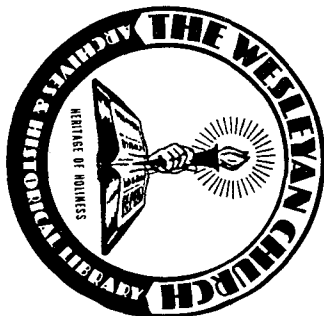

Daily Proceedings.

Tuesday, First Day, October 1, 1901.

MORNING SESSION.

THE members of the Indiana Conference of the Holiness Christian Church met in Rescue Chapel at Frankfort, Indiana, October 1, 1901, at 8:30 a. m., to hold their Sixth Annual Session.

A. D. Buck, Presiding Elder of the North Indiana District, acted as chairman, assisted by C. C. Brown, Presiding Elder of the South Indiana District.

MORNING SESSION.

OPENING EXERCISES:—After devotional services conducted by D. C. Shearer, A. D. Buck, chairman, called conference to order and the business of the day was resumed.

MINUTES: The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.
