Covington, Ky. to be place of next Convention. Time, the second Tuesday in October and to last over Sunday.

Moved and supported we show our appreciation to Covington Church by a rising vote. Minutes read and accepted.

Assembly dismissed by singing "All Hail The Power of Jesus Name" and old-fashioned hand shake.

REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE.



Resolution No. 1—

Resolved: That we the Resolution Committee recommend that we raise an offering on the floor for present State expenses.

Resolution No. 2—

Resolved: That we the Resolution Committee recommend that Sec'y mail a copy of the minutes of this convention to each minister and that he should remit for same at once. Also each pastor notify the Sec'y the number of minutes he can sell on his charge on or before Nov. 15, 1921.

Resolution No. 3—

Resolved: That we the Resolution Committee recommend that the Sec'y send out report blank 10 days before each quarter expires. Further, that all quarterly reports be sent in not later than 1 week after quarter expires. Further, that all unpaid assessments be enclosed. All preachers whether licensed or ordained will not be excused, though they have but few meetings to report, in order that District Sup't may be able to make out an accurate report to the General Supt.

Resolution No. 4—

Resolved: That we the Resolution Committee recommend that all churches observe the Lord's Supper, and it to be administered the first Sunday in each quarter, namely, January, April July and October, and on circuits where all churches cannot be reached the Sacraments of said church be administered as near the time as convenient, and a liberal Missionary offering be taken at close of service.

Resolution No. 5—

Resolved: That we the Resolution Committee recommend to the State Convention that we as a district raise \$1,200.00 for our Supt. \$600.00 of this to be raised per annum by assessing the preachers in district (see resolution of last convention.) The balance to be raised according to the membership of each church. The State Council to fix said apportionment. Also a free will offering to be raised on each quarterly visit for traveling expenses.

Resolution No. 6—

Resolved: That we the Resolution Committee recommend to the State Convention that we raise Home Missionary Fund for financing the State work. Said fund to be raised by apportioning each church \$1.00 per member per annum.

Resolution No. 7—

Resolved: That we the Resolution Committee recommend to the State Convention that all preachers failing to send in accurate reports, quarterly and annually, said reports will not be accepted on the conference floor or placed in the minutes, and should be dealt with according to Paragraph 157, page 59, of the manual.

Resolution No. 8—

Resolved: That we the Resolution Committee recommend to the State Convention, that we the Assembly of the I. H. Church now in session, place ourselves on record as opposed to uniting with any organization which does not stand firmly for a four fold gospel, namely Regeneration, Sanctification, Divine Healing and the Pre-millennial Coming of Christ.

Resolution to General Assembly—

Be it resolved: That we recommend to and request that our General Sup't place in his call for Special meeting of the General Assembly the following:

That provision be made for the election of three General Superintendents of the International Holiness Church.

Further, that the church territory be divided into three territories, and that one of these General Superintendents preside over first territory, second over second territory and third over third territory.

Further, that these Superintendents change territories at the end of each year until each shall have presided over each territory, and that this order continue year after year.

Further, that these Superintendents shall meet together for general council as frequently as two times a year, in such place as may be agreed upon among themselves. Also that one of these Superintendents be elected at each General Assembly after the first election, which time one Superintendent shall be elected for 2 years, one for 4 years and one for 6 years.

An Experience Showing the Power of the Satan in the Present Day.



On my way up the river from the Cincinnati Camp in June we stopped off a few days at Portsmouth, O. A friend of mine was passing a house in which the mother was caring for a lunatic. A young man about 24 years old had lost his mind through a heavy blow received 14 years before. As my friend was passing the house he heard screams and knowing of the young man, he ran in as the boy was getting the best of his mother. My friend being a strong man delivered the mother and sends for me to come and pray for the boy. It was all he could do to hold him until I arrived. We fell on our knees at the foot of the bed. We could feel the presence mightily of Satan's personal presence. Soon we found it difficult to pray as we would be seized with smothering spells and had to pound our chest to get relief. Suddenly we would be taken again till we could scarcely talk owing to a heavy pressure and an incapacity to breathe.

Three times it seemed that we could feel a cold bony hand grip our throats, shutting off all power to breathe. But we held on as best we could fighting with all our might. Right behind us, a little to our right was a center table on which lay a Bible, we grabbed it and raised it to the extent of our arms, but our arms began trembling so we changed to the other hand and the same thing occurred to it. The Bible fell in spite of all we could do to hold it up. The first we knew we were back from the bed some four feet, so we grabbed the center table and table and all were carried back to the wall. We would be seized with smothering spells, though the room was well ventilated, doors and windows all open. We would occasionally burst forth in holy violence against the power of depression only to be enveloped with a smothering power. We called to our friend to pray the best he could, we tried to raise up but were trembling and weak, so we fell on our face and cried mightily for God to strengthen us. Soon we revived and rose to our feet, perspiration rolling from every pore of our body. We again grabbed the Bible, raising it over our head.

We began to plead the promises and realized we were gaining strength, but seemed powerless to get back to the bed as it was our desire to get back where we were driven from. So we prayed and struggled as never before. While we realized we were gaining strength every moment, yet the object in view was not achieved, that is the bed post from which we were carried by a foreign power. Soon we could move one leg forward some six inches, but were unable to move the other leg, so we fought and

demanded and insisted, until little by little we reached the bed, it taking one hour and fifty-one minutes by my friend's watch from the time we rose to our feet till we reached the bed, and that was the hardest, most personal struggle we have ever had. While we had off our coat and collar, yet there was not a dry thread on us and we were completely exhausted.

At that moment everyone in the room felt the power of God and the absence of the other power. The moment our knees struck the bed the boy released his hold on my friend and sank down in perfect submission. He has never caused his mother any trouble since. He formerly got up nights and if the door was locked he would kick it to pieces unless his mother unlocked it. He has never got up nights or caused the least disturbance, but is docile and calm, though his mind is very weak. But he is a changed boy after that desperate struggle lasting three hours in all; to Jesus be all the glory. I tell you these are testing days when some are tested to their limit, and it means something to take a stand. To walk out where Abraham did. Way out where not a trace of man has gone. Way out alone with God. Out where the promise seems to be way out on a dangerous precipice, with hundreds of feet between us and a safe landing. With darkness and rocky crags below us and we about to go crashing down. To be torn to pieces and God's word come to naught, but God has always aided and cared for and delivered us. We have never been defeated when we unflinchingly launched out and cut every shore line.
