Minutes of the Second Annual Conference

International Apostolic Holiness
Union and Churches of the
Central Carolina District

Held in the High Point Holiness
Church, November 28, 29, 1912.

Minutes.

First session convened at 9:30 A. M., Nov. 28th, 1912. The devotional service which preceded the business session was conducted by Rev. M. A. Baldwin, pastor of the High Point Holiness church. The business session was opened by a scripture lesson read by Rev. S. M. Stikeleather and prayer by Rev. B. H. Vestal.

Motion made and carried that Rev. C. A. Lain act as secretary of this conference. Minutes of the First Annual Conference read and approved.

Motion made and carried to record the names of the preachers and delegates in the minutes.

Church reports were then called for and were read by the various pastors and delegates present.

After hearing the reports of the churches the State Council asked that the secretary write to those whose reports were not in and secure same to go in the minutes.

Rev. W. R. Cox offered resolutions in regard to the representation by delegates of the churches and missions, and in regard to support of pastors.

Motion made and carried that a committee of three be appointed to

frame resolutions with reference to the sending of delegates to the quarterly meetings and conferences by the churches and missions.

Committee Appointed:—M. A. Baldwin, C. G. Johnson, O. L. Ruth.

After much discussion, motion was made and carried to appoint a committee of five to frame a resolution in regard to the support of pastors. Such resolution to be considered by this conference. Committee appointed: W. R. Cox, C. G. Johnson, B. H. Vestal, T. M. Stikeleather, C. A. Ludwick.

Conference adjourned until 8:30 A. M., Friday.

Third session convened Friday, Nov. 29, 1912, 8:30 A. M. Short devotional service preceded the regular business session.

The committee on delegates to Quarterly Meeting and Annual Conference offered the following resolution:

Be it resolved, First, That each church and mission send at least one delegate to each Quarterly Meeting held in the district.

Second, That each church and mission send at least one delegate to the Annual Conference.

Third, That each church and mission shall pay carfare of the delegate.

Signed—O. L. Ruth, C. G. Johnson, M. A. Baldwin, committee.

The committee on support of pas-

tors offered the following resolution:

Be it Resolved, That this conference adopt the decision of the quarterly meeting held at Bethlehem church over two years ago which was as follows:

“Let the Advisory Board of each church meet and settle on the amount which their pastor shall have each month or week and then see that this amount is forthcoming.

“The State Superintendent is to co-operate with the advisory boards in putting this into effect.”

Signed:—W. R. Cox, C. G. Johnson, C. A. Ludwick, M. A. Baldwin, T. M. Stikeleather, committee.

These resolutions were unanimously passed by the conference.

Motion made and carried that we use in our Sunday Schools our own literature now published by the Apostolic Messenger Office, Greensboro, North Carolina.

Motion made and carried that all of our churches adopt the “Mite Box Plan” as passed by the General Assembly which met in Huntington, W. Va., Nov., 1911. Resolution follows:

Resolved, First, That the pastor of each church or circuit shall appoint some competent member of his church as Secretary of the Home Missionary Mite Boxes, whose duty it shall be to see that each member of his church, and as many others as they can get interested, takes one or more Mite Boxes.

Second, It shall be the duty of this Secre-

tary to collect the money every three months, or oftener as they may see proper.

Third, That this Secretary shall forward this money to the State Superintendent, and that he, with a committee of two or more, make distribution of this money as they may see proper.

Fourth, That the State Secretary shall report through a paper concerning the work being accomplished and the amount of money received for this purpose.

Moved and carried that a committee of three be appointed to frame a resolution in regard to the raising of money for our missionaries. Committee appointed: Mrs. W. R. Cox, C. G. Johnson, C. A. Ludwick.

Report of the Mt. Olive church was called for. There being no delegate present, Rev. C. A. Lain spoke for the church.

Committee on Foreign Missions recommended as follows:

We the committee appointed, recommend that the pastor and Sunday School Superintendent of the churches in this district use their influence to place on foot some plan to awaken an interest in Foreign Missions in the hearts of our people.

Signed:—Mrs. W. R. Cox, C. G. Johnson, C. A. Ludwick, committee.

Moved and carried that the minutes of this conference be published in pamphlet form, and that an offering be taken to bear the expense of same.

The offering taken amounted to \$7.32.

Next business in order was the reports of the pastors for the conference year ending Nov. 28, 1912.

After reading of the reports, motion was made and carried that a committee of three be appointed to prepare an Annual Report Blank for pastors, Annual Church Report Blank and Quarterly Church Report Blank.

Committee:—C. G. Johnson, M. A. Baldwin, W. R. Cox.

The following officers were elected for the ensuing year:—State Superintendent, C. G. Johnson; Assistant Superintendent, W. R. Cox; State Secretary, C. A. Lain; State Treasurer, James L. Crouse; additional members of council, O. L. Ruth, M. A. Baldwin, S. M. Stikeleather.

Motion made and carried that this conference allow C. G. Johnson \$50.00 per month for his services as State Superintendent. S. M. Stikeleather stated that he would stand good for one-sixth of this amount on condition that he have the services of Bro. Johnson for one month of the year to help him in his work in the western part of the state.

Motion was made and carried that this proposition be accepted.

Motion made and carried that the

balance be raised by the same plan used when Bro. Frazier was State Superintendent. Under this plan each church and mission is to raise the amount apportioned to them by the State Council for each month. This amount to be sent to the State Treasurer, James L. Crouse, Greensboro, North Carolina.

In order that Bro. Johnson might enter upon his work at once, it was decided that an offering be taken for him at this time. Same to be deducted from the first month's offering and returned to the persons giving it by the churches which they represented. The offering taken amounted to \$25.90, in cash and pledges.

Conference adjourned until 2 P. M.

Fourth session convened at 2 P. M.

This session was devoted to the Bible and Literary Training School of Greensboro, N. C., and Greensboro Rest Cottage.

At the close of the service motion was made and carried that all of our pastors and workers, and State Superintendent work for the interest of the school by way of encouraging prospective students to attend the school. Also that they secure subscriptions for the Apostolic Messen-

ger, the official organ of the International Apostolic Holiness Union.

The Council recommended the following candidates as being worthy of ordination and license:

For Ordination:—C. A. Ludwick, J. E. Shaw, B. H. Vestal, C. A. Lain, Miss Mossie Pugh.

For License:—J. W. Allred, H. B. Barger, Miss Alma Hicks.

The churches were arranged into quarterly meeting districts as follows:

Greensboro District No. 1, includes the following churches: Reidsville, Proximity, Greensboro, High Point, Hobson Street Mission, Archdale Mission, Mt. Olive, Randleman, Sawyersville, Asheboro, John Wesley Stand and Troy.

Gold Hill District, No. 2: Mt. Zion, Albemarle, St. Paul, Gold Hill, and Mt. Zion and Beulah churches in Davidson county.

Kernersville District, No. 3: Kernersville, Benifit, Sinai, Mt. Tabor, Sheffield and Harmony.

Liberty District, No. 4 Ramseur, Mt. Carmel, Emmanuei, Mt. Olivet, Pleasant Union, Pleasant Grove, Bethlehem, Staley, Hillsboro, Burlington, Haw River and Durham.

The pastors were assigned to stations and circuits as follows:

C. A. Ludwick, pastor of the Gold Hill church. M. A. Baldwin, pastor of the Troy church. Thomasville circuit, C. A. Ludwick, pastor. Mt. Zion and Beulah churches in Davidson county. Proximity church, S. S. Nelson, pastor.

After the Bible School and Rescue Home services, the Ordination service was set for 7 o'clock p. m., Rev. W. R. Cox delivering the charge, using the 4th chapter of Timothy as a lesson.

The afternoon service on Friday of the Conference was devoted to the interest of the Bible School and Rescue Home at Greensboro, N. C.

The Southern Railway furnished a private car to the Conference and back, and student body and teachers of the school and the matron and her assistant, of the Rescue Home, attended.

They sang, shouted and testified while the train was taking them on.

The superintendent, W. R. Cox, gave a talk explaining the object of the school, what it

is accomplishing, the blessings of God upon it and emphasized the duty of the Holiness people to stand by it and patronize it.

Several students were called on to give their testimony, and as they told how God led them to school, what they were receiving out of it and how their needs were supplied, the people cried and shouted, and we believe many realized that there is a great deal more being accomplished through the Bible School than they had thought.

RESCUE HOME REPORT.

After a talk by the superintendent, the matron, Mrs. Craner, told of how God led her to the Rescue Home as matron and how He was blessing her in the work of helping to save precious wayward daughters.

Miss Harvey, the assistant matron, then talked, telling her experience in connection with the Home and how God was working in that institution to rescue and salvation of souls. She encouraged the people to stand by it and lend their support, that these lost souls might have a chance to be saved.
