FLORIDA CONFERENCE

Journal of Proceedings

First Sitting

Thursday, June 17, 1965, 7:00 P.M.

The first sitting of the Twelfth Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 7:00 P.M. June 17, 1965, at the Pinecrest Church, Tampa, Florida.

The Conference was opened by Rev. M. C. Kittle, District Superintendent, welcoming the ministers, delegates and friends to the Conference.

Rev. F. A. Sumwalt led the congregation in singing "Guide Me" and "More About Jesus."

Sister C. B. Winkle led in prayer.

Several testimonies of praise was given.

A special song was sung by Brother and Sister McCrory of the St. Petersburg Church.

The Conference was honored with the testimonies of Sister Hawkins and Sister Kittle. Other testimonies were given at this time.

An offering was received for the expense of the Conference.

Rev. Kittle introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Church Extension Secretary who delivered the message of the hour. Rev. Hawkins brought out that we, the church, are not to accommodate the world but to carry the gospel into the world. There are those in the world trying to destroy the Word of God but we of the church must guard and protect the divine Word of God. He went on to say that this is a plan to accommodate the church to the world. We must keep the fire burning in our hearts to keep the fire burning on the altar of the church. God's message shines through us in many ways; may it shine properly through us. We must permeate the world with the gospel. This is done through prayer and good works.

The Conference then entered the business session.

Brother Hawkins introduced Rev. Raymond Kensell as Secretary Pro Tem.

The Chair ask for the roll call.

A motion was made and seconded, that the Conference Bar consist of the first five pews on both sides of the Church.

Rev. Carl Bennett and Rev. Raymond Kensell were received into the Conference pending their letters of transfer.

The report of the Educational and Examining Board was given. The report was accepted.

Rev. George Ware was then received into the Conference bar.

The Chair called for the Report of the District Superintendent, Rev. M. C. Kittle, which was read and accepted with a rising vote for Rev. Kittle.

A motion carried for the conference to adjourn at 9:30 and re-convene at 9 A.M. and continue until finished.

The reading of the Statistician's report was delayed until the next sitting.

The report of the Sunday School Promotional Secretary was then called for. In the absence of the Promotional Secretary, Rev. Floyd Gookins read the report which was accepted. Certificates and ribbons were presented to the Sunday Schools showing attendance gains.

Rev. Ralph Baynum, District Youth Secretary gave his report. Motion carried to accept.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins then gave a report on the merger of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. His main emphasis was for prayer that God's will be done in the matter.

The Chair ask for a report from the Memorial Committee. The report was delayed until the next sitting.

The meeting adjourned in prayer by Rev. J. C. Baynum.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting convened Friday, June 18, 1965 at 9:00 A.M.

Rev. F. A. Sumwalt opened the service by leading the congregation in singing "All the Way My Saviour Leads" and "Amazing Grace." Rev. Ray Richards led in prayer. An offering was then taken for the expenses of the Conference.

The minutes of the first sitting were read and accepted.

Brother and Sister Springer were introduced to the Conference and given a seat within the Conference bar.

The Chair ask for the Statistician's report. The Statistician, Rev. Norval Rickner, read his report which was accepted.

The Resolution Committee's report was given.

A new resolution was moved, seconded and carried. (See Resolution Committee Report on Insurance.)

Resolution number three was discussed. Motion made, seconded and carried for a date change for conference years. (See Resolution on Conference.)

Resolution number six changed. Carried. (See Ministerial Meeting.)

Resolution number four changed. Carried. (See Conference Delegates.)

A new resolution was moved, seconded and carried. (See District Progress.)

Resolution number two was discussed. Resolution to change lost. Another new resolution was introduced to the Conference. It was amended and carried. (See Building Committee.)

The Chair ask for the report of the Ways and Means Committee. Two new resolutions were presented to the Conference. Both were adopted. See Ways and Means Report.

The Chair ask for the Memorial Committee Report. Report held until later.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins reported that the following appointments had been made by the General Board:

Rev. M. C. Kittle--District Superintendent
Rev. Raymond Kensell--District Secretary
Rev. Robert Emmons--District Treasurer

Rev. M. C. Kittle appointed tellers for the election. The Conference recessed for the noon meal. Dismissed in prayer by Brother Ransom.

THIRD SITTING

The third sitting convened Friday, June 18, 1965 at 1:00 P.M. Rev. F. Sumwalt led the congregation in singing "The Solid Rock." Rev. Billy Pevey led in prayer.

Ballots were then cast for the two Advisory Members of the Council. Rev. Norval Rickner and Rev. Ralph Baynum were elected. The minister elected as delegate to General Conference was Rev. Ralph Baynum. The layman elected as delegate to General Conference was Mr. J. B. Stucky.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the program as planned by the District Council for the Ministerial Meeting for this year. An invitation was given by the St. Petersburg Church for the place of the meeting. The Conference accepted the invitation.

The Memorial Committee Report was given. A moment of silence and a prayer by Rev. Hawkins was given in honor of the deceased.

Rev. Floyd Gookins, filling the absence of the Sunday School Promotional Secretary, announced that the Ship for the Decade of Progress went to the Miami Church.

An invitation was given by the Satellite Beach Church for Conference to be held there next year.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins commented on the fine fellowship of the Conference. He also requested prayer for the Superintendent and Council for the coming year.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to express appreciation for the fine hospitality extended by the Pinecrest Church to the Conference.

The Conference was adjourned by prayer by Rev. J. C. Baynum.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

SALUTATION: Dr. Hawkins, Ministers, Delegates and Friends:--

We greet you in the Name of our risen Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ who loved us and gave Himself for us. Our lives have been touched by His grace and our souls quickened by His Spirit thru another Conference year. The knowledge of His faithfulness gives us hope and courage as we face the tasks of the new year ahead. The poet has written "With Jesus We Shall Win," this is a certainty and how wonderful to be on the winning side. What a feeling of elation comes over us when we know that we have met and conquered our foes, made right use of our time, have seen our Church grow, and our people in the process of development. Happiness comes in the fulfillment of our aims, goals and attainments. The Minister without these aims and goals never attains and only sadness characterizes his life. - PLAN YOUR WORK-- This is an absolute necessity in the age we are in.
- SEEK CONSTANTLY FOR METHODS THAT WORK-- A great wealth of material is available. Monotony is a great enemy, very destructive.
- KEEP IN CLOSE CONTACT WITH GOD--He is the source of our Light, strength, Wisdom.
- BE WILLING TO MAKE CHANGES--when they are necessary. Analyze your church and yourself.

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

To the Twelfth Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church:

Greetings to our General Secretary, Dr. R. C. Hawkins; our District Superintendent, Rev. M. C. Kittle; and members of the Conference.

Having to prepare this report a little early, it is incomplete in some areas. It is based on the monthly reports of the churches.

Florida Sunday Schools show a gain of 41 or 5%. Miami and West Hollywood tie for the highest attendance gain. Each has an excellent gain of 28. Miami has the highest percentage gain with a gain of 54%. Congratulations to both of these schools and their pastors.

Eight Sunday Schools show gains of 5% or more. To these we present ribbons of recognition:

Miami with a 54% gain.
West Hollywood with a 45% gain.
Lynn Haven with a 40% gain.
Beverly Park with a 24% gain.
Fort Myers with a 18% gain.
Lake Worth with a 14% gain.
St. Petersburg with a 7% gain.
Tampa, Pinecrest with a 7% gain.

My prayer is that the coming year will be the greatest in Florida Sunday Schools with a continued increase in attendance, a careful teaching of the Word of God, and a spiritual awakening among the scholars.

Thank you, Rev. M. C. Kittle, each pastor and friend for your cooperation. It has been a pleasure to serve with you.

REPORT OF CONFERENCE YOUTH LEADER

To the 1965 Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Doctor Hawkins, District Superintendent Kittle, Ministers, Delegates, and friends:

The youth of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are marching on. I think we can truly say that this has been an exceptional year for Pilgrim Youth. God has greatly blessed and guided our progress.

Our first annual youth camp was held in August of 1964 in conjunction with the Wesleyan Methodist Church. It was a wonderful success. The unity of spirit was something to behold as teachers, counselors, and all staff members worked as one during the entire camp.

A total of 120 campers attended classes on tithing, narcotics, miracles and parables of the Bible, Bible study with charts, and teen-age social problems. About half of this number were Pilgrim youth.

The most wonderful part of the camp was to see these teen-agers fleeing to the foot of the cross. It was obvious they meant business as tears streamed down their cheeks and the radiance of their newly-found Savior illuminated their faces.

All zones have had youth rallies this year and some have carried special missionary projects. It appears that this has been an extremely active year for the youth of our District.

Two C.Y.C. chapters have been started with wonderful success in both. These are at the Hollywood, Beverly Park Church, under the leadership of Paul Muir, and the Miami Church, under the direction of Bob Neudigate. The First Church in Hollywood has started a Teen Club which meets weekly with the emphasis alternately on Religion, Education, Social, and Handicraft. This has been very successful.

Recommendations:

1. We would urgently recommend that each church investigate the possibility of starting a C.Y.C. in the local church. This program will not only gain new people, but it will help you hold the ones you have.

2. We would further recommend the starting of the PELT program for the youth of your church. This will insure good leadership for tomorrow's church.

3. Then, in closing, we would request that you as pastors and laymen boost our Youth Camp at Brooksville. The dates this year are August 9-13. We are depending upon you.

We greatly appreciate the opportunity we have had to serve the youth of our District. We wish to thank the Youth Council, the workers at Youth Camp, and all of you who have cooperated in making this a truly banner year for Florida Pilgrim Youth.

Rev. Charles P. Pridgen was born in Kansas, January 11, 1888 and departed this life at Colorado Springs, Colorado, May 21, 1965 at the age of 77 years.

The District records shall close May 15, and the annual conference be held Monday and Tuesday of the last week in May; for the conference years only.

No. 4 Conference Delegates

Whereas the conference delegates give their time to attend the conference, and whereas there is additional expense involved, be it resolved that five cents per mile be paid for travel. Cost of meals and lodging shall also be paid for. This cost shall be borne by the local church. Each church shall sponsor one car.

No. 5 Finance

Be it resolved that the local Church Treasurers balance their books at the close of each month and forward all District and General funds to the District Treasurer immediately. (Standing Rule)

No. 6 Ministerial Meeting

Be it resolved that we have an annual Ministerial Meeting, the time and place to be determined by the District Conference. Be it further resolved that the District Council appoint a program committee. (Standing Rule)

No. 7 Ministers

Be it resolved that all Ministers accepted as members by the Annual Conference of the Florida District, shall place their membership in some local church in the District within thirty days following the close of the Conference and that they shall make quarterly reports to the District Superintendent and an Annual report to the District Statistician. (Standing Rule)

No. 8 Parsonages

Be it resolved that each Church provide a parsonage with at least a telephone, utilities, refrigerator and cooking stove. (Standing Rule)

No. 9 Pastors

Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay annually.

No. 10 Pastors Recall

Be it resolved that the vote on the pastors recall shall be taken in the first week of April and the results be immediately forwarded to the District Superintendent. Be it further resolved that where the pastor intends to resign or change churches, that he shall notify the District Superintendent not later than April 1st. This shall not apply to those serving under unexpired extended calls.

No. 11 Revival

Be it resolved that the Florida Conference set Friday noon meal as a time of prayer and fasting and we urge each local church when possible to observe the same.

No. 12 Sunday Schools

Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary publish a news sheet each month showing the attendance of each Sunday School and news items. These reports shall be sent to each pastor in sufficient number that they can be passed to each family in the Church. (Standing Rule)

No. 13 District Youth

Be it resolved that there be a District Youth Board consisting of the District Superintendent, Conference Youth Leader and the District Youth Treasurer. Their duties shall be to determine the program, time and place of our District Youth activities. (Standing Rule)

No. 14 Zone Youth

Be it resolved that the Zone President, Secretary, and Treasurer Local Youth Leaders and the Pastor constitute a committee. They shall plan the programs, set the date and choose the place of the zone meeting. They shall raise funds in the youth zone meetings and disburse the same.

No. 15 Building Committee

Since the location and type of building is of much importance, therefore we recommend that a District Building Committee be set up to work with the local church board and the local building committee when new buildings are to be constructed. Any cost involved shall be borne by the local church.

No. 16 Progress

Whereas the Florida District has been making progress, and since the Church Extension Department has been placed under financial obligations the same as an organized District, therefore, we appeal to the Secretary of Church Extension to place the Florida District in the next step of organization.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

BUDGET

1. Be it resolved that each Church pay 10% of the regular and Sunday School offerings to be applied on the District Budget.
2. Be it resolved that the United Stewardship Fund be \$8.00 per member as recommended by the General Conference.
3. Be it resolved that the District Budget be prorated as follows: District Administration, 88%; District Camp and Conference, 5%; General Conference 5%; Southern Pilgrim College, 2%.
4. Whereas there is a shortage of approximately \$300.00 in our General Conference fund and whereas the General Conference is scheduled for this coming year; Be it resolved that each Church raise an offering of at least one dollar per member during the month of September.
5. Since our expanded Youth program is an added financial need, Be it resolved that each Zone send their October Zone Rally offering to the District Treasurer for the Youth expense.

DISTRICT MINISTERS

6. Be it resolved that all ordained and licensed ministers of the District pay fifty (50%) per cent of their tithes from ministerial labors, into the District treasury, through the local church where their membership is held, the same to be applied on the District Budget. (Standing Rule)

SALARIES

7. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be paid two hundred (200.00) dollars on his salary monthly.
8. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer be paid \$50.00 annually and the District Secretary be paid \$25.00 annually, the District Statistician be paid \$15.00 annually, and District Publications be paid \$25.00 annually.
9. Be it resolved that the District officials, other than the District Superintendent be paid 6 cents per mile, by auto, plus lodging and meals when engaged in District business.

DISTRICT EXPENSE

10. Be it resolved that the District Statistician and Sunday School Promotional Secretary shall be paid for all mailing and publishing expense.
11. Be it resolved that there be 250 copies of the District Minutes printed, each Church to be assessed \$5.00 for 10 copies, additional copies 50 cents each.
