After song and prayer service, Rev. Wm. G. Bogue read a Scripture lesson; Rev. R. L. Wisler led in prayer, after which Bro. Bogue gave an interesting address.

Conference was then called to order.

After roll call a motion was made to dispense with the reading of the minutes of last conference. Carried.

The order of the day was taken up. Reports continued. See table. Adjourned until 8:30 Monday, September 7th.

SEPTEMBER 7.
THIRD DAY, A. M. SESSION.

After devotional services, the conference was called to order by Presiding Elder R. L. Wisler in chair.

After roll call the minutes of the last session were read and accepted.

A collection of \$5.25 was then taken for the secretary.

Reports continued.

The conference then entered into the election of officers for the coming year. See table.

Adjourned. Benediction by R. L. Wisler.

SEPTEMBER 7.
THIRD DAY, P. M. SESSION.

After devotional services the conference was called to order by Presiding Elder D. C. Shear in chair.

After roll call the minutes of the last session were read and accepted.

REPORT OF EXAMINING COMMITTEE—We recommend:—George Huff, E. L. Pendry, N. S. Hollis, J. H. Overmyer, E. A. Davis, J. H. Cruser, D. L. Sailor, Benjamin Lehman, Perry Reynolds and J. H. Julian be granted itinerant license first year.

For Renewal of Itinerant Licenses—H. T. Whiteford, Lee Goins, W. E. Ketchum, Thomas Burger, C. W. Lamar, W. B. Pullen, Thomas

Willis, Arthur Canary, W. C. Canary, Arthur Plunkett, I. R. Akers, T. N. Metcalf.

For Renewal of Evangelistic License—Maggie Hull, Lillie Rodgers, E. C. Burroughs, Sarah Plunkett, Lucinda Rhoads, Anna Hinds and Mary B. Akers.

We recommend that J. F. Blocker who was received last year as preacher on trial, be received into the conference a minister fully ordained.

We recommend that Charles Spears, coming to us as an ordained elder from Apostolic Holiness Union, be received in full connection.

We Recommend J. G. Powell, W. S. Jewell, C. A. Green, Albert Ewing and Edward Scheoff for ordination.

Moved and seconded that the Penn. conference be granted a dismissal from the general conference, at their request. Carried.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE—(1) We recommend that the pastors of each class appoint a committee of one as soon as he or she go to their respective charges to collect \$.25 per capita quarterly on members over eighteen years of age for conference expenses and home missions. We further recommend that each pastor see to it that said committee has a full list of the membership of said class; we further recommend that the pastor and presiding elder urge the members to respond.

(2) We recommend that each pastor holds one foreign missionary service during the year and take up an offering for this cause; also that this service be held on the fourth Sunday in July.

(3) We recommend that presiding elders, pastors, evangelists, local preachers and lay members preach, practice and urge the tithing system.

(4) We recommend that each pastor appoint two quarterly conference stewards to collect the presiding elder's money before each quarterly conference.

(5) We recommend that the presiding elder meet with the stewards each quarter to help them devise ways and means to support the pastor the coming quarter.

(6) We recommend that each pastor and evangelist keep in touch with the Bible School and Orphanage at Carlinville, Ill., and have special services in their behalf and take offerings for their support; we further recommend that the second Sunday in December be known as Bible School Day and the Second Sunday in May be known as Orphanage Day all over the field.

(7) We recommend that any class or individual giving money

for any purpose must pass receipt for same through conference treasurer's hands to receive credit.

(8) We recommend that the Sunday before Thanksgiving be known as Rescue Day and that each pastor preach a sermon on rescue work and take offerings for that work.

(9) We recommend that this conference elect a beneficiary board.

(10) We recommend that each pastor take two or more offerings on his or her charge during the year for the purpose of helping the needy sick and burying the worthy dead; that each pastor raise the equivalent of five cents per capita each month; that each pastor explain what these collections are for and urge the people to do all they can to support this branch of charity.

(11) We recommend that the collections for Bible School, Orphanage, Rescue Work and Beneficiary Fund be paid into the local church treasury and a strict account kept of each.

Moved: That the chair appoint a committee to select the place and time and arrange the subjects for the ministerial meeting the coming year.

A cash offering of \$19.65 and a subscription of \$27.50 was taken for Sister Fogle, wife of Dr. E. T. Fogle, deceased.

M. L. Steward, N. B. Herrell and B. H. Grimes were elected beneficiary board.

Moved: That the chair appoint a camp meeting committee. Chair appointed Earl Benjamin, Albert Ewing, S. M. Lehman, I. R. Akers and J. H. Overmyer.

Moved: That the Kansas and Oklahoma work be made another district and a presiding elder be elected.

Moved: That the Illinois and Missouri work be made another district and a presiding elder be elected.

Adjourned.

SEPTEMBER 8, 1908.

FOURTH DAY, A. M. SESSION.

After devotional services the conference was called to order by Presiding Elder D. C. Shear in chair.

After roll call the minutes of the last session were read and accepted.

By motion, the beneficiary board was empowered to elect their own officers.

D. C. Shear was elected a trustee to the Orphanage to fill the place of R. L. Wisler.

C. C. Brown was re-elected trustee on Bible School board for the term of five years.

M. F. Pratt was elected home missionary for Missouri and Illinois.

Moved: That question of camp meeting and conference time and place be left to the discretion of the camp meeting committee and that the camp meeting and conference be held together.

A subscription of \$310 was then taken to defray the expenses of the camp meeting and conference of next year, to be paid by July 1, 1909.

Fifteen pledged themselves to get ten subscriptions to "A Voice From Caanan," and ten pledged to get five each.

Moved: That the conference treasurer pay to the publishing committee the amount back on last year's minutes.

Chair appointed Albert Ewing, B. H. Grimes and C. E. Ellsworth as a committee to get out new report blanks.

Moved: That the chair appoint a committee of three to rearrange the division of the two Indiana districts.

Chair appointed J. J. McIntosh, W. E. Ketchum and Albert Ewing. They changed the districts by placing Frankfort, Tipton and Jefferson classes on the northern district; with these exceptions, the L. E. & W. R. R. is the dividing line.

Adjourned with the benediction by N. B. Herrell.

SEPTEMBER 8, 1908.

FOURTH DAY P. M. SESSION.

After devotional services the conference was called to order by Presiding Elder W. J. Webster in the chair.

After roll call the minutes of the last session were read and accepted.

Auditing committee gave their report.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS.

(1) Whereas our conference officers, especially our presiding elders, have for the past year so faithfully discharged the duties falling upon them by virtue of their office, in such a spirit of humility, unity, and equality with the brethren, resolved, that we show our appreciation of the same by a rising vote, and a hearty "God Bless Them."

(2) Whereas our editor, E. J. N. Bradshaw, and the office workers assisting him have labored so faithfully the past year in bringing forth from time to time the Voice From Caanan, resolved that we show our appreciation of the same by a rising vote, and further, by sending in for publication such news and notes as will contribute to the interest of the paper.

(3) Inasmuch as God has, in His infinite wisdom, seen fit to take from the home and church our esteemed sister, Shoemaker,

Resolved, That we extend to the bereaved our heart felt sympathy by a rising vote.

(4) Resolved, That we tender a vote of thanks to the young workers and others who have so cheerfully given their services in the kitchen and dining hall, by rising to our feet.

(5) Inasmuch as this is campaign year and the forces of those opposed to the prohibition of the liquor traffic shall rally with renewed zeal, resolved, that we do all in our power by word and deed against this evil and that we who have a right will, if possible, register our vote against it.

(6) Whereas we believe, not only in the existence of a Supreme Being as Ruler of Creation, but in the divinity of His Son, as our Saviour and the Holy Ghost as our comforter, and that any faith that does not acknowledge the Trinity of the God Head is detrimental to the best good of the people.

Resolved, That we protest against the election of any man to the highest office in the gift of the people, who denies the divinity of our Lord and the personality of the Holy Ghost.

These resolutions were adopted.

Bro. L. E. Burger requested a letter of recommendation to the Pentecostal Naserene church, which was granted.

Ordination service was held and J. G. Powell, W. S. Jewell, C. A. Green, Albert Ewing and Edward Scheoff were duly ordained.
