# Journal of the Session

## FIRST DAY—MORNING SESSION

The Twenty-third Indiana Annual Conference, of the Holiness Christian Church, convened in the Tabernacle on the Camp ground at Frankfort, Indiana, Monday morning, Aug. 26, 1918.

Song services were followed by prayer by Rev. N. Bradshaw the Secretary. The General Superintendent, C. C. Brown read the lesson from (1st Tim. 4th Chapter) and then delivered the annual conference address.

Conference was called to order with C. C. Brown in the chair. The conference roll was then called and revised.

Song "When We All Get To Heaven."

Moved and seconded that all doubtful names on the roll be referred to the examining committee. Carried.

The minutes of the last conference of the last session were then read by the secretary and accepted.

It was agreed that the Presiding Elders appoint all standing committee.

Moved and seconded that we adopt the same rules for governing Conference as we had last year. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the chair appoint a reception committee. Carried. Edw. Schoeff, Geo. Huff and I. J. Snider were appointed.

The buying of provisions was left with O. W. Barnes and I. J. Snider and the managing of the dining hall to A. H. Blume.

## RULES FOR GOVERNING CONFERENCE.

CONFERENCE BAR—First four of seats from North aisle around South.

Hours of session: 8:30 a. m. to 12:00; 1:30 to 5:00 p. m. Each session preceded by fifteen minutes devotional service.

No member leave the conference bar without permission of chair.

All reports to be read without comment.

All members tardy at roll call give reasonable excuse for absence.

No member make more than one speech until every member has spoken who desires to do so and then only with consent of chair.

It is agreed that all members on boards be excused from roll call.

Moved and seconded that the Chair appoint a committee on investigation. Carried, Chair appointed A. M. Ewing, I. J. Snider, O. W. Barnes, E. W. Wright and W. A. Fry.

Next in order was the reception of new classes knocking for admission into the conference. Delphi was the first one desiring admission and on motion was received.

Dayton, Ohio was the next one and on motion was received into the conference. The next one was Huntington, it also on motion was received.

Moved and seconded we adjourn, Carried.

Benediction by B. H. Hines.

#### FIRST DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION

After devotional services the conference was called to order with C. C. Brown the Gen. Superintendent in the chair.

The first in order was the calling of the roll after which the minutes of the last session were read and adopted.

North Kokomo class was knocking for admission and on motion was received into the conference. Bluff Ave. S. W. Indianapolis, 3rd class on motion was received.

Shelton has reorganized into a class. Moved and seconded it be received into the conference. Carried.

Moved and seconded we lay aside the new blanks and use the old ones. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the chair appoint a committee of three, himself as chairman. Carried. Geo. Huff and Edw. Schoeff were appointed.

It was decided that the pastors reports and evangelists should not be read but handed to the secretary.

The following were received as advisory members and admitted into the conference bar. Geo. Biernes, Henry Cornelius, G. W. Anderson, Alma Sheares, Bro. Cox, E. M. Cornelius, Garnet Jewell, C. A. Horton and Rev. Noah McCoy.

By general consent Henry Cornelius, Edw. Cornelius and John Wallace ordained elders of the Ill. Conference were received into this conference after being dismissed by the Ill. conference.

Motion to adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by E. J. Clem.

#### SECOND DAY—MORNING SESSION

After devotional services the conference was called to order with C. C. Brown in the chair. The first in order was the calling of the roll after which the minutes of the last session was read and received.

Motion to receive the decision of conference not to read pastors reports. Lost.

Foreign Missionary report read by M. F. Pratt.

On motion it was referred to the auditing committee.

Moved and seconded that the reports of the pastors and evangelists be read at our next annual conference. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we receive the reports of the committee on blanks carried.

Moved and seconded that the 2nd church of Indianapolis which is knocking for admission be received into the conference. Carried.

Prayer Band report was read by sister Alice Hart. On motion it was received.

The General Superintendents report was read and on motion was received

Geo. Huff read the presiding elders report for the south district. Received and referred to the auditing committee.

Moved and seconded that the secretary write to all ministerial members of this conference who failed to attend or report to this session, requesting them to send him their reports and also give reasons for their absence. Carried. In case of no satisfactory reply the P. E.'s are to make a special call on them and report to the next Annual Conference. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we send two delegates to attend the State Convention of the Apostolic Holiness Church now in session at English, Ind., and that the Gen. Supt. and the Presiding Elder of the South District be the delegates. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the question of changing the report of the committee on blanks be referred to them. Carried

A letter was read from sister Roberts requesting the conference to petition the President for her husbands release from prison on account of his health. It was decided to let the letter lay on the table.

Motion to adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by the Gen. Supt. C. C. Brown.

#### SECOND DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION

After devotional services the conference was called to order with C. C. Brown in chair.

The first in order was the calling of the roll and reading of the minutes of the last session. Read and received.

The presiding elders report of the south district was read by Edw. Schoeff and on motion was received.

Report of the Holiness Christian Burial Association was

read by the secretary I. J. Snider and on motion received.

Home Missionary reports were read and on motion were received.

The question of abanded churches was brought up. Flat Rock. Moved and seconded that the furniture of the church be given to the Bicknell class. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the trustees have power to sell the church building at Flat Rock. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we call a special General Conference of the Holiness Christian Church to be held with the Apostolic Holiness Church at their next General Conference for the purpose of consolidating our two churches also that all our ordained preachers be allowed a voice in this General Conference. Carried.

Moved that the Presiding Elders of the N. and S. district act as part committee and request that the other conferences make like representation as a committee on union with the Apostolic Holiness Church. Carried.

Examining committee reports (see reports)

After prayer by C. C. Brown we proceeded to nominate and elect officers. The following were nominated as elders, A. M. Ewing, W. C. Canary, I. J. Snides, E. J. Clem and W. Sherman. On motion nomination was closed and by ballot W. Sherman and A. M. Ewing was elected.

Moved the elders make a speech. Carried. They responded, after which a song was sung and they were greeted by the right hand of fellowship.

Moved and seconded that the elders follow around on the two Dist. Carried.

O. W. Barnes, C. A. Horton and J. W. Shue were nominated for treasurer. O. W. Barnes by ballot was elected.

Next in order was nominations for Con. Trustee. Geo. Huff was nominated and elected by acclamation.

On motion it was decided to re-elect the Foreign Missionary Board O. W. Barnes and O. Sheets were elected by acclamation.

Moved and seconded that we elect by acclamation the following as officers of the Foreign Missionary Prayer Band, Alice Hart, Hattie and Katie Dunkleburger and Lillian Rogers. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the tents be left in the hands of the presiding elders and the Home Missionary work also be left in their care. Carried.

Moved we re-elect the Burial Association officers. Carried They were as follows—See official record. (Page 1)



Nominations were made for the election of an educational board. The following were nominated and elected—E. W. Wright, W. E. Bradley and Geo. Huff.

By consent of the conference the Examining Committee on morals were re-elected. See Record on page 2.

Moved and seconded that we elect O. W. Barnes, Edw. Schoeff and Clarence Dye on the Ways and Means committee. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the Statical Committee be re-elected. Carried. They were J. W. Shue, Paul Brichetto and W. S. Adams.

Moved that the Auditing Committee consisting of A. H. Blume, J. H. Cruser and E. C. Rhodes be re-elected. Carried.

The following nominations were made for the Resolution Committee—Elsie Bradley, Bertha Blume and E. W. Wright. They were elected by acclamation.

Moved and seconded that the Camp Meeting Committee be elected one at a time. Carried. They were as follows—I. J. Snider, O. W. Barnes, A. M. Ewing, Edw. Schoeff, L. F. Crute, A. H. Blume and W. Sherman.

Moved and seconded that we extend the time until supper bell rings. Carried.

The following were elected as a Reception Committee—A. M. Ewing and Washington Sherman.

Bell rings and on motion we adjourn.

Benediction by W. Sherman.

#### THIRD DAY—MORNING SESSION

After devotional services the conference was called to order with C. C. Brown in the chair. The first thing in order was the calling of the roll after which the minutes of the last session was read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that the committee on blanks get them out at once. Carried.

Report was read on Ways and Means. (see report)

Treasurers report was read by S. W. Bland and accepted. See report.

Moved and that we lend our little tents to the Missouri Conference. Carried.

Moved that C. C. Brown carry greetings to the Ill. and Mo. Conferences and that A. M. Ewing carry the same to the Kan. and Okla. Carried.

Moved and seconded that all pastors have their membership where they are pastors and all conference preachers names on some church roster. Carried.

Insomuch as our camp meeting is a conference camp meeting it was moved and seconded that no conference preacher make engagements that will inflict with the camp meeting. Carried.

Moved and seconded that all local churches release their pastors for the camp meeting and give them their full pay. Carried.

Moved that each class make one or more comforts for the camp next year. Carried.

It was requested that the presiding elders carry greetings to the convention of the Apostolic Holiness Church at English, Ind.

On motion it was decided to carry the Beneficiary work on as last year. The pastor, class leader, secretary and treasurer of each class constituting the board and each member of the class pay 10 cents per month to the steward of the board to help our worthy need.

Moved and seconded that the hundred dollars that was borrowed by Voice From Canaan from the conference be relinquished and that we take up an offering for the same. Carried. An offering of \$25.02 was taken.

It was decided to pay the publisher of the Voice from Canaan \$25.00 for advertising our camp meeting in four issues of the paper.

Moved and seconded that this conference favors the emerging of the Voice From Canaan and the two Apostolic Holiness papers and recommend that the western conference do the same. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the secretary furnish all data concerning the union of the Apostolic Holiness Church and the Holiness Christian. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this conference go on record as favoring the selling of the Bible School Building and use the contents on the Orphanage. Carried.

Moved that the reports that are read next year be accepted as read unless objections are made. Carried.

Report from committee on blanks was read by Edw. Schoeff and was received.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by H. W. Cornelius.

#### THIRD DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION

After devotional services the conference was called to order with C. C. Brown in the chair. First in order was the calling of the roll after which the minutes of the last session was read

and accepted.

Moved and seconded that we have a Ministerial Meeting in the South District. Carried. On invitation it was decided to be held at the first church at Indianapolis.

By motion it was also decided to have a Ministerial Meeting at Elwood, S. Dist.

Moved that all other arrangements as concerning dates and subjects etc. be left to the Presiding Elders. Carried.

Moved that the camp meeting board of three be made five and three be elected. Carried, I. J. Snider, Geo. Huff and Oliver Toney were elected.

Resolution Committee reports were read by Alice Hart. They were accepted as read. See report.

Rev. Arthur Plunket was admitted into the conference bar as an advisory member.

Moved that we adjourn for a fifteen minutes recess. Carried.

After adjournment it was decided that the secretary of the blank committee have the new blanks printed at once and forwarded to all pastors at earliest date.

Moved and seconded that the conference secretary be given \$10.00 for his services as secretary and all his car fare and postage be paid. Carried.

A letter was read by Alice Hart from our Foreign Missionary, Rev. A. R. Higgs and it was received.

Moved and seconded the secretary write Bro. Higgs a letter in reply to the letter read. Carried.

Song by Bro. Bradshaw, entitled "O Lord Send Us The Blessing."

Moved and seconded that we adjourn until 6:45. Carried. Benediction by Brother Fouts.

#### THIRD DAY—EVENING SESSION

Moved and second that we dispense of the roll call and the reading of the minutes. Carried.

Moved and seconded the members of the churches do not vote for their preacher the last quarterly meeting but the members instruct the delegate. Carried.

It was decided that the Home Mission work be reported by the P. E.'s once every three months.

We recommend that every preacher and Holiness Christian family subscribe for the Voice.

Moved that the expenses of the delegate to English, Ind. be paid out of the church extension fund. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we send a night letter to the

President requesting his clemency on behalf of Harry Roberts and that the secretary write Mrs. Roberts, informing her that this conference petitioned the president by night letter. Carried.

Stationing Committee report was read and accepted.

Moved we adjourn. Carried.

Benediction by C. C. Brown.

## REPORT OF COMMITTEES

### REPORTS OF THE EXAMINING COMMITTEE

We recommend that Marion French be ordained.

We recommend that F. A. Callahan be received into the conference on his credentials as an ordained elder on trial for one year.

We recommend that the following be granted first year itinerant license—Rush Moore, C. A. Horton, A. C. Harris, W. G. Jewell, Chas. Kendall, Elsie Bradley, Bertha Blume and Birdie Francis.

Recommended by the examining committee that the following names be stricken from the conference roll—Oliver Barker, John Higginbotham and Della Bowser.

Insomuch as Roscoe Earlywine has joined another church it was decided to drop his name from the conference roll.

We recommend that the following be granted renewal of first year itinerant license—J. O. Ecret, Harry Adams, G. W. Chamberlin, G. C. Colter, Samuel Moore, B. F. Winger, C. W. Lamar, E. L. Buck, J. J. St. Clair, J. L. Thornton, G. W. Brown, J. W. Graham, F. Wheeler, W. F. Hinds and L. Morris.

We recommend that A. H. Blume be granted renewal of first years itinerant license.

Recommended that Ida Franklin be accepted as a second year itinerant and received into the conference.

We recommend that Albert Holcomb be continued as second year itinerant.

The candidates recommended by the committee for first year itinercy with the exception of Rush Moore answered the usual questions and were received into the conference and greeted by the right hand of fellowship.

By request J. P. Garrisons name was dropped from the conference roll.

We recommend that C. L. Eddie be granted renewal first

year itinerants.

We recommend that C. Shoemaker be granted renewal of first year itinerants.

#### WAYS AND MEANS

1. We recommend insomuch as tithing is scriptural and disciplinary that each preacher, preach and practice it and urge his or her members to tithe and with pencil and paper keep strict account with God; said tithe to be paid into the local church treasury.

2. We recommend that the P. E.s on their quarterly rounds urge the members to make a rousing donation once a month for their pastor.

3. We recommend that each church be assessed at the rate of 75 cents for each and every member over 18 years old for apportionment and that 10 per cent of the amount raised be paid into the General Conference Treasury.

4. We recommend that each member of the annual conference pay into the conference treasury  $\frac{1}{2}$  of his or her tithe to be used for Home Missionary Work. Said amount to be forwarded to the conference secretary. The use of the same to be reported to the annual conference.

5. We recommend that a minimum amount of 800 dollars be given our P. E. on the north district and 900 to the P. E. on the south district. Said amount to be raised by apportioning local churches according to their ability. And that this amount be paid out in equal quarterly amounts. If the districts fail to raise the amount the Annual Conference will make up the deficiency, including the Camp Meeting offering.

6. We recommend that the General Superintendent be paid not less than 100 dollars for his services, said amount to be paid out of the Conference Treasury.

7. Insomuch as the salaries of the past have not been sufficient for many of our preachers we recommend that the P. Es. see that each class promise a minimum amount to be paid weekly. And that we use the envelope system.

8. We recommend that each pastor and evangelist work for and push the Voice and its collections. Including the one cent plan per member.

9. We recommend that in organizing a mission or class that the pastor or evangelist appoint a superintendent to keep the names of its members and to see that the preacher in charge and the P. E. is paid.

10. We recommend that the Annual Conference pay the traveling expenses of the Presiding Elders.

## AUDITING COMMITTEE

We the auditing committee have examined the reports and accounts of the Foreign Missionary Treasurer, Beulah Rescue Home, Holiness Christian Burial Association and the Home Missionary Financial Account and find them correct. The Presiding Elders Apportionment account with the exception of a few cents on Bro. Huffs we find to be correct.
