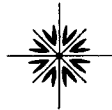

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

The Twelfth Annual Conference of the North Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:00 A. M., July 13, 1961 at the Salvation Army Camp in Kansas City, Missouri.

Rev. Robert Keith led the Conference in singing "All Hail The Power of Jesus Name" and "Beneath The Cross of Jesus."

Mr. William Schloeman led the Conference in prayer.

Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, District Superintendent, introduced Dr. Melvin S. Snyder, General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church to the Conference.

Dr. Snyder brought greetings from the General Church and other conferences.

He addressed the Conference by using the Scripture, Matthew 8:5-13, giving a spiritual lesson concerning our faith in this day.

He stressed the following points:

3. Our Work by Constitutional Authority
4. Our Work by the Exercise of Authority

Rev. W. O. Bottenberg offered a brief prayer.

Roll call of ministers was read

Professor Walter Thomas from Central Pilgrim College gave words of greeting and a brief report on some of the main objectives of the College.

Report of the District Statistician was read and accepted.

Motion carried to extend the Conference to 12:30 P. M.

Discussion was held on giving better reports.

The sitting was adjourned.

Ways and Means Report was read and accepted.

Motion carried to extend the time of sitting to 12:25 P.M.

Dr. Melvin S. Snyder led the Conference in prayer in honor of the deceased.

Report of the Educational and Examining Board was read and accepted.

Motion carried to re-convene at 1:30 P.M. with the election of officers being the first order of the day.

REPORTS TO CONFERENCE

REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Dr. Melvin S. Snyder, General Superintendent, Pastors, Evangelists, Laymen and Friends, --- Greetings, in the Name of Jesus, our blessed Lord. God has called us to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ in our district, and around the world to every creature. Today, as we give due thought to this striking responsibility, the great truths grip our hearts that TIME is marching on. In Ephesians 5:15, 16, "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, Redeeming the time, because the days are evil." Surely these are evil days. Who should redeem the time? You and I, and each member of North Central District, and each Pilgrim minister and layman around the world. Time is passing swiftly. The past year has seemed so short, it seems we have to do things in such a hurry. It is so easy to neglect prayer and the Bible, but we must take time to be Holy. The religion of Jesus is not streamlined, it has the cross in it. It has the blood in it. It has death in it, but the way of the cross leads home. May our hearts be stirred in this camp meeting. God will give us a fresh anointing, and a burden for lost souls, such as we have never had. Our love for God should compel us to go and win men for Christ. When we go home next Monday, may we go with a determination in our hearts to give God our very best in winning souls.

While the past year has seemed short, it has been one of the busiest years of my life, working for God and the Pilgrim Holiness Church. God has given me wonderful health. I thank Him for it, and I have counted it a privilege to give each day to Him.

I have recently completed the sale of the six lots located in Warrenton, Missouri for \$5,396.70, after real estate commissions and fees were paid, giving our district a profit of \$3,196.70. The delay in selling these lots held us up quite a while in starting our new church in Mexico, but we have now begun the building of the church. The grants, permits and plans have all received proper sanctions from the city of Mexico.

God has given us a good year in Mexico. Because of our small place of worship, we are very limited and will be so thankful for our new church. We have had a 25% gain in membership. One of the bright spots in the Mexico Pilgrim Church was our fine Vacation Bible School, with an enrollment of 70 and an average attendance of 45 the first week, the second week, 52. We presented 47 certificates. A great spirit of enthusiasm prevailed and some wonderful contacts made for our church.

We have visited each church of the Conference the past year at least twice. We have enjoyed wonderful fellowship with the pastors and laity. I have received \$85.14 in love offerings from the churches, and our salary is paid in full. I have received from our church in Mexico \$640.00. Our parsonage and utilities are furnished by the district. I have traveled 10,685 miles, have preached 176 times, conducted 51 prayer services, made 540 calls, 200 hospital calls, have had 40 seekers, and I have dealt with many in personal work. I have also conducted 3 funerals.

I would like to express my deep appreciation for each of our fine pastors and their families, and for each member of my District Council for their confidence, prayers and their loyal support.

We were privileged to have Dr. Snyder as our speaker in two conventions; one in Des Moines, the other in Warrenton. These conventions were a great blessing and Brother Snyder was surely at his best.

A fine Sunday School Convention was held in the Kansas City church April 7, with Reverend John Abbott and Reverend Chester Wilkins as speakers. These workers gave us truths and help in building better Sunday Schools. We trust we shall continue to reap a bountiful harvest as we work for the up-building of God's kingdom. The following day, Saturday, April 8, God gave us a fine Youth Convention, with Reverend Abbott in charge.

We had the privilege of visiting our college in Bartlesville, Oklahoma for the Annual Board Meeting.

All of our churches except three paid their budgets in full. We wish to thank one and all for their fine cooperation, for this is what makes the success of the district.

REPORT OF ASSISTANT DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Greetings to our esteemed General Superintendent, Dr. Melvin S. Snyder, our beloved District Superintendent, W. O. Bottenberg and members of the North Central District Conference of 1961 of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

One more year with its months, weeks, days and minutes has slipped away from us, never more to return since we last met in such a session as we are in today. I thank God and praise Him for His preserving care through sickness, travel and dangers seen and unseen.

During this conference year I had two funerals, one of a bachelor of 78 years who left \$500.00 in his will to the First Pilgrim Church in Des Moines. In his will he stated that he had been impressed with the conduct of his neighbors who attended our church. I also conducted a funeral for a man whom I had tried to help in the past in his marital difficulties, but refused my counsel and testimony. Later I was called to the county jail where he was serving a term. It was then he told me that all had failed him. After serving his time, he was killed in a brawl.

During the year I held twelve revivals in various denominations. I also supplied fourteen Sundays for different churches throughout Iowa. I am sure if I remained at home, which I am thinking of doing, I can keep busy nearly every Sunday of the year. It seems there is a large demand for supply speakers as the pastors move, take their vacations or are absent because of illness. During the year I preached 209 times, which included the showing of my pictures of my missionary trips.

June 18, Father's Day, was a "red letter" day of my life, as my wife and I attended the church near Grand Rapids, Michigan where we were converted 45 years ago. There was also present my spiritual father in the Gospel, Rev. Fay Wing, and his twin brother, Jay. These brothers are 85 years of age. Rev. Wing delivered a very fine message in the morning while I, his son in the Gospel, preached at night. Jay Wing led the singing in the revival in which I was saved. I assisted him in singing a duet in each service this past Father's Day. My daughter, Mrs. Olive Roesink of Flint, Michigan, who was a babe in her mother's arms the 23rd day of January, 1916, was also present with her two children. She played the piano while my grandchildren sang a duet. There were twelve persons present who

were there the night of our conversion, when fourteen in our neighborhood found the Lord. This was such a glorious day that the people of that church want to make it an annual event. I am deeply grateful to God for these encouraging and refreshing times from the Lord.

I did not count the seekers in my meetings and revivals as I feel that is the pastor's responsibility which should be reported to the conference of which he is a member. If the evangelists reports the seekers, we will have a double count in our minutes, which in turn shows many seekers but many less members taken in.

I received \$1933.50 for my services in the ministerial field. My total expenses for gas, oil, meals and motels were \$1082.13. This left me a total of \$851.37.

It is a pleasure to serve the Lord and work in His vineyard. It is a joyful duty to glorify God, to exalt Jesus Christ and to let the Holy Ghost have His way in my life and ministry.

REPORT OF MISSIONARY SECRETARY

To Dr. Snyder and the Twelfth Annual Conference of North Central District, Pilgrim Holiness Church, --Greetings and God's bountiful blessings.

I can truly say with the Psalmist, "Bless the Lord, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless his holy name. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits:" Psalms 103:1,2.

One of the greatest benefits of God unto us is that He has allowed us to be born in America instead of in heathen darkness. We are privileged to have the light of the glorious Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. Many of us have been saved since our early youth, and each and every day of our lives has been enriched because of His manifold blessings unto us.

Not so with the heathen. Many of them have never heard that there is a Christ. This brings a great responsibility to you and to me.

We have heard. We experience. We rejoice. There is ignorance, sorrow and darkness. This is the answer to the question asked by the Psalmist, "Why do the heathen rage, and the people imagine a vain thing?" Psalms 2:1.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

Moved and adopted that Ways and Means Committee make a correction of Article I to read:

1. That each member of voting age pay \$2.00 per month Budget. This \$2.00 includes 85¢ District Budget, 66 2/3¢ United Stewardship Fund, 20¢ Camp and Conference, 13 1/3¢ District Home Missions, 05¢ General Conference Delegate Expense, 10¢ Central Pilgrim College. This \$2.00 per member is to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month.

Inasmuch as our Zone School has set a goal of \$5.00 per member per year, we further recommend that each church strive to meet this goal. It is further understood that money raised by deputational workers be credited to this goal.

2. The District Council shall meet at the close of this conference to determine the District Superintendent's salary, provide for his expenses, and help to plan his work for the year. We further recommend that the Council determine the amounts of salary to be paid to the Secretary, Treasurer, and Statistician.

3. The Superintendent at each visit to the churches shall take a special offering for the purpose of assisting the churches in raising their budgets. This offering is to be sent to the District Treasurer who shall receipt the churches for the same.

4. Inasmuch as the pension plan for preachers has been passed by the General Conference, therefore, be it resolved that we encourage all our pastors and evangelists to cooperate with this plan.

Moved and adopted that Ways and Means Committee correct Article V to read:

5. Each church shall pay the camp meeting charge of room, board and travel expenses for their pastor and wife and church delegates. Travel expenses to be paid at the rate of 05¢ per mile plus 01¢ per mile for any additional delegate.

We further recommend that each local church have a "Bank For Camp Plan" for their youth, and that each church shall encourage all their youth to participate. Each unemployed young person will pay \$17.00 and the District will pay \$3.00, making the \$20.00 requirement for camp fee. This plan is to be under the direction of the District Youth Leader.

Motion carried to delete Articles VI and XII from the 1960 Conference Minutes.

6. Be it resolved that each church pay its offering to deputational workers of the Central Pilgrim Bible College, Foreign Missions, and Church Extension through our District Treasurer, so that the District will receive credit for the same.

7. We recommend that each church grant its Pastor two weeks vacation with pay, and the church is to pay for the pulpit supply during this time.

8. We recommend that when a church is financially able, they pay all of the utilities of the parsonage, or the Pastor's home.

9. Each district shall raise the general church funds according to its own plan. When a local church has raised the monthly quota of the general budget asked of it by the district such local church shall be permitted to stipulate the interest, or interests, to which said surplus shall be directed, provided the budget is paid up to date.

10. We recommend that our Pastors receive a love offering for the District Superintendent at his two visits to the churches each year.

Be it resolved that all District Superintendents be included on the General Board.

STANDING RULES - CONFERENCE

1. The District Secretary shall issue Credentials to those entitled to them during the Conference.
2. We recommend that each pastor be permitted to conduct one revival away from his own charge during each conference year.
3. We recommend that each pastor keep a record of all the names and addresses of the subscribers to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate. We further recommend that each pastor endeavor to secure subscriptions equivalent in number to his membership roll.

STANDING RULES - SUNDAY SCHOOL

1. Resolved that each Sunday School strive earnestly to attain a 10% gain in attendance for the conference year.
2. We recommend that all churches where possible start Pilgrim Branch Sunday Schools, under the supervision of their local Church Board.
3. Resolved that this Conference go on record as cooperating fully with the General Sunday School Committee for Rally Day on the second Sunday in October.
4. We recommend heartily the observance of the Sunday School Revival in all of our churches. We further recommend that we conduct Daily Vacation Bible Schools.
5. Be it resolved that this Conference go on record as cooperating fully with the personal evangelism program as introduced to our churches by our General Superintendent; Further, that each pastor or delegate bring to our next Conference a verbal or written report of the results, that it may encourage and stimulate this ministry among our people.

STANDING RULES - CAMP MEETING

1. Whereas our Camp Meeting begins on Tuesday night, continues through Sunday; Therefore, be it resolved that our pastors come, and urge their people to attend the FULL TIME.

STANDING RULES - MEMORIAL

In order to guard against any oversight in compiling the Annual Memorials of the deceased members, Be it resolved: that each pastor or church secretary send the names of deceased members to the Chairman of the Committee on Condolence immediately following the close of each conference year.

STANDING RULES - PENSION PLAN

Inasmuch as the Pilgrim Pension Plan is now a mandatory responsibility upon all of our churches, and in order that this obligation may be clearly and effectively set before our people,

Be it resolved that Sec. 70, Par. 2, of the P. H. Church Manual be made a part of the Conference Journal.

Pilgrim Manual, Sec. 70, Par. 2, "Each local church shall contribute to the Pilgrim Pension Plan fund each month an amount equivalent to 4% of the salary of the pastor, the same to be remitted to the District Treasurer, who will forward same to the General Pension Treasurer. If the pastor of the local church is not a member of the Pilgrim Pension Plan, the said 4% paid by the church which he is pastoring shall be placed in a fund to assist the aged ministers.
