MINUTES

27th Annual Assembly

Kansas District

Pilgrim Holiness Church

FIRST SITTING, MONDAY, 8:30 A. M., AUGUST 5, 1940

The first sitting of the twenty-seventh annual assembly convened at Beloit, Kansas, with Gen. Supt. W. L. Surbrook as chairman. Brother Surbrook read Titus the second chapter using part of the seventh verse as the text, "In all things shewing thyself a pattern of good works". His subject was, "Three Essentials to Ministerial Success". The main points of his address were:

1. Be spiritual.
2. Be sociable.
3. Be serviceable.

The roll call was read and revised.

Moved and seconded that the two center sections back to the third elevated seat constitute the assembly bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the time for regular sittings of the assembly be from 8:30 a. m. to 12 noon; 1:30 p. m. to 5 p. m.; and 7 p. m. to 9:30 p. m. Carried.

The district superintendent report was read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that Brother A. C. Wieand, Roy Glendening and A. E. Whittington be received into the assembly with assembly privileges. Carried.

Partial report of the examining board read and accepted.

Report of the Ways and Means committee read and accepted.

Rev. B. F. Durham and Rev. Paul Siekler were introduced to the assembly and granted honorary seats in the assembly bar.

- Report of the Foreign Missionary committee read and accepted.
- Report of the committee on resolutions read and acted upon. Report of the auditing committee read and accepted. Report of the statistical committee read and approved.
- Moved and seconded that the order of the day for 2 p. m. be the election of officers. Carried.
- Moved and seconded to pay the district treasurer \$25.00 and the district secretary \$20.00 for their services during the past year. Carried.
- Moved and seconded that the district council determine the time and place of the ministerial convention. Carried.
- Moved and seconded that the place of printing the minutes be left to the district council. Carried.
- Moved and seconded that the assembly year close June 30 and that all district monies be sent to the district treasurer and all ANNUAL reports to the district SECRETARY by July 15. Carried.
- Motion to adjourn.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting convened at 1:30 p. m., with Rev. W. L. Sarbrook in the chair.

The remainder of ballots were scattered. First ballot for district treasurer: 70 ballots cast. Jack Campbell 57; scattering votes 13. Other members of the council: Paul N. Isgrigg, J. J. Cork on first ballot, and B. F. Ireland on the third ballot.

District Superintendent's Report

TO THE 27TH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE KANSAS DISTRICT
OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH.

GREETINGS:

Due to God's goodness we are again able to assemble after serving one more year in this holy war.

I am grateful for the cooperation that I have received from our people and for the fine spirit of unity that exists today among our brethren. Truly God has helped us.

Good revivals have blessed our people in a marked way. Material improvements have been made in the way of painting, repairing and building. We have acquired a fine parsonage at Winona which is free of debt. Fowler has built what is perhaps the nicest parsonage on the District. Twelve months ago we organized at Lucas. Rev Milton Stockman in some nine months has been able to buy a lot, build a church and parsonage on which there is no indebtedness. I had the privilege of dedicating their church in a splendid service some time ago.

Several good Home Missionary meetings have been conducted. These have opened new doors for us. We have three preaching points where we expect to hold revivals soon with an effort to organize.

I have held many business meetings, visited all of our churches; have been engaged in nine revivals, attended one General Board Meeting and three Bible School Business meetings. I have preached 170 sermons, traveled approximately 30,000 miles and have seen 156 seekers bow at an altar of prayer.

My soul says, Amen! to the whole will of God.

RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off charge during the year; provided that his charge be supplied satisfactorily to his advisory board.

2. Resolved that the 1941 District Camp have children's and young people's services; workers to be secured as soon as possible.

3. Resolved that we as an assembly express our thanks and appreciation to the council and city of Beloit, also to the Park care-taker, which have contributed to make our camp and assembly a success; and that it be printed in the Beloit paper:

4. Resolved that each church send ~~six knives, six forks and six spoons~~; one cot and two pounds of dried noodles (not home-made) for the 1941 camp and assembly.

5. Resolved that we have a workers meeting each day of the 1941 camp.

6. Resolved that we have two prayer band leaders appointed by the camp management for the 1941 camp; one for the men and one for the women.

7. Resolved that we hold assembly at the close of camp.

8. Resolved that all annual reports to the assembly be made on uniform blanks and that they have the pastor's signature of approval.

9. Resolved that each active minister be released for two Sundays during the camp and assembly and that they receive regular salary provided that they attend camp and assembly.

10. Resolved that no pastor or church employ an evangelist for a revival without the endorsement of the District Superintendent.

11. Resolved that we urge our evangelists and other ministers to arrange their slates and work so as not to conflict with the Camp and Assembly.

12. Resolved that all pastors and evangelists sound a clear and constructive note against all worldliness.

13. Resolved that inasmuch as it is the little foxes that spoil the vines, that our ministers and laymen take a more definite stand against anklets, rolled hose, short sleeves, permanents, etc.

14. Resolved that we as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church go on record as opposed to being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the church in physieal educational classes in public schools.

15. Resolved that we devote two of the workers meetings of the camp to the Sunday School.

16. Resolved that each church send a food or cash donation to the 1941 ministerial convention.

17. Resolved that as some of our churches are quite a distance from

our district camp, each church pay the expense of their delegates to the camp and assembly.

18. Resolved that all licensed ministers and licensed deaconesses, looking forward to ordination, keep in touch with the secretary of the educational board, whose name and address will be in the minutes.

19. Resolved that all ministers and deaconesses taking the course of study have their papers in to the educational board by June 30.

20. Resolved that the District Superintendent have charge of the district tents,

21. Resolved that all our District musicians bring their instruments to the 1941 camp.

22. Resolved that the first prayer meeting night of each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the District. The announcement shall be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School superintendent.

23. Resolved, that when a licensed minister continues year after year as a licensed minister making no attempt to take the course of study, and is doing little or no active preaching, that he or she be referred by the Examining Board to the local church for local preacher's license.

24. Resolved, whereas there are several licenced preachers who are doing little or no active preaching, and who have no prospect of doing more than local work, we urge that our local churches be more careful in recommending candidates for district license to preach.

25. Resolved, that all ministers and lay delegates remain until the close of the assembly; no pastor or lay delegate shall be excused without a good and written excuse.

26. Resolved, that by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to Sister Sigle for her untiring services as children's worker.

27. Resolved, that we as an assembly show our sincere appreciation to our beloved district superintendent, Howard K. Busby, by a rising vote of thanks for his untiring labor of love among us during the past year.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all active ministers pay three-fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of their ministerial tithe, through their local Church Treasurer, to the District Budget.

2. We recommend that the Evangelists of our District pay one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer for the District Budget.

3.
