FLORIDA CONFERENCE
Journal of Proceedings
First Sitting

Monday, May 23, 1966, 7:00 P.M.

The first sitting of the Thirteenth Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 7:00 P.M., May 23, 1966, at the Morrison Memorial Church, Intercession City.

The conference opened with Rev. J. C. Baynum, welcoming the ministers, delegates and friends to the Conference. Brother Kittle, District Superintendent, then thanked Rev. J. C. Baynum and the Church for the warm welcome that all had received.

Brother Kittle introduced Bro. Wilson and Bro. Evans to the congregation. They were appointed in charge of the music throughout the Conference. Rev. Ron Wilson led the congregation in singing, "He Lives."

Several testimonies of praise were given.

Sister Pridgen led in prayer.

An offering was taken for the expense of the Conference.

The congregation was led in singing "Am I a Soldier of the Cross?"

Brother Kittle introduced Dr. Melvin Snyder, General Superintendent to the Conference. Dr. Snyder then brought the message of the hour. He read from Revelation, chapter 3, verses 7-13. Dr. Snyder brought out four great truths. No. 1. Spiritual perceptibility is needed. No. 2. Spiritual conflict is one of the issues of the hour. No. 3. Spiritual accountability is before us. No. 4. Ministerial responsibility must be adhered to and not neglected. In concluding the message he stated that the laity was also responsible in carrying out the responsibility of the church and to support the pastor at all times in his work.

The Conference then entered the business session.

A motion carried for the Conference to adjourn at 9:30 and reconvene at 8:30 a.m. and conclude at 11:30.

A motion was made and seconded that the Conference bar consist of the first ten rows of pews on both sides of the Church.

The report of the Educational and Examining Board was given. The report was accepted.

Rev. Ron Wilson, Rev. Audley Freed and Rev. Leonard Davis were welcomed to the Conference by Dr. Snyder. They were then seated within the Conference bar.

The Chair called for the report of the District Superintendent, Rev. M. C. Kittle, which was read and accepted with a rising vote for Brother Kittle.

Dr. Snyder then introduced Brother George Butts to the Conference, who presented a family hospital plan for the ministers of the Conference.

The following reports were read and accepted:

Auditing.....Rev. Ronald Evans
Treasurer.....Rev. Robert Emmons

The congregation then stood and sung the "Doxology" after which the meeting adjourned in prayer by Dr. Snyder.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting convened Tuesday, May 24, 1966 at 8:30 A.M.

Ron Wilson opened the service by leading the congregation in singing "Love Divine." Rev. James Cunningham led in prayer. A special number was sung by Brother Lewis and Brother Wilson, "All That Thrills My Soul." After this there was a time of testimony and praise.

The minutes of the first sitting were read and accepted.

An offering for the expenses of the Conference was taken.

Brother Snyder then exhorted to the congregation to let Christ's mind be in us. Reminding us that "The joy of the Lord is our strength." He then ask for those of the congregation to quote a verse of scripture that had meant much to them in a time when it seemed that they were being tried.

Brother Snyder then proceeded on to the business of the Conference.

The report of the Statistician was called for. The report was read. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report with the Statistician checking the total amount given for the pastors support.

The report of the Sunday School Promotional Secretary was then called for. The report was read and accepted. Certificates were presented to the Sunday Schools showing attendance gains.

The Chair ask for the District Youth Secretary's report. The report was not given in the absence of the District Youth Secretary.

Rev. James Cunningham gave a report for the Memorial Committee. He reminded us that we had lost a Brother in the Lord, Brother L. E. Flemming. Brother Flemming's pastor, Rev. Pevy, then commented on his last visit with him, the day before he went to be with the Lord. Brother Flemming told him that he was ready to meet the Lord.

The Chair then ask for the report of the Resolution Committee.

A resolution was introduced concerning the calling of an evangelist to the churches from outside our denomination. (See resolution on calling evangelist.)

A resolution on Youth Zones was brought before the Conference. (See Youth Zones.)

The Chair ask for the Ways and Means Committee report.
The report was read and accepted.

The Chair called for the Conference to dismiss for the
ordination of Leonard Davis and to reconvene at 1:15. Carried

THIRD SITTING

The third sitting convened Tuesday, May 24, 1966 at 1:15 P.M.

Rev. Ron Wilson led the congregation in singing "Majestic Sweetness," which was requested by Dr. Snyder. Rev. Billy Pevy led the congregation in prayer.

The Ways and Means report was then continued.

Resolution number 4 was recommended to be dropped (deleted.)
Carried.

The Resolution Chairman then asked for the floor. He gave a resolution in regarding a hospital plan for the ministers. Passed.
(See Hospital Plan)

Dr. Snyder then reported that the following appointments had been made by the General Board:

Rev. M. C. Kittle.....District Superintendent
Rev. Raymond Kensell....District Secretary
Rev. Robert Emmons.....District Treasurer

Rev. M. C. Kittle appointed tellers for the elections.

Ballots were then cast for the two Advisory Members of the Council. Rev. Ralph Baynum and Rev. Ray Richards were elected.

A motion was made that the highest number of votes received would serve three years and the second highest would serve two years. Carried. Ballots were then cast for the Education and Examining Board. Rev. T. R. York for three years and Rev. Ray Richards for two years.

A motion was then made that the Council take care of any unfinished business.

A motion was then made that we of the Conference give a vote of appreciation to Bro. J. C. Baynum and his people. Carried by the congregation all standing in appreciation. While standing a motion came from the floor that a hearty "Amen" be given in our appreciation to Bro. Snyder. This was also done.

A motion was then made that the Conference take a vote on How we feel about the merger of the Wesleyan and Pilgrims. This was done with a rising vote which was almost unanimous.

A motion was made that the Council hear the reading of the minutes of the last two sittings of the Conference. Carried.

The Conference was then dismissed in prayer.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

SALUTATION: Dr. Snyder, fellow Minister, Delegates and friends:

As we gather for another Annual Conference we feel we should give thanks to the Father, Son and Holy Ghost for Their watchful care, abundant provision, fresh anointings and gracious blessings which have been so wonderfully bestowed upon us as a District this year. There have been many visitations of the Spirit and some have found their Saviour, others have been cleansed and filled with the Spirit. REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

To the Thirteenth Annual Conference of the Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church:

Greetings in Jesus name:

I count it a great privilege to have been able to work in the Florida District during the past year. The existing unity and fine co-operation of the pastors have made it a pleasure to serve here. To the churches and pastors who have been faithful in sending their monthly reports I want to say, "Thank You!"

The district had an average Sunday School of 952 for the year. This gives a gain of 11 or 1% over last year. Orlando achieved the highest gain both numerically and percentage wise. Congratulations are certainly in order to Rev. Emmons and his fine staff for a wonderful gain of 20 or 61%. Zephyr Hills, a new church in the district, had an average of 22 in Sunday School for the year. We welcome this Sunday School and trust that their progress will continue throughout the coming year.

There were six Sunday Schools that showed a gain for the year. To these we present certificates of recognition:

Orlando with a 61% gain.
Ft. Lauderdale with a 21% gain.
Lynn Haven with a 20% gain.
Clearview with a 19% gain.
Beverly Park with a 11% gain.
Brownsville with a 3% gain.

We present a certificate of recognition to the Zephyr Hills Sunday School for a fine average of 22 for their first year.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

No. 1 Committees

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees not elected by the Conference or appointed by the District Council. (Standing Rule)

No. 2 Conference

Be it resolved that the Conference year shall end April 30 and that all reports shall be in the hands of the District Statistician and all funds in the hands of the District Treasurer by May 10. The District records shall close May 15, and the Annual Conference be held Monday and Tuesday of the last week in May; for the Conference years only.

No. 3 Conference Delegates

Whereas the Conference delegates give their time to attend the Conference, and whereas there is additional expense involved, be it resolved that five cents per mile be paid for travel. Cost of meals and lodging shall also be paid for. This cost shall be borne by the local church. Each church shall sponsor one car.

No. 4 Finance

Be it resolved that the local Church Treasurers balance their books at the close of each month and forward all District and General funds to the District Treasurer immediately. (Standing Rule)

No. 5 Ministerial Meeting

Be it resolved that we have an annual Ministerial Meeting, the time and place to be determined by the District Conference. Be it further resolved that the District Council appoint a program committee. (Standing Rule)

No. 6 Ministers

Be it resolved that all Ministers accepted as members by the Annual Conference of the Florida District, shall place their membership in some local church in the District within thirty days following the close of the Conference and that they shall make quarterly reports to the District Superintendent and an Annual report to the District Statistician. (Standing Rule)

No. 7 Parsonages

Be it resolved that each Church provide a parsonage with at least a telephone, utilities, refrigerator and cooking stove. (Standing Rule)

No. 8 Pastors

Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay annually.

No. 9 Pastors Recall

Be it resolved that the vote on the pastors recall shall be taken in the first week of April and the results be immediately forwarded to the District Superintendent. Be it further resolved that where the pastor intends to resign or change churches, that he shall notify the District Superintendent not later than April 1st. This shall not apply to those serving under unexpired extended calls.

No. 10 Revival

Be it resolved that the Florida Conference set Friday noon meal as a time of prayer and fasting and we urge each local church when possible to observe the same.

No. 11 Sunday Schools

Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary publish a news sheet each month showing the attendance of each Sunday School and news items. These reports shall be sent to each pastor in sufficient number that they can be passed to each family in the church. (Standing Rule)

No. 12 District Youth

Be it resolved that there be a District Youth Board consisting of the District Superintendent, Conference Youth Leader and the District Youth Treasurer. Their duties shall be to determine the program, time and place of our District Youth activities. (Standing Rule)

No. 13 Zone Youth

Be it resolved that the Zone President, Secretary, Treasurer, Local Youth Leaders and the Pastor constitute a committee. They shall plan the programs, set the date and choose the place of the zone meeting. They shall raise funds in the youth zone meetings and disburse the same.

No. 14 Building Committee

Since the location and type of building is of much importance, therefore we recommend that a District Building Committee be set up to work with the local church board and the local building committee when new buildings are to be constructed. Any cost involved shall be borne by the local church.

No. 15 Progress

Whereas the Florida District has been making progress, and since the Church Extension Department has been placed under financial obligations the same as an organized District, therefore, we appeal to the Secretary of Church Extension to place the Florida District in the next step of organization.

No. 16 Youth Zones

Since there is excessive driving the way we now have the Sky Way Zone set up, therefore, we request that we return to the former four zones for the Sunday School and Youth Work. Namely: The Sky Way Zone, The Gold Coast Zone, The Orange Belt Zone, and The western Zone. Passed

No. 17 Revivals

Be it resolved that the Church Board and Pastor consult the District Superintendent, when calling an evangelist from outside our denomination.

No. 18 Insurance

Be it resolved that the District Council appoint a committee to secure information about a True Group Hospital Plan. When sufficient information has been obtained, the District Council shall have power to put the plan in force. Passed

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Be it resolved that each Church pay 10% of the regular and Sunday School offerings to be applied on the District Budget.
2. Be it resolved that the United Stewardship Fund be \$8.00 per member as recommended by the General Conference.
3. Be it resolved that the District Budget be prorated as follows: District Administration, 88%; District Camp and Conference, 5%; General Conference 5%; Southern Pilgrim College, 2%.
4. Be it resolved that all ordained and licensed ministers of the District pay fifty (50%) per cent of their tithes from ministerial labors, into the District Treasury, through the local church where their membership is held, the same to be applied on the District Budget. (Standing Rule)
5. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be paid two hundred (\$200.00) dollars on his salary monthly.
6. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer be paid \$50.00 annually and the District Secretary be paid \$25.00 annually, the District Statistician be paid \$15.00 annually, and District Publications be paid \$25.00 annually.
7. Be it resolved that the District officials, other than the District Superintendent be paid 6 cents per mile, by auto, plus lodging and meals when engaged in District business.
8. Be it resolved that the District Statistician and Sunday School Promotional Secretary shall be paid for all mailing and publishing expense.
9. Be it resolved that there be 250 copies of the District Minutes printed, each Church to be assessed \$5.00 for 10 copies, additional copies 50 cents each.
10. Be it resolved that the youth sponsor their own financial program through the District Youth Treasurer.
11. Be it resolved that each local youth society and each zone rally tithe their offerings, and the October Zone Rally offering, all of which is to be sent to the District Youth Treasurer for District Youth promotion.
