Report of the Educational and Examining Board

1. We recommend that Rev. Dale Kessler of the Michigan District be taken into this Conference, that he be placed in the same status as carried by the former district.
2. We recommend that Rev. George Farah be received as an Ordained Minister subject to the transfer coming from the North Carolina District.
3. We recommend that Rev. Robert Keith be received as a Licensed Minister from the Western Ohio District.
4. We recommend that the following names be taken from the

Ministerial roll, having joined other districts: Rev. Mr. and Mrs. Frank Salvador; Myrtle Stephens, Ira Ullom and Ron Adams. We further recommend that Rev. Adrian Grout, Jr. be dropped, due to the fact he has joined another denomination.

5. We recommend that Ivan Arnold, and Larry Yarrington be retained in the class of the 1st year. We also recommend that Rev. Dan Copeland, and Rev. Mrs. Norma Keyes be retained in the class of the 4th year.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The eleventh annual Conference of the North Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Warrenton, Missouri July 18, 1960 at 9 a.m.

Rev. Robert Keith led the congregation in singing the hymn, "Amazing Grace." Prayer was offered by Rev. H. J. Beecher.

The presiding officer Dr. M. J. Snyder, General Superintendent was presented to the Conference by Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, District Superintendent.

Our General Superintendent read from Revelation 3:7 through 13, and brought an address on "The Seven Churches of Asia," pointing out that the major thing in this Conference is to discern what the Spirit has to say to us, that when we leave we will feel that we have done what the Spirit approves and also to be overcomers in the face of many conflicts, using the example of Paul. He also brought to our attention that God observes both our works, and the quality of our works. He emphasized the responsibility of the Ministry, in naming what we preach, the high honor of the calling, our faithfulness to the calling under all circumstances.

The roll call was given.

The fine Church at Mexico, Missouri was accepted by the Conference, given to us through the labors of Rev. and Mrs. Bottenberg. The Conference stood in appreciation, and in unison said "Praise The Lord."

The Conference Bar was set for the first six rows of chairs.

Introduced were: Rev. S. R. Wilcox, pastor of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Willard, Kentucky, also Rev. Robert Keith, pastor of Kansas City Pilgrim Holiness Church. These Ministers were seated.

Rev. Bottenberg presented a letter from Rev. T. E. Aslin and it was read by the Secretary. A fine report of progress was given by the Aslins. Receipt of this letter is to be acknowledged by the Secretary, along with greetings from the Conference.

The report from the District Superintendent was received and accepted by a standing vote of appreciation.

The Assistant Superintendent read his report and it was accepted. The report of the Auditing Committee was given and accepted.

The report of the District Treasurer was received with a hearty amen.

Rev. Arnold Keyes gave his report as Sunday School Promotional Secretary, and it was accepted by all saying "Praise The Lord."

The report of the District Statistician was given partly, as it was time for adjournment.

The Conference convened again at 1:00 p.m.

After the balance of the statistics were read, they were accepted by the Conference.

The report of the Educational and Examining Board was accepted.

The Resolution report was given and accepted.

The Ways and Means committee gave their report which was accepted.

The Report of the Condolence Committee was accepted and Dr. Snyder prayed a memorial prayer.

The matter of changing the location of the Camp Meeting for 1961 was discussed by the Conference, and a committee was appointed by the Chairman to make investigation concerning the Salvation Army Camp, on Highway 40, 15 miles east of Kansas City, Missouri, and any other suitable location that might be available. The Committee appointed were: W. O. Bottenberg, Edward Boone, Wm. Schloeman, Robert Keith, C. E. Hanks and H. J. Beecher.

Motion made and carried that W. O. Bottenberg, Edward Boone, H. J. Beecher, C. E. Hanks serve as Trustees of the North Central District, of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Motion made and carried that the District Council transact any unfinished business.

The Conference joined in singing the Doxology.

REPORT OF W. O. BOTTENBERG DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To General Superintendent, Dr. M. H. Snyder, Pastors, Evangelists, Laymen and Friends, Greetings! The eleventh Camp Meeting of the North Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, is now history, but we will long remember the victories that have been won, the blessings from heaven, the wonderful presence of God, and His anointing that has been on our people the past week. The anointed Ministry of Dr. Snyder has been greatly appreciated, also the fine work of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Hamilton, singers and musicians. We have also enjoyed the singing of their little son each night. These fine workers have surely been at their best, and we feel that our people have made spiritual growth under this ministry that was indeed blessed of God.

We are surely grateful to God today for His faithful leadership during this Conference year, and permitting us to gather for this special day, to make plans for the coming year.

We are thankful for our Youth of North Central District, for the fine number attending, participating, and cooperating for the suc-

cess of the Camp. We want to thank North Central Youth for their contribution during the year to our new work in Mexico, Missouri. We are glad for the district organization of our Pilgrim Youth, as well as each local society.

I am happy to report the fine new organization we have in Mexico, Missouri. We organized this church on the 9th day of August 1959. We now have 15 members. A very choice location for a new Pilgrim Church in Mexico, at the corner of Clark and Vine Street, was purchased October 1st. We paid earnest money at that time and we are just now closing the sale, as we have been waiting all this time for the abstract. Work on the new church will soon begin. These fine new Pilgrims will greatly appreciate your continued prayers.

Three pastors are transferring to North Central. Reverend Robert Keith has accepted the pastorate at Kansas City, having replaced Reverend and Mrs. T. E. Aslin. The latter being accepted by the Missionary Department, to work in the West Indies. Reverend George Farah of North Carolina is moving to Des Moines 1st Church, and Reverend Dale Kessler is moving to Hannibal. We truly believe these three fine ministers will be a great blessing to their Church, and our District. Reverend Robert Keith is already proving to be a capable leader for our Youth.

Several of our Churches have made fine improvements on their Church and Parsonage. St. Louis has provided extra Sunday School rooms. Webster Groves has greatly increased the value of their property by filling in needed soil, and installing a drainage sewer, at a cost of \$2,200.00. Warrenton Church has done some painting, and made several repairs. We greatly appreciate the kindness and hospitality of the Warrenton Pilgrims, in allowing us to bring Camp Meeting to their town, these several years. Kansas City Church is still going forward in their building program. They are continually planning for the future, and their attendance has been constantly gaining for the past several months. Pacific Junction has worked on their church, repairing, and painting. They have always advocated the upkeep of their property when needed. Brother and Sister Houck are taking over the work at Glenwood. We are anticipating a wonderful year of progress for them. Sister Williams is accepting the pastorate at Eddyville, and already there seems to be an increase of interest. Reverend Ivan Arnold has recently started a Sunday School at Albia, Iowa, and we pray that a work may be established there. Brother and Sister Beecher have recently moved to Des Moines, to pastor the Trinity Church. The Trinity Pilgrims are greatly encouraged to press on, under their fine new leadership. We have had a very busy year on the district, visiting each

Church at least twice. Some of the Churches more. We have always enjoyed a fine spirit of unity and cooperation. Our pastors have stood by us in every way. We have traveled nearly 6,000 miles in district work. Three revivals took us to Tucson and Phoenix, Arizona, and Hannibal, Missouri. We have received \$102.00 in love offerings from the Churches of the District. There were nine issues of the North Central Pilgrim published. A number of our Churches have the Lay Visitation Plan in use. We trust this will net fine results. Vacation Bible Schools have been conducted by some, others have the program in their calendar for the weeks after Conference, and before school starts.

As we continue to make plans for our Churches, though world conditions seem dark and uncertain, may we realize that God holds the future. We believe His coming is near; let us hasten to work while it is yet day. Our prayer today is that we each one strive to do God's will, and keep His smile upon us.

ASSISTANT DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Greetings in the name of Christ our Lord, to our beloved General Superintendent Dr. Melvin Snyder, our hard working District Superintendent and members of the North Central Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. It is said over 45 million people have gone the way of all the earth since our 1959 conference, so I recognize the preserving kindness of a loving God in permitting me to give one more report. Other members more useful and worthy than myself were not allowed to see July 18, 1960 on this sphere, so I am deeply grateful to my Lord for sparing my life.

During the past conference year I held two Camp meetings, our own Camp in the North Central District and the Eastern Ohio Camp, both to my joy and satisfaction. I also held eleven revivals, besides I supplied the pulpits weekends for the Free Methodists, the Nazarenes, the Baptists and Pilgrims and showed my Missionary slide to various churches on different occasions, in several denominations. This, too, was delightful service for Jesus Christ and His cause.

I have written one book entitled, "The Bible and Rockets to the Moon" which is quite timely and prophetic. Then I have started the manuscript of another book which is well under way which I hope to call "The Apostasy According To Jude". It gives me great joy and comfort to revel in God's Holy Word, besides I received that soul food so badly needed in these days. This book, when completed,

will make the tenth book I have written and the 54th which I have published.

During the year I preached 313 times, which included the showing of my pictures of my missionary trips. In the past conference year, wife and I drove to the northwest Idaho and Washington District and held six meetings. It was my pleasure to hold a meeting in the stone veneer Church built by Rev. George Lounds in 1913. He later moved to Michigan and was one of our fine godly ministers of the Michigan District with whom I labored to start the Port Huron Church in a home missionary project. While I was holding this meeting in Post Falls, Idaho the pastor dug up some old minutes of nearly 60 years ago, wherein was recorded the name of Rev. George B. Kulp who was the General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Church then going under the name of the Apostolic Holiness Church.

In the minutes we also ran across the name of Rev. James Strong, who was the son-in-law of Brother Kulp and who was the General Secretary of the Apostolic denomination at that time. Seeing his name touched me deeply as I was reminded that this departed brother gave me the first \$50.00 to start the Home Missionary Church in Grand Rapids. Those were the days before we had any Church extension work. Fifty dollars was a lot of money in the days of depression. I was reminded of the verse in Rev. 14:13: "blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth: yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labours; and their works do follow them".

Wife and I also made a trip down to Troy, North Carolina to be with Dr. and Mrs. W. L. Surbrook; then back to Michigan to a former United Brethren Church where I had spoken over forty years ago. This Independent Group is looking towards the Pilgrim Holiness Church for membership. We then completed this trip with three meetings in northern Michigan. While there I met folks that heard me preach in the same churches 32 years ago. Memory took me back to the days when the departed spiritual leader and excellent pastor, Rev. B. O. Shattuck, built the Church in Ellsworth. This, too, is a stone veneer Church.

I conducted one funeral in the past year, that of William K. Arnel, to whom I ministered for several years. He was such an encouragement to me, as his pastor.

I received the gross income of \$2340.26 for all my ministerial labors. The total expense for gas and oil, car repair, meals and motels in travel, phone calls and other necessary expenses totaled \$1425.71 which left me a balance of net ministerial income of \$914.55.

I have worked in harmony with my successor who followed me in the Des Moines church for three years.

9. We recommend that when a church is financially able, they pay all of the utilities of the parsonage, or the Pastor's home.

10. Each district shall raise the general church funds according to its own plan. When a local church has raised the monthly quota of the general budget asked of it by the district such local church shall be permitted to stipulate the interest, or interests, to which said surplus shall be directed, provided the budget is paid up to date.

11. We recommend that our Pastors receive a love offering for the District Superintendent at his two visits to the churches each year.

12. That the District Council be empowered to change to a central location the District Camp if they think best and feel the leading of the Lord.
