Rev. Arthur Phillips,

Rev. Arthur Phillips was born at Big Springs, Sullivan Co., Ind., Jan. 13, 1870. United in marriage to Miss Flora Turman, Oct. 1st, 1890. Translated from the home of his father at Frankfort, Ind., at 11 o'clock p.m., Sept. 19, 1904. Aged 34 yrs., 8 m., 6 d. He leaves to mourn his departure a companion, father, 5 brothers, 3 sisters and many friends. His mother preceeded him to the other world 11 years ago. He was converted in his own home Feb. 14 on Sunday night at 11 o'clock 7 years ago.

Miss Etta Innis, Evangelist, Pastor at Seymour, Ind.

Received the blessing of Holiness a few months later. God called him to forsake home and all that he held dear to which call he responded without a murmur. He united with the Holiness Christian church and took up the ministry of this precious Gospel with his dear wife by his side. They preached and sang the Gospel from the Rocky Mountains to the Keystone state. They were always cheerful and in great demand. They had engagements one year ahead.

The church has lost a loyal member, the Conference a faithful preacher and the world a holy man. How we shall miss him at our alters. His dear voice is stilled. Sister Phillips needs our prayers under the heavy stroke.

The funeral was largely attended. His request was that your numble servant should lay his sacred dust to moth er earth and preach to the people under the grove beside his grave. His last words were, "Yes" and ',Praise the Lord!"

I stood by his bedside three days before he passed away. He said, "Bro. Buck, thank God it is well with my soul. If I die I want you to know that I'll go right straight to heaven." Little did I think one year ago when he stood by my bedside where I was burning with the fever that almost to a day I would preach his funeral. For two months he thought he would improve in health if he would go to Wisconsin. But he stayed there only one week. The Dr. advised him to return home speedily. He reached his father's home in a bad condition physically. On his way home he would say to the conductor, "If I become unconscious please put me off at Frankfort."
