REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To our General Secretary, Dr. R. C. Hawkins, members of the District Conference, and visitors, Greetings.

This has been an eventful year from the very beginning. For some of these events we can rejoice together while there are others over which we share regret.

Above all, I rejoice in that "I know Him, whom to know means life eternal." I rejoice over the sinners that have been won to Christ in our churches this past year, these conversions being the supreme end. I rejoice in the fellowship I received from God's good people. I am happy for the material progress that you have made during the year. We have bought or built four new parsonages, plus numerous improvements which will be brought out in the oral report of our pastors. We have bought two lots in Butler, Alabama, where Reverend and Mrs. Jack Polson will open a new church this summer.

Aside from the areas of rejoicing, I am confronted with a sobering seriousness when I think of the responsibility God and the church have entrusted to us. Out there are the masses of unredeemed souls that pass us by (or maybe we pass by) and they are going to a Christless grave. My heart becomes heavy with passion, but we must be moved to more than tears and passion; we must be moved to action. Action that will move men to God and our church.

We are not reaching the lost as we should. I do not think it is the fault of our message so much as it is the fault of our methods. Separation does not mean isolation. In our day the people will not come to us, we must go to the people. Go with a genuine interest in their spiritual welfare. We cannot afford to pour sweat and blood, time and tears, Pilgrim energy and Pilgrim dollars into a giant sieve of little return.

Last year we adopted a Pattern For Progress that called for 10% increases in Sunday School and Membership. This is not unreasonable or impractical. Is it too much to expect of a church with 50 scholars in Sunday School, to gain 5 in a whole year? Or a church with 10 or 20 members to gain just 1 or 2 members in one full year? We all know these goals are reachable and I know you can reach them if you will bend every effort to do so.

I am recommending that our pastors develop an effective and systematic program of visitation for themselves and the laity. I strongly recommend that our pastors become active in civic and public affairs so as to have a voice for good in these places of influence. I am recommending that we increase our effort and activity for the youth and the children. If you do not have enough young people to fully organize a society, give them a Sunday night service once a month and help them to develop a worthwhile program. Our losses in some of the churches, coupled with the closing of Baton Rouge and Lake Charles, have far outweighed the gains made by the other churches. These reverses, I trust, are only temporary setbacks. We will open in a section of Baton Rouge with a brand new program this year. The new

work in Butler, where we have been having prayer meetings for several weeks, will open soon. Each of you will go back to your churches to push the Pattern for Progress in order to reach your quodrennial goals that have been set.

God has been very gracious in that he has given us some fine new teams to take the places of other good men that will be leaving us for other fields of service in our church. We have our host pastor, Reverend and Mrs. Petit that are being used of God to turn the tide for us in Columbia. The Johnsons that came to Bastrop late in the conference year and are now enjoying tremendous gains. Brother and Sister Allen Killen have been in West Monroe just a few weeks and they are giving us sound leadership there. Gains are already being registered in attendance. Brother and Sister Clint Elliot are already dedicated to the opening of our work in Baton Rouge this fall. Reverend Merideth Turner and wife, from our Arizona Conference have accepted the Pineville church and will add to the good work done by Brother Cox. Alexandria and Huntsville are yet to be supplied.

Today we will pause to remember that one of our pastors terminated his service to our church and went to his eternal reward. Brother W. C. Killen passed away while at the front of the battle in a revival at his church in Alexandria.

REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

To the Gulf States Conference, now in session at the Columbia, Mississippi church, this 27th day of June of 1963.

This has been a very enjoyable year in this work of Sunday School promotion. We have come far short of doing an outstanding piece of work, but our heart has been in the program and we have not lost hope. Lack of finances and lack of equipment has hampered the efficiency of the Secretary and his committee. A break down in communication has contributed to a lesser piece of work. We have not been able to schedule any Sunday School Rallies or even send out promotional literature in the quantities desirable. These are odds to be overcome and perhaps goals to work to.

Perhaps I am opening the door to reproussions, but may I take the liberty to mention some contributing causes to our poor showing this year. The first is our failure to use the Standard of Excellence Scoring Sheet for evaluating our schools. A pastor just does not know his school until he has judged it by the Standard. Only four out of sixteen have done this. The second is our ability to discard the Decade of Progress, and in doing so have done away with what could be a prod, or a gold, to better work. Only three out of sixteen are in this program. The third is our attitude toward the Pattern for Progress, our District program. We must continually plug that program and it's goals to ourselves. We must be sold on it and sell it to our people, or at least prove ourselves a nuisance in plugging for it.

The final report shows sixteen churches in the district with Sunday Schools. Five of these show a gain of 18 and 11 show a loss of 61, making our NET LOSS for the year 43. This loss is pitied against a gain of 30 for last year. (1962)

Highest honors in both categories go to Bastrop church with a numerical gain of 7 and a percentage gain of 14%. Taking both awards causes them to tie with Pineville church which accomplished the same feat last year. Honorable mention in attendance gains goes to Birmingham with 4; Magnolis Springs with 4; Bayou La Batre with 2; and Bogalusa with 1.

Ribbon winners are Bastrop, 15%; Birmingham, 10%; Magnolia Springs and Bayou La Batre, 5%. Bogalusa has the distinction of being the ONLY church in the District who has enjoyed a consistent gain over a four year period.

CONFERENCE ACTION COMMITTEE REPORT

Section I: Regulations:

1. Resolved that three copies of all reports be made; the monthly reports to be mailed; one to the General Secretary of Church Extension, and one to the District superintendent. The annual reports to be sent immediately at the close of the year to the District Statistician and District Superintendent. The third copy of the reports to be retained for local files.
2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his or her report to the District Statistician not later than ten days after the conference year closes.
3. In as much as there are two elected advisory members to the District Council; Be it resolved that one may be a lay member
4. Be it resolved that we have a District Camp and conference beginning on Monday night and closing the following Sunday night. Be it further resolved that the Council serve as a committee to arrange the program and location.
5. Be it resolved that no pastor be absent from his church more that 30 days a year, camp meeting excepted.
6. In as much as the General Board has rezoned our district as a part of the Central Pilgrim College School Zone; Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and one lay member serve as our representative on the school board during the coming year.
7. Whereas the District Superintendent is in closer relation with our ministers of the district and their ministerial standing than the Educational and Examining Board; Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be a standing member of the Educational and Examining Board.
8. Be it resolved that the entire camp fund be used only at the discretion of the District Conference; Be it further resolved that the District Council have access to this fund on a "Short Term Loan" basis.

9. Resolved that his conference adopt a group hospitalization plan to be paid for either by the pastor or by his church, to be worked out between the pastor and his church.

10. Be it resolved that the names of all evangelists be put into the district minutes, providing they are passed on by conference members.

11. Be it resolved that any church desiring to call an evangelist of another denomination should first consult the District Superintendent.

12. Resolved that the first Friday of each month be known as a day of fasting, prayer, soul-burden and consecration.

13. Be it resolved that our conference year close on April 30, and that all reports be in by May 15th.

14. Be it resolved that the Gulf Stated District continue the Pattern for Progress Program as presented to us by the District Superintendent with the approval of the Church Extension secretary and recommended by the District Council. That this program embody the following goals and objectives:

1. To win men for Christ
2. Unite them with our Church
3. Set minimum goals as follows:
 - A. 10% increase in local church giving
 - B. 10% increase in membership
 - C. 10% increase in Sunday School Attendance
 - D. Church loyalty on every level
 - E. All budgets paid monthly
 - F. Establish existing churches and bring them to a full operational level in buildings, pastors, support, membership, and organization.

15. Whereas the work of the Resolution Committee and the Ways and Means Committee is of a nature, at times, that it necessitates a combined meeting of the two; Be it resolved that this Conference establish a "Conference Action Committee" consisting of five men to take the place of these Committees.

Section II: Finance:

1. We recommend that all money from the local churches be sent to the District Treasurer for District operation and General Church operations, and sent not later than the tenth of each month.

2. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$8.00 a month for his services; also that each member of the District Council be paid at the rate of five cents per mile when called to District Council meetings and the District Treasurer and Secretary be supplied their stationary and postage for district work.

3. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$30.00 a year for his services.

4. We recommend that our Sunday School Promotional Secretary and Executive Youth Secretary attend the Worker's Conference held annually at Church Headquarters. Expense for same shall be taken from these separate departmental funds.

5. We recommend that our Sunday School fund be adopted by the following plan: (a) The first Sunday of August shall be known as "S. S. Dollar Day" in our churches, wherein adults shall be urged to give one dollar. (b) All Sunday School offerings received this first Sunday of August shall be sent no later than August 15th to the District Treasurer. This is to become a separate S. S. fund which shall further be used to promote District Sunday School work.

6. We recommend that a district youth budget be inaugurated according to the following plan: Each local youth society shall set aside 10% of its weekly offering to be paid monthly to the District youth treasurer, and that 75% of the zone rallies' offerings be sent to the same immediately following such rallies. This fund shall be used to promote district youth work.

7. We recommend that the district pay its portion of the District Superintendent's salary which is \$175.00 a month, also that we pay him 6 cents per mile travel expense, his postage, stationery, telephone expense (as used in connection with his duties in district work) and his utilities.

8. We recommend that the district pay the District Superintendent's Social Security.

9. We recommend this conference adopt a united budget of 15% of regular church and Sunday School offerings. This 15% to cover District and General interests. This money to be prorated by the District Council.

10. We recommend that our conference adopt a home missionary plan: a dollar a year per member for each new church.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The first sitting of the third annual conference of the Gulf States District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:01 A.M. June 27, 1963 in the Columbia Pilgrim Church.

The meeting was called to order by the District Superintendent, Rev. Arnold Peck. Rev. Allen Killen led the congregation in singing, "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus."

Dr. R. C. Hawkins, conference chairman, read and commented on Isaiah 54.

The first order of business was the roll call by the conference secretary, Rev. C. B. Cox.

The conference bar was designated to include the first five rows of seats. It was moved that the first sitting be from 9:00 until 12:00 noon, and reconvene at 1:30 P.M. This was seconded and accepted.

The Educational and Examining Board Report was read and accepted. The ordination was set for the evening service. The candidates for ordination were C. K. Crowder and Fred Summers.

It was moved and seconded that we take money from the district treasurer, which was sent to us from the general fund, to pay Rev. Peck's back traveling expenses. (\$245.75)

The Statistician's Report was read and accepted.

The Sunday School Promotional Secretary's Report was read and accepted.

It was moved to introduce Sis. Margarette Robinson to the conference and give her an honorary seat in the bar.

An oral report was made by each pastor. All reports were accepted.

The Conference Action Committee report was read and accepted.

By expiration of time the conference was adjourned.

The conference was reopened at 1:30 P.M. Rev. Allen Killen led the congregation in a song.

Mrs. R. C. Hawkins and Judy were given an honorary seat in the donference bar.

The election of the District Council began. Rev. Arnold Peck was elected for a two year term as District Superintendent. Bro. Smack was elected to serve as Assistant Superintendent. Rev. Russell Rodriguez as Secretary. Rev. Kensell as Treasurer. Rev. Allen Killen was elected to serve as the advisory member. Rev. Jack Polson was elected as the new member for the Educational and Examining Board. Bro. Garlington was re-elected as district trustee.

A memoir was read of Rev. Killen and Dr. Hawkins led in prayer.

The meeting was adjourned in prayer by Rev. Peck.
