MINUTES
of the
28th Annual Assembly
of the
KANSAS DISTRICT
of the
PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

FIRST SITTING, 8:00 A. M., AUGUST 11, 1941

The first sitting of the twenty-eighth annual assembly convened at Beloit, Kansas, with the Dist. Supt. H. K. Busby as Chairman. Prayer was offered by Rev. H. P. Engle, after which Rev. W. R. Plummer read the scripture lesson from Phil. 2:1-16. A letter was then read by the secretary, J. H. Fortner, from the General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook. Rev. H. K. Busby then addressed the assembly on the subject, "Our Church." The principal points of his address were: 1. Our place. 2. Our program. 3. Our piety.

The roll call was read and revised.

Motion that the two center rows of seats back to the elevation constitute the assembly bar. Carried.

Motion that the time for the regular sittings of the assembly be from 8 a. m. to 12 noon; 1:30 p. m. to 5 p. m.; 7 p. m. to the close. Carried.

Report of the examining board read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that Mrs. M. M. Conrad be received into the Kansas District with the same license that she held when she left a few years ago. Carried.

Report of the District Superintendent read and accepted.

Rev. J. D. Robertson, Rev. and Mrs. Lee Rathbun, Rev. and Mrs. C. C. Coleman, and C. W. Miller were introduced to the assembly and granted honorary seats in the assembly.

The new church at Rexford, Kansas, was received into the assembly.

The report of the foreign missionary committee was read and accepted.

Motion was passed that the order of the day be the election of officers at 2:00 p. m.

Report of the auditing committee read and accepted.

We, the auditing committee, have audited the district treasurer's books and they stand correct.—Lois Cork, Zella Kemp.

Report of the district treasurer read and accepted.

A letter from our foreign missionary, Rev. H. L. Solter, was read by the secretary and he was instructed by the assembly to write a letter of reply.

The report of the ways and means committee read and acted upon.

Motion passed to pay the district secretary \$25 and the district treasurer \$30 for their services during the year.

Moved and seconded that the district council determine the time and place of the ministerial convention. Carried.

Motion passed to leave to the district council to determine place of the printing of the district minutes.

Moved and seconded that the assembly year close June 30 and that all district monies be sent to the district treasurer and all annual reports to the district secretary by July 15. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this assembly express their appreciation of the services of the district treasurer and district secretary by a rising vote of thanks. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this assembly grant the district council authority to take care of any district business which may have been overlooked by the assembly. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this assembly grant authority to the district secretary to insert late reports in the statistical report. Carried.

Report of the statistical committee read and approved.

Motion passed to insert young peoples' society reports in the minutes.

Moved and seconded that we close with prayer especially for the safety of the Solters. Carried.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting convened at 1:30 p. m. with Rev. H. K. Busby in the chair. The scripture was read by Rev. J. J. Cork after which prayer was offered by Rev. J. E. Isgrigg.

The roll call was read and revised.

The election of officers resulted as follows:

All the members of the council were overwhelmingly elected on the nominating ballot. H. K. Busby elected superintendent with 67 out of 74 votes; W. R. Plummer as his assistant with 56 out of 73 votes; J. H. Fortner as secretary with 59 out of 72 votes; and Jack Campbell as treasurer with 63 out of 74 votes. Other members of the council elected were Paul Isgrigg, B. F. Ireland, and J. J. Cork.

R. C. Stalcup was elected Bible School board member.

Motion was passed that the district council nominate candidates for the examining and educational boards.

Motion passed that the council nominate candidates for lay delegates to the general assembly in 1942.

H. P. Engle was elected to fill vacancy on the examining board, and M. E. Stockman to fill the vacancy on the educational board.

Moved and seconded that the chair appoint committees for 1942 assembly. Carried. Committees appointed as follows:

Auditing—Zella Kemp and Lois Cork.

Foreign Missionary—M. L. Pottenger, O. R. Hofen, and F. N. Griffin.

Resolutions—R. H. Smith, R. C. Stalcup, Roy Nible, Homer Wolcott, and J. E. Isgrigg.

Reception—R. E. Hahn and J. J. Doll.

Ways and Means—Jack Campbell, W. R. Plummer, J. H. Philpot, J. J. Cork, and R. L. Jellison.

Statistical—J. H. Fortner, Harold Bland, Myrle M. Nixon, Clara Craik, Clifford Conard.

The following memorial to the general assembly was passed: "Resolved, that the local church board nominate not less than three nor more than five persons for Sunday School superintendent and that the local church elect their superintendent from this number."

Report of the stationing committee was read.

Moved and seconded that this assembly show their appreciation to the following childrens' workers: Sisters Jellison, Lois Cork, Zella Kemp, Ethel Harris, Griffin, Fortner, Isgrigg, and Slater, by a rising vote of thanks. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this assembly show their appreciation to the cooks, Sisters Alice Cork and Zoe Briles, for the splendid way in which they performed their duties. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this assembly show their appreciation to our district superintendent, H. K. Busby, for the efficient way in which he has presided over the assembly. Carried.

Minutes of the last sitting read and approved.

Motion to adjourn.

District Superintendent's Report

TO THE 28TH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS
CHURCH OF THE KANSAS DISTRICT CONVENED AT BELOIT,
KANSAS, AUGUST 11, 1941

GREETINGS:

Through the goodness of God, we are permitted to meet here again after spending another year in the service of the Master. While the nations rage and much of the world suffers the ravages of war, we thank God for blessings still enjoyed.

This year has been an eventful one. Many problems have faced us, but the prayers and cooperation of God's people have lightened our load.

I am hopeful that our Sunday Schools will show an increase this year. Several good revivals have encouraged our people and a number have been added to the church. After several revivals and months of faithful labor, brother J. J. Cork was able to organize a new church at Rexford, Kansas. Our folk are operating Sunday Schools at Sylvan Grove, Highland School House and Modoc. After closing our revival in Virgil, brother Jellison has had an interesting cottage prayer meeting there. These folk are very hopeful for a tent meeting immediately after Assembly. A number of our pastors have loyally stood by our Home Mission work. Shortage of funds hinder us at this point, but there should be better days ahead. Numbers of improvements have been made in a material way. Colby has built a nice parsonage which has been needed for years. Toronto has a growing building fund. Goodland lifted their indebtedness and we owe very little on our property throughout the District. Some of our young men are being called into the whitened harvest. I thank God for this.

I have preached in seven revivals, have had 88 seekers and some happy finders. I have held many business meetings throughout the District and all of our annual meetings and elections save one. I have preached 179 sermons, conducted 4 funerals, attended three Bible School board meetings and one General Board meeting. I have traveled approximately 30,000 miles.

I hope for better things in God this coming year and if the Lord delays His coming, let us keep in readiness for the meeting of that other "Assembly."

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

1. Resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off charge during the year; provided that his charge be supplied satisfactorily to his advisory board.

2. Resolved that the 1942 District Camp have children's and young people's services; workers to be secured as soon as possible.

3. Resolved that we as an assembly express our thanks and appreciation to the council and city of Beloit, also to the Park care-taker, which have contributed to make our camp and assembly a success; and that it be printed in the Beloit paper.

4. Resolved that each church send six cereal dishes, one good quality cot, and two pounds of dried noodles, (not home made) for the 1942 camp.

5. Resolved that we have a workers' meeting each day of the 1942 camp.

6. Resolved that we have two prayer band leaders appointed by the camp management for the 1942 camp; one for the men and one for the women.

7. Resolved that we hold assembly at the close of the camp.

8. Resolved that each active minister be released for two Sundays during the camp and assembly and that they receive regular salary provided that they attend camp and assembly.

9. Resolved that no pastor or church employ an evangelist for a revival without the endorsement of the District Superintendent.

10. Resolved that all pastors and evangelists sound a clear and constructive note against all worldliness such as anklets, rolled hose, short sleeves, permanents, etc.

11. Resolved that we as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church go on record as opposed to being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the church in physical educational classes in public schools.

12. Resolved that we devote two of the workers' meetings of the camp to the Sunday School.

13. Resolved that each church send a food or cash donation to the 1942 ministerial convention.

14. Resolved that as some of our churches are quite a distance from our district camp, each church pay the expenses of their delegates to the camp and assembly.

15. Resolved that all licensed ministers and licensed deaconesses looking forward to ordination, keep in touch with the secretary of the educational board, whose name and address will be in the minutes.

16. Resolved that all ministers and deaconesses taking the course of study have their papers in to the educational board by June 30.

17. Resolved that the District Superintendent have charge of the district tents.

18. Resolved that all our District musicians bring their instruments to the 1942 camp.

19. Resolved that the first prayer meeting night of each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the District. The announcement shall be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School superintendent.

20. Resolved that we as pastors do our best for our evangelists in their cash offering and where practical give them a good food donation.

21. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, furnish his successor a complete calling list with their location.

22. Resolved that when a licensed minister continues year after year as a licensed minister making no attempt to take the course of study, and is doing little or no active preaching, that he or she be referred by the Examining Board to the local church for local preacher's license.

23. Resolved, whereas there are several licensed preachers who are doing little or no active preaching, and who have no prospect of doing more than local work, we urge that our local churches be more careful in recommending candidates for district license to preach.

24. Resolved, that we as an assembly, show our sincere appreciation to our beloved district superintendent, Howard K. Busby, by a rising vote of thanks for his untiring labor of love among us during the past year.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all active ministers pay three-fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of their ministerial tithe, through their local church treasurer, to the District Budget.

2. We recommend that the Evangelists of our District pay one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer for the District Budget.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District Budget at the rate of \$1.00 per member, in full standing; and at the rate of \$3.00 per member for the General Budget, which apportionments equal the following amounts for each church. The first item being the District Budget and the last the General Budget.

4. We recommend that all churches calling the District Superintendent on trouble calls pay his traveling expenses.

7. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$100.00 per month and his traveling expenses.

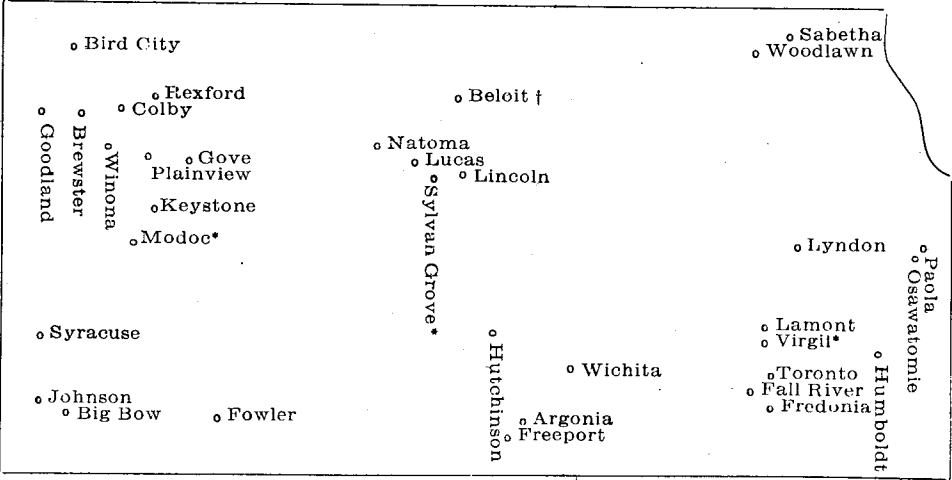
