GENERAL PROCEEDINGS

The Eighth Annual Conference of the Gulf States District convened at the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Pineville, Louisiana, July 17, 1947, at 1:30 P. M., with Dist. Supt. J. C. Williams in charge. Supt. J. C. Williams led the conference in singing "Standing on the Promises". Rev. C. A. Simmons led in prayer. Misses Arletta Pack and Mary Frances Allen sang a duet, "God was There." Supt. J. C. Williams introduced and presented to the conference Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary of Home Missions.

Bro. R. A. Beltz, after giving an encouraging, brief report of his Home Missionary activities, addressed the conference using for a text, "Behold I set before thee an open door," Rev. 3:8.

After the address, Bro. Beltz took the chair and opened the

business session of the conference. The roll was called by the secretary. The conference bar was established, which was the first three pews across the church and the platform. At the suggestion of the presiding officer the conference time was set at 9 A. M. of the following day.

The District Superintendent appointed the committees.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. O. L. Ruth of North Carolina, field representative of the southern school zone. Bro. Ruth spoke appreciatively and briefly to the conference. Bro. Ruth was invited to sit within the bar.

The Examining Committee recommended Rev. D. D. Robertson of Portsmouth, Ohio, from the Church of Christ in Christian Union to this conference as an ordained minister and as a member of this district. He was received into the conference. Rev. H. Milton Lee was transferred from the West Virginia District to the Gulf States District by letter.

The District Superintendent gave his encouraging report; the report was accepted.

The Ways and Means committee reported; the report was accepted.

The conference united in singing, "Blest be the Tie"; Rev. O. L. Ruth led in prayer; thus the first sitting of the conference adjourned.

Second Sitting

The second sitting of the conference opened at 9 A. M., July 18, 1947. Rev. H. Milton Lee led the conference in singing "Love Lifted Me". The first scripture lesson consisted of Biblical quotations by the members of the conference. Rev. S. P. Creech led in prayer, followed by Rev. Mable Rathbun.

After reading Luke 10:1-16, Rev. Beltz addressed the conference on "The Relation of the Home Missionary Department to the Home Missionary District".

The Minutes of the preceding session were read and approved.

The Auditing Committee reported; the report was accepted.

The District Treasurer read his report; the report was accepted.

The final report of the Ways and Means committee was given; the report was accepted.

The Statistician's report was given and accepted.

The Examining Board and the Educational Board reported; the

The Examining Board and the Education Board reported; the report was accepted.

Bro. Beltz appointed the following officers:

Rev. J. C. Williams, District Superintendent.

Rev. C. A. Simmons, Treasurer.

Rev. Lee Rathbun, Secretary.

The conference elected Rev. S. P. Creech and Rev. C. E. Johnson as additional councilmen.

Rev. W. F. Drown led in prayer and the conference recessed until one o'clock.

The conference reconvened at one o'clock and sang "Amazing Grace". Rev. Lee Rathbun led in prayer.

The conference ratified by election the following nominations:
Trustees—Rev. J. C. Williams, term—three years; Rev. C. A. Simmons, term—two years; Rev. C. E. Johnson, term—one year.

Examining Board—Rev. C. A. Simmons, term—three years; Rev. S. Repogle, term—two years; Rev. S. P. Creech, term—one year.

Educational Board—Rev. C. E. Johnson, term—three years; Rev. Lée Rathbun, term—two years; Mrs. R. S. McCord, term—one year.

The District Sunday School Committee—Rev. H. Milton Lee, Rev. S. Repogle, and Rev. C. E. Johnson.

District Young People's President—Rev. Mable Rathbun.

Zone Chairmen—Rev. C. A. Simmons, Northern Alabama; Rev. S. Repogle, Southern Alabama; Mrs. G. L. Pack, Northern Louisiana; Rev. Mable Rathbun, Central Louisiana; Mrs. R. S. McCord, Southern Louisiana.

Bro. Beltz presented to the conference the Pilgrim Pension Plan; he also formed a resolution which was passed.

A motion was made and carried that the council be empowered by the conference to take care of any unfinished business.

The conference closed with the ministers and lay delegates kneeling at the altar while Dist. Supt. J. C. Williams petitioned our Heavenly Father to bless the laborers and the work of the coming year. While still on our knees we covenanted with Heaven to be faithful by singing, "We'll Work 'Till Jesus Comes".

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all licensed and ordained ministers pay their ministerial tithes into the District Treasury to be applied on the District Superintendent's salary.
2. We recommend that all birthday offerings be paid to the District Treasurer to be applied on District Home Missions.
3. We recommend that each church pay ten per cent of all regular tithes and offerings to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Budget.
4. We recommend that the District Superintendent's traveling expenses, while traveling in the interest of the district, be paid at the rate of three cents per mile, also that his district correspondence and communications be paid by the District Treasurer.
5. We recommend that on each quarterly visit of the District Superintendent each church take an offering to be applied on traveling expenses.
6. We recommend that all monies be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the tenth of each month.
7. We recommend that each church pay the equivalent of fifty cents per member per year to be applied on General Conference expenses.
8. We recommend that there be a camp meeting registration fee of one dollar per person above the age of twelve to be applied on the expense of the camp.
9. We recommend that each church contribute the equivalent of

- twenty-five cents per member per month to District Home Missions.
10. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid one hundred dollars per month, the same to be paid out of ministerial tithe and the District Budget.
 11. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid twenty-five dollars for his services, the same to be paid out of the District Budget.
 12. We recommend that the District Secretary be paid fifteen dollars for his services.
 13. We recommend that all unstationed ministers who hold conference license pay one dollar per month into the District Treasury.
 14. We recommend that we have a camp meeting membership fee of one dollar per member per year, and that this money be applied on the camp expenses.
 15. We recommend that five per cent of the District Budget be paid to our zone Bible school.
 16. We recommend that for each examination in the study course a fee of twenty-five cents be paid to cover expense of questions and postage.
 17. We recommend that the District put into operation immediately the Pilgrim Pension Plan: that each church pay into the District Treasury monthly the sum of four per cent of their pastor's salary, and that a sum equal to four per cent of the District Superintendent's salary be paid from the District Budget, the same sums to be forwarded to the Board of Pensions. Be it further resolved that the four per cent of evangelists' salaries be paid from the District Treasury providing they are paying their tithes into the District.

RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that our conference years close June 30.
2. Resolved that the quarterly reports be mailed to the District Superintendent and that the yearly reports be made in duplicate, one copy to be mailed immediately to the District Statistician and the other to be brought by the delegate to the conference.
3. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his report to the District Statistician not later than ten days after the conference year closes which is June 30, and that the statistician disregard any and all reports received thereafter. Be it also resolved that the District Treasurer's books close at noon, July 10.
4. Resolved that the District Treasurer send to each church a quarterly financial report of all churches in the district.
5. Resolved that on the last Wednesday of each quarter a district meeting be held at one of our churches, eventually visiting each church.
6. Be it resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first prayer-meeting of each month.
7. Resolved as ministers and Christian workers we especially em-

phasize the portion of the church covenant referring to dress—"Whose adorning let it not be that outward adorning of plaiting the hair, and wearing of gold, or of putting on of apparel; But let it be the hidden man of the heart, in that which is not corruptable, even the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit, which is in the sight of God of great price." 1 Peter 3: 3-4, and according to 1 Timothy 2:9-10, "In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with brodered hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array; But (which becometh women professing godliness) with good works."

8. Resolved that license shall not be granted to anyone who does not tithe to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.
9. Resolved that our Christian Workers Convention be held Thursday and Friday of the second week of January.
10. Resolved that all ministers and workers attend the Camp meeting throughout.
11. Resolved that the churches pay their pastors while attending the camp and conference the same as if they were on their charge.
12. Resolved that there be an offering taken in the local church to defray the pastor's expense to and from camp, this offering to be taken by the District Superintendent at his annual meeting with the local church.
13. Resolved that all register who come to camp.
14. Resolved that all persons attending the camp bring their own bed linens.
15. Resolved that since our conference is not large that it be conducted on the last Thursday and Friday of the camp.
16. Whereas our District Superintendent has faithfully and untiringly served the district the past year, therefore be it resolved that we show our love and appreciation by standing and saying a hearty "God Bless You", and by singing the first verse of "Blest Be the Tie that Binds."
17. Resolved that we as a conference show our General Secretary, Bro. Beltz, that we greatly appreciate his presence with us and that we pledge our utmost loyalty to him; this being done by a rising vote and a hearty "God Bless You".
18. Resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to Rev. W. F. Drown, our camp evangelist, by a rising vote of thanks.
19. Resolved that this conference give a vote of thanks to our food-and-dining hall manager, to our cook, and to all who kindly assisted with the work.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Eighth Annual Conference of the Gulf States District convening at Pineville, Louisiana.

Greetings.

We praise the Lord for the privilege of meeting in another conference. God is giving us a wonderful camp; the preaching and the singing of the workers have been of the highest type; many souls have passed through.

We have had many problems this past year, but we have had some real victories. Most of our churches have had some splendid revivals with new converts; thus our lines have been reinforced.

Our young people are rallying to the thought of going to our Bible schools. This past year eleven students from this district attended Bible school; for this coming year we have more prospects.

While we showed some gain in membership, there should have been more. Some pastors have prospects now of new members.

Our Sunday School gained. Some of the churches had large gains for which we thank the Lord. There is a move on foot to work the Sunday School this coming year as never before.

Our young people are working at their job. This next year will show a large increase in the young people's work I trust.

We will show a large gain in finance this year especially in regard to property. We have been building new buildings. This has taken time and money, but we are getting our own places of worship. Our new buildings at Birmingham, Alabama, Montgomery, Alabama, and Pensacola, Florida, will be permanent assets.

Starting with Pensacola, Florida, I shall give a brief report of the churches. At Pensacola, we have a new portable tabernacle in a splendid location with Bro. and Sr. Lee from the West Virginia District at the job. We see in this venture a great opportunity to get started in this large sea-coast town of about 100,000 people.

At Magnolia Springs, Alabama, there has been much accomplished this year. The Sunday School has jumped from forty-seven of last year to sixty-eight. They have had some good meetings. The winter camp held there was a success and the local people entertained the crowd well. People came from various parts of the country. We were graciously blessed with the presence of three of our general men: Bro. Sturk, Bro. Beltz, and Bro. Elliot; also Bro. Story came in interest of foreign missions. Bro. Repogle, the pastor, and his folk have done quite a lot of redecorating of the church and the parsonage. We now have some fine buildings at this place.

The work in Mobile, Alabama, is on the upward move and has led the district this year in Sunday School attendance. They have been real busy in meetings. Now they are getting ready for their new building since the present one is too small for their growing crowds. Already the basement is underway and the new church will soon be a reality. Bro. Johnson, the pastor, formerly from Frankfort, Kentucky, has been appointed president of a holiness league formed by the National Holiness Association. This is a forward movement in Mobile for the advancement of holiness. Bro. and Sr. Johnson work at the job.

Bro. Strong in Montgomery, Alabama, has proved his faithfulness in waiting on the Lord to help him get a work started for our church there. He waited over five years, but now we have a fine building where we can get a Sunday School and church started. They are now in the process of getting the work going. We have as fine a location and building there as we have anywhere. This building is worth ten thousand dollars today. Let us pray for Bro. Strong and his wife.

In Birmingham, Alabama, we have two churches. At the first

church there have been some gains this past year and they are getting ready to launch a drive. They have had a thriving Sunday School this year.

In the second church of Birmingham there has been a large building program on most of the past year. The fine new building worth twelve thousand dollars is a parsonage and church combined with a full basement. Their Sunday School has almost tripled in the past month. They bid well to have a strong church there in the future.

In Shreveport, Louisiana, they have been in a building program; now they have one of the finest little churches that we have anywhere. Bro. and Sr. Creech and their faithful crowd have worked hard to see this accomplished. They have had some splendid revivals, and the Sunday School has increased over last year. They have some definite plans for the future in Shreveport. When we think of all the manual labor that our pastors have done this last year we wonder how they have done as well as they have, but hitherto has God helped them.

In Pineville, Louisiana, there has been some activity in spite of the fact they had a lot of sickness. This work has a bright future. The Carrolls, pastor, are leaving us to do more home missionary work in the far North. Our loss is their gain. We shall miss these good people with their standards. Blessings on them as they go.

In Baton Rouge, Louisiana, we have been hit the hardest in loss of membership as two large families have gone to other fields. Bro. and Sr. Brubaker are now in a new work in Georgia. This is the first opening we have had in this state. While living in Chattanooga, Tennessee, they have opened up this new work.

In Bogalusa, Louisiana, they have had an increase and the McCords are leaving a good taste in the mouths of the public. Some of our churches have had some black marks against them in the past and it will take some time to out-grow these. Let us pray for this work. Bro. McCord helped on the Montgomery building.

Personally, God has brought us through many battles this past year for which we are very thankful. This has been a busy year and we have learned a lot. I have traveled forty thousand miles in the interest of the district and two thousand miles in interest of the general work. I have worked five months on our building programs over the district. I have preached ninety-seven times, conducted five revivals, had around one hundred seekers, have dealt with several personally, prayed with a number for healing, held six deputational services in interest of home missions, helped to promote two camps and one ministerial program, pastored the Pineville church one month, did a lot of buying and soliciting for the district, and best of all, I have by God's help kept the victory.

Yours for a better year in the Lord in 1948.
