incurred; in order to distribute income equitably, be it resolved that the income from these sources, be disbursed on the following percentage basis:
