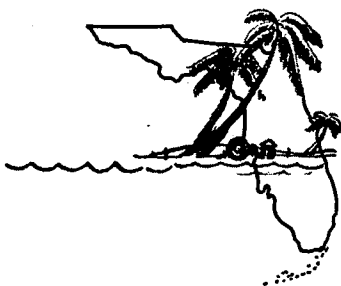

**FLORIDA CONFERENCE**  
**JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS**

**First Sitting**

**Monday, June 12, 1961, 7:30 P.M.**

The first sitting of the Eighth Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 7:30 p.m. June 12, 1961, at the Morrison Memorial Church, Intercession City, Florida.

The conference was opened by Rev. H. C. Rickner, District Superintendent, with prayer, after which Rev. Ray Richards led in the congregational singing of "He Abides" and "Amazing Grace".

Prayer was requested for our General Superintendent, Rev. R. G. Flexon and Rev. Elmer Kizzee led in prayer.

After a word of appreciation to the host church, Rev. H. C. Rickner introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension, who brought greetings from Rev Flexon, who was ill and unable to be present at this conference.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins thanked those who prayed for Mrs. Hawkins during her recent illness. He gave a personal testimony of how God proved His faithfulness in that dark hour, inasmuch as there was to be an ordination service at 8:30 p.m. the opening address to the conference would be given in the form of a charge to the candidate for ordination.

In the absence of Rev. Virgil Lashbrook, Rev. R. C. Hawkins asked the newly appointed District Secretary, Rev. Harry M. Lee, to serve as secretary during this session.

The Secretary called the roll. It was moved and carried that Mrs. Martha Pullian be seated as delegate from Intercession City.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins explained that by action of the General Board the entire state of Florida would be one conference. This would mean four additional churches would become members of this conference.

The roll was then called for these churches by the secretary.

It was moved and carried that Rev. Elmer Kizzee and Mrs. J. C. Baynum be received into the conference. It was moved and carried that Mrs. William Hartz be seated as delegate from Pinellas Park.

The roll call was then completed. A motion was made and seconded that the conference bar consist of the first ten rows of seats. Motion carried. All ministerial and lay delegates were asked to be seated within the bar.

A motion was made and seconded that the time of the second sitting of the Eighth Annual Conference of Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church be opened at 8:00 a.m. and continue to 12:00 noon and to reconvene at 1:00 p.m. and continue until 5:00 p.m. Motion carried.

The chair called for the report of District Superintendent, Rev. H. C. Rickner. The report was read and heartily accepted by a rising vote of thanks to God for His wonderful goodness and help, with regret that Rev. H. C. Rickner was leaving the district for other fields of labor.

Rev. Fred Sunwalt reported for the auditing committee. Report accepted.

Rev. E. O. Howell reported as District Treasury. Report accepted.

Rev. H. C. Rickner read a letter received from Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Treasurer of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, concerning the finances of the District.

### Ordination Service

Rev. J. H. Morningstar opened the ordination service with prayer. Rev. H. C. Rickner led the congregation singing, "A Charge To Keep I Have", after which he presented Rev. Billy Pevy, candidate for ordination, to Rev. R. C. Hawkins and the conference. The following scriptures were read:

Rev. E. O. Howell, I Timothy 3:1-16.

Rev. R. E. Strickland, II Timothy 4:18.

Rev. H. C. Rickner, Titus 3:1-11.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins gave the charge to Rev. Pevy. He pointed out that a man of God should not be:

1. A financial wizard.
2. Not to be caught in the spirit of the age.
3. Not to dabble in sin.

To be a man of God:

1. He should be a man of God-given convictions.
2. He should be loyal to his church.
3. He should be a man with a mission.

Rev. Pevy knelt at the altar as Rev. R. C. Hawkins led in prayer with the ordination committee, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Rev. R. E. Strickland and Rev. E. O. Howell, laying hands upon the candidate. The congregation joined in singing the Doxology. Rev. Pevy was greeted by the conference, after being ordained.

Announcements were made and a motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried. Rev. E. O. Howell dismissed the first session with prayer.

### Second Sitting

The second sitting convened Tuesday, June 13, 1961, at 8:00 a.m. Rev. H. C. Ricker led in the singing of "Work For The Night Is Coming". Rev. H. E. Osborn led in prayer.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins read from Matthew 14:20, speaking on the subject "The God of Abundance".

Rev. R. C. Hawkins called for the complete roll call.

Rev. Harry M. Lee, District Secretary, called the roll.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

The chair called for the presentation of the newly organized churches.

Rev. H. C. Rickner introduced to the conference two churches and their pastors; Beverly Park Church, Rev. R. E. Richard, Pastor; Pinellas Park Church, Rev. James Cunningham, Pastor. These churches were accepted into the conference.

The following reports were read and accepted:

Rev. Floyd Gookins, Sunday School Promotional Secretary.

Rev. Fred Sumwalt, District Youth Secretary.

Rev. R. E. Richards, Examining and Educational Board.

Rev. R. E. Richards, Ways and Means.

Rev. Floyd Gookins led in prayer and conference recessed 10 minutes.

Conference was called to order by singing "Let The Beauty of Jesus Be Seen In Me". Rev. Clarence C. Klopfenstein led in prayer.

Rev. T. R. York reported again for the resolution committee.

Rev. Harry M. Lee, District Secretary reported for District Council on the Memorial to General Conference. Accepted.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins reported the following appointments were made by the General Board:

Rev. M. C. Kittle, District Superintendent.

Rev. Harry M. Lee, District Secretary.

Rev. O. E. Howell, District Treasurer.

Rev. H. C. Rickner appointed the following tellers: Rev. Gene Osborn and Rev. Billy Pevy.

Ballots were cast and the following officers were elected:

Advisory Council Members; Rev. Norval C. Rickner, Rev. James Cunningham.

The District Council's nominations for the Examining and Education Board were as follows: Rev. Elmer Kizzee and Rev. Harold Huff. Rev. Huff was elected to serve three years.

It was moved and carried that we have nominations for delegates to the General Conference from the District Council. Nominations were as follows: V. Lashbrook, N. Rickner, R. Richards, H. Huff, T. York, J. Cunningham.

It was moved and carried that the three highest be the delegates and the next three highest the alternates each in their order.

Ballots were cast and the results were: Ministerial, N. Rickner, J. Cunningham, H. Huff. Alternates: R. Richards, T. York, V. Lashbrook.

Nomiantions for Lay Delegates were: George Ransom, J. B. Stucky, Mrs. Betty Taylor.

It was moved and carried that the highest be the delegate and the second highest alternate, Lay Delegate.

Ballots were cast: election as follows: J. B. Stucky. Mrs. Betty Taylor.

Rev. F. Gookins presented the following Sunday School awards:  
Ft. Lauderdale, Rev. E. O. Howell, Pastor; Achievement Certificate  
for Highest Gain and a 20% Award Ribbon.

Bradenton, Billy Pevy, Pastor; 15% Award Ribbon.

Rev. T. R. York reported for the resolution committee. Carried.

It was moved and carried the time of the conference be extended un-  
til the call of the chair for adjournment.

Moved and carried this conference send greetings to Rev. R. G.  
Flexon.

Moved and carried the Sunday School count be taken 15 minutes  
prior to closing time.

A love offering was taken for Rev. H. C. Rickner. He expressed his  
thanks to the conference, and also gave a word of appreciation to Rev.  
and Mrs. Strickland for their work at Intercession City.

Announcements were made, the conference arose in singing "When  
the Roll is Called." Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Ex-  
tension, dismissed with prayer.

## RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

### No. 1 Appreciation

We, the Florida District Conference wish to express our appreciation to our General Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, for his inspiring leadership and efficient services. We also wish to express appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. H. C. Rickner, members of the District Council, Business Managers, Rev. and Mrs. R. E. Strickland and the many members and friends of the Church for their labors of love in making this conference a victory.

### No. 2 Camp

Be it resolved that the District Council with two elective members serve as a Camp Meeting Board and that they secure the services of Camp Evangelists and Workers, if possible, two years in advance; and that the date of the Camp Meeting and the names of the workers be placed in the Minutes each year as a permanent advertising for the benefit and information of the public. (Standing Rule)

### No. 3

Since all the ministers of this District help to support the work of the District, be it resolved that all active ministers and their families of the District be permitted to share the food and fellowship of the dining hall at Camp and Conference without charge, and that all will be subject to call, to help anywhere needed to advance the Camp and Conference.

### No. 4 Committees

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees not elected by the Conference or appointed by the District Council. (Standing Rule)

### No. 5 Conference

Be it resolved that the Conference Year shall end April 30th and that all reports shall be in the hands of the District Statistician and all funds in the hands of the District Treasurer by May 15. The District records shall close May 31 and the Annual Conference shall be held the third

week of June, the place to be determined by the District Council. (Standing Rule)

#### **No. 6 Finance**

Be it resolved that the local Church Treasurers balance their books at the close of each month and forward all District and General funds to the District Treasurer immediately. (Standing Rule)

#### **No. 7 Ministerial Meeting**

Be it resolved that we have an annual Ministerial Meeting, the time and place to be determined by the District Council. Be it further resolved that the District Council appoint a program committee. (Standing Rule)

#### **No. 8 Ministers**

Be it resolved that all Ministers accepted as members by the Annual Conference of the Florida District, shall place their membership in some local church in the District within thirty days following the close of the Conference, and that they shall make quarterly reports to the District Superintendent and an annual report to the District Statistician. (Standing Rule)

#### **No. 9 Missionary Societies**

Be it resolved that the Conference elect a Missionary President for the District for the coming Conference year to work in cooperation with the local missionary societies and assist in the organization of new groups where possible.

#### **No. 10 Parsonages**

Be it resolved that each local Church provide a parsonage with at least a telephone, utilities, refrigerator and cooking stove. (Standing Rule)

#### **No. 11 Pastors**

Be it resolved that each Pastor be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay annually.

#### **No. 12 Revival**

Be it resolved that each local Church set aside one day each year for fasting and prayer and that we pray for the leadership of the Holy Spirit in all matters and that we intercede for a Revival in our Churches.

#### **No. 131 Schools**

Inasmuch as there was a temporary exception made by the General Board for the operation of the School at Intercession City:

Therefore, be it resolved that if the School continues to operate, it shall do so according to the policy of the General Board concerning Schools.

## **No. 14 Sunday Schools**

(a) Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary publish a news sheet each month showing the attendance of each Sunday School and news items. These reports shall be sent to each pastor in sufficient number that they can be passed to each family in the Church. (Standing Rule)

(b) Since a number of our Sunday School students from our local church attend the District Camp Meeting:

Therefore, be it resolved that the local Church of which they are members be permitted to count their attendance. (Standing Rule)

## **No. 15 Youth**

Be it resolved that there be a District Youth Board consisting of the District Superintendent, District Youth Secretary, and the District Youth Treasurer-Secretary. Their duties shall be to determine the program, time and place of our District Youth activities. (Standing Rule)

## **WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT**

### **BUDGET**

1. Be it resolved that each Church pay eight (8%) per cent of the regular and Sunday School offerings to be applied on the District Budget. Be it further resolved that the United Stewardship Fund be \$8.00 per member as recommended by the General Conference.

2. Be it resolved that the District Budget be pro-rated as follows: District Administration, 88%; District Camp and Conference, 7%; General Conference 5%.

### **DISTRICT MINISTERS**

3. Be it resolved that all ordained and licensed ministers of the District pay fifty (50%) per cent of their tithes, from ministerial labors, into the District treasury, through the local Church where their membership is held, the same to be applied on the District Budget.

### **SALARIES**

4. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be paid one hundred and sixty (\$160.00) dollars on his salary monthly.

5. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer be paid \$50.00 annually and the District Secretary be paid \$25.00 annually.

6. Be it resolved that District officials, other than the District Superintendent be paid 6c per mile, by auto, plus lodging and meals when engaged in District business.

### **DISTRICT EXPENSE**

7. Be it resolved that the District Statistician shall be paid for all mailing and publishing expense.

8. Be it resolved that there be 250 copies of the District Minutes printed, each Church to be assessed \$3.50 for 10 copies, additional copies 35c each.

**Memorial adopted by Florida District:**

WHEREAS the membership of our General Conference is unusually large, and

WHEREAS it works a financial hardship on many districts to send such a large delegation, and

WHEREAS the ratio of lay delegates to Ministerial delegates is so small, THEREFORE be it resolved that we substitute the following for section 116, Paragraphs 1, 2 and 3.

**Par. 1**

There shall be a General Conference composed of all the general officers and members of the General Board, district superintendents, the presidents of Pilgrim Holiness Church Colleges and other zone or general church educational institutions in the U.S.A. and Canada, members of all standing committees and a ministerial and lay delegation, to be selected at the annual conferences immediately preceding the General Conference. If the district superintendent is a member of the General Board the assistant district superintendent shall be a member of the General Conference.

**Par. 2**

The delegates to the General Conference shall be selected as follows: one ministerial delegate and one lay delegate to each 300 members or major fraction thereof. Each district shall be entitled to at least one ministerial delegate and one lay delegate in addition to the district superintendent. A lay delegate must be at least 21 years of age to be seated as a member of the General Conference. The ministerial delegates must be chosen from the ordained ministers who are actively engaged in full time service in the Pilgrim Holiness Church at the time of the General Conference.

**Par. 3**

In considering the ratio for the ministerial delegation to the General Conference, foreign missions fields shall be represented as follows: All field superintendents shall be members of the General Conference. In addition to the field superintendents, one missionary shall be chosen from each mission field area as a delegate, those delegates to be selected by the Council in the area where they served from among the missionaries on furlough in the U.S.A.
