MINUTES

OF THE

TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE

OF THE

KANSAS DISTRICT

OF THE

PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

HELD AT BELOIT, KANSAS, AUGUST 10, 1942

First Sitting, 8:30 a. m., August 10, 1942

The first sitting of the twenty-ninth annual conference convened at Beloit, Kansas, with the first assistant general superintendent, Rev. R. G. Flexon, as chairman. The song service was led by Rev. B. F. Ireland. Rev. Jack Campbell conducted the opening exercises. Prayer was offered by Rev. J. E. Isgrigg.

Rev. R. G. Flexon read II Tim. 4:1-8 and addressed the conference using as a text these words: "Preach the word." The subject of his address was "What Holiness Does Not Do For Us."

The roll call was read and revised.

Moved and seconded that each pastor be granted authority to select a delegate where neither the delegate nor the alternate is present. Carried.

Motion that the two center rows of seats back to the elevation constitute the conference bar. Carried.

Motion that the time of the regular sittings of the conference be from 8:30 a. m. to 12 noon; 1:30 p. m. to 5 p. m.; and 7 p. m. to the close. Carried.

Report of the examining board read and acted upon.

Moved and seconded the conference accept the recommendation of the district council in regard to receiving of Rev. J. E. Pottenger, Rev. and Mrs. J. J. Doll, and Rev. Alvin Reissig. Carried. Recommendation reads thus: The council recommends that J. E. Pottenger be received into our conference on his credentials (with a second year license), and that Rev. and Mrs. Doll and Alvin Reissig be received on their credentials.

Report of the district superintendent read and accepted.

Report of the auditing committee read and accepted. "We, the auditing committee, have audited the treasurer's books and they stand corrected."—Miss Helen Berggren, Mrs. Wayne Glendening.

Rev. Mrs. Lee Rathbun, Rev. Frank Freed, and Rev. A. R. C. Howard were introduced to the assembly and granted honorary seats in the conference bar.

Report of the foreign missionary committee read and accepted.

Report of the resolution committee read and acted upon.

Report of the statistical committee read and accepted with corrections.

Motion made and seconded that loss or gain on Sunday School report be reckoned on average weekly attendance. Carried.

Report of the district treasurer read and accepted.

Moved and seconded to extend a rising vote of thanks to the retiring district treasurer. Carried.

Report of the ways and means committee read and acted upon.

Motion to adjourn.

Second Sitting

The second sitting of the conference convened at 1:30 p. m. with Rev. R. G. Flexon in the chair. The song service was led by Rev. M. E. Stockman after which Rev. H. P. Engle led the conference in prayer. Scripture verses by the people were quoted.

The roll call was read and completed. Minutes of the last sitting were read and approved.

Partial report of the ways and means committee was read and approved.

Partial report of the resolution committee read and adopted.

Sister R. G. Flexon was introduced to the conference and was granted an honorary seat in the conference bar.

Moved and seconded to proceed with the election of officers. Carried.

The following tellers were appointed by the district superintendent: Granville Carroll, J. E. Pottenger, Joye Doane, and Wayne Glendening. Miss Lois Cork was selected to help check the results.

The election of officers resulted as follows:

H. K. Busby was elected superintendent on the nominating ballot with 57 votes out of a total of 72 ballots cast. He declined to accept the office due to the restriction in section 6 of the report of the ways and means committee

in regard to the number of meetings held out of the district. Special privilege was granted by the conference to Bro. Busby to hold four meetings out of the district providing he cannot cancel the fourth. Bro. Busby then accepted the office of district superintendent.

Rev. W. R. Plummer was elected assistant superintendent with 55 votes out of a total of 72 ballots cast. Rev. B. F. Ireland was elected district treasurer on the second ballot with 43 votes out of a total of 73 ballots cast. Rev. J. H. Fortner was elected district secretary with a vote of 63 out of a total of 71 ballots cast. Other members of the council elected were J. J. Cork, Paul Isgrigg, and M. M. Conrad.

Paul Isgrigg was elected to fill vacancy on the examining board and Mrs. R. C. Stalcup to fill vacancy on the educational board. R. C. Stalcup was elected to serve on the Bible School board.

Moved and seconded that this conference give Rev. R. H. Smith and Rev. Roy Glendening a rising vote of appreciation for their splendid success in the April Sunday School rally. Carried.

Motion carried to insert the young people's reports in the minutes.

Motion prevailed to permit the district council to determine the place of printing the minutes and also the number to be printed.

District superintendent granted authority to appoint committees for the 1943 conference. Committees appointed as follows:

Statistical—J. H. Fortner, H. L. Bland, Clara Craik, Clifford Conard, Myrle M. Nixon.

Moved and seconded that the district secretary write a letter of greeting to Rev. H. L. Solter and Rev. A. Hulse. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the conference year close June 30 and that all district monies be sent to the district treasurer and that all annual reports be sent to the district secretary by July 15. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this conference grant authority to the district council to take care of any district business which may have been overlooked by this conference. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this conference grant authority to the district secretary to insert late reports in the statistical report. Carried.

Motion to recess until 8 o'clock. Carried.

The ordination service was conducted at 8 o'clock by the following committee: R. G. Flexon, H. K. Busby, W. R. Plummer, J. J. Cork, Jack Campbell, and B. F. Ireland. Bro. Flexon brought the ordination message.

The report of the stationing committee was read.

Moved and seconded that this conference show their appreciation to the following children's workers by a rising vote of thanks: Sisters Granville Carroll, J. E. Pottenger, Vera Glendening, Hope Dillon, and F. N. Griffin.

Moved and seconded that this conference show their appreciation to the cooks, Sisters Alice Cork and Zoe Briles, for the splendid way in which they performed their duties. Carried.

Moved and seconded that this conference show their appreciation to our first assistant general superintendent, R. G. Flexon, for the efficient way in which he has presided over this conference. Carried.

Minutes of second sitting read and accepted as corrected.

Moved and seconded that the district secretary act as statistician for the fall Sunday School rally. Carried.

Motion to adjourn.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 29th Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Kansas District, convened at Beloit, Kansas, August 10, 1942.

GREETINGS!

Through the goodness and mercy of the Lord we have been permitted to assemble again. Though the flames of war have enveloped our land, we are glad to report that our workers are pushing on in this holy war. New developments of these days have brought real problems in our work, but they are problems that we will do our best to meet.

I think we can honestly say that a splendid spirit of unity is prevalent among our brethren. We praise God for this.

Home Missionary meetings have been conducted at Hiawatha, Virgil, and Modoc. Brother Jellison and the Martsof sisters held a meeting at the Oil Field School house near Lamont; Brother Campbell one in Goff. Our unorganized work at Sylvan Grove is progressing nicely.

We have a slight loss in membership on the District. About twenty of our churches have their budgets paid. This is twice as many as we have had in several years. We have had a total increase of approximately \$8,000.00 in receipts. During the year Sabetha has lifted the mortgage on their parsonage. Various material improvements have been made in the District. A need of the years was met at Toronto, where God enabled Rev. Wolcott and his people to build a nice new church on a choice lot. This new property is free from debt. In fact, our District indebtedness is very low.

I have labored in eight Camps and revivals and have preached 180 sermons and have seen 351 seekers. Also have traveled countless miles night and day in the work of the Lord. Have attended one General Board meeting, two Bible School Board meetings, and have visited all of our churches for Annual church meetings. My salary is paid in full.

I appreciate the love, cooperation, and confidence of God's people that I have enjoyed, but most of all praise Him who keeps the great record and promises grace for our every need. Hallelujah!

The district council of the Kansas District voted to accept Miss Grace A. Schneider as an ordained minister and Miss Virginia N. Johnson as a licensed deaconess on their credentials.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

1. Resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off charge during the year; provided that his charge be supplied satisfactorily to his advisory board.
2. Resolved that the 1943 District Camp have children's and young people's services; workers to be secured as soon as possible.
3. Resolved that we as an assembly express our thanks and appreciation to the council and city of Beloit, also to the Park care-taker, which have contributed to make our camp and assembly a success; and that it be printed in the Beloit paper.
4. Resolved that each church send six dessert dishes, one large kitchen apron and a free will offering to the 1943 camp.
5. Resolved that we have a workers meeting each day of the 1943 camp.
6. Resolved that we have two prayer band leaders appointed by the camp management for the 1943 camp; one for men and one for women.
7. Resolved that we hold conference at the close of the camp.
8. Resolved that each active minister be released two Sundays during the camp and conference and that they receive regular salary provided that they attend camp and conference.
9. Resolved that no pastor or church employ an evangelist for a revival without the endorsement of the District Superintendent.
10. Resolved that all pastors and evangelists sound a clear and constructive note against all worldliness such as anklets, rolled hose, short sleeves, permanents, etc., calling special attention to the resolution of our last general Conference relative to this subject.
11. Resolved that we as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church go on record as opposed to members of the P. H. Church being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the church in physical educational classes in public schools.
12. Resolved that we devote two of the workers' meetings of the camp to the Sunday School.
13. Resolved that as some of our churches are quite a distance from our district camp, each church pay the expenses of their delegates to the camp and assembly.
14. Resolved that we have a Ministerial Convention in 1943, the date to be set by the District Council and announced before the close of this conference, and that each church send a food or cash donation. Date set for March 9-11, 1943.

15. Resolved that all licensed ministers and licensed deaconesses looking forward to ordination, keep in touch with the secretary of the educational board, whose name and address will be in the minutes.

16. Resolved that all ministers and deaconesses taking the course of study have their papers in to the educational board by June 30.

17. Resolved that the District Superintendent have charge of the district tents and Tabernacle.

18. Resolved that all our District musicians bring their instruments to the 1943 camp.

19. Resolved that the first prayer meeting night of each month shall be donation night for the pastors of the District. The announcement shall be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School Superintendent.

20. Resolved that we as pastors do our best for our evangelists in their cash offering and where practical give them a good food donation.

21. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, furnish his successor a complete calling list with their location.

22. Resolved that when a licensed minister continues year after year as a licensed minister making no attempt to take the course of study and is doing little or no active preaching, that he or she be referred by the Examining Board to the local church for local preacher's license.

23. Resolved, whereas there are several licensed preachers doing little or no active preaching, and who have no prospect of doing more than local work, we urge that our local church be more careful in recommending candidates for district license to preach.

24. Resolved that we instruct our secretary to write a letter of appreciation to Merle Van Winkle for the beautiful neon cross he gave us.

25. Resolved, that we as an assembly, show our sincere appreciation to our beloved district superintendent, Howard K. Busby, by a rising vote of thanks for his untiring labor of love among us during the past year.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all active ministers pay three-fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of their ministerial tithe, through their local church treasurer, to the District Budget.

2. We recommend that the Evangelists of our District pay one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer for the District Budget.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District Budget at the rate of \$1.00 per member, in full standing; and at the rate of \$3.00 per member for the General Budget, which apportionments equal the following amounts for each church. The first item is the District Budget and the last the General Budget.

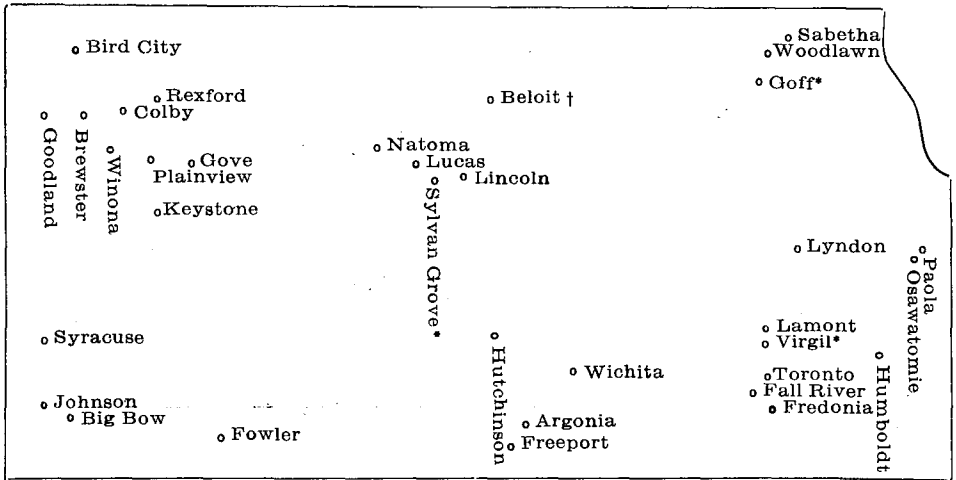
